### Round 1

#### Toss-Ups

1. Cynthia Nixon made her debut as a character with this name in *Little Darlings*, and it was Ronnie Bass' nickname in *Remember the Titans*. Istvan Szabo directed a movie with this title about three generations of a Hungarian Jewish family, while another stars Hiroiyuki Sanada, Benedict Wong, and Michelle Yeoh as astronauts on a possible suicide mission. It describes vaudevillians Willy Clark and Al Lewis in a 1975 comedy and appears in the name of two recent Sundance favorites set in Albuquerque: one deals with the business of sisters Rose and Norah Lorkowski and the other with the Hoover family's trip to a beauty pageant. For ten points, a 2004 comedy-drama in which Joel erases the memory of his relationship with Clementine references what noun's "eternal" type?

Answer: Sunshine (accept "Sunshine Boys," "Sunshine Cleaning," or "Little Miss Sunshine")

2. He is the co-owner of Pro Touch Detail in St. James, New York. He grew up on Long Island near Charlie Samuels, who got him a job as a batboy in 1985. He worked his way up to being a home clubhouse attendant in 1987. Nicknamed "Murdoch," he often gave workout advice and made shakes for players, but after talking with new Met Lennie Dykstra in 1989, he apparently started to provide other services, which he recounted in his recent book, *Bases Loaded*, and in the best-known documenting of steroid use in baseball. For ten points, name this former New York Mets employee who provided roughly two-thirds of the player names that appear in the Mitchell Report, and who is thought to have sold Brian McNamee the steroids he allegedly injected into Roger Clemens.

Answer: Kirk Radomski

3. According to a sketch on *Chocolate News*, it was following the lead of *Jet* magazine by reducing its copy sizes. Featuring the interviewing talents of Irv O. Neil, this Mavety Media publication helped spawn the careers of Crystal Nights and Ebony Ayes, the latter of whom wrote an advice column in the mid 1990s. The most famous person to grace its pages was singer Blu Cantrell. On 30 Rock, Frank Rossitano is allegedly an avid collector of this publication. The subject of extensive litigation in the early 1990s, the government initially refused to grant its trademark due to its vulgarity and alleged racial insensitivity. For ten points name this adult magazine dedicated to showcasing African-American women in general and their backsides in particular.

Answer: Black Tail

4. Recurring characters on this show include Pierre, who teaches children to dance and wants to meet their fathers, and James Quall, a man of at least a dozen voices whose impersonations usually include the phrase "Spaghetti and Meatballs." Most of the skits are centered around public access TV shows and figures, such as *Afternoon Review*, a women's program featuring odd-acting men, and *Brule's Rules with Dr. Steve Brule*, a series of uncomfortable health updates, and the *Uncle Muscles Hour*, a telethon-like program hosted by Weird Al Yankovic. It also features crappy products from the Cinco Corporation and Jan and Wayne Skylar, the married news team, both of which came over from *Tom Goes to the Mayor*. Name, for ten points, this live action Adult Swim show starring and named for Tom's two creators.

Answer: Tim and Eric Awesome Show, Great Job!

5. Still performing though their last charting single came in 1974, they were formed by a group of classmates at Philadelphia's Overbrook High School. Often sampled in hip-hop, they sang backup for Ghostface Killah's 1996 song "After The Smoke Has Cleared." Members included Frank Washington and Major Harris and original members included the late Randy Cain and their longtime leaders, brothers William and Wilbert Hart. Proteges of producer Thom Bell, they notched 16 Hot 100 singles but are known today in part because their two biggest hits were used to highlight the relationship between characters played by Robert Forster and Pam Grier in *Jackie Brown*. For ten points, name this classic Philly soul group, best known for "La-La Means I Love You" and "Didn't I (Blow Your Mind This Time?)"

Answer: Delfonics

6. In one game, he was initially intended to have a sidekick named Pilot, while Tara and Kitnee were friends who helped him in a game aimed at the younger set. He is initially guided to the Asterite by Big Blue and finds out why the aliens known as the Vortex caused the disappearance of those around him, a revelation that comes after traveling 55 million years into the past to explore Atlantis. The more recent *Defender of The Future* and the older *Tides of Time* both allow him to communicate with Glyph crystals by using his sonar abilities. Best known as the star of several Genesis games, for ten points, identify this dolphin.

