1. The first album by an American to debut at #1 on the Billboard charts, it stayed there for 14 consecutive weeks in 1976. It took two years to make and included 160 musicians, including George Benson and Herbie Hancock. It later became the focus on a 1997 documentary about its making and was listed as #7 in the VH-1 Greatest Rock and Roll Albums in 2001. FTP, name this Stevie Wonder double album featuring the songs "I Wish" and "Sir Duke."

SONGS IN THE KEY OF LIFE

2. He attended Montgomery Blair High, the same high school as Goldie Hawn, Sylvester Stallone, and Connie Chung, and scored a 1573 on his SAT. While writing for the Wall Street Journal, a rant about racist writing on "The Jeffersons" earned him a job as creative consultant to Norman Lear. His early acting work has included playing a surplus salesman in The Wild Life and Dr Who (no, not that Dr. Who) in Frankenstein General Hospital. His breakthrough acting job, however, came at the age of 40 when he gave a lecture on economics in the movie "Ferris Bueller's Day Off." FTP name this host of a game show where you might win his money.

Ben STEIN

3. Named "Rookie of the Year" runner-up in 1983, he qualified for finals every year from 1984 to 1989, but was killed in '89 at the Cheyenne Frontier Days Rodeo by a bull named "Taking Care of Business." The 1987 world bull-riding champion, he had appeared in Garth Brooks' video for "The Dance," but would be better known through film. FTP, name this bull rider portrayed by Luke Perry in the movie 8 Seconds.

Lane FROST

4. Considering his history, his claim that he was a Penn State valedictorian is a little suspect. His literary endeavors include a haiku on the literary webzine La Petite Zine and a proposed book called Laughing Your Way to the Top. Other events in the last year have been less positive. In addition to losing a toenail when a drunken fan stepped on his foot, he participated in a charity kick boxing tournament called "Who Wants to Kick a Millionaire's Butt?" And in a Valentine's Day special of Curtis Court called "Sue the One You Love," he was the guest advisor to litigants. FTP, name this comic / millionaire who performed to sold out crowds during last year's Annulment Tour.

Rick ROCKWELL

5. The 90's versions of this game include the "World Tour," where the characters moved to new locations including London and parts of South America, and the "Universal Tour" which added the characters Curtis, Ruby, and Boris. In the original, the National Guard posed the chief threat although toilets, cacti and light bulbs could also hurt characters. Health could be restored by consuming milk, turkeys, fruit, and (of course) human beings. If the health meter was exhausted, however, characters reverted to their normal naked human selves and would slink off-screen. FTP, name this arcade classic starring George, Lizzie, and Ralph, monsters who destroy 85 North American cities.

6. Univac, Kojak, Mr. Rogers, Jimmy Carter, Richard Nixon, Sigmund the Sea Monster, Land of the Lost, H.R. Pufnstuf, Skylab, Led Zepplin, and of course the Brady Bunch are referenced visually. Craig's shirts alternate between "Disco Still Sucks," "Do The World A Favor. Kill A Techno Raver," and "If This Song Is Too Pop, It's Past Your Bedtime" while Greg's Kobi Bryant jersey and Art's Scotti Pippin jersey stay the same. FTP, name this video by Everclear celebrating the merits of the 530 to 1600 bandwidth.

AM RADIO

7. Kurtwood Smith played "Mr. Sue" on this short-lived program which ran from July 18 to November 28, 1987. Of the 17 episodes, only three – "Driver's License," "Under the Weather," and "No Place Like Omsk" – do not contain the protagonist's name in the title. While most of the cast was forgettable, Elinor Donahue – who played Princess on "Father Knows Best" – played the clueless mother of the protagonist. FTP, name this early FOX show which featured Jonathan Ward searching for his kidnapped secret agent father.

