- 1. The songs Oceanside and Shiny appear on this band's EP 5 Songs, and their most recent release was the live album We All Raise Our Voices to the Air. One music video by this band was based on David Foster Wallace's Infinite Jest and features the lyrics "All that remains is the arms of the angels," and that song appears on an album along with tracks like "Rox in The Box" and "June Hymn." Another of their albums features three different songs titled "The Perfect Crime," and is about the titular Crane Wife, and this Portland-based band is famous for performing "The Mariner's Revenge Song" as a finale at their concerts. For 10 points, name this indie folk rock band fronted by Colin Meloy that released the album The Hazards of Love as well as one that features the track "This is Why We Fight," the King is Dead. ANSWER: The Decemberists
- 2. One concept in this film is likened to "Hitting a bullet with a smaller bullet whilst wearing a blindfold, riding a horse," and was originally tested on an admiral's prized beagle. "Sabotage" by the Beastie Boys is playing during a car chase in this movie, and one character is surprised by another's knowledge of xenolinguistics. Olsen is incinerated after skydiving in this film, and Karl Urban's character gives his friend the symptoms of Milvarian mud fleas to bring him aboard the central vessel. One anomaly in this movie is described as a "lightning storm in space," and red matter is used to destroy the home world of Zachary Quinto's character. For 10 points, identify this J.J. Abrams remake of a certain TV series that sees Chris Pine portray Captain Kirk.

ANSWER: **Star Trek**

3. This character once dated Connie DiMico and married Loka, the daughter of a South American chief. At one point he converted to Judaism to try to be better at math, and injures his dog so that he had an excuse to go to the vet and see an ex-girlfriend. This character's birth allowed his parents to pay for their house after a lawsuit against a condom company, and this character described one of his father's friends as a "Transformer that broke halfway through." He played Luke in several *Star Wars* specials, after which character defended Robot Chicken in an argument with his father. Voiced by Seth Green and he is often pursued by Herbert the Pervert, for 10 points, name this oldest son of Lois and Peter Griffin.

ANSWER: Chris Griffin

4. Nigel Weir was the warden of one location in this city, a gulag created by Augustus Sinclair called Persephone. The Lazarus Vector is needed after one area in this city is flooded with a foliage-killing toxin, and that area is adjacent to another that is ruled by Sander Cohen. Besides Fort Frolic, this city is home to Point Prometheus, and this city's founder was famous for the phrase "No Gods or Kings, Only Man." The Circus of Values names a series of vending machines in this city, and in one game, this city is first accessed through a lighthouse. Fontaine Futuristics pioneered the use of Plasmids in this city, which are powered by ADAM. For 10 points, name this underwater city founded by Andrew Ryan, the setting for *Bioshock* and *Bioshock* 2.

ANSWER: Rapture

5. This film was based on a book of the same name by Paul Brickhill, and at one point, one character uses a pin on the floor to try to demonstrate that he is not blind. In this movie, one man known as "The Ferret" gives Colin Blythe a camera in exchange for his lost wallet, and several characters make moonshine out of potatoes for a 4th of July Celebration. One of three passages out of the central location is discovered after a cup of coffee is dropped, and those passages are named "Tom" "Dick" and "Harry." James Garner's character is nicknamed "The Scrounger" in this movie, and another nicknamed the "Cooler King" engages in a notable motorcycle chase. For 10 points, identify this 1963 film starring Steve McQueen and centering on the titular event from a German POW camp.

ANSWER: *The Great Escape*

- 6. One character in this series created his own superhero comic "Slug-Man," and was responsible for the "I-Don't-Love-You-Eileen-Jacobson" computer virus. Another character in this series once "flirted with four digit speeds" while driving the family station wagon, and is dating Denise, who is blind. This series also features one character that regularly vomits chewed clothes, Quincy the Iguana, and the mother of the family in this comic strip once bought an iFruit computer. Created by Bill Amend, this series centers on the family composed of Andy, Roger, Peter, Paige, and Jason. For 10 points, name this comic strip partially titled for the last name of the family, which can also refer to a dance in 4/4 time. ANSWER: *Foxtrot*
- 7. The disappearance of Melanie Coe inspired one track on this album, while another track was inspired by one of the band members getting a parking ticket. The death of Tara Browne and the movie *How I Won the War* contributed to the lyrics of the last song on this album, which features an extremely long E-major chord played on three pianos. The line "Try to realize it's all within yourself, no one else can make you change" appears on one sitar-heavy track, and this album also includes the songs "When I'm Sixty-Four" and "Being for the Benefit of Mr. Kite!" For 10 points, identify this album by The Beatles that contains "Lucy in the Sky With Diamonds" and "A Day in the Life."

