

1: Directed by Aaron Crosland, this melodrama tells the tale of a young man trying to become a professional singer, despite his Rabbi father's wishes that he become a cantor. Georgie Jessup was originally slated to star in the title role, but Warner brothers eventually decided to give the role to the man who starred in the stage version. FTP, name this 1927 Al Jolson film

A: THE JAZZ SINGER

2. Convicted twice for molesting teenage boys, he died penniless in 1953. A failed actor and novelist, he lost much of his money backing failed Broadway plays. This man is better known for his exploits on the tennis court. The oldest man ever to win Wimbledon, he won there three times and also led the US to 7 straight Davis Cup wins between 1922 and 1926. FTP, name this man, probably the dominant player of the first half of the century.

A: Bill TILDEN

3. In order to protect the good citizens of MetroCity after the departure of Julian Wilkes and Joe Astor, a new team was created to drive the Defender. The new lead, Thomas Cole, is an expert driver from the elite UN Security Drivers squad. FTP, name this Knight Rider rip-off, which doubles as an extended commercial for Dodge.

A: VIPER

4. When a painting entitled Crucified Venus is deemed blasphemous, Rev. Anthony Campion and his wife set out to attempt to convince the painter to withdraw it. Instead they find themselves alternately shocked by and drawn to the amoral atmosphere created by the painter, his wife, and the three nude models scampering about the place. FTP, name this Australian film starring Sam Neill, Hugh Grant, and Elle MacPherson.

A: SIRENS

5. In "Sorry Fugu" he tells the story of a restaurant owner trying to win over a food critic. In "Big Game" he modernizes "The Short Happy Life of Francis Macomber" by setting it in a Southern California game ranch. In "East is East," he tells the tale of a Japanese sailor who jumps ship and drifts ashore in a writer's colony. FTP, name this author best known for "The Road to Wellville"

A: T. Coraghessan BOYLE

6. Formed by a pair of South Carolina broadcast journalism majors, this band has lacked critical acclaim, but not commercial success. In order to gain better financial control over their affairs, the band is technically owned by a limited partnership named fishco. It's first three albums: a self-titled release, Time, and Kootchypop all sold slowly, but it scored a major hit with it's fourth album. Critical backlash, however, hurt sales of its

most recent album: Fairweather Johnson. FTP, name these soft-rockers whose songs include "Only Wanna be with You"

A: HOOTIE AND THE BLOWFISH

7. His pet hatred is street mimes, and he throws any that he encounters into a scorpion-filled pit after explaining their crime to them via a sign that says "Learn the Words". His hobbies include playing chess and reading music (having instruments play it spoils the purity for him). He rules the city of Ankh-Morpork on the principle of "One Man, One Vote", i.e. he is that man and he has that vote. FTP, name this Discworld character, the patrician of Ankh-Morpork.

A: Lord Havelock VETINARI (prompt on patrician on interrupt)

8. Legends in this sport include Donald Bradman, Ian Botham, and Brian Lara. A ritual-intensive game, an English side recently became defunct after none of the members proved sufficiently adept at making Tea Sandwiches. Perhaps the most entertaining part of this game, however, is its terminology, which includes such phrases as Silly Point, googly, Leg Before Wicket, and Boundary 6. FTP, name this sport, whose powers include India, Australia, England, and the West Indies.

A: CRICKET

9. This leader dispatched the beggars in his kingdom by summoning them to a feast, locking them inside the dining hall, and burning the building down. He also had a thing for manners, nailing the turbans to the heads of two insolent Turkish ambassadors. His trademark manner of killing, however, did serve a defensive purpose. After all when the Turkish sultan Mehemet invaded his kingdom, the sight of 20,000 corpses that this prince had chosen to display was sufficient to convince the Turks that they might wish to find an easier target. FTP, name this Wallachian ruler, the inspiration of Bram Stoker's Dracula

A: VLAD TEPEȘ or VLAD THE IMPALER or VLAD DRACULA

10. Born Brian Wagner, this Ohioan gave up a career in journalism to become a musician. After rising to prominence as the opening act for Nine Inch Nails, his career has had it's share of controversial episodes such as the time he shredded a copy of the Book of Mormon on stage in Salt Lake City and the time the Dr. Anton LaVey, founder of the Church of Satan, bestowed the title of Reverend upon him. FTP, name this neo-satanist rocker, whose bandmates have included Gidget Gein and Madonna Wayne Gacy.

A: Marilyn MANSON

11. The sixth pick in the 1985 free agent draft, this Arizona State grad reached the majors in 1986 and was switched to left field in 1987. Voted the S. Rae Hickock Athlete of the Year in 1993, his playing skills have been somewhat overshadowed by his surly personality and occasional reluctance to make his alimony and child support payments. Willie Mays' godson, he's won three MVP awards and is the only member of the 400 HR/400 steal club. FTP, name him.