Answer: Ecco the Dolphin

7. Bonnie Graney of La Mesa, California attempted to obtain a trademark for this phrase, allegedly first conceived to taunt opponents during games of Mario Kart. Used to establish the lameness of Chris Pratt's character in *Wanted*, it's also been associated with Veronica Mars witnessing the opening of a garage full of stolen goods; Stephen Colbert's color commentary during a chess match and the orgasms of Cleveland Brown on *Family Guy*. For ten points, name this ubiquitous four word phrase, uttered by Will Smith to hide a flub on Oscar night, first brought to prominence as it accompanied video footage of a 3-point shot in an Indiana Pacers game in a notoriously awful attempt at a TV sports report by Ball State student broadcaster Brian Collins.

Answer: Boom Goes The Dynamite

8. [AUDIO] THREE ANSWERS REQUIRED. For ten points, name the song being covered, the artist performing, and the original artist:

Answer: "Go Your Own Way" by the Cranberries, originally by Fleetwood Mac

9. This actor's screen debut was as Prince Alexei in the 1986 telefilm *Anastasia: The Mystery of Anna*. He voiced a colonist named Thomas in *Pocahontas* and played John Rolfe in Terence Malick's *The New World*, while literary roles include Ned Rosier in *The Portrait of a Lady*, Laurie in *Little Women*, Demetrius in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, and a young page in *Henry V*. The villainous Walter Wade in *Shaft*, he is better known for appearing as a child in *Empire of the Sun*, *Swing Kids*, and *Newsies*, and for making Shane Hurlbut the target of a recent rant. For ten points, name this temperamental star of *Equilibrium*, *The Machinist*, *American Psycho*, and *Batman Begins*.

Answer: Christian Bale

10. Ohio school teacher Nancy Donnelly maintains a blog regarding his neckties, reviewing their look and lamenting repeat wearings and a lack of green. He did not finish college, leaving the Catholic University of America to intern in the Carter White House, but returned to it in 2002 to receive an honorary degree. He worked for the National Association of Broadcasters' lobbying branch before getting into news with KOAM in Pittsburg, Kansas. He worked up to a network job in 1993, and was his network's White House correspondent from 1994 to 1996. He then got his own program, the main prime time news show on MSNBC and CNBC, before transitioning into his current job in 2004. The winner of four Edward R. Murrow Awards, five Emmys, and a Peabody for his coverage of Hurricane Katrina, this is, for ten points, what news man who is the seventh anchor in the history of the NBC Nightly News?

Answer: Brian Williams

11. The winners of its American and National conferences win trophies named for Bud Gingher and Bruce Taylor, respectively, while Reebok sponsors the trophies for its top goalie and plus/minus leader. The Carolina Thunderbirds won its first championship in 1989, one of five teams that survived the folding of two other leagues. It admitted nine new teams in 2003, and based on their location it changed its name to deemphasize its right coast-based origins. The Cincinnati Cyclones are the reigning champion of, for ten points, what minor hockey league that is considered a level below the AHL?

Answer: ECHL (accept East Coast Hockey League before clue about name change)

12. On the June 2, 2008 edition of *The Daily Show*, this singer was asked by Jon Stewart to provide an interpretive reading of Scott McClellan's book. While also getting some promotion for his band's March 2008 release, *Funplex*, the appearance did not mention his former gig as Friday night host of Sirius Radio's "Party Out of Bounds." According to *Song From a Future Generation*, he is a Cancerian from New Jersey who likes collecting records and exploring the cave of the unknown. He is also known for having a Monster in his pants from a song done without the B-52's. For ten points, name this pioneer of the Athens music scene who has a Chrysler that seats about 20.

Answer: Fred Schneider

13. The final strip of Shaenon Garrity's Narbonic webcomic is an homage to it. The character of "The Imp", a cannibal youth who appears in minstrel show getup, did not appear in the 1989 Studio Ghibli film or the 1990 Capcom NES game. An episode of the Sandman story "The Doll's House" uses the same visual style of reentering the world, and Alan Moore used it as the basis for Margie's adventures in Misty Magic Land in Promethea. Known for its lush visual style, it entered the public domain in 2005 and is being reissued by Fantagraphics. For ten points, name this newspaper comic involving characters like Flip and The Princess, created by Winsor McCay, which sees the title character entering the domain of King Morpheus while he dreams.

