1.)Gannymede and Aliena buy a sheep farm from Corin and take up quiet lives as shepherds. Oliver de Boys is sent by Frederick to look for his missing brother. Along the way, he meets and falls in love with Aliena. FTP, all of these happen in what Shakespeare comedy that takes place in the Forest of Arden and stars Orlando and Rosalind?

ANSWER: As You Like It

2.) They are formed of undulating collagen fibers that run in parallel to each other and are tightly packed together. Some of them are round and some are flattened, but they all lack elasticity. They get strained, not sprained, and one disease of them, de Quervain's syndrome, can be treated with cortisone injections and immobilization. FTP, name this type of tissue which connects muscle to bone, the most famous of which is the Achilles in the heel.

ANSWER: Tendon

- 3.)Nothing remains of this ancient city at its original location. It was an important religious and political center until about 330 B.C, with important monuments including the temple of Ptah, palace of Apries, and two huge statues of Ramses II. King Menes founded the city and made it his capital around 3100 B.C. FTP, name this city, near which the pyramids at Giza and Sakkara stand as reminders of its past glory.
- 4.)Its first movement was longer than any other previously composed, and the Development was one hundred bars longer, featuring a stretch of off-beat accents on a dissonant harmony. In the Recapitulation, one horn announces the return 4 bars too early, and the Coda is almost as long as the first movement. FTP, name this symphony, to whom Beethoven originally dedicated to Napoleon. ANSWER: Symphony No. 3 (accept Eroica)
- 5.)He was born around 1618 in County Clare, and spent most of his early life in England. He was an officer in the Cromwellian army, probably doing espionage during the Civil War. After the restoration his lands were confiscated, he began a career of skullduggery that included two attempts to kidnap the Duke of Osmond and a daring rescue of his friend Captain Mason. FTP, name this Irish adventurer, most famous for his failed attempt to steal the Crown Jewels.

ANSWER: Thomas Blood

6.)In 1536, Gonzalo Jiménez de Quesada ascended the Magdalena River, subdued the

Chibcha, and named it a kingdom. In 1538, Santa Fé was founded, and this was named a presidency in 1564. Disputes with Lima in 1717 led to the creation of this viceroyalty comprising Colombia, Ecuador, Panama, and Venezuela; and in 1819, it broke away from Spain. FTP, name this former country, named a republic in 1830 after Venezuela and Ecuador seceded, then renamed the Republic of Colombia in 1886.

ANSWER: New Granada

- 7.)He received a Bachelor of Science degree in Aeronautical Engineering from the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, in 1949. As a B-25 pilot with the 340th Bombardment Group, he flew 56 combat missions in Europe. In November 1963, he resigned his commission as an Air Force Major to assume the role of Director of Flight Crew Operations. FTP, name this man who was one of the original Mercury Astronauts, but did not go into space until the Apollo Program due to a heart condition. ANSWER: Donald "Deke" Slayton
- 8.) Rising in Las Animas County, in the 1800s, the south side of its valley was followed by pioneers heading west on the Fort Smith-Santa Fe Trail. The largest lake in Oklahoma, the Eufaula Reservoir, is formed near its confluence with the Arkansas River, and in north Texas, it is part of the Lake Meredith National Recreation Area. FTP, name this 906-mile-long river, that flows just north of Amarillo and just south of Oklahoma City, an despite its name, is located in the US.

ANSWER: Canadian River

9.)In this philosophy, thought is considered an instrument for achieving a human organism's life aims, and has no metaphysical significance. Its principles were first developed by C.S. Peirce around 1878. Other proponents have included Richard Rorty, William James, and John Dewey. FTP, name this philosophy in which the truth of a proposition is measured by its correspondence with experimental results and by its practical outcome.

ANSWER: pragmatism

10.)Supply and demand are completely independent of each other, and value will be the actual price after an adjustment period. Pioneered in the late 19th century by Neoclassicists, including Walras, Jevons, and Menger; it developed out of Ricardo's theory of rent, and asserts that increasing cost industries were the norm. FTP, name this economic theory that explains why our 20th beer of the evening brings less pleasure than the 19th.

ANSWER: Marginal Theory of Value

11.)Also called the Kipchak Khanate, it had its capital first at Sarai Batu near Astrakhan on the lower Volga, and later at Sarai Berke on the Volga near present-day Volgograd. In the early 14th century this empire adopted Islam as its official religion. FTP, name this empire in Russia established by Batu Kahn and named because of its beautiful tents of the capital city along the Volga River.

ANSWER: Golden Horde

12.)Involving petty intrigues, schemes, deceits, and flirtations, it detailed three social factions, each headed by a royal lady, one of them Catherine de Medici, wife of King Henry II. Unlike other works of the time, it foreshadows the views of the rising bourgeoisie rather than the aristocracy, and extols a view of marriage based on true love. FTP, name this novel by Madame de Lafayette, published in 1678, considered the first great French novel of analysis.

ANSWER: Princess of Cleves

13.) This condition is most often caused by a stroke. When Samuel Johnson suffered attacks of it, he mentally translated prayers into Latin in order to convince himself he wasn't losing his mind. One type originates in Wernicke's area and consists of constant talking that conveys no information; in this type, the ability to understand speech is severely impaired. Another type originates in Broca's area and people with this type are unable to find the words that they want to say. FTP, name this psychological impairment of language.

