1. The majority opinion cited, among others, *Griswold v. Connecticut* and *Eisenstadt v. Baird* as decisions establishing and strengthening the right to privacy. It also rejected an earlier court's reasoning that "proscriptions have ancient roots," while in his dissent, Antonin Scalia claimed that the court had taken sides in the "culture war." FTP, identify this recent Supreme Court decision which held that states could not criminalize the private conduct of homosexuals, thereby overturning *Bowers v. Hardwick*.

Answer: Lawrence v. Texas

2. This man's tomb is a free-standing structure traditionally called the Tomb of the Mother of Solomon, located at Pasargadae. He succeeded to the throne of Anshan in 559 BCE. He left his general Harpagus to complete the conquest of Anatolia after capturing Sardis, and his general Ugbaru supposedly captured Babylon without a battle. FTP name this man who defeated the Medes to found the Achaemenid Persian empire.

Answer: Cyrus the Great

3. This work discusses the paradigmatic actions of the author's grandson Ernst in his nursery, and compares human instinctual life with the sexual behavior of protozoa. The theory of repetition compulsion is connected with an instinct based on observations of hate and destructiveness. FTP name this work by Freud which introduces the concept of the death instinct, Thanatos, in opposition to the titular concept, called Eros.

Answer: Beyond the Pleasure Principle or Jenseits des Lustprinzips

4. The title discipline comprises, among other things, the moral law, heaven, earth, and method. The author claims to forecast success or failure on the basis of seven criteria, claims that nine types of ground influence the outcome, and counsels that the good commander must know both himself and his enemy. The reader is further advised on being flexible, capturing territory, and strategic and tactical planning, by FTP, what ancient war manual in which every chapter begins, "Sun Tzu said?"

Answer: Art of War

5. The Bell Harry tower was finished in 1498 and was the last element of the rebuilding started by William of Sens in 1175. That was the third cathedral on the site, since in 1067 the one that St. Augustine built burned down. Lambeth Palace in London is the full-time residence of Rowan Williams, the current archbishop in, for 10 points, what cathedral in Kent that houses a shrine where St. Thomas Becket was murdered?

Answer: Canterbury Cathedral

6. The aggressors in this war won an early victory at Bloody Brook. Despite the loss of Captain Turner's company at Deerfield, Major Talcot, aided by 200 Mohegans, won decisive victories at Hadley and Marlborough, after which the conflict's instigator was apprehended and shot.

FTP, identify this 1675-1676 conflict between New England colonies and an alliance of Indian tribes, named for the chief of the Wampanoags.

Answer: King Philip's War or Metacom War

7. Her last name is Cavatica, and one of her daughters takes the name Aranea from her middle initial. Templeton brings her a soap ad with the word "radiant," while a newspaper clipping yields "humble." Together with "terrific" and "some pig," her writing saves her friend, who wins a special prize at the fair. FTP name this friend of Wilbur the pig, the title spider in an E. B. White story.

Answer: Charlotte A. Cavatica

8. The title character is eventually shot by the crippled Peter Doyle, the husband of Fay, with whom the title character becomes involved. Between his involvement with Fay, he makes advances toward Betty, to whom he had proposed months earlier, and the wife of his cruel boss at the New York Post, the editor Shrike. FTP, give the pen name of the title character, a love-starved advice columnist, that gives a title to this Nathanael West novel.

Answer: Miss Lonelyhearts

9. Australian forces landed at Balikpapan on its east coast in 1945 to seize the island's oil wells from the Japanese. Mount Kinabalu, in the northern state of Sabah, is the highest point. The southern region known as Kalimantan is separated from Celebes by the Strait of Macassar. FTP, most of the world's remaining orangutans are found on what island shared by Malaysia, Brunei, and Indonesia?

Answer: Borneo

10. By applying Bose-Einstein statistics to them, it is possible to derive an expression which approximates the Dulong-Petit law at high temperatures and the T^3 law at low temperatures. In the first Brillouin zone, their allowed frequencies have an optical and an acoustical branch. One method of obtaining their dispersion relation is to inelastically scatter neutrons with energy in the same range as the lattice vibrations of the material. FTP, identify these quasi-particles, the elementary carrier of vibration in solids.

Answer: phonons

11. During his ten-year stint as foreign secretary, he managed to get all the Great Powers to guarantee Belgian independence in the 1831 Treaty of London. His fear of Russia led him to start the First Afghan War and prolong the Crimean War. He was prime minister when the Trent was captured, and he sent troops to Canada as a bluff to get the Confederate ministers released. For 10 points, name this prime minister from 1855 to 1865, beloved by the public for his "you-be-damnedness."