ANSWER: **Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band**

8. In one film, this actor played a former FBI agent that tries to capture the "Tooth Fairy," a serial killer that is obsessed with a William Blake painting. Besides that movie which also starred Ralph Fiennes, *Red Dragon*, this actor portrayed Eisenheim in another film which sees him produce an orange tree from a seed in seconds. In addition to that film in which this actor is pursued by a chief inspector played by Paul Giamatti, *The Illusionist*, this man is known for one role in which he plays a Neo-Nazi involved in a brutal curb-stomping murder. For 10 points, identify this actor who starred in *American History X* as well as another movie alongside Brad Pitt, a film that you do not talk about, *Fight Club*.

ANSWER: Edward Norton

9. The second game in this series features one character with the alias "mortified penguin" that is revealed at a French cryogenics clinic to be an ex-CIA agent named Norman Soth. The first game in this series features Kombayn Nikoladze trying to attain the "Ark" a Special Atomic Demolition Munition. The next entry into this video game series will be titled *Blacklist*, and comes after one game with features including "Mark and Execute" and "Last Known Position." This series' protagonist frequently collaborates with Anna Grimsdottir and works under Irving Lambert, the director of Third Echelon. Featuring titles like *Pandora Tomorrow* and *Chaos Theory*, for 10 points, identify this Ubisoft stealth series starring Sam Fisher and based on a series of books by Tom Clancy.

ANSWER: Splinter Cell

10. This song was originally written by Barrett Strong and Norman Whitfield, and first recorded by Smokey Robinson & the Miracles. Gladys Knight & the Pips performed one notable cover of this song, as did one band that added a seven-minute jam onto the end and included it on their album *Cosmo's Factory*. The singer states that "People say believe half of what you see, Son, and none of what you hear," and also that "A man ain't supposed to cry." Besides the cover by that John Fogerty-fronted band, this song was famously covered by the man who created *Let's Get It On*. For 10 points, name this song covered by Creedence Clearwater Revival and Marvin Gaye.

11. Janus Cars is discovered to provide human relocation services on one episode of this show, and that show also sees Connie Prince murdered by an increased dosage of botox injections. At one point, the protagonist pretends to be an injured priest to gain entry to a house, and soon after fires a Glock into the air to alert the police. "Staying Alive" by the Bee Gees is the ringtone of the antagonist of this show, and that antagonist once allowed himself to be arrested after almost stealing the British Crown Jewels. A cab driver gives out poison capsules in the first episode of this show, while the most recent was titled "The Riechenbach Fall." For 10 points, identify this BBC show starring Martin Freeman and Benedict Cumberbatch, a modern adaptation of stories about a certain consulting detective.

ANSWER: Sherlock

12. This location was originally founded by Lis Kaslan, around the *Dowager Queen*, his crashed ship. The Desilijic Complex housed one main ruler of this city, and was located near Kerner Plaza. This city is divided into Old and New Quarters, and is situated in a valley southeast of the Jundland Wastes, about 80 kilometers north of Anchorhead. One shop owner in this city refused to sell a T-14 hyperdrive generator for normal galactic currency, and this city contains Chalmun's Cantina which saw an altercation where Ponda Baba lost an arm. Described as a "Wretched hive of scum and villainy," Luke Skywalker originally left for Alderaan from a spaceport here. For 10 points identify this city on Tatooine.

ANSWER: Mos Eisley

13. This man stated that he would support the John Ritter Foundation for Aortic Health after he gained initial fame. He was first identified around the Cooper River Bridge in Charleston, South Carolina by a picture taken by computer programmer Will King. He revealed that he prefers to go by the name "Watkins" in a Good Morning America interview, and his real name is Zeddie Little. Some derivative memes after his original include a horse and a girl after lung surgery, and one caption associated with him reads "Runs marathon and wins... my heart." For 10 points, identify this man, famous for being incredibly attractive to the camera.

ANSWER: Ridiculously Photogenic Guy [accept Zeddie Little before mentioned]

14. Harkin describes this character as a hothead who "still thinks he can change the world," and this character originally worked under Executor Pallin. This character once pursued a rouge geneticist that was growing extra organs inside living hosts, Dr. Saleon, and this character was betrayed by Sidonis, which caused the death of a squad of mercenaries. Voiced by Brandon Keener, the third game in which this character appears first sees him directing troops on a moon of Palaven, and this character once went by the alias "Archangel." This character originally worked for C-Sec, and one of his favorite activities is calibrating the main battery of the SSV Normandy. For 10 points, name this Turian, a squad-mate in all three *Mass Effect* games.