ANSWER: Aphasia

14.)Examples include Prospector, used to analyze geological data, and Internist, a diagnostic tool. Their basic components are an inference engine, a problem-specific knowledge base, and a user interface. For ten points, what is this type of artificial intelligence program used to solve problems that would ordinarily require a knowledgeable human?

ANSWER: expert system

15.) This relief sits below a free-standing sculpture of its main figure at Or San Michele in Florence. A tree in the background is just barely above the back of the relief. This is the first use ever of *rilievo schiacciato*, in which reliefs are carved very thinly so that they protrude very little. FTP, name this sculpture by Donatello in which the main character kills a mythical beast.

ANSWER: "Saint George and the Dragon"

16.)His incredible vision allowed him to see thousands of *li* away and probe the disguises of demons. His extraordinary hearing picked up everything that came through the wind. A master of transformation, this trickster god accidentally swallowed Wang Mu-yiang's peaches of immortality. Always hungry, he was the first disciple of the Tang priest in *Journey to the West*. FTP, name this Chinese folk deity, whose weapon was a long, magical stick.

Answer: the **Monkey King** or Sün Wu-kong

17.)He was the son of a prosperous German chemical merchant, and worked for his father for a time after his education. His lesser-known work includes studies of fuel cells, the electrolysis of crystalline salts, and free energy measurements. He is infamous for his contributions to chemical warfare-he directed the first large scale use of chlorine gas at Ypres in 1915. FTP, name this chemist best known for his technique for producing ammonia.

ANSWER: Fritz Haber

18.) She looks to school as a deliverance from her life of hardship and abuse, but finds a continuance of her troubles in the lack of food and of adequate clothing, and in her fear of what may be said by the administrator, Mr. Brocklehurst. She finds comfort, however, in her friendships with Helen Burns and with Miss Temple, the superintendent. FTP, who is this heroine who goes on to become a governess and marry Mr. Rochester?

ANSWER: Jane Eyre

19.)He taught at Rostock and Kiel before he became professor of the philosophy of inductive sciences at the University of Vienna. He was influenced by Ludwig Wittgenstein and Rudolf Carnap. His works include _General Theory of Knowledge_ and _Problems of Ethics_. FTP, name this philosopher who was the leader of the Vienna Circle.

ANSWER: Moritz Schlick

20.) This principle shows that the classical voiceless stops (k,t,p) in Latin evolved to voiceless aspirates (h,th,f) in English and mediae (h,d,f) in German, such as the Latin frater, English brother, German Bruder. It shows that a process-the regular shifting of consonants in groups-took place in the development of English and the other Low German languages. FTP, name this law, formulated in 1822 by its namesake, a German better known for his folk tales.

ANSWER: Grimm's Law

- 21.) This political group had called for the Green Bay Packers to be renamed the Six-Packers. Recently they handed out old fur coats to the homeless. The logic the group used in giving the homeless the coats was that the animals were already dead and the homeless needed to be warm. FTP, name this group concerned with the treatment of animals. ANSWER: People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals demonstration (accept PETA)
- 22.)It was first observed by Galileo in 1613, but he believed it to be a star. It was not seen again until it was discovered by Galle and D'Arrest in 1846 based on independent calculations by Adams and Le Verrier. It has only been visited once, by Voyager II, in 1989. FTP, name this planet whose largest moon is Triton.

ANSWER: Neptune

- 23.)On January 11, 1980, the temperature in Great Falls, Montana, rose a record 47 degrees in seven minutes from negative 32 degrees F to 15 degrees F as the result of one of these. When air falls down a mountain, it compresses adiabatically, causing a temperature increase, and often a rapid snowmelt. Known as Chinook winds in Montana and the Santa Ana winds in California, FTP, name these warm, dry winds. ANSWER: Foehn winds (acc. CHINOOK before mentioned)
- 24.)Born on the anarchic Turkana Colony, she and her sister Ishara parted ways when she, at 15, escaped and chose to pursue a career in Starfleet. While participating in a rescue mission on Vagra II in 2364, she was wantonly attacked by Armus, an entity

comprising all the evil impulses of a race of vanished beings, and died, but returned to life in an alternate universe. FTP, name this first security officer of the USS Enterprise-D. ANSWER: Natasha "Tasha" **Yar**

25.)In this short story, an exercise in dialogue, the two main characters remain nameless. They are waiting at a station in the Spanish countryside for a train to Barcelona. While waiting, they sit and drink beers and the man tries to convince the woman that this trip will remove all of the unpleasantness in the relationship. FTP, name this short story by Hemmingway whose title refers to the look of the surrounding area.

ANSWER: "Hills Like White Elephants"

26.)Sony has announced that by the end of 2003, they will use them as field emitters for a flat panel television. In 2001, IBM placed gates on them, making them transistors in the world's most efficient logic circuit. Easy to fabricate from a high voltage discharge in the presence of hydrocarbons, they were not isolated until the 1990s, when their remarkable mechanical and electrical properties quickly made them the object of worldwide research. FTP, what are these narrow, rod-shaped objects?

Answer: Carbon Nanotubes
