1. As a result of this man's most famous achievement, he was named director of the Paris Observatory in 1854. Later in life, he organized the French meteorological service and set up an international weather warning scheme, but he is best known for calculating from the perturbations of the orbit of Uranus the position of an unknown planet found by Galle in 1846. FTP, who is this man who, independently of John Adams, discovered Neptune?

Answer: Urbain Jean Joseph _Leverrier_

2. In the foreground there is a bowl of oranges, a vase with two roses, and a number of assorted bottles. There may be two barmaids, or we may simply see one girl and her reflection; the blurry panorama in the background may be reflected in a mirror, and the man in the top hat at the upper right corner may represent the reflection of the artist, Edouard Manet. FTP name this 1882 painting.

Answer: A BAR AT THE FOLIES-BERGERE

3. It begins with "No-Name Woman," a story about the author's aunt, who drowned herself and her baby after giving birth out of wedlock. The next section, "White Tigers," is a retelling of the story of Fa Mu Lan. The third section, "Shaman," is a story about the author's mother, a medical doctor in China. Subtitled "Memoirs of a Girlhood Among Ghosts," this autobiographical work was published in 1976. FTP, identify this work by Maxine Hong Kingston.

4. His preaching helped to convert St. Augustine. An opponent of Arianism, he convinced Emperor Gratian to outlaw heresy in the West. Originally a popular governor, he was made bishop by popular demand. FTP, identify this Bishop of Milan and Doctor of the Church.

5. After studying with Karl Jaspers, this German philosopher settled in the US and became the first woman to be appointed full professor at Princeton. Chief editor of Shocken books, her works include _On Revolution_ and the controversial _Eichmann in Jerusalem_. FTP, who is this political theorist and author of _The Human Condition_ and _The Origins of Totalitarianism_?

Answer: Hannah _Arendt_

6. Located 150 miles south of Cuba and 180 miles nortwest of Jamaica, these islands were sighted by Columbus in 1503 and named Las Tortugas, but they were soon renamed for the indigenous marine crocodiles. FTP, name this British Crown Colony, a major

offshore banking center, whose capital is George Town.

Answer: _CAYMAN_ Islands (or _CAYMANS_)

7. On October 5, 1991, its first official release, version 0.02, was announced in a usenet post. This was the humble beginning for an operating system now distributed commercially by Red Hat and Caldera, but also freely downloadable off the Internet. FTP, name this UNIX variant developed by Linus Torvalds and thousands of others on the Internet.

Answer: _LINUX_

8. General manager Harry Domin was the title characters' first target. Even though she had fought for their rights they also killed Helena Glory. With their creators gone, they began to die, but two of them, Helena and Primus, showed the signs of love and the promise of continuing their species. FTP name this play, an attack on the mechanization of society published in 1920 by Karel Capek.

Answer: _RUR_ (Rossum's Universal Robots)

9. Referred to as the Home of Brightness, it is home to Bergelmer among others. The giant Ymir and his cow Audhumla were formed from the mixture of ice from Niflheim and flames from this territory south of the Ginnungagap, and this land's element makes up the Bifrosts red band. FTP name this domain guarded by Surt with a flaming sword, the land of fire in Norse myth.

Answer: _MUSPELHEIM_ (or muspelsheim)

10. He became the Soviet Union's natural-gas minister in 1985, and in 1989 he became chairman of the board of Gazprom, the state-owned natural gas conglomerate. His political fortunes looked their brightest in 1995 when he negotiated the release of nearly 1100 hostages in a hospital taken by Chechen rebels. FTP, name this politician, Russia's prime minister from 1992 to this March, who's recent renomination was rejected by the Duma.

Answer: Viktor _CHERNOMYRDIN_

11. Article 5 concerns the United States intention to improve sanitation and decrease infectious disease in the country concerned; article 7 requires the country to sell or lease land to the US; Article 2 releases the country from debts, and Article 3 releases the US from further obligations. Named after the Connecticut senator who sponsored it, it was added to the Army Appropriations Bill of 1901. FTP name this amendment that specified the nature of future US involvement in Cuba.

Answer: _PLATT_ Amendment

12. Samuel Ruben and Martin Kamen first discovered it around 1940, and recognized its potential as a research tool in photosynthesis. Melvin Calvin won a Nobel Prize in 1961 for the elucidation of his namesake cycle by using this isotope, but a more famous application had won Willard Libby the Nobel Prize a year earlier. FTP, what is this isotope used in the dating of objects of biological origin?

Answer: Wolfgang Amadeus _Mozart_

14. While a student of Walter Pater, this poet wrote the dialogue _O the Origin of Beauty_. His poems, including "Felix Randall" and "The Windhover," were first published by his friend Robert Bridges in 1918. FTP, who is this Jesuit priest and user of "sprung rhythm," best known for his "Wreck of the Deutschland" and "Pied Beauty"?

Answer: Gerard Manley Hopkins

15. The last of the Antonine line of emperors, this man was followed by Pertinax. The praefect Perennis and the crueler mercenary Cleander managed the government for most of his rule, as he was more interested in pleasurable pursuits. After indentifying with Hercules and renaming most Roman institutions after himself, he was strangled by a wrestler in 192. FTP, who is this emperor, the eldest son of Marcus Aurelius?

Answer: Marcus Aurelius _Commodus _ Antoninus

16. Persistent symptoms may include irritability, insomnia, or hypervigilance. General responsiveness is often numbed; the patient often feels detached from others, has a sense of a foreshortened future, and is unable to remember important aspects of the trigger event. FTP name this disorder in which the patient reexperiences a violent event to which he originally reacted with horror, helplessness, and intense fear.

Answer: _POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS_ Disorder/Syndrome

17. Knighted in 1812, he had essentially retired from science the next year at the age of 35. He did, however, later invent a safety lamp which would not ignite the methane gas in coal mines. He also determined chlorine and iodine to be elements. FTP, name this British chemist who used the newly invented voltaic pile to discover barium, potassium, calcium and sodium.

Answer: Sir Humphrey _DAVY_

18. She and her lover are offered asylum by Lord Edward Bomston, who later puts the lover aboard Admiral Anson's ship. The daughter of the Baron d'Etanges, she marries the elderly baron Wolmar, who later hires her former lover, Saint-Preux, as the tutor to their children. FTP name this heroine of a 1761 epistolary novel, in which she is compared to Pierre Abelard's lover, by Jean-Jacques Rousseau.

Answer: JULIE ou la Nouvelle Heloise

19. Her story is retold in C.S. Lewis's novel "Till We Have Faces." Her beauty caused mortals to neglect Venus, so Venus asked her son to punish this woman by making her fall in love with a monster. However, he himself fell in love with her, and married her but came to her only at night so she couldn't see him. FTP, identify this mythological figure who spilled lamp oil on her husband Cupid when her curiosity got the better of her.

Answer: PSYCHE (accept "Cupid & Psyche," since it's confusingly worded)

20. It elected Martin V as pope, deposed Benedict XIII and John XXIII, and accepted the resignation of Gregory XII. It lasted from 1414 to 1418. FTP, identify this council which ended the Great Schism.

Answer: Council of CONSTANCE

21. Its currency, the koruna, on the verge of being devalued. Its government credit was downgraded to junk bond status. It's applications to NATO and the European Union were shelved because of accusations that its government was trampling democracy. But the win by the opposition led by Mikulas Dzurinda in late-September elections may signal a turnaround. FTP, name this central European country, whose outgoing government was led by Vladimir Meciar.
