It can be a hyaline degeneration, in which normal tissue is replaced with a transparent substance, or it can be the deposition of fat and calcification, depending upon the size of the vessel in which it takes place. Calcium channel blockers and anticoagulants are some of drugs used to treat this condition that causes the heart to work harder than normal. For 10 points—name this hardening of the arteries.

ANSWER: arteriosclerosis (prompt on "atherosclerosis")

Ernest Hemingway's *The Torrents of Spring* was intended as a parody of one of this man's novels. Although he wrote novels such as *Dark Laughter*, *Windy McPherson's Son*, and *Beyond Desire*, he is better known for stories such as those found in *Horses and Men* and *Triumph of the Egg*. For 10 points—who created the teenage journalist George Willard in *Winesburg*, *Ohio*?

ANSWER: Sherwood Anderson

He was born into the royal clan of the Thembu people and was originally prepared for the chieftainship. Although he started out as a peaceful advocate, he was implicated by evidence in a raid on the Rivonia farm, which linked him to the Umkonto We Sizwe, a new military wing that he organized after the Sharpeville Massacre. For 10 points—name this man imprisoned for almost three decades for his role with the African National Congress.

ANSWER: Nelson Mandela

The 11/4 time signature was invented for the final measure of "Mysterious Circles of Adolescents" and its composer later described the dancers at its memorable first performance "a group of knock-kneed and long-braided Lolitas jumping up and down." In 1913, Pierre Monteux managed to finish conducting it, but not before a full-scale riot broke out the Théâtre des Champs-Élysées. For 10 points—name this ballet in which a pagan girl dances herself to death, choreographed by Nijinsky, commissioned by Diaghilev, and written by Stravinsky.

ANSWER: The Rite of Spring (accept whatever the hell its non-English names are)

It includes a satirical look at the "Querelle des Femmes," a heated philosophical dispute in France on the difference of the sexes. That occurs, along with a request that the reader not laugh until the 78th book, in a volume dedicated to Margaret, Queen of Navarre. The Third Book is where the Woman Question is cast in terms of whether or not the Panurge should marry. For 10 points—name this work, in which a demon of thirst and his giant father are the title characters created by Francois Rabelais.

ANSWER: Gargantua and Pantagruel

His writings include imaginary characters named Eusebius and Florestan who represent the opposing introverted and extroverted sides of his nature and the "League of David," who fight against musical "Philistines." All three appear in his piano suite *Carnival*, while other piano works include the *Abegg Variations* and *Kriesleriana* [kreyes-ler-YAH-na]. For 10 points—name this composer noted for his lieder and not just the *Spring* and *Rhenish* symphonies.

ANSWER: Robert Schumann

He wrote a critical work, John Wester and the Elizabethan Drama, and made Elizabethan drama his special study at King's College, Cambridge. With Harold Monro, he planned the anthology Georgian Poetry, but he later died of septicaemia on the island of Scyros. For 10 points—name this poet, who died in World War I before the publication of 1914 and Other Poems.

ANSWER: Rupert Brooke

His World War I military experience included being wounded in the buttocks by trench mortars in 1917. Returning to his job as a newspaper publisher, he joined other war veterans in founding a nationalist movement that took as its symbol a bundle of rods tied together around an ax that was once a Roman symbol of power. For 10 points—name this Fascist dictator known as *Il Duce* to Italians. ANSWER: Benito Mussolini

He took a family name meaning "Abundant Provider" and was given a name meaning "Wealth of the Nation" when he was deified after his death. He created laws barring social mobility in order to prevent rivals like himself, who had risen up from being the son of a peasant. He was made a Shinto deity shortly after his death, which came as he was preparing to invade Korea. For 10 points—name this man who continued to drive to Japanese unification begun by Oda Nobunga.

ANSWER: Toyotomi Hideyoshi

After the title character's father, Seabrook, dies, the title character becomes aimless, drifting from Cornwall to Greece before dying in World War I. Based on the author's brother, Thoby, the title character is portrayed mainly through the observations of other characters. For 10 points—name this work, which makes heavy use of stream-of-consciousness and interior monologue, a character study of Mr. Flanders, the third novel by Virginia Woolf.

ANSWER: Jacob's Room

It was also known as the Transcontinental Treaty because it created a boundary all the way to the Pacific. Negotiated out of fear that an invasion was presaged by the capture of several forts by Andrew Jackson in 1818, it included giving up claims to the Pacific Northwest and ceding Florida to the U.S. For 10 points—name this treaty negotiated by James Monroe's secretary of state and the Spanish minister to America. ANSWER: Adams-Onís Treaty

Its first symptom is a skin lesion called erythema chronicum migrans, which normally arises in the summer. Associated with *Borrelia burgdorferi*, a spirochete, it is transmitted by a member of the Ixodidae family. It has flu-like symptoms and can result in meningitis and encephalitis. Although prevalent in northern California and Oregon, it was first diagnosed in Connecticut. For 10 points—name this disease transmitted by deer ticks.

ANSWER: Lyme disease

Its operations are usually labeled as Right-Insert, Right-Delete, Left-Insert, Left-Delete, and Empty. It has two ends, usually called the "right" and the "left," and insertion and deletion can occur at either end. For 10 points—name this abstract data type, which can function as a stack or as a queue in either direction. ANSWER: deque /deck/ or double ended queue