Answer: Little Nemo in Slumberland

14. He is likely based on the character of Reverend Lupin from *The String of Pearls: A Romance*, which originally appeared Edward Lloyd's "The People's Periodicals." His affections for Lucy result in the false imprisonment of Benjamin Barker in Australia, her attempted suicide and madness and the orphaning of Johanna, for whom he also has plans. Assisted by the obsequious Beadle Bamford, he mistakenly takes his toadie's advice for a shave at a wicked barber's shop. Edmund Lyndeck originally played him on Broadway in 1979, though Alan Rickman's 2007 film version is more likely how people envision his character these days. For ten points, identify this judicial antagonist responsible for the titular character's descent into madness in *Sweeney Todd*.

Answer: Judge Turpin

15. Mel Brooks is the only person to win in this award class three years running, for playing Uncle Phil on *Mad About You*. Jay Thomas, Martin Sheen and Colleen Dewhurst all won for *Murphy Brown*, while Chloris Leachman and Elaine Stritch have won in both comedy and drama. *The Practice* has generated the most winners, with actors taking the award in all but one year between 1998 and 2004, and Beah Richards, Alfre Woodard and Sharon Stone taking actress awards. 2008 saw awards go to Cynthia Nixon for *Law & Order: SVU*, Kathryn Joosten for *Desperate Housewives*, Glynn Turman for *In Treatment*, and Tim Conway for *30 Rock*, which had four of the five nominees for actors in a comedy. Name, for ten points, this class of Emmy Award restricted to actors and actresses who are contracted or billed as appearing outside of the lead or supporting cast.

Answer: Guest Role

16. He's not Van Damme or Lundgren, but this man did star opposite Germaine Greer as a mercenary in Africa in 1971's *Universal Soldier*. He voiced "The King" of the Royal Flush Gang in *Batman Beyond* and asked "Whose reality? Yours, or mine?" as an architect in the "That's Armageddon!" sketch in *The Kentucky Fried Movie*, while his roles in a 1981 episode of *B.J. and the Bear*, the 1983 TV movie *The Return of the Man from U.N.C.L.E.*, and the 1989 *Alfred Hitchcock Presents* episode "Diamonds Aren't Forever" all referenced his most famous character, who tells Tracy, "We have all the time in the world" at the end of a 1969 film. For ten points, name this Australian model-turned-actor for whom *On Her Majesty's Secret Service* marked the entirety of his tenure as James Bond.

Answer: George Lazenby

17. A Nebraska fan growing up, he wears his number to honor 'Huskers QB Brook Berringer, who died in a plane crash in 1996. He won 10 games as a rookie in 2005, a record for his franchise, despite having the lowest QB rating of any qualifying passer that season. He was demoted to the third string the following year, and clawed his way back to starting late in 2007, when he supplanted both Brian Griese and Rex Grossman. He started all but one game in 2008, going 9-6. This was apparently good enough for Josh McDaniels, who brought him to Denver in the Jay Cutler trade. Nicknamed "Neckbeard" for his shaggy facial hair, name, for ten points, this Purdue alum who hopes to find smoother sailing with the Broncos than with his original team, the Chicago Bears.

Answer: Kyle Orton

18. On the album which this song appears, its lyrics are reprised two tracks later on the song "FEZ-Being Born." It is partially inspired by a trip to a French fair that occurred right before the Iraq war started, which explains lyrics like "rockets hit the funfair / Satan loves a bomb scare." The singer goes on to state "I don't wanna talk about wars" before pleading to "let me in the sound." The first single off of *No Line on the Horizon*, for ten points, name this U2 song that's probably not literally about sexy footwear.

Answer: "Get On Your Boots" (do not accept or prompt on "Sexy Boots," the song's original name)

19. The original incident occurred in May 2008, and after forgetting to hit the "privacy" button, over 3 million individuals had viewed it within three days of its original posting. It sparked a strong reaction from Chicago Sun-Times writer Mary Mitchell, and the overwhelming response to that article has instructed her to "relax." Chad Vader decided to have a go at it, wherein a random outburst includes a lightsaber before a sleepy declaration of "I don't feel tired." Follow-ups on the official blog include the young star telling a pirate joke and having a one-sided conversation with Christian Bale regarding Batman. Also featuring such lines as "I can't see anything" and "I feel funny, why is this happening to me?" name, for ten points, this YouTube gem wherein a young Devore child still goofy after anesthesia from oral surgery ponders from the back seat, "Is this real life?"

