## Bonuses

1. As we are all (presumably) boring non-magical people, we might as well start with a bonus about those who aren't lucky enough to be witches and wizards. 5-10-15.

This by now well-known term refers to those without any hope of magical powers

## Muggle

This term refers to those who have magical parents but show no capacity for magic themselves. Argus Filch is suspected to be one of these.

## Squib

This derogatory term refers to those who, like Hermione (her MY ah nee) Granger, have Muggle parents or other ancestors.

## Mudblood

2. Although Muggle-born, Hermione is the top student in her year. See if you can match Hermione's knowledge and tell us what each of these spells does. (Accept approximate equivalents for each answer.)

Petrificus Totalus

The Full Body-Bind (you can't move, you're frozen, etc)

Lumos

Your wand lights up

Expelliarmus

Disarms the person (Blasts the wand out of the person's hand, etc)

3. Spells are one thing, but Unforgivable Curses are something else again. FTP each, given the following description of its consequences, name the Unforgivable Curse.

Oddly enough, being put under this curse actually feels good, because you have no control over your actions. However, you're at the mercy of the person cursing you, and must do whatever they tell you to do.

The Imperius Curse (Also accept Imperio, the command which puts the curse into effect)

This curse subjects the victim to excruciating pain.

The Cruciatus Curse (Also accept Crucio, the command)

This curse is impossible to defend against. It sends a flash of brilliant green light towards the victim, who dies immediately.

Avada Kedavra

4. Mmm. Cockroach clusters. FTP each, give the name of these other, slightly less disgusting magical sweets.

These “hop around realistically in the stomach.”

Chocolate Frogs

These sherbert balls cause the eaters to levitate after eating them.

Fizzing Whizbees

Okay, this candy isn't actually magical, but it's one of Dumbledore's favorite sweets. He's eating these when he and McGonagall oversee Harry's deposit at the Dursleys' house.

Lemon Drops (also accept sherbet lemon, the British name)

5. Among the many magical things hidden away from our Muggle eyes are numerous schools of magic. Name these three on a 5-15-10 basis.

This is the school attended by Harry and his friends.

Hogwarts

This Frenchy school is presided over by Madame Maxine. Translated loosely, it might mean “beautiful wands.”

Beauxbatons

This menacing-sounding school with a spooneristic name specializes in teaching the dark arts.

Durmstrang

6. Even wizarding families have to pay the rent. Identify the following things about the jobs held by Hogwarts parents.

FTP: Both of Hermione's parents hold this job

Dentist

FFP: Where does Mr. Weasley work?

The Ministry of Magic

For a final fifteen, in what department of the Ministry does Mr. Weasley work?

This main street in the magical section of London has a name that might suggest that it runs neither horizontally nor vertically.

Diagon Alley

To get on this chivalrous mode of transportation, just hold your wand out.

Knight Bus

Harry once accidentally ended up on this scary street; since it's full of vendors of the Dark Arts, it's not surprising that its name is associated with the night.

Knockturn Alley

9. After four trips to Diagon Alley for school supplies, the merchants there are becoming old friends. FTP each, identify these people who help outfit Harry and his friends at the beginning of each school year.

This pale-eyed, slightly creepy man has fitted generations of Hogwarts students with their wands.

Mr. Ollivander

Harry first meets Draco Malfoy in her store, as she's fitting them both with their school robes.

Madame Malkin

Mr. Weasley and Mr. Malfoy get into a bit of a fight in this bookstore.

Flourish and Blots

10. Even before he becomes the Care of Magical Creatures teacher, Hagrid has a penchant for scary beasts. Name these "friends" of Hagrid's FTP each.

Hagrid wins this cute little guy in a card game; he gets sent away with Charlie Weasley when he gets too big for Hagrid to keep

Norbert the Norwegian Ridgeback

Hagrid befriends this scary beast while a student at Hogwarts, which unfortunately leads to his expulsion. Being scared of spiders, Ron is not particularly fond of this creature.

Aragog

Hagrid acquired this three-headed dog from a "Greek chappie" he met in the pub. No, his name isn't Cerberus.

Fluffy

This is the dream racing broom that Sirius gives to Harry during his third year.

Firebolt

16. J.K. Rowling has written two books under pseudonyms to be sold for charity; they're supposed to be copies of schoolbooks that Harry and his friends use. One is about Quidditch and the other about magical animals. For 15 points each, name those two books.

17. Going to school at Hogwarts is quite different from Muggle education. Name these things from magical pedagogy FTP each.

Fifth-year students take exams referred to by the acronym OWL. What does OWL stand for?

Ordinary Wizarding Level

When taking exams, students can't use their own quills but are given quills bewitched with what kind of spell?

An Anti-Cheating Charm (accept equivalents)

Hogwarts students measure the length of the composition not by word number or page length, but by one of these two measurements. Name one.

Inches or number of rolls of parchment

18. Most wizards believe that Sirius Black killed this man right before he went to Azkaban. Instead, he faked his death and has resurfaced as Voldemort's most faithful follower.

For 15 points, give the name of this man, once one of James Potter's dearest friends.

Peter Pettigrew

For 10 points, give the nickname he goes by as a result of his ability to turn into a rat.

Wormtail

And for a final five, give the name that he went by while he was a pet rat in the Weasley family.

Scabbers

19. Name the character, 30-20-10

30 pt: She shares her name with a character from *Mansfield Park* who is similarly concerned with snooping.

20 pt: She is the first to be attacked by the basilisk.

10 pt: She is the cat who helps Argus Filch seek out student rule-breakers.

Mrs. Norris

20. Anyone thirsty? Name these drinks which appear in Harry's world FTP each.

Students buy this fruit juice on the Hogwarts Express and also frequently drink it at meals. Sounds kind of icky, if you ask me.

Pumpkin Juice

A specialty at the Three Broomsticks in Hogsmeade, it warms you up on a cold day.

Butterbeer

This glutinous potion can make you look and sound like someone else.

Polyjuice Potion

21. And finally, we couldn't have a Harry Potter packet without a Quidditch question.

For five points each, name the other three positions on a Quidditch team besides Seeker.

Chaser, Keeper, Beater
