1. Trained as a pediatric nephrologist and a public health expert, she became a clinical professor of pediatrics at Georgetown University Hospital in 1986, after working in private practice and later in the U.S. Public Health Service. In 1987 she assumed directorial responsibilities at the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development, a position she held until 1990, when she received her most influential assignment. FTP, name this person, the first woman and the first Hispanic to be named Surgeon General of the United States.

5. This musician has sold over 22 million records worldwide since her recording career began with her debut release, "Touch", in 1988. Since then, her work has earned her 3 Grammy Awards, as well as the Elizabeth Cady Stanton Visionary Award for advancing the careers of women in music. FTP, name this musician, whose most recent release, "Afterglow", may reach the popularity of her most successful albums, "Mirrorball" and "Fumbling Towards Ecstasy".

A: Sarah McLachlan

6. Born in France as the only child of a French father and an American mother, he spent his childhood shuttling between the two countries after his parents' divorce. Once he

finally chose between the two, he undertook training to be an actor, which reaped its first rewards when he was cast in "The Pallbearer". His roles after that have made him the favorite of the ladies, such as Sam Coulson in "Never Been Kissed". FTP, name this actor, Agent Michael Vaughn in "Alias".

A: Michael Vartan

7. As a 22 year-old pre-med student, her life looked pretty mapped out. The daughter of immigrants, she grew up in the affluent suburb of Bloomfield Hills, Michigan. Her life changed one day when she decided to make her own cosmetic to match her shoes. FTP, name this entrepreneur, the creator of the shades Urban Decay and Trailer Trash for her cosmetic line "Hard Candy".

A: Dineh Mohajer

8. With features that include beauty secrets, advice columns, and quizzes on things like "Are you dating a Godly guy?", this retrofitted New Testament looks more like a teen magazine than a Bible, but preach it does. In one advice column, the writers advise a girl with a crush to sit back and not do anything, because "God made guys to be the leaders". FTP, name this version of the New Testament.

9. Quote: "He was already kind of hyped up. He kept looking at my breasts, kept asking if I worked out. 10. Warning: Two answers required: Contraceptive questions are de rigeur for packets about women, but here's a twist on that: male contraception. At one point in her career she wrote erotica to order as a result of financial pressures, but gained fame with the release not of her novels or short stories, but instead her diaries in the 1960s. Name this woman, author of the collections "Little Birds" and "Delta of Venus".

12. She is an elementary school teacher in Atlanta who earned degrees in history and literature. She also has volunteered in the cancer and AIDS unit of a research hospital. Somewhere in there, she wrote her first play, which went on to win a Pulitzer Prize in

~~1990~~²⁰⁰⁰ and was then made into an HBO movie starring Emma Thompson. FTP, name the author of "Wit".

A: Margaret Edson

13. This Iowa City, Iowa native became the first woman to compete in a NASCAR Winston Cup event in 1976. She also made history when in 1977 she became the first woman to win a starting spot in the Daytona 500. Name this woman, a pilot, aerospace engineer, and member of the Women's Sports Hall of Fame.

A: Janet Guthrie

14. Labeled alternately as a Realist and a Romantic in style, this artist's subjects are mainly animals, which she studied in slaughterhouses. Her painting "Plowing the Nivernais" won her acclaim at the École des Beaux-Arts in Paris, which she followed up by winning the title of Chevalier of the Legion of Honor in 1865 and was the first woman to receive the Grand Cross of the Legion. FTP, name this woman, who counted Queen Victoria as a patron.

A: Rosa Bonheur

15. With a tailor for a father and a model for a mother, her future in the fashion industry seems obvious in retrospect. She attended the Parson's School of Design and after her second year of study, an internship at Anne Klein turned into a permanent job; she became an associate designer in 1971 and took over the company in 1974. Ten years later she launched her self-named brand, followed a year later by a less expensive line geared for younger buyers. FTP, name this influential designer, the creator of DKNY.

A: Donna Karan

16. This woman is remembered as one of the foremost composition teachers of the 20th century and one of the first female professional conductors. She had been a composer herself until the death of her younger sister Lili, at which point she focused on mentoring other performers and composers, a list which included Aaron Copland, Virgil Thompson, and Elliott Carter. FTP, name this woman, the first to conduct the Royal Philharmonic of London and the Boston Symphony Orchestra.

A: Nadia Boulanger

17. One of the most recognized pieces of feminist art is "The Dinner Party", which has been seen by more than a million people on three continents. It consists of a triangular table set with 39 place settings that commemorate a goddess, historic personage, or other important woman. FTP, identify the creator of this project, a founder of the Feminist Art movement.

A: Judy Chicago

18. Her childhood was marked by constant teasing by neighborhood children because of her red hair and green eyes. The resulting depression forced her to search for an area where she was accepted, which she found in the local clubs. Her unique voice made her the natural lead singer for groups like August 1984, Wild Indians, and Goodbye, Mr.

Mackenzie. It was when she was fronting Angelfish that she caught the eye of a top producer, Butch Vig, who had been looking for a vocalist for a band Steve Marker, Duke Erikson, Daniel Shulman, and he were forming. FTP, name this woman, possibly the coolest female Scottish singer ever and the lead singer of Garbage.

A: Shirley **Manson**

19. John Lee Malvo, one of the alleged D.C. area snipers, acknowledged shooting at least two victims in his interrogation, including this woman, shot October 14, 2002 outside a Home Depot in suburban Falls Church, Virginia. FTP, Malvo is currently on trial for killing what FBI analyst, an intelligence operations specialist in the Cyber Division, who shares a last name with the only person to have signed the Treaty of Alliance, Amity and Commerce with France (1778), the Treaty of Peace between England France, and the United States (1782), the Declaration of Independence, and the Constitution.

