## Valencia Fall Invitational 2002 Round 7

Ouestions mostly by CB, with guest appearances by Chip Thomas and various science helpers

1) The only elected office this man held was as an Indiana state representative from Terre Haute in 1885. During that time he was already Grand Secretary of the Brotherhood of Railway Firemen, and eight years later he founded the American Railway Union in Chicago. Jailed for speaking out against American participation in World War I, in 1920 the Socialist Party had buttons made reading "Convict No. 9653 for President." FTP name this firebrand who ran for president five times in the early 1900s.

## A. Eugene V. Debs

2) First, electrons are excited and passed to the primary acceptor on the thylakoid membrane, replaced by water which splits, giving off hydrogen and oxygen. The electrons are then passed along the transport train, creating ATP. The electrons are passed again, this time to the NADP<sup>+</sup> reductase enzyme forming NADPH. The ATP and NADPH are used in the Calvin cycle to turn carbon dioxide into glucose or another organic compound. FTP, name this process that takes place in chloroplasts, which converts light energy into food for plants.

3) His latest literary output is a novella called "Shopgirl." This follows plays like ZigZag Woman, WASP, and the celebrated Picasso at the Lapin Agile, in which a fictional conversation between the painter and Einstein takes place. Two collections of his short works are titled Pure Drivel and Cruel Shoes. FTP name this author better known for his comedy, the man who has hosted "Saturday Night Live" the most times, and whose first film was The Jerk.

4) This structure at birth is dominant, translating a baby's needs into motivational forces, called Triebe (TREE-buh) in the German of its theorizer. This psychic structure works in keeping with the pleasure principle, the demand to immediately fulfill any given need. As humans age, however, this drive is fought more and more by the mores and norms that form the superego. FTP name this part of the unconscious said by Freud to be the repository of all instincts and drives.

5) The fourth title character is the son of Lizavetta, a local woman, who dies in childbirth. That child is taken in by Grigory, the servant of Fyodor, whom most people assume is the child's father. That child, Smerdyakov, eventually grows up to murder Fyodor, trying to pin the crime on Dmitri. FTP such is the happy plot of what fraternal novel by Fyodor Dostoevsky?

## A. The Brothers Karamazov

6) It occurs in regions where the momentum becomes imaginary, resulting in wavefunctions that exponentially grow or decay. Finite barrier width results in a non-zero transmission coefficient, in contradiction to classical physics, which predicts 100% reflection when the potential barrier exceeds the energy of the particle. Used in some types of electron microscopes, FTP particles can leak through barriers in what quantum phenomenon?

### A. quantum tunneling

7) The original, created over 2,500 years ago, is lost, and we know it now by a Roman copy made hundreds of years later. That copy exemplifies the rhythmos and symmetria with which its sculptor endowed it, and is considered superior to copies in the Vatican and British Museum since the figure's head is facing back to his right, in line with the throwing arm. FTP name this sculpture by Myron of an athlete preparing to hurl an object.

8) Historians suspect that their name is an adaptation of the German word Eidgenossen, or "confederates," as it first was used to designate citizens of Geneva who didn't accept the claims of the Duke of Savoy over that city. In the 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> century they were most populous in Southern France, and fear of their influence, and concerns about the accession of Henri IV, led to the St. Bartholomew's Day Massacre. FTP who are these historical protestants of France?

10) This novel has a sequel, *Closing Time*, published in 1994. The protagonist is haunted by the memory of the death of Snowden, who died in his arms. His squadron's mess officer, Milo Minderbinder, makes a fortune on the black market, while his squadron leader, Major Major, will only see people in his office when he's not there. FTP this describes what 1961 novel by Joseph Heller?

### A. Catch-22

11) Last year they went 5-11, their first losing season in 17 years. They joined the NFL in 1961, coached by Norm Van Brocklin, and they first made the playoffs in 1968, then lost to the Chiefs in Super Bowl IV in 1969. They went on to lose three other Super Bowls, all in the 1970s under Bud Grant. Currently led by Mike Tice, FTP name this NFC franchise that employs Daunte Culpepper and Randy Moss.

## A. Minnesota or Vikings

12) Opposed to the classical style taught in the Academy, and drawing inspiration from earlier Flemish landscape painters, this group moved away from Paris and settled itself in the forest of Fountainbleau. The rough brush work of Charles Daubigny (daw-bin-yay) and Theodore Rousseau greatly inspired the impressionist painters who came later in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Also including Camille Corot, FTP what was this loosely organized French school of painters that has nothing to do with being a model or just looking like one?

### A. Barbizon School

13) The speed of light squared times the permeability of free space times the permittivity of free space. 14) The garrison lay at the bottom of a bowl shaped valley and was protected by firebases on nearby

hills named, supposedly, after the mistresses of the garrison commander, Christian de Castries (castree-ay). The main assault on the garrison began on March 13, and its airstrip was soon destroyed, making resupply nearly impossible, though two American civilian pilots were killed trying to parachute in materials, becoming the first Americans to die in Vietnam. FTP name this French outpost which was overrun by the Viet Cong in 1954, ending French power in Indochina.

## A. Dien Bien Phu

15) The protagonist of this short story is named for a Mississippi colonel under whom his father briefly served in the Civil War. That father, Abner, harbors a nasty grudge against those he feels snub him, often leading him and his other son Flem to set fire to their stores of grain and livestock. FTP name this short story featuring Sarty Snopes and written by William Faulkner, the title of which refers to Ab's pyromaniac tendencies.

# A. "Barn Burning"

16) Standing 630 feet tall, there are 1076 steps to reach its top, though the steps are restricted to maintenance personnel; visitors must ride one of two trams. The focal point of the Jefferson National Expansion Memorial, at its western end lies the Museum of Westward Expansion. Designed by Eero Saarinen as a large catenary curve, FTP this is what dominant figure of St. Louis's skyline?

### A. Gateway Arch

17) Diseases that afflict it include Algille Syndrome, Carolli Disease, Galactocemia, and Wilson's Disease. When a physician takes a biopsy from this organ, the patient must hold his breath for ten seconds to keep still, so the doctor doesn't nick the gall bladder or lower lungs. Also affected by various forms of hepatitis, FTP name this organ that develops cirrhosis if you pound drinks for too many years.

18) After routing eleven rival kings who had besieged his court at Caerleon, he defeated the Saxons at Mount Badon. He had been reared by Sir Ector, whom he believed to be his own father, though Ector clearly favored his natural son, Kay. However, Kay lost his sword at a tournament and sent this man to fetch it, thus giving him the chance to prove he was meant to be king. FTP name this man who pulled the sword from the stone, the leader of the Knights of the Round Table.

### A. King Arthur

19) When governed by two officials called shophets or sufets in earlier times, this famous city entertained a gruesome custom: the mass sacrifice of upper-class children to Baal-Ammon in times of public crisis. Founded in 814 BCE by colonists from Tyre, it was burned to the ground in 146, its lands salted and survivors sold into Roman slavery. FTP, the ruins of what "new city" can be found about 10 miles from Tunis, the home city of Dido and Hannibal?

## A. Carthage

20) First published in 1923, the author's key affirmation is "To man the world is twofold, in accordance with his twofold attitude." Strongly influenced by the author's reading of Kierkegaard in German translation, it argues that the title concept comes in three spheres: man's life with nature, with men, and with intelligible forms. FTP name this work that also examines the "I-it" experience, a book by Martin Buber.
