2. Mattias Nilsson, Christopher Jacobs, and Jennifer Mui are back as the title characters in *World in Flames*, the second game in this series whose first entry was subtitled *Playground of Destruction*.

Answer: Mercenaries

Answer: Robert Baccalieri or "Bobby Bacala"

3. This character, who whacked Adriana in the episode "Long Term Parking," is the *consigliere* to Tony in the DiMeo crime family.

Answer: Leo Gerstenzang

 - 1. Marjorie Main and Percy Kilbride starred as the titular couple in 8 of the 10 films in this popular Universal comedy franchise, which focused on a backwoods family with a small army of children.

Answer: The Kettles (or Ma and Pa Kettle) (accept anything with "Kettle" in it)

2. Ma and Pa Kettle first appeared in this 1947 film based on a Betty MacDonald novel, which starred Fred MacMurray and Claudette Colbert as a young chicken-farming couple. It earned Main an Oscar nomination for Best Supporting Actress.

Answer: The Egg and I

- 3. Main and Kilbride also co-starred though not as the Kettles in the 1948 musical *Feudin'*, *Fussin'*, *and A-Fightin'*, which starred this noted hoofer as a salesman kidnapped by a small town in order to run a race against their rival community. He is best known for singing "Make 'Em Laugh" as Cosmo in *Singin' in the Rain*. Answer: Donald O'Connor

3. This player barely qualifies, as he interrupted his long minor league career in 1997 to play for the Reds, making that, his name, and his penchant for crime - he was busted for dealing GBH to teammates in 2005 - things he shares with his better-known father.

Answer: Pete Rose, Jr.

 - 1. Ron Livingston and Rosemarie DeWitt played hostage negotiators who had to balance work with their burgeoning romantic relationship on this clunker that lasted 18 episodes in the 2006-07 season.

Answer: Standoff

3. Travis makes his first appearance in this surreal 1968 classic named for a Rudyard Kipling poem, in which he proclaims that "a man can change the world with a bullet in the right place." It famously shifts randomly between color and black-and-white, and climaxes with a school shooting.

2. Future Guns 'n' Roses drummer Matt Sorum was also a member of this hard rock outfit starring Tori Amos. Answer: Y Kant Tori Read

3. A pre-pretenders Chrissy Hynde played for the Malcolm McLaren-managed Masters of the Backside, which became this British punk act whose most notable line-up included Rats Scabies and Captain Sensible.

Answer: the **Damned**

- 19. The US has already qualified for the CONCACAF finals of World Cup 2010 qualifying. For ten points each:
 - 1. Their first step in the process was winning their second round two-match series against this Caribbean nation, which they did with a 9-0 aggregate, notable for an 8-0 drubbing at home.

Answer: Barbados

2. Third round qualification was notable for the two games against this country, who not only lost to the US 7-1 but had two players defect before their game at RFK Stadium.

Answer: Cuba

3. The US's only loss in the round was to this 2006 CONCACAF Cup finalist, dropping a 2-1 decision at Hasley Crawford Stadium.

Answer: Trinidad and Tobago

- 20. The 1970s was the golden age of the television miniseries. For ten points each:
 - 1. The highest-rated of all the '70s miniseries was this epic 1977 David L. Wolper super-production based on Alex Haley's novel about his African ancestors.

Answer: Roots

2. This 1976 miniseries, based on an Irwin Shaw novel, received 23 Emmy nominations, including nods for 13 different cast members.

Answer: Rich Man, Poor Man

3. This TV legend won 2 of his 7 Emmy Awards in 1976 and 1977 for *Roots* and *Rich Man, Poor Man*. Both years, he was also nominated for his role as the producer of WJM-TV news.

Answer: Edward Asner

- 21. For ten points each, name these literary detectives who may get help in their cases from a higher power.
 - 1. G. K. Chesterton wrote a series of stories in the 1930s featuring this priestly detective who solved crimes in London. It was adapted to a TV series in the 1980s starring Tom Bosley.

Answer: Father Brown

2. Ellis Peters penned a series of mysteries featuring this Welsh seafarer turned monk, who served an abbey in Shrewsbury. Derek Jacobi would play him in a series of British TV movies that also aired on PBS.

Answer: Brother Cadfael

- 3. This crime-solving rabbi from the town of Barnard's Crossing was created by Harry Kemelman, who used the series to explain facets of Judaism to his Gentile readers. It was adapted into the TV show *Lanigan's Rabbi*. Answer: David Small
- 22. Guys in celebrity sex tapes, for ten points each.
 - 1. Although Pamela Anderson is most famous for her tape with Tommy Lee, a video released in 2005 featured her and this other musician, who also appeared in Guitar Hero III.

Answer: Bret Michaels (or Bret Michael Sychak)

2. Joanie Laurer's sex tape, *1 Night in China*, featured her with this other professional wrestler, whose ring names include X-Pac, Syxx-Pac, and the 1-2-3 Kid.

Answer: Sean Waltman

3. Skater Tonya Harding appeared in a wedding dress opposite this then-husband, who later decided it would be a good idea to try to bang Nancy Kerrigan (literally).

Answer: Jeff Gillooly
