1. The petitioners in this case included Michael Vignera, Carl Calvin Westover, and Roy Allen Stewart. In his majority opinion, Earl Warren quoted from *Brown v. Walker, Weems v. United States*, and *Escobedo v. Illinois*, as well as the 1962 book *Criminal Investigation and Confessions*. For 10 points—name this 1966 case in which the Supreme Court established guidelines to ensure that arrested persons are informed of their right against self-incrimination.

answer: Miranda v. Arizona

2. He planned to compose an opera based on "The Fall of the House of Usher," but he never completed it. He wrote several works of music criticism under the name Monsieur Croche, claimed that Poe's work haunted his single opera, "Pelléas et Mélisande," and, in an attempt to amuse his daughter, wrote the piano suite "The Children's Corner." For 10 points—name this French composer of "La Mer."

answer: Claude(-Achille) <u>Debussy</u>

3. Osteogenesis imperfecta and Ehlers-Danlos syndrome are diseases of this group of proteins. They are triple helices where every third amino acid in a strand is glycine. They contain quantities of hydroxylysine and hydroxyproline, two amino acids rarely found elsewhere. For 10 points—what is this family of connective tissue proteins converted upon boiling to gelatin?

answer: <u>collagen</u>

4. In Tom Clancy's *The Hunt For Red October*, Jack Ryan quotes from this poem when he hands over the keys to the nuclear missiles. It was inspired by the Greek historian Diodorus Siculus, in his description of a mortuary temple complex. For 10 points—name identify this poem whose title is a corruption of the prenomen of Rameses II, a Percy Bysshe Shelley work that includes the line "Look on my works, ye mighty, and despair!"

answer: Ozymandias

5. Offshore Flo, the New England diner owner; the superhero Obviousman; Homer, the reluctant soul; and Danae, the wise six-year old, are all characters in, for 10 points what Wiley Miller comic strip named for a French phrase meaning "it does not follow"?

answer: Non Sequitur

6. South Africa has negotiated a broad exemption from them, while Canada, Mexico, Israel, and Jordan are exempt. They have caused Brazil to demand compensation for lost export revenue. They were created under the "safeguard" rules of the WTO; the EU claims the necessary conditions have not been met, and is threatening retaliation. For 10 points—new tariffs on what commodity have been interpreted as an attempt by Republicans to make political gains in the Rust Belt?

answer: steel tariffs

7. The Huffman-Krätschmer technique is used to produce them. Occurring naturally in meteorites and in red giant stars, they rotate at a rate of over one hundred million times per second, and can withstand collisions with stainless steel plates at speeds of over 15,000 miles per hour. For 10 points—identify this form of carbon, of which the most common is C60.

answer: <u>fullerenes</u> (accept <u>buckyballs</u> until "carbon," after which prompt)

8. As a poet, he was called "a weak imitator of Byron" by the governor of Odessa. After the supression of the Decembrist uprising, Nicholas I allowed him to return to Moscow and promised to personally censor his work, a curse in disguise. Among his "little tragedies" are "Mozart and Salieri" and "The Stone Guest." For 10 points—name this nineteenth-century Russian author of *Boris Godunov* and *Yevgeny Onegin*.

answer: Aleksandr Pushkin

9. In this battle, the Union forces sustained casualties of 13,000 men, while the Confederates lost only 2,500. Many of the Union casualties came during an attack near the Bethesda Church on June 3, an attack that Ulysses S. Grant would later write was the only one he ever regretted. For 10 points—name this 1864 Robert E. Lee victory, the last major battle of the Overland campaign.

answer: The second battle of Cold Harbor

10. It does not concern itself with consequences but only with actions themselves. Suicide, false promises and masturbation are exceptionally immoral according to this maxim. It is distinguished from the hypothetical type in "Grounding for the Metaphysics of Morals." For 10 points—name this generative moral principle, one statement of which is "treat everyone as an end, not merely as a means," the basis of Kant's ethics.

answer: categorical imperative

Marcel Mauss wrote about this sort of social relation, citing the Melanesian kula and other less hostile versions, and stressed social rather than economic aspects of it. For 10 points—name this sort of social interaction that sociologists still study during Christmastime and other holiday periods.

answer: gift giving (accept gift exchange)

13. The length of its coastline is comparable to the circumference of the Earth. Its parliament is the Landsting, which administers the home rule granted in 1979. The only regular commercial flights to this island originate from Copenhagen and Rejkavijk. For 10 points—identify this part of the Kingdom of Denmark, the world's largest island.

answer: Greenland (or Kalaallit Nunaat)

14. The wife says that she doesn't know how her husband died. The bandit claims that the woman was willing and that she told him to kill her husband. The woodcutter says that the woman prodded the bandit and her husband into a duel. The dead samurai claims that he committed suicide. Different versions of the story are related in the shadow of a ruined gate in, for 10 points, what Akira Kurosawa classic?

answer: Rashomon

15. A chrono-synclastic infundibulum smears Winston Niles Rumfoord across time, making him appear periodically in various locations in the solar system. It also lets him see time as a whole, allowing him to predict miracles for the Church of God the Utterly Indifferent. It turns out that the purpose of human civilization was to deliver a replacement part for a spaceship to a moon of

Saturn. For 10 points—name this Vonnegut novel, whose title refers to statues in a pool on that moon.

answer: The Sirens of Titan

16. The group with this name is the only group with eight elements that is not a nontrivial semidirect product. As an algebra, its center is isomorphic to the reals. The unit ones are isomorphic to SU(2) [S-U-2], which makes them useful for computing three-dimensional rotations. For 10 points—identify this algebra, famous for having its fundamental relationships inscribed on a Dublin bridge by William Hamilton.

answer: quaternions

17. He was pierced through with spears by four soldiers after converting the wife and son of King Misdai. Previously, he had been imprisoned by King Gundafor, who had given him money to build a palace, because he gave this money to the poor. However, he is best known for his role in the Gospel of John, where he asks to see the wounds from the Crucifixion before he will believe in the Resurrection. For 10 points—name this "doubting" apostle.

answer: Thomas

18. In the funniest scene in the novel, the protagonist dresses up in a bear suit to save Alice and Duncan from the evil Magua. After the Hurons massacre a group of people leaving Fort William Henry, a chase through the woods ensues, and the novel ends with the death of Cora Munro. For 10 points—name this second of the Leatherstocking Tales, whose title character is Uncas, the son of Chingachgook.

answer: The Last of the Mohicans

19. In the second episode, Hannah and Elijah Wood clean up when Lola, the bulldog, has an accident. Slightly more interesting segments include an appearance on TRL and Jack's family confronting him about his pot use. In the fourth episode, Sharon throws a ham over the fence while blasting Black Sabbath to get their neighbors to turn down their music. For 10 points—name this MTV show about the life of Ozzy's family.

answer: The Osbournes

20. Two of his titles were Bishop of Autun and Prince of Benevento. He lost the first title after being excommunicated by the pope in 1790, and after being expelled from France, he was forced

to live in the U.S. from 1794 to 1796. Upon his return, his paper stating that France should concentrate on Africa because it could not regain its American colonies got him his best-known job. For 10 points—name this foreign minister in the Directory, under Napoleon, and under Louis XVIII.


