ROUND 1: Questions by Williams GRU and MIT Dialectical Materialism

TOSSUP 1

Born in Gia Dinh, Vietnam, this author was educated in Indo-China. Her reputation was made by the novels she wrote in the 1950s, such as Un Barrage contre le Pacifique, Le Marin de Gibraltar, and Le Square. She achieved a wider celebrity with her screenplay for Alain Resnais' film Hiroshima Mon Amour in 1959. Her autobiographical novel, L'Amant, was published in 1984 and made into a successful film in 1992. For ten points, name this author.

ANSWER: Marguerite _DURAS_

TOSSUP 2

Roentgen, Archimedes, Gauss, Balboa and Vasco Da Gama all have one bigger than Einstein's. Rutherford's is inside of Clavius's. The three largest are Hertzsprung, Korolev and Apollo. Seven of these objects will be named for the astronauts who died in the Challenger disaster. FTP, what are they?

ANSWER: _LUNAR CRATERS_ (or equivalent)

TOSSUP 3

This small country consists of three islands. Around 800 BC, it was colonized by the Phoenicians, and in 200 BC, it became part of the Roman empire. One of its most famous visitors was Odysseus, who stayed on one of its islands, now called Gozo, but known to him as Calypso's Isle. It recently reactivated its previously withdrawn application for EU membership. For 10 points, name this Mediterranean nation once home to the Knights Hospitalers [HOSS-pit'l-ur].

ANSWER: Republic of _MALTA_

TOSSUP 4

The Tin Lizzies, the Wabash Cannonball, the Hangman, the Grizzly River Rampage, the Dulcimer Splash, the Rock 'N Roller Coaster, as well as the Roy Acuff and Bluegrass Theaters were all attractions at, for 10 points, what recently defunct theme park in Nashville, Tennessee that is soon to be replaced by a grand ole shopping mall?

ANSWER: OPRYLAND USA

TOSSUP 5

The official name of this sect is "The United Society of Believers in Christ's Second Appearing", though it is also known as "The Millenial Church." It was founded in England in the 18th century and brought to America by Ann Lee. For 10 points, name this celibate faith whose members are known for their simple lives, music, and furniture.

Answer: _SHAKERS_

TOSSUP 6

After his adopted home state seceded from the Union, he was appointed a commander in the Confederate Navy. As the commander of the C.S.S. Sumter, he captured 17 Union merchant ships. However, he is most noted for his ventures from 1862 to 1864, which ended with his being rescued out of the English Channel by a yacht. FTP, name this Confederate who successfully captured, sunk, and burned over 80 Union ships as the commander of the C.S.S. Alabama.

Answer: Raphael or Ralph _SEMMES_

TOSSUP 7

Symptoms of this disorder include nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, stiffness, and swelling of muscular structures and the face. Effectively treated by thiabendazole, the disease in the US has an incidence of infection rate of 15 to 20 percent, as detected by finding calcified cysts, or larval capsules, in skeletal muscles at autopsy. FTP, name this disorder commonly acquired by humans who eat undercooked pork.

ANSWER: TRICHINOSIS or TRICHINIASIS

TOSSUP 8

First published in 1927, this is the story of the Ramsay family in their summer residence on the Isle of Skye in Scotland. The three sections of this book take place between 1910 and 1920. For 10 points, name this novel, written in stream-of-consciousness by Virginia Woolf.

ANSWER: _TO THE LIGHTHOUSE_

TOSSUP9

This British general was made governor of Montreal in 1760 and eventually rose to become chief of English forces in America in 1763. After returning to England in 1772, he was sent back to replace the mild-mannered Thomas Hutchinson as governor in Boston in 1774. FTP, name this man who sparked the American Revolution when he ordered the British raid on Concord.

ANSWER: General Thomas GAGE

TOSSUP 10

Marion Barry gleefully offered to send him a bus ticket south. As Chairman of the Senate Appropriations subcommittee on the District of Columbia, he wrote much of the legislation that stripped power from Barry and the city's other elected officials. Of course, District residents could not vote for the wealthy trial lawyer who beat him, Democrat John Edwards. FTP, name this outgoing Senator and hog farmer from North Carolina.

ANSWER: (Duncan McLauchlin) "Lauch" (LOCK) _FAIRCLOTH_

TOSSUP 11

This physical phenomenon was credited by Lord Rayleigh to the German physicist and chemist who first investigated it experimentally in 1853. It arises from the asymmetric distortion of the boundary layer thickness in the flow past a spinning sphere. The

asymmetry of the boundary layer creates a lateral force on the spinning orb. FTP name this manifestation of Bernoulli's principle which explains how curveballs curve.

ANSWER: MAGNUS EFFECT or MAGNUS FORCE

TOSSUP 12

As he often did, Lewis Powell provided the crucial fifth vote. Though no other Justice actually joined his entire opinion, it became the decision of the Court when Rehnquist and the conservatives joined one part and Brennan and the liberals joined the rest. In this 1978 opinion, Powell cited Harvard College's admissions policies in holding that race could be a "plus" factor, but not the determining factor, in college admissions. FTP, name it.