Answer: David After Dentist

20. In the February 3rd episode of *Privileged*, a contest of this game between Will and Charlie escalates into a fight over Megan. Because his sons were playing as Francois the Butt Dusters, Rick Reilly wrote a back page column for ESPN the Magazine about the World Series of this game held in Vegas in during the first week of January 2009. Jimmy Fallon played this game with Paris Hilton during his debut week on *Late Night*. For ten points, name this adults only game played by sinking a 40mm hollow plastic ball into any of 6 to 10 pyramidally aligned 16 ounce plastic cups filled a quarter of the way up with a brewed hop-filled beverage.

Answer: Beer Pong (prompt on Beirut before "World Series")

21. Its characters include a woman who is recently divorced and trying to raise a pre-teen named Annie and new baby Sophie while getting back to work, thankfully with the help of a "manny" named Horatio. Jane's sister Emily is the stay at home mom with children Esther and Bill, all of whom are provided for by hard-working - perhaps too hard working - Jason. And then there's Rosemary, a single mom whose off the cuff parenting style has resulted in her teenage son Syd, who in many ways is more responsible than she is. Based on a series of webisodes starring Leah Remini, Jenny McCarthy and Chelsea Handler, it now stars Cheryl Hines as Jane and Megan Mullally as Rosemary. Name, for ten points, this mid-season ABC sitcom.

1. Name the classic game given its new variations for ten points each.

1. The Scratch and Play version uses lottery-style cards to allow you to play in a car, Wild adds a 7, and Power adds a possible fourth throw.  
Answer: Yahtzee
2. The Attack version features an electronic card shooter with a "launcher button", Spin uses a spinner, and Flash eliminates the clockwise or counterclockwise order of play.  
Answer: Uno
3. The Trickster adds Bounce, Surprise, and Rewind, and the "2" version has an eight-lens side on the back, allowing head-to-head double play.  
Answer: Simon

2. Answer the following about the on-the-rocks career of rapper Cam'ron, for ten points each.

1. Besides his hits "Oh Boy" and "Hey Ma" Cam'ron is perhaps most famous as the head of this rapidly disintegrating Harlem crew, whose other members include J.R. Riter, 40 Cal, and Juelz Santana.  
Answer: The Diplomats or Dipset
2. Cam'ron's last album, which featured the singles "Girls, Cash, Cars" and "Get 'em Daddy," shares its name with a 2006 movie written by, directed by, and starring Cam'ron himself, where he plays a former high school basketball star who becomes a heroin mogul. Both feature several Dipset members; neither was a success.  
Answer: Killa Season
3. In the meantime, this estranged Dipset member has released two albums that have included the major hits "We Fly High" and "Pop Champagne."  
Answer: Jim Jones or Joseph Guillermo Jones

3. Answer the following about a fellow with no brains, for ten points each.

1. Though infinitely scarier these days, this singer portrayed the scarecrow in the 1978 film adaptation of *The Wiz*.  
Answer: Michael Jackson
2. In *Wicked*, Elphaba turns this love interest into the scarecrow in an attempt to save his life after he defends her from the palace guards.  
Answer: Fiyero
3. The last of the main actors to die, this man played Hunk and the Scarecrow in the original film version of *The Wizard of Oz*.  
Answer: Ray Bolger

4. The NFL draft is next week, and while some players have helped themselves through performances at the combine and in pro days, others players have taken a slightly different path. For ten points each:

1. He started to sabotage himself early, getting suspended for the Sugar Bowl. Still a projected top 3 pick, this Alabama lineman then cost himself millions by pulling out of the combine - which was probably for the best, given his lack of fitness - and then having a below average pro day. He's now a projected mid-first round pick.

1. This man, politically associated with Mike Huckabee, has announced that he wants to run for President of Texas; he also entitled a recent column about immigrants "Invasion, USA".  
Answer: Chuck Norris
2. This boyish editor of the National Review went on Colbert to promote his spy novel "Banquo's ghost", about a spymaster who recruits a bumbling liberal journalist to assassinate Iranians and prevent nuclear terrorism.  
Answer: Rich Lowry
3. This author of "Liberal Fascism" has called for the total destruction of France.  
Answer: Jonah Goldberg

8. Why bother creating an original RPG when you can just remake old console RPG's for portable systems? Name these examples for ten points each.