Answer: Henry John Temple, 3rd. Viscount Palmerston

12. Kits for this character class include border runner and bounty hunter, and examples in the Forgotten Realms include Montolio DeBrouchee and Dove Falconhand. Under first edition AD&D rules, they can gain magic-user spells; in the second edition they can gain priest spells. They also gain some thieving abilities with a penalty for attempting them in an urban setting,

as well as tracking skills. FTP name this outdoor warrior class which counts Aragorn among its numbers.

Answer: ranger

13. Eugene Bozza composed a 1936 aria for this instrument, which is also featured in Darius Milhaud's *Scaramouche*. It appears in Ravel's orchestration of *Pictures at an Exhibition* only for a solo representing a troubadour in *The Old Castle*. Current performers on this reed instrument include David Sanborn and Joshua Redman. FTP name this instrument played by Cannonball Adderley, Paul Desmond, and Charlie Parker.

Answer: alto saxophone (prompt on "Saxophone")

14. Ruderman and Sutherland invoked a vacuum gap due to ion trapping in the crust of these objects in a polar cap model for their emission process. Some exhibit carousel subbeam systems rotating about the magnetic axis. Ones with millisecond periods are believed to be sped up by accretion from a companion star. Pair production and synchrotron radiation contribute to their radiation patterns, which caused the first one to be named LGM-1. FTP name these spinning neutron stars whose beams periodically sweep Earth.

Answer: pulsars or pulsating radio sources

15. Proverbs 30:27 claims that they "have no king, yet all of them march in rank." In the book of Revelation, they appear "like horses arrayed for battle; on their heads were what looked like crowns of gold; their faces were like human faces." Along with wild honey, they served as food for John the Baptist in the desert near the River Jordan. FTP, name these insect pests, brought as a crop-devouring plague onto Egypt.

Answer: locusts

16. Barry's friend David wants to exterminate the title characters but Ezra Lieberman refuses to hand over the list of names. A clue to the ultimate plan is provided in the form of the nurse who handled the original adoptions through the title country, prompting Lieberman, played by Laurence Olivier, to travel to Pennsylvania and face down Josef Mengele, played by Gregory Peck. FTP, what is this 1978 film about a Nazi plot to clone Hitler and recreate the environment of his youth?

Answer: The Boys From Brazil

17. This dimensionless quantity is given by the ratio of the forward and backward rate constants, multiplied by an appropriate power of the reference concentration. The van't Hoff equation gives its temperature dependence, and the law of mass action expresses it in terms of the activities of products and reactants. The reaction quotient always approaches, FTP, what value which characterizes the final state of a reversible reaction?

Answer: equilibrium constant

18. At its center lies the plain of Idavoll. Its walls were built by Blast or Hrimthurs with the help of the magical stallion Svadilfari. The residents meet regularly in the halls Vingolf and Gladsheim, and at the well of Urd. Located on an upper level of the universe with Alfheim and Vanaheim, it is connected to the mortal realm by the rainbow bridge Bifrost. FTP name this Norse world, home to Valhalla and the Aesir.

Answer: Asgard

19. Portions of it depict the creation of the world and the images of strawberries are ubiquitous inside. The central panel depicts such activities as horseriding and fornication, while the right panel depicts devastation, complete with a hollowed out body and a severed ear. In the left wing, animals lie down together in peace, but the painting is dominated by pleasure and torture. FTP, identify this most famous triptych of Hieronymus Bosch, thought to depict the state of Man on the eve of the Flood.

Answer: Garden of Earthly Delights or Garden of Delights

20. One character with this name is the common-law wife of Nicholas, the brother of Konstantin Levin in *Anna Karenina*, while another is the wife of Nicholas Kirsanov in *Fathers and Sons*. In Chekov plays, one character with this name has an affair with Vershinin and is married to the schoolteacher Kuligin, and another marries the schoolteacher Medvedenko but loves Treplyev. FTP, give the name of the sister of Olga and Irina in Chekov's play *Three Sisters*.

Answer: Masha or Marya

21. One of its formulators introduced it in the course of trying to show that Hilbert's decision problem is unprovable for the predicate calculus if this statement is assumed to be true. An alternate version was formulated by another man using lambda-definability instead of computability, and his version states that a function of positive integers is effectively calculable only if it is recursive. FTP, identify this statement which claims that "logical computing machines can do anything that could be described as... purely mechanical."