A: Linda **Franklin**

20. Established in 1847, this was the first U.S. public university to admit men and women on an equal basis and was the first institution of higher education in the nation to accept creative work in theater, writing, music, and art as theses for advanced degrees. It established the first law school and the first educational radio station west of the Mississippi, broadcast the world's first educational television programs, and developed and continues to hold preeminence in educational testing. You should know all of this about, FTP, what university, whose quiz bowl team is hosting this tournament.

A: The University of **Iowa**

A: Sara Jane Moore

15) According to British intelligence, Saddam Hussein held training camps for female assassins who would pose as belly dancers, actresses and artists who claim to be seeking asylum. F15P, give the code name for these "Mata Hari" hit squads.

A: Operation Falcon

10. "If you want a thing well done, get a couple of old broads to do it." So said this actress, whose career spanned six decades and included films such as "The Man Who Played God" (1932), "Jezebel" (1938), "All About Eve" (1950), and "Whatever Happened to Baby Jane?" (1962). FFP, name this actress, the first female president of the Motion Picture Academy of Arts and Sciences.

The foundation named for Bette Davis presents a Lifetime Achievement Award to "an actor or actress whose work exemplifies the high standards Miss Davis set forth." The first recipient was, FTP, this actress, best known for her film roles in "Out of Africa", "Silkwood", and "The Hours"

A: Meryl Streep

Children of the '80s probably immediately associate Bette Davis with the song Kim Carnes recorded about her eyes. Two other actresses of the silver screen are mentioned in the song. Name one for five points or both for 15.

A: Jean Harlow ("Her hair is Harlow gold, her lips sweet surprise") and Greta Garbo ("She got Greta Garbo's standoff sighs, she's got Bette Davis eyes")

11. Given the show, identify the women's cable network on which the show appears
FTPE:

a) "Mix It Up", a new show from Courteney Cox that assists couples in "mixing it up" by combining divergent tastes into one harmonious home.

A: WE (or Women's Entertainment)

b) "Girls Behaving Badly", a sort of cross between Jackass and Candid Camera where comediennes play pranks on unsuspecting victims.

A: Oxygen

c) "Merge", a new show with Lisa Rinna that helps newlyweds combine their individual styles and belongings into one household.

12. The Church of Christ, Scientist has been criticized virtually since it was founded for its view of religion being a better source of healing than traditional medicine in many (but not all) cases. 13. The WUSA turned out to be a short-lived effort to bring women's soccer to mainstream America. It went bankrupt in late 2003 largely because of its failure to get its hoped-for 8 corporate sponsors, each of which was to have donated \$2.5 million per year. Instead, they only got two sponsors and potentially all the bandages and small cars they could want. Name these F15PE.

A: Hyundai and Johnson & Johnson

14. Brothers can be a mixed blessing. Take, for instance, Mozart's sister. She was five year older than him and was his partner in a piano duo their father took around Europe on tour. When she reached adolescence, their father took her out of the act, seeing that Mozart would be more lucrative as a solo act. Instead of continuing her love of music, his sister was made to marry a man she didn't love. F15P, name her.

A: Maria Anna or Nannerl (also accept Berchtold, her married name)

On the other extreme is the relationship Felix Mendelssohn had with his sister. They challenged each other musically and intellectually, and both of them benefited from it. Felix's sister played a major role in shaping some of his compositions, notably his oratorio St. Paul (1837), and also advised him on musical matters. She went on to write many of her own pieces, that are starting to appear and be appreciated in modern editions. F15P, name Felix Mendelssohn's sister.

A: Fanny (also accept Hensel, her married name)

15. Mary Harris was born the daughter of a tenant farmer in Ireland. The family witnessed the potato famine, which drove them to emigrate to Toronto. Once in Canada, Mary began to experience wanderlust and started traveling around the United States; along the way she met her husband (a foundry worker) and they had four children. After they all died from a yellow fever epidemic, Mary found a new calling as a union activist. FTP, name the common name she donned, today shared by a very liberal magazine.

A: Mother Jones

(20) Upton Sinclair thought so much of her that he included her as a character in one of his books. He described her as "wrinkled and old, dressed in black, looking like somebody's grandmother; she was, in truth, the grandmother of hundreds of thousands...". Name this book.

A: The Coal War

16. Saturday Night Live has long been a boy's club with a few women tossed in, some being more memorable than others.

10) This woman was one of the original cast members and stayed for five years despite being repeatedly called an "ignorant slut" on the air.

A: Jane Curtain

10) This woman also lasted for five years, only to leave due to the controversial episode with Sinead O'Connor and Andrew Dice Clay. Since the show she's had small roles in a variety of films, such as Zoolander, Bulworth, and Three Kings.

A: Nora Dunn

10) She was the first female head writer in the show's history. Anyone who says they don't like her cat-eye glasses is a liar.

A: Tina Fey

17. The winner of the 2003 Nobel Peace Prize was not Pope John Paul II, as many had expected, but instead this woman, a champion for democracy and the rights of women and children in her home country of Iran. FTPE, identify the prize recipient, a former judge known and admired for her defense in court of victims of hard-liners.

18. Sofia Coppola has done an impressive job redeeming herself after her widely panned performance in "The Godfather: Part III". Answer these questions about her career FTPE:

b) Her previous movie writing and directing effort was this 1999 movie, based off a Jeffrey Eugenides novel.

c) Coppola also got writing credits on this UPN TV series, which shows the problems two brothers experience while running a hip-hop/rap label in New York.
