TOSSUPS

1. Christine Cavanaugh portrayed the short, underestimated hero. Danny Mann was the crazy sidekick who impersonated roosters. Miriam Margolyes was the motherly figure who took the hero into her clan. Sounds like another Hollywood carbon copied film, except that none of these actors appeared in the movie. In fact, only two principal roles were not given voice dubs: Madga Szubanski, and James Cromwell. FTP, name this film about a farmer, his sheep, and the little sheep herder who inspired the phrase, "That'll do, Pig."

Babe

2. His comedy The Relapse; or, Virtue in Danger, was a sequel to Colley Cibber's Love's Last Shift. Other plays of his include The Provok'd Wife and The Confederacy. He took up another field in 1702, when he designed Castle Howard, Yorkshire. Later, he would design the Queen's Theatre, or Opera House, which was ruined because its acoustics were bad. A frequent partner of Nicholas Hawksmoor, Christopher Wren's clerk, this is, FTP, which architect, the master of English Baroque who designed Blenheim Castle?

Sir John Vanbrugh (van BROO)

3. These devices are the most sensitive magnetometers, capable of measuring down to 5 times 10 to the negative fourteenth volts. They employ ultra_low_resistance loops with a "weak link" of normal material that carries a small current with respect to the rest of the loop. Flux changes in the loop can then be measured very sensitively. FTP, name these solid_state devices that share their name with cephalopods in the order Teuthoidea.

FTP, name this second ecumenical council of the Christian Church, which took place what the rejected canon called "the New Rome," and promulgated what became known as the Nicene Creed.

5. In 2000, this Nasdaq company's stock lost 98% of its value, going from a 52 week high of \$104.25 to a 52 week low of \$1.06. Perhaps gaining Sarah Jessica Parker as a spokesperson in February, 2001, will help turn that around. Founded in 1998, this Norwalk, Connecticut, company lets users bid on such things as home financing and telephone long distance, as well as travel items. FTP, name this internet company, which has said it will make no new advertisements with original pitchman William Shatner.

6. She initially wrote first in English and then rewrote her books in her native language, but later produced them simultaneously in both. She used the pseudonym Pierre Andrezel to write her only novel, The Angelic Avengers. She is more famous for her collections of tales, writing Last Tales, Winter's Tales, and the story collection Seven Gothic Tales. FTP, name this Danish woman, who wrote about her experiences on a coffee plantation in Kenya in the autobiography Out of Africa.

Karen Christen (Isak) Dinesen or Baroness Blixen Finecke

7. Book III of one of this man's great works inspired Jeremy Bentham to utilitarianism, and this man himself reworked that Book III into An Enquiry Concerning the Principles of Morals. Combining the ideas of Locke and

Newton, he began his investigations into how the mind gains knowledge in the work to which that famous Book III belongs, A Treatise on Human Nature. FTP, name the skeptical Scottish philosopher, whose studies were presented most famously in An Enquiry Concerning Human Understanding..

David Hume

8. Caused by a defect in the phenylalanine_tyrosine metabolism, the mutation results in the synthesis of inactive enzymes. In plants this condition is always fatal, while in animals it usually just shortens their life span and causes red coloration in the eyes, as well as its better known effect. FTP, name the condition, which due to a lack of melanin, causes an absence of natural coloration.

albinism or _albino_

9. Its lowest point is only 97 meters high, but its highest point, Kula Kangri, is more than 7,500 meters high. The Chhukha Hydel project, the largest single investment in this country, harnesses the waters of the Raidak River, to produce power. Surplus power goes to its large southern neighbor, from which it received its independence in 1949. FTP, name this country, Land of the Thunder Dragon, whose official language is Dzongkha, whose capital is Thimphu, and whose large southern neighbor is India.

Bhutan

10. King Baldwin II became the first protector of this group, giving them a place to stay. Formed in 1119 by Hugh de Payens, the group's population soared because of St. Bernard of Clairvaux's propaganda. Their popularity meant that they received donations of money and land from all of Europe, and it is possible that their wealth led to their persecution in the early 14th century. FTP, name this group of knights, essentially eradicated by Philip the 4th starting in 1307, whose name was derived from the holy building in Jerusalem where they originally stayed.

The (Knights) _Templar_s

11. In 1989, he won the CMA Horizon Award, in 1991 he married Lisa Hartman, and in 1993 he released his third album, The Hard Way. His first album, Killing Time, was the first album in country music to have five consecutive #1 singles. His latest album, D'lectrified, features no electrical instruments. FTP, name this harmonica_playing, song_writing Texan that sings such hits as "Summer's A_coming," "No Time To Kill," "Like The Rain," and "Better Man."