Answer: Church-Turing thesis

22. It lasted from 1889 to 1914, and its 1900 congress featured a defense of Millerand's joining the French government, given by Jean Juares. August Bebel got the 1904 Amsterdam Congress to condemn Eduard Bernstein for advocating gradualism over revolution. It broke up over the issue of support for the war, as its predecessor had ended in the conflict between Marx and Bakunin. FTP, name this would-be governing body of world Socialism.

Answer: The Second Socialist International

23. With "mare" it's the nickname given to Henry VIII's fourth wife, Anne of Cleves. It names a medieval county that was controlled by the Burgundians until about 1482, when the Habsburgs took over. The "fields" there are the resting place of Allied soldiers in a poem by John McCrae. FTP, give this historic region of the Low Countries, famous as the surname of the man who donated a princely sum to "Bibles for Belgians."

Answer: Flanders

24. His second play, *The Indian Queen*, coauthored with Robert Howard, marked his attempt to found a new genre of "heroic tragedy." After this was viciously mocked by the satirist George Villiers, he turned to comedies such as *Marriage a la Mode* and histories such as his adaptation of *Antony and Cleopatra*, *All for Love*. FTP, name this author of "Absalom and Achitophel," poet laureate of England during the Stuart Restoration.

Answer: John Dryden

25. The "two thousand words" manifesto was published on June 27th, one day after the end of press censorship. Its call for the revival of the Social Democratic Party was too radical for the government, which instead continued with the April "Action Program" for a "unique experiment in democratic communism." An August invasion by Warsaw Pact troops restored a hardline government, ending Alexander Dubcek's attempt to create "socialism with a human face." FTP, name this failed 1968 movement for a more liberal Czechoslovakia.

Answer: the Prague Spring

26. She seems reasonably affluent from the little we know about her, since she lives in a house with a pool and travels on business. She is also fairly uninhibited, at one point coming out "with just a towel on." This attire is heartily approved of by the narrator, who claims that this single mother of a school-age daughter "has got it going on." FTP name this fantasy object who is the subject of a song on the CD *Welcome Interstate Managers*, by the band Fountains of Wayne.

Answer: Stacy's Mom

27. This poem tells of "an angel throng" that sits "in a theatre to see/A play of hopes and fears...And much of Madness, and more of Sin,/And Horror the soul of the plot." The actors are "Mimes, in the form of God on high." Then "A blood-red thing" intrudes, "and seraphs sob at vermin fangs/In human gore imbued." FTP name this Poe poem in which the angels "affirm/That the play is the tragedy, 'Man,'/And its hero, the" title creature.

Answer: The Conqueror Worm

28. Born in Hilla, near Karballa, at various times he has served as his country's ambassador to Sweden, Burma, the United Nations, and Italy, before becoming Foreign Minister in 1992. In his more famous role, his pronouncements earned him the nicknames "Comical Ali" and "Baghdad Bob." The deliverer of such now-classic lines as, "The Americans are going to surrender or be burned in their tanks," and "There are no American infidels in Baghdad," FTP, who is this former Iraqi Information Minister?

Answer: Mohammed Said al-Sahaf

10) This man held in his *Mind and Society* that political influence lay with a small elite that needed periodic revitalization by talented lower-class persons.

Answer: Vilfredo Pareto

10) His *The Power Elite* depicted a small number of key people from upper-class backgrounds who more or less run the military, economy and government.

Answer: Charles Wright Mills

10) This Italian theorized in *The Ruling Class* that elite minorities can, by coming up with religious or moral rationalizations, easily get the masses to cede them power

Answer: Gaetano Mosca

2. Identify these successors of Genghis Khan, FTPE.

10) Although younger than his brother Jagatai, this son of Genghis Khan became the grand khan after his father's death until dying in 1241.

Answer: Ogadai

10) This grandson of Genghis commanded the Golden Horde and by 1240 ruled both Moscow and Kiev but went no further after going back home in 1242.

Answer: Batu

10) In 1256, this other grandson of Genghis destroyed the Assassins in Persia, and in 1258 he sacked Baghdad and executed the last Abbassid caliph. His western advance was halted by the Mamelukes at the Battle of Ayn Jalut.

Answer: Hulagu

3. Name these Hitchcock films FTPE.

10) Based on a John Buchan novel, this film focuses on Richard Hannay, on the lam after a counterespionage agent is murdered in his flat.

Answer: The 39 Steps

10) Cary Grant plays Johnnie Aysgarth, a man with a strange interest in untraceable poisons. His wife begins to believe he murdered his partner and is planning to kill her.