Answer: Regents of the _UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA V. BAKKE_

TOSSUP 13

This disease is caused by a mutation in the gene that codes for a transmembrane protein responsible for chloride ion movement. The standard mutation is the Delta 508. Symptoms are obstruction of the airways leading to respiratory infection, pancreatic insufficiency, and infertility. It is no longer exclusively a disease of young children, as treatment techniques have allowed patients to survive into adulthood. For 10 points, name this inherited autosomal disorder.

Answer: _C_ystic _F_ibrosis

TOSSUP 14

Know primarily for her virtuoso piano playing during her lifetime, she is now considered to have written many excellent piano compositions. The mother of eight children, she stopped her career at times to support her husband and raise her family. For 10 points, name this friend of Johannes Brahms who often performed her husband Robert's compositions.

Answer: Clara _SCHUMANN_ or Clara _WIECK_ (her maiden name)

TOSSUP 15

This dramatist, born in Czechoslovakia in 1937, moved to England as a young boy, and later began a career as a reporter and free-lance journalist. He wrote one novel, called _Lord Malquist and Mr. Moon_, as well as a number of plays, such as _The Real Inspector Hound_. For 10 points, name this author of a play told through the eyes of marginal characters Rozencrantz and Guildenstern.

ANSWER: Tom _STOPPARD_ or Tomas _STRAUSSLER_

TOSSUP 16

As a kid at the Bolliteri Tennis Academy in Florida, he was ridiculed for his awkward looks and poor serve. Today, he often travels to tournaments with his priest. He has never won a tournament held in the United States. He has reached as high as number 2 in the ATP rankings, but has never won a major. A fiery temper and a dominant serve are hallmarks of, FTP, what Croatian-born three-time Wimbledon finalist?

Answer: Goran _IVANISEVIC_

TOSSUP 17

He was first elected to the House in 1955, and decided to remain there after an unsuccessful run for LBJ's open Senate seat in 1961. In 1976 he beat Phil Burton and two others to become Majority Leader. His autobiography, Reflections of A Public Man, got him into trouble, and Newt Gingrich, future recipient of a big book advance, charged him with abusing his position. FTP, name this man succeeded by Tom Foley as House Speaker.

ANSWER: James (Jim) _WRIGHT_

TOSSUP 18

This Roman, declared emperor by the troops in the East, where he was engaged in putting down the Jewish Revolt, ended the civil wars that had been going on since Nero's overthrow. He put the state on a sound financial footing and restored discipline to the army. Among his many lavish building projects was the Colosseum. For ten points, name this man who was Roman emperor from 69 to 79 AD and who founded the Flavian dynasty.

ANSWER: _VESPASIAN_

TOSSUP 19

This occurs when the demand curve for real money is horizontal, thus indicating that a change in the quantity of money does not affect the interest rate. Generally, this happens in a country with extremely low interest rates and a high rate of savings. This combination of low interest rates and high savings, which makes monetary policy completely ineffective, explains why Japan is having trouble salvaging its economy. FTP, give this economic term.

Ans: _LIQUIDITY TRAP_

TOSSUP 20

Originally, it was the name given to people who submitted to Christian baptism by the Ante-Nicean Church fathers due to the enlightened understanding that they had recieved. Later, the name came to refer to a mystical sect in 16th-century Spain. However, it most often refers to a secret society founded by Adam Weishaupt to combat religion and foster rationalism. FTP, name these enemies of Masonry whose name refers to enlightenment.

Ans: _ILLUMINATI_

TOSSUP 21

It is a lute shaped stringed instrument popular in the Middle Ages. It has two to four drone strings sounded by a hand-cranked wheel. The melody is played on the strings by depressing keys. For 10 points, name this instrument that is sometimes confused with the barrel organ.

Answer: HURDY-GURDY

TOSSUP 22

This Greek writer was born on Crete. His _The Odyssey, a Modern Sequel_ is a verse tale that explores the views of Buddha, Jesus, Nietzsche and Lenin, among others. For 10 points, name this author of _The Greek Passion_, _The Last Temptation of Christ_, and _Zorba the Greek_.

Answer: Nikos _KAZANTZAKIS_

TOSSUP 23

He had already gotten one each for Koby, Kory, and Kasy, and last year when he got one for Kody, he joked that his mission was complete. But when he received another one after going unbeaten in his final 22 starts, his boys told him that this one was his. FTP, name this Toronto Blue Jay who "Rocketed" his way to a record fifth American League Cy Young award for this past season.

Answer: Roger _CLEMENS_

c.) This Canadian rebellion took place in Upper and Lower Canada, now Ontario and Quebec, after Britain's refusal to grant more home rule. The rebellion in Upper Canada, led by William Mackenzie, died out quickly, but the uprising in Lower Canada was more significant, with a major uprising in the Richelieu River Valley. It takes its name from the year it occured.