A: Barry BONDS

12. The youngest grandmaster in history, this Hungarian recently defeated 30 players in a simultaneous exhibition. One of three grandmaster-level sisters, she's the best of the lot and is currently ranked 16<sup>th</sup> in world, though she recently defeated 2<sup>nd</sup>-ranked Vishy Anand in a match. FTP, name this woman, the highest-ranked female chess player ever.

A: Judit POLGAR

13. It uses the Duke Nukem 3d game engine, but transposes it to a variety of colorful locales: examples include a bowling alley, a drive-in theater, a sewage treatment plant, and downtown Hickston. Power-ups include hard liquor and Moon Pies, and its one of the few games with a country music soundtrack (plus a couple tracks by the Mojo Nixons). FTP, name this game subtitled Suckin' Grits on Route 66.

A: REDNECK RAMPAGE

14. He was a Baptist missionary in China who was forced to flee from the Japanese in 1941. While trying to establish new missions in eastern China, he led Cap. James Doolittle and crew to safety when they were forced to crash-land after their famous Tokyo raid. He served out the remainder of the war as an Allied intelligence officer before being shot and killed by Chinese Communists. FTP, name this man, who lent his name to a notorious ultra-conservative, anti-Communist organization.

A: John M. BIRCH

15. The son of a quiz show panelist on Canadian TV, this singer's first band was called The Squires. He was then a member of the Myna Birds with Rick James. The two of them then joined Buffalo Springfield. Launching a solo career in 1969, his hits included Down by the River. He was also an on-again, off-again fourth member of Crosby, Stills and Nash. His video for 1987's This Notes for You featured scenes of a Michael Jackson look-alike's hair catching fire. FTP, name this singer whose 1995 collaboration with Pearl Jam earned him the nickname: "The Grandfather of Grunge"

A: Neil YOUNG

16. An airplane carrying several counterfeit paintings, worth millions to the counterfeiters, suffers a malfunction in the cargo hold, spilling the paintings, as well as all the luggage, near a colony of cave men that has existed somehow unaltered in the middle of California. Two of the men from the colony, Yuk and Hubba, find the crashed luggage and begin to assimilate themselves and the other members of the tribe into modern culture using its contents, hilarity ensues, virtue triumphs, and the counterfeiters get their just desserts. This roughly describes the plot of this truly weird 1983 flick, made all the weirder by the fact that most of the dialogue is in caveman-ese. FTP, name it.

A: LUGGAGE OF THE GODS

17. Chillingly, this movie stars Art Carney and Bea Arthur. It also stars members of Chewie's immediate family, including his wife Itchy and son Lumpy. The movie also features minutes of lilting Wookie dialog, without subtitles. The plot, such as it is, consists of Han's attempts to get Chewie home for Wookie Life Day. FTP, name this movie, which graphically illustrates why you should never, ever make a Star Wars film without George Lucas.

A: The STAR WARS HOLIDAY SPECIAL

18. It stars John Matuzak, Angelica Huston, and Robert Urich. Possibly the only sci-fi flick that includes eunuchs, it is set in a time when in the far future water is the most valuable substance. Two space pirates are captured, sold to a princess, and recruited to help her find her father who disappeared when he found information dangerous to the rulers, namely the existence of Earth. FTP, name this 1984 film.

A: The ICE PIRATES

19. The band's name comes from a film starring George C. Scott and Joanne Woodward. They first developed a following through their Dial-A-Song service, but didn't sign a record deal until People profiled them in 1985. Band members John Linnell and John Flansburgh have written such memorable songs as I Palindrome I, and Purple Toupee. FTP, name this band, whose Istanbul (not Constantinople), and Particle Man found their way into a Tiny Toons episode.

A: THEY MIGHT BE GIANTS

20. A die-hard Notre Dame alum, he first gained national attention as the title character's sidekick on The Joey Bishop Show. He had a New York City talk show with Cindy Garvey, but the show didn't go national until Garvey was replaced by his current co-host. Possibly the most annoying man on TV, this former cracker pitchman is well-balanced by his co-host, the most annoying woman in TV history. FTP, name this man, Kathlie Lee Gifford's co-host.

A: Regis PHILBIN

21. A precocious lad, he hosted a radio program for the Canadian Broadcasting Company at the age of 9. At 21, he was the host of Canada's version of American Bandstand, before becoming the youngest network news anchor ever at age 26. Widely derided as a callow pretty boy, he was replaced by Frank Reynolds, but resumed his anchor role after Reynolds died seven years later. FTP, name this man, the anchor of ABC's World News Tonight.

A: Peter JENNINGS

22. This book was commended by the British Library Association and won the Smarties Book Prize for 1998 however. There were some problems with this, because people were buying it direct from Amazon.com UK, thus annoying Scholastic, who had purchased the rights to distribute it in the U.S. Unfortunately, it probably won't win the Newbery award, since that is awarded to the author who has made the most distinguished contribution to children's literature in America. Name this book, which although a 'children's' title, is currently number 8 on the New York Times BestSeller list.