Answer: Suspicion

10) Richard Blaney goes on the run following the murder of his ex-wife by the Necktie Strangler.

Answer: Frenzy

10) Along with *Cat and Mouse* and *Dog Years*, this book, detailing the adventures of Oscar Matzerath and his most prized possession, completes Gunter Grass's *Danzig Trilogy*.

Answer: *The Tin Drum* or *Die Blechtrommel*

10) The title of this Max Frisch novel refers to both the protagonist's name and his status as a "technological man" who believes he is an advanced being until he unwittingly has an affair with his daughter.

Answer: *Homo Faber: A Report* or *Homo Faber: Ein Bericht*

10) This novel of Heinrich Boll shows how the title character's integrity is destroyed by the press when the criminal record of a man she is seeing is revealed.

Answer: *The Lost Honor of Katarina Blum* or
Die verlorene Ehre der Katarina Blum

10) Colombia's armed forces recently captured Simon Trinidad, the most senior leader captured by government forces during their war against this Marxist militant group.

Answer: FARC

10) The capture is good news to this man, who won the presidency in the first round of elections in part on a promise to bash FARC.

Answer: Alvaro Uribe Velez (accept "Velez")

Answer: Cayley's Theorem

10) If G is a finite group and H is a subgroup of G , then the order of H divides the order of G .

10) The "reaction" of this month in summer 1794 resulted in the execution of Robespierre.

Answer: Thermidor

10) The coup on the eighteenth of this month in 1799 brought Napoleon to absolute power.

Answer: Brumaire

10) The harsh laws passed on the 22nd of this month announced the height of the Jacobin terror with their assertion that "Every citizen has the right to seize conspirators and counterrevolutionaries."

Answer: Prairial

12. Name these special temperatures associated with boiling points of substances, FTPE.

10) As ambient pressure decreases, the boiling point decreases until this point is reached; the boiling temperature can't be decreased below this point.

Answer: triple point

10) A liquid in contact with a mass at a temperature above this point, which is higher than a liquid's boiling point, produces an insulating vapor layer which prevents it from boiling rapidly.

Answer: Leidenfrost point

10) The boiling point of a substance can't be increased past this point. At this point, a meniscus will disappear.

Answer: critical point

Answer: the Bland-Allison Act

10) This 1930 act's two Republican sponsors forged a compromise by selecting the highest tariffs from both the Senate and House versions of the original limited bill.

Answer: Hawley-Smoot Tariff (accept if names reversed)

10) The peaceful transfer of power already has a nickname, which was purposefully chosen to underline similarities between the recent events and the 1989 movement in Czechoslovakia which led to the resignation of Gustav Husak.

Answer: Rose Revolution (after the Velvet Revolution)

18. Name the color, 30-20-10.

30) It's the national color of Gillikin Country in Oz and the name given to a Dutch coalition government that came to power in 1994 under the leadership of Wim Kok.

20) A highly prized dye of this color was produced in Tyre from the secretions of members of genus *Murex*.

10) It's the typical color of amethysts.

Answer: purple

10) One title character of this comedy earned his nickname through a smelting accident which left him naturally equipped to turn on a tractor beam.

10) In this film we learn that the title band's original drummer, John "Stumpy" Pepys, died in a bizarre gardening accident and was replaced by Eric "Stumpy Joe" Childs.

20. Name these schools of sociological theory FTPE.

10) Competition plays a key role in this theory, which holds that societies and organizations function so that each participant struggles to maximize their benefits, resulting in revolutions.

Answer: conflict theory

10) George Mead was a predecessor to this school whose adherents include Herbert Blumer and Erving Goffman. It focuses on symbolic processes of communication and the social construction of personal identity.

Answer: symbolic interactionism

10) Talcott Parsons and Robert Merton were adherents of this school, which assumes that social systems are characterized by homeostasis, and postulates that social structures evolve to fill social needs.

Answer: structural-functionalism

Answer: Meissner effect

Answer: vortex state

5 each) The Gita consists of a dialog between these two characters; one is a great hero, the possessor of the bow Gandeeva, and the other is his advisor and charioteer, an incarnation of Vishnu.

Answer: Arjuna and Krishna

10) Throughout the Gita, Krishna uses this term, which refers collectively to the indestructible soul and consciousness of a person.

Answer: Atma

25. Identify these cities, which threatened to file lawsuits after being negatively depicted on a Fox network television show, for fifteen points each.

15) The mayor of this California city contemplated a suit against Fox's *The O.C.*, which has portrayed it as beset by gang violence and poverty.