Clint Black

12. It allowed for other rulings such as Abington v. Schempp and paved the way for the Lemon Test. Though a group in New Hyde Park was the specific target of this case, actions mandated by the State Board of Regents of New York were at issue. Justice Black, writing the majority opinion, sided with those who quoted Thomas Jefferson's "wall of separation" metaphor in defense. FTP, name this case which determined the constitutionality of prayer in public schools in 1962.

Engel v. Vitale

13. Bored with school, he quit in 1830 and married Isabella Shawe. As a writer under the pseudonyms of Mr. Michael Angelo Titmarsh, Fitz_Boodle, and The Fat Contributor, he started The Cornhill Magazine in 1860 and quarreled with Dickens in the "Garrick Club Affair." FTP, name this author, who brought us the novel The History of Henry Esmond and the character Becky Sharp.

William Makepeace Thackery

14. Said to be founded by one called Frauenlob, the Tabulatar was long their set of guidelines, though Hans Folz eventually instituted an easing of restrictions. Passing through for grades from Schuler to Dichter, one "graduated" by having the Merkern approve a Bar_form song he composed himself for competition. Popularized by an 1868 Wagner opera, these are, FTP, what members of German city guilds in the 15th and 16th Centuries, whose teachers

claimed artistic descent from the courtly minnesingers.

_meistersinger_s (accept: _singschulen_; prompt on _master singers_; do not accept _minnesinger_s)

15. This man drew up the edict "Henotikon" with the support of the emperor Zeno in 482. His work was widely accepted in the East, but to Rome and the Western church, it was unacceptable, as the author ignored some of the findings of the Council of Chalcedon. Pope Felix III excommunicated first this man, and later his accomplices. FTP, what Byzantine patriarch was the cause of the first schism between the Eastern and Western Christian church, a schism that was named for him?

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_Acacius_ (uh_KAY_shus)
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16. The active ingredient in this concoction is the chemical cantharidin. In the beetles of Family Meloidae who produce it, it is a defensive chemical. However, if consumed by humans, it causes an irritation in the urinary tract as it is being excreted, leading to an altogether different sensation. FTP, give the common name for this substance, also the common name of the European insect that produces the major component of this aphrodesiac.

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_Spanish Fly_
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17. This American actress was born in Tokyo on July 1, 1916. While she had a long_running feud with sister Joan Fontaine, and won Oscars for Best Actress in The Heiress and in To Each his Own, she is probably best known for playing Melanie in 1939, a role that won her a Best Supporting Actress nomination, though she lost to co_star Hattie McDaniel. FTP, name the sole surviving principle cast member of the Best Film of 1939, Gone With the Wind.

Olivia _de Havilland_

18. The seat of Dallas County, it originally called Moore's Bluff or Landing, but was renamed after its incorporation from the title of an Ossian poem. The era of mayor Joe Smitherman, in office since the 1950s, has seen many changes, but it was the beating death of James Reeb, a Boston Unitarian, that led to its most famous event. FTP, from what southern Alabama city did thousands, demanding racial equality, march 50 miles to Montgomery?

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Selma, Alabama
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19. Mnesilochus disguises himself as a woman in order to help defend his son_in_law against the charges of the title characters. The manner in which Mnesilochus is detected by those characters and the various attempts made by his son_in_law, Euripdes, to help him makes this play highly comedic. FTP, name this play about the titular gathering of Athenian women to celebrate the Eleusinian mysteries, a play by Aristophanes.

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Thesmophoriazusae or The Women at the Festival of Demeter or Women at the Thesmophoria
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20. It is surrounded by Mounts Townsend, Twynam, North Ramshead, and Carruthers, all of which exceed 7,000 feet. Along with these peaks, its melting snows feed others rivers and reservoirs that constitute the Snowy Mountains Hydroelectric Scheme. Located near the Pilot, source of the Murray River, this is, FTP, what mountain, named after a Polish patriot, the highest peak in Australia.

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Mount Kosciusko
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21. Nicknamed "Lackland" by his father, he was given lordship of Ireland in and the earldom of Gloucester instead of land. He tried to take control of England when his brother was imprisoned in Germany but in the end was banished. Only after his nephew Arthur was turned over to Philip II of France did his brother Richard recognize him as heir. FTP, name this youngest son of Henry II, a man who, as king, was forced by Pope Innocent III to accept Stephen Langton as Archbishop of Canterbury.