1. The fifth game in this series, *Hand of the Heavenly Bride*, has been remade for both the PS2 and DS. The spin-off *Heroes* series yielded an earlier DS game where one of this series' notable enemies, a slime, was the protagonist.  
Answer: Dragon Quest (accept Dragon Warrior)
2. Roddick Farrence is the hero of *First Departure*, a PSP remake of this Super NES RPG that was unreleased in the States. The second game in the series, which was released domestically for the PlayStation, has also been remade for the PSP under the subtitle *Second Evolution*.  
Answer: Star Ocean
3. This 2008 Nintendo DS rehash of a PlayStation game subtitled *A Musical Adventure* focuses on the story of a girl named Cornet. While it at least changed the combat system, it unfortunately changed from an interesting turn-based tactics setup to a more old-school system.

2. On route to a 1985 New Years' Eve concert in Dallas that was part of a comeback tour for this former 1950s teen idol, a fire brought down his DC-3 near Texarkana.  
Answer: Ricky (or Rick) Nelson
3. More recently, two members of this jazz horn player's band were killed in Colgan Air Flight 3407 in transit to a February 2009 gig with the Buffalo Philharmonic.  
Answer: Chuck Mangione

11. For ten points each, name these European actresses with something in common.

1. This French star of *Damage* and *Chocolat* won the Best Supporting Actress Oscar as the nurse Hana in 1996's *The English Patient*.  
Answer: Juliette Binoche
2. Oscar-nominated for her contributions to the *Before Sunset* screenplay, this *An American Werewolf in Paris* star directed herself as the notorious Erzebet Bathory in the 2009 biopic *The Countess*.  
Answer: Julie Delpy
3. Like Binoche and Delpy, this Swiss actress was employed by Krzysztof Kieslowski; she starred in both *The Double Life of Veronique* and *Red*. You may also remember her as Desdemona to Laurence Fishburne's Othello or as Wesley Snipes' girlfriend in *U.S. Marshals*.  
Answer: Irene Jacob

12. Sometimes, you just end up getting thirty bonus points on a fluke. For ten points each:

1. Darin Morgan portrayed this creature who became oddly popular with *X-Files* fans despite only appearing in the season 2 episode "The Host."  
Answer: Flukeman
2. The 1995 film *Fluke* saw the titular dog voiced by this actor who also portrayed Private Joker in *Full Metal Jacket* and Loudon Swain in *Vision Quest*.  
Answer: Matthew Modine
3. The film *Fluke* was based on a novel of the same name by this author whose works in the horror genre include his debut novel, *The Rats*, which was made into the 1982 film *Deadly Eyes*.  
Answer: James Herbert

13. For ten points each, name these Aussies who have found their way into US professional sports.

1. This Tampa Bay reliever is the ranking Aussie in major league baseball, with five seasons split between the Rays, Reds and Twins. He is known to yell at himself on the mound, and exchanged words with Orlando Cabrera during the 2008 playoffs.

2. This punter became the first Aussie to play in a Super Bowl when the Arizona Cardinals made the big game. He previously played for the Jets and Saints.

3. This first Aussie in the NBA played two seasons with Minnesota before winning the lottery by getting traded to Chicago, where he played on three title winning teams before fading away with Phoenix and the Knicks.

1. The twin brother of Caramon Majere, this frail red-robed magic-user is led astray by the black-robed Fistandantilus and tries to become a god.

Answer: Barney Miller
2. Linden appeared on this ABC sitcom as Mr. Van Zant, a representative from the Dutch company that was buying the title character's place of employment, Winfred-Lauder.  
Answer: The Drew Carey Show
3. Linden's most recent recurring role was that of Jerry Kramer, a ship captain with a mysterious past involving Jackie and Nick Marone, all characters on this CBS soap set in Los Angeles.  
Answer: The Bold and the Beautiful

20. It causes between 250 and 1000 deaths in the United States each year. For ten points each:

Answer: Fritz Lang

3. Both Renoir and Luis Bunuel took a crack at this Octave Mirbeau novel about a female servant; Renoir's version was scripted by one of its stars, Burgess Meredith.

Answer: *(The) Diary of a Chambermaid* or *Le Journal d'une femme de chambre*
