1. His name is used by Albert Memmi to describe a colonizer who accepts yet despises a usurping position over the colonized, a complex named for his persecution of (\*) Britannicus. After murdering his wife Octavia and his mother Agrippina, he committed suicide after a revolt by his Praetorian Guard in A.D. 68. FTP, identify this stepson and heir of Claudius.

Answer: Nero\_

2. Members of this major league baseball team's 1995 roster included bullpen set-up man Julian Tavarez, .300 hitter Paul Sorrento, Orel Hersheiser and (\*) Eddie Murray. Ending a 41-year long playoff drought, this team won the first American League Central Division championship. FTP, name the only AL franchise except the Yankees to appear in the World Series since 1994.

3. In Stanley Kubrick's film A Clockwork Orange, this composer's Overture to the Thieving Magpie is played during the fight scene with Billyboy's gang in the dilapidated Opera House. More memorably, Alex (\*) has sex with two women in an accelerated sequence to what is often recognized as the Lone Ranger theme. FTP, identify this Italian composer of the William Tell Overture.