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John of England (accept: John I )
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22. Recited in the Esaglia during every new year festival, this poem tells the story of its central character's rise to

become the god of 50 names. It also relates Apsu's death at the hands of Ea, and how Apsu's widow remarries and starts a war. The sky god Anu tries to subdue, but only the central character was powerful enough to overcome her. Dating from the time of Nebuchadrezzar I, this is, FTP, what Mesopotamian creation myth, featuring the struggles of Marduk?

Enuma elish or _When on high_

23. Be careful when handling these animals they are common carriers of leprosy! This creature belongs to the Order Xenarthra (zen_ARTH_ruh) and the Family Dasypodidae (das_ih_PAH_dih_day). Unique among mammals, all of its offspring are born as identical quadruplets. It will also not live where there is not diggable soil. FTP, name this creature, species Dasypus, whose nine_banded kind is often found dead on the roads of Texas, where it is the state animal.

Armadillo

24. Its origin is often credited to sage_queen Lei_zu, who formalized the practices of sericulture. It had spread through Asia by the 1st Century BCE, but it wasn't until 550 AD that Justinian I bribed two Persian monks to bring back in their staffs the means of production, leading to most of Europe being introduced to this material. FTP, name this animal-produced fabric, originating in China, that was the source of so much caravan traffic that it had a trade route named after it.

silk

25. In 1997, this state's electric chair became a center of controversy after flames burst from the head of convict Pedro Medina. Last month, it had 13-year-old Lionel Tate convicted of first degree murder. Joe Carollo survived a voting scandal to become mayor of one of its largest cities. Clearly, Attorney General Bob Butterworth has a lot to be concerned about besides recent high-profile legal battles. FTP, name this state, containing Duval, Seminole and Broward counties.

Florida

26. If this title had existed before 1977, both John C. Calhoun and Andrew Johnson would have been recipients. The title was created in response to Herbert H. Humphrey winning a U.S. Senate seat in 1970. It is bestowed upon a senator who was a former president or vice_president. FTP, name this superfluous title, similar to the title of the fourth person in line of the succession to the presidency.

Deputy President Pro Tempore (prompt on President Pro Tempore)

27. Now that it is established, scientists believe that it has been over_wintering in Culex pipiens and the common house sparrow. First noticed because of its toll on the crow population, it was originally thought to be the St. Louis variety. It affected 69 people – killing seven – during its first appearance in 1999, despite heavy spraying. FTP, name this newly-introduced type of mosquito-borne encephalitis that showed up in New York City, far removed from the African region for which it is named.

West Nile Virus or Fever or Encephalitis

28. This artist was heavily influenced by the Precisionist painters Charles Sheeler, and Charles Demuth, but became distinguished by an ability to invest bimorphic forms with a life of their own. A teacher in southern colleges from 1912 to 1916, who lived for a time in the southwest, this artist's big break came when Alfred Stieglitz discovered and promoted her drawings. He also took a notable series of photographs of her. FTP, name this American artist who is best_known for her perspective_less southwest landscapes such as Cow's Skull, Red, White and Blue.

Georgia O'Keeffe

29. Its most famous Editor_in_Chief took his job's tradition of long lunch hours to the extreme, as the plaque on his desk refers to him as "Missing, Presumed Fed." The new restaurant critic strikes most people as rather eccentric, and has a penchant for going to college fraternity parties and laughing at the astrophysics majors. The book itself is actually just a small electronic console with the words "Don't Panic" on the cover in big, friendly letters. FTP, name this handbook, which annually outsells the far inferior Encyclopedia Galactica.

The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy

30. Written under the pseudonym Alcofribas Nasier, it features the character Panurge, who attends the University of Paris. Throughout this five story saga, the protagonist goes on a journey from Paris to the Fountain of Youth in Cathay for answers to life's meaning. At Cathay, the only answer he receives is the word "Drink!" FTP, name this collection of stories named after a father and son pair by François Rabelais.

Gargantua and Pantagruel

31. Aimé Césaire's version of this play transfers it to the Caribbean, and turns the two principal servants into mulatto slaves to discuss racism. Whether the main character still inherits his powers from the Sycorax is unknown, though the rest of the cast Adrian, Francisco, Trinculo, Alonso and Ferdinand, among others remain essentially the same. FTP, name this Shakespearean island play, featuring Miranda and her father, the exiled Duke of Milan, Propsero.

The _Tempest_

32. This team couldn't even stay in their first league for a full year, forfeiting their franchise in the American Football League in 1960. It joined the NFL later that year. Despite such unpleasant beginnings, only the Dallas Cowboys have had more playoff appearances in their franchise history, and the team managed to win berths in Super Bowls IV, VIII, IX, XI. 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
