Round 5 - Old Maryland people

1. In this country's first World Cup appearance in 1954, it defeated Korea 7-0 before losing twice to eventual champion West Germany, a harbinger of things to come. After that, this nation didn't do much on the international scene until 2000, when it reached the quarterfinals of the European Championships, and its biggest club, Galatasaray [ga-la-TAS-uh-rye], won the UEFA [yoo-EH-fuh] Cup. FTP, name this country which beat both Japan and South Korea in the 2002 World Cup, but lost twice to eventual champion Brazil.

Answer: Turkey

2. She made her feature film debut as "Southern Lady" in 2002's *Martin & Orloff*, which also starred the Upright Citizens Brigade. After graduating from the University of Virginia in 1992, she went to Chicago to join the Second City group, where she met her future husband, director Jeff Richmond. She has also written for *The Colin Quinn Show* and performed a critically-acclaimed stage show with Rachel Dratch. FTP, name this first female head writer in *Saturday Night Live* history and current Weekend Update co-anchor.

Answer: Tina Fey

3. With only guitarist Adrian Vandenberg and its lead singer remaining from its previous incarnation, this band reunited in 1997, but their album *Restless Heart* wasn't even released in the U.S. Formed around 1977 by a former Deep Purple vocalist, their better-known albums include *Trouble*, *Ready an' Willing*, *Saints & Sinners*, and *Slide It In*. FTP, name this David Coverdale-fronted hair-metal band, whose best-known songs include "Fool For You Loving", "Still of the Night", "Is This Love", and "Here I Go Again".

Answer: Whitesnake

4. "Three Leaf Clover", "Tidal Wave", "Buddha's Revenge", "Round the Corner", "Kwijibo", "The Forward Pass", "The Buzz Saw", "Hop the Fence", "Over the Falls", "Rocking the Baby", "The Creeper", "Around the World", and "Walk the Dog". FAQTP, these are just a few of the tricks that can be performed with what device, most famously manufactured by the Duncan Company?

Answer: Yo-yo

5. Invented in 1965 by Dr. Dana Shires and Dr. Robert Cade, after its invention, the football team for which it was invented would outplay its opponents in the second half, even in conditions that would make a salamander sweat. It played a crucial role in the improvement and eventual Orange Bowl success of the University of Florida. Thus explains Keith Jackson in the latest commercial for, FTP, what sports drink?

6. She wears a braided chain made from the finest silver north of Spain, with a locket that bears the name of the man she loves. He was assisted in his investigations by LAPD cop Adam Tobias, played by Robert Reed, and his frequently-kidnapped secretary, Peggy Fair. FTP, name this title character of a CBS show that aired from 1967 to 1975, played by Mike Connors.

10. A four-time PGA tour winner as of July 11, 2002, he putts left- or right-handed, depending on the break of the putt. His grandfather was one of the 375 Navajo code talkers employed by the U.S. military during World War II. FTP, name this most successful Native American golfer in PGA history, who is perhaps best-remembered for being Tiger Woods' roommate at Stanford.

Answer: Notah Begay III

11. Lesser-known tracks on this album include "Which One of Them", "Cold Shoulder", "In Lonesome Dove", and "Burning Bridges". The first country album to debut at No. 1 on the pop charts, it was the followup to another record-setting album, *No Fences*. FTP, name this 1991 album that added "Papa Loved Mama", "The River", "What She's Doing Now", and "Shameless" to Garth Brooks' list of chart-toppers.

Answer: Ropin' the Wind

12. He looks exactly like Abraham Lincoln. He's been struck by lightning six times. He believes Al Gore was the best Vice President this country has ever had. He enjoys gambling while wearing his lucky shrimp costume. He owns a complete set of Mickey Mantle's toenails. He's a fan of the nation of Tonga. And he has a corn on his foot that resembles Shelley Fabares. Or so he claims, if he even exists. FTP, name this possible alter ego of Jerry Seinfeld, whose dozens of letters to corporations and public officials are collected in the 1997 book *Letters from a Nut*.

Answer: Ted L. Nancy

13. Born in Redwood City, California, she made her TV debut as a contestant on *The Price is Right*, taking home a fireplace. After making her movie debut in *Good Burger*, she appeared in forgettable films like *Dead Man on Campus*, *Dying to Live*, and the Dee Snider vehicle *Strangeland*, but her best-known film role before this year was probably Ali Larter's stepdaughter in *Legally Blonde*. She is currently dating her former TV co-star, Jason Segel. FTP, name this actress who played Lindsay on *Freaks and Geeks*, but is unfortunately best known as Velma in 2002's *Scooby-Doo*.

Answer: Linda Cardellini

14. He named his bulldog, once a prize stud, after Art Shamsky of the Miracle Mets. In one episode, he foiled a burglar by throwing a hot pizza in his face, perhaps his finest moment as a police officer, as opposed to when he was hurt by a bull in the line of duty. Far from a success with women, and often moving in and out of his parents' place, FTP, identify this giant older brother on *Everybody Loves Raymond*, played by Brad Garrett.

15. He averaged 20 points per game in three seasons with PAOK of the Greek Professional League before signing with his current team, which had selected him with the 14th overall pick in the 1996 draft. His scoring average has increased each of his four NBA seasons to 21.2 in 2001-02, when he was selected as an All-Star for the first time. Unfortunately for him and his team, he injured his ankle at the worst possible time, causing him to miss the first four games of the Western Conference finals. Born on the mountain formed by the death of Lews Therin during the last battle of the siege of Tar Valon, he is found by the second Companion of the King of Illian, and taken home to the Two Rivers. There, he is raised as a farmer, not knowing of his birthright as son of the missing Daughter-Heir of Andor, nor of his ability to wield saidin, the male half of the True Source. FTP, name this hero of Robert Jordan's Wheel of Time series.

18. Founded in 1984, it released its first single that same year, L.L. Cool J's "I Need a Beat." Co-founder Rick Rubin left in 1990 to form his own label in Los Angeles, while three years later Polygram bought a 60 percent share, eventually merging it with Island Records. Subsidiaries include Roc-a-Fella Records and the producer Irv Gotti's effort, Murder Inc. FTP, identify the record label of Method Man and Ludacris, forever linked with its other co-founder, Russell Simmons.