8. Carecen in 1992, Bide-A-Wee in '93, Boggy Creek Gang in '94, Sunlight Mission in '95, LA Youth Network in '96, Community Services For Autistic Adults and Children in Spring 1997, divided between Share Our Strength & Habitat For Humanity in Winter '97, Cure Autism Now Foundation in '99, and the Southern Poverty Law Center in 2000. These were all recipients of the top prize money in, FTP, what annual competition which in February included Jodie Foster, Eric Idle, Kevin Sorbo, and, of course, Alex Trebek?

CELEBRITY JEOPARDY

9. He was drafted in the first round of the 1978 NBA draft by the Atlanta Hawks based on his 16.6 career scoring average while at Kentucky. After 3 years this 6"5 forward and his measly 6.7 PPG were deemed expendable by the Hawks and he was cut, thus ending his NBA career. Five years playing in Japan would follow, during which he would come back home to broadcast Kentucky high school basketball games during the off-season. This would lead to his current job as the TV voice of the Orlando Magic, a job he has held since the team's inception in 1989. FTP name this former Kentucky Wildcat standout awarded the 1978 NCAA Tournament MVP for leading the Wildcats to the National Championship over Duke.

Jack GIVENS

10. The film looks like a casting call for sit-com has-beens. Having graduated, the principal characters work for a company owned by Stromboli and prove themselves fit to work by handling a stressful situation. Like the majority of the supporting cast in the second half of the film, Sherman Helmsley's character is blind, leading to various attempts at slapstick humor. Among the more memorable moments in the film, however, is Judy Landers' attempt to calm a hysterical passenger. FTP, name this 1986 film featuring Landers, Wendie Jo Sperber, and Donny Most as flight attendants.

STEWARDESS SCHOOL

11. Some revisionists see her as the precursor to the 90s "riot grrrls" by way of her influence on the Runaways. In the 1960s this aunt of Sherilyn Fenn was a member of "The Pleasure Seekers" a Detroit all-girl band who played their own instruments. After they split, she went solo, garnering the hits "Can the Can," "48 Crash," and later the duet with Chris Norman "Stumblin In." In 1974, she interrupted a tour of Japan for her only major acting role, opposite Henry Winkler. FTP, name this musician who played Leather Tuscadero on "Happy Days."

Suzi QUATRO

12. Its distinctive logo was made from letters cut from Rolling Stone, Cosmopolitan, and Life magazines, as well as a Ruffles potato chip bag, a Clark Bar, and a Goobers box. Made for only \$27,575, it was financed largely by credit cards and money borrowed by family and friends. Although it did not contain nudity, sex, or violence, it was originally given an "NC-17" rating until the distributor hired Alan Dershowitz to petition the MPAA to change the rating to "R" which he did without any cuts. FTP, name this film which documents Dante Hicks' and Randal Graves' jobs at the Quick Stop.

CLERKS

13. Considered the third worst of its kind, the works of the Azgoths and Paula Nancy Millstone Jennings being worse, it resulted from its creators' insistence on being considered evolved and cultured. The most well-known one to humans was the creation of Jeltz, something which began "Oh freddled gruntbuggly thy micturations are to me / As plurdled gabbleblotchits on a lurgid bee." FTP, name this literary form which, though repulsive to Ford, Arthur Dent rather liked.

VOGON POETRY (accept equivalents)

14. The company that makes them also holds the patent for The Clapper. Based in San Francisco, California, Joseph Enterprises doesn't actually hold a patent on these novelties. Many other companies make items like them, but Joseph does own the rights to the name which you all know. The company first used a paste made from the moistened seeds of the *Salvia Columbariae* and sold them along with a ram in 1982. Today, you can also get a variety of Looney Toons characters along with a pig, puppy, elephant, turtle, hippo, and a head among others. Among his other sins was organizing the group responsible for the Morlock Massacre, the discovery of which led to his leaving the X-Men. FTP, name this red-eyed Ragin' Cajun born Remy Lebeau.

GAMBIT

16. His website says that he went bankrupt during the time he owned his painting business. He also ran an unsuccessful dating service called the 18/28 Dating Club. He says that his total debt, including his mortgage, was \$130,000. Somehow, this supposed mountain of debt caused him to losing everything he had, including his truck. He then started placing ads in newspapers offering his services to people who were due refunds after paying off their FHA mortgages. He then started working in the 900 number business. It is here that he makes his money now by getting people to buy 900 numbers from him. You have probably seen him on late night TV telling you how to get rich by placing tiny little ads in newspapers. FTP, what is the name of this questionable money-making guru?

Don LAPRE (La Pree)

17. He spent his entire professional career, from 1970 to 1988, with one team, having one of his best seasons his penultimate year with a .319 batting average and a .377 on base percentage although he played just 104 games that year. A five-time Gold Gloves winner, he started five All-Star games from '73 to '82 and won the All-Star MVP award in '82 with a two-run homer for the NL. Other feats include winning the 1977 Roberto Clemente Award. Second only to Pete Rose in doubles, games, hits, and at-bats for the Reds, and second to Joe Morgan for stolen bases, FTP, name this Venezuelan shortstop for the Reds.

Dave CONCEPCION

18. Its name is a combination of the company's initial name and location, Richterich & Co., Laufen. More than sixty years ago, the late Emil Richterich set up the family business which has since grown into a company of international reputation. The Swiss company has become a global trademark for natural herbal specialties such as Herbal Health Dietary Supplements, Sugar Free Swiss Herb Breath Mints, and Natural Herb Throat Drops. From their website, you can actually download a wave file of their trademark Alphorn sound. FTP, identify this company best known in the States for their commercials which feature Alphorners and yodelers singing their company's name.

RICOLA

19. It begins with the dark, cold, rain-soaked scene of a funeral. Almost all of the familiar characters are present, either buried around Melanie in the cemetery or dressed in dour, black mourning clothes, surrounding her grave, rain drops mixing with the tears streaming down their cheeks. Emotional to the very last line, this sequel sold millions of copies, but it never received the critical acclaim of the original. It even inspired a CBS mini-series in 1994 starring Timothy Dalton and Joanne Whaley-Kilmer. Copycat works created a problem for the Mitchell estate. You may recognize it from its opening line, "This will soon be over, and then I can go home to Tara." FTP, name this work by Alexandra Ripley.

20. JESUS Christ

22. Created by Bill Everett, he first appeared in an 8-page story in Motion Pictures Comic Weekly, a story which would be later republished. The offspring of Captain Leonard McKenzie and Princess Fen, he has been married twice with both wives dying, and has been involved in romances with Betty Dean and Sue Richards. At various times he has been a member of the Defenders, the Avengers, the Invaders, and the All-Winner's squadron, despite his initial disdain for surface dwellers who were responsible for destroying part of his kingdom. FTP, name this Prince of Atlantis, revived from amnesia by the Fantastic Four.

NAMOR (accept Sub-Mariner)

23. A middle school teacher and part-time lecturer at Westminster College, Oxford, he began writing for adults but shifted to younger readers while he was a school teacher. His works include the picture book I was A Rat and the young adult novel The Tin Princess which borrows some of the younger characters from his earlier work The Sally Lockhart Trilogy. FTP, name this author most famous for The Subtle Knife, The Golden Compass, and The Amber Spyglass.

Phillip PULLMAN

24. It is mentioned in the 1957 Dana Andrews film Curse of the Demon when the villain's preference of a usually less desirable action suggests his wickedness. This British game also shares its name with a song by Men At Work criticizing the music business, coming from their third album Two Hearts. It seems to have originated in India as a means of teaching virtue and was adapted for play in Victorian England to teach Thrift, Penitence, and Industry. Players begin at the bottom of the board and, depending on whether the player lands on the certain squares, may move rapidly up the rows or back down. FTP, name this British children's game in which chutes have been substituted in the American version.