ANSWER: Garrus Vakarian [accept either]

15. The outro to this song was named after the band's two-man road crew Geoff Lucas and Spock Wall, and this song's original title was "Walpurgis" This song, along with one by Ludicris, was sampled as "Oh No" on the album *All Day* by Girl Talk, and this song first appeared on an album along with tracks like "Planet Caravan" and "Electric Funeral." In this song, politicians are "Treating people just like pawns in chess" and at the end, "Satan laughing spreads his wings." Featuring several guitar solos by Tony Iommi and opening with the line "Generals gathered in their masses," for 10 points identify this song from the album *Paranoid*, a hit by Black Sabbath.

ANSWER: War Pigs

16. This item makes a brief appearance in the 1977 film *Jabberwocky*, and it bears some resemblance to the globus cruciger of the British Crown Jewels. In the film in which it most notably appears, the sound created by this object leads police to the group that murdered Frank the historian. Normally carried by Brother Maynard, a chanting of "pie jesu domine dona eis requiem" accompanies this object's unveiling, and the Book of Armaments is consulted for its use. Instructions for this object include "Three shall be the number thou shalt count, and the number of the counting shall be three," and it was used to gain entrance to a cave in an effort to find the Castle of Aaarrggh. For 10 points, name this weapon used to blow up a killer rabbit in *Monty Python and the Holy Grail*.

ANSWER: The Holy Hand Grenade of Antioch

17. An airport public address system can be heard during one track of this album saying "BA flight 215 to Rome, Cairo, and Lagos." The beginning of the fourth tack of this album was recorded in an antiques shop, and compares the title concept to "Half a page of scribbled lines." The fifth tack features lyricless vocals by Clare Torry as well as the faint spoken line "I never said I was afraid of dying." The track "Any Colour You Like" transitions into this album's finale, which states that "The Lunatic is on the grass." For 10 points, identify this fantastic album by Pink Floyd that contains the tracks "The Great Gig in the Sky," "Time," and "Money."

ANSWER: Dark Side of The Moon

18. This song was originally written by Barrett Strong and Norman Whitfield, and first recorded by Smokey Robinson & the Miracles. Gladys Knight & the Pips performed one notable cover of this song, as did one band that added a seven-minute jam onto the end and included it on their album *Cosmo's Factory*. The singer states that "People say believe half of what you see, Son, and none of what you hear," and also that "A man ain't supposed to cry." - 19. One character in this game sates that he received a "theoretical degree" in physics and works at a solar power station, and another character has a mohawk and treats injured people at an old Mormon fort. Besides Julie Farkas and Fantastic, this game features such locations as Cottonwood Cove and Camp Golf, as well as one underground city where creatures fight each other, The Nail. The central location of this game includes Gomorrah, the Ultra-Luxe, and the Tops, and main quests include working for Mr. House, Caesar, or the New California Republic. This game begins with a courier getting shot in the head, and is a sequel to a game in which the Enclave and Brotherhood of Steele vie for control of Washington D.C. For 10 points, name this post-apocalyptic RPG, the latest entry in the *Fallout* series. ANSWER: *Fallout: New Vegas* [don't accept or prompt on anything else]
- 20. Too many visits to a website cause the creation of a Tibetan Thoughtform in one episode of this show, and another sees the main characters have amnesia and believe their last names to be Smith and Wesson. A recent story ark centers around beings from Purgatory creating a food additive to make the human race slow and docile, while an earlier ark saw the main characters trying to recover a gun made by Samuel Colt. Misha Collins plays the angel Castiel on this TV series, and earlier shows saw the protagonists fighting the yellow-eyed demon Azazel and trying to find their father. For 10 points, identify this CW show in which Sam and Dean Winchester hunt monsters and ghosts.

ANSWER: Supernatural

21. This band covered Tracy Chapman and The Cure with the tracks "Talkin' Bout a Revolution" and "Boy's Don't Cry" on their album *Our Live Album is Better than Your Live Album*. The lyrics "We won't wise up so how can we rise up, tired of being enslaved" appear on their most recent album, as well as a track that says "You got to slow down." Besides that album featuring "Will the Revolution Come?" this band released the album *Why Do They Rock So Hard?* after their most successful album that included one track with the lyrics "No more flipping burgers putting on my silly hat." For 10 points, name this band who released *Monkeys for Nothing and Chimps for Free* and *Turn the Radio Off*, which features the song "Sell Out," a ska band from California.

ANSWER: Reel Big Fish

22. One character with this name formally worked as a New York City policeman and defeated such criminals as Captain Axis and Screaming Skull. Besides that man who was eventually killed by the Knot Tops, another character with this name initially retired after the passing of the Keene Act, and owned a flying vehicle he called "Archie." *Under The Hood* was published by Hollis Mason about his time using this identity, and Dan Drieberg was its second incarnation. Members of both the Minutemen and the Watchmen, for 10 points, identify this name that refers to a certain nocturnal avian.

ANWERL Nite Owl

23. This band's live album Alive Behind the Green Door contains the track "Selfish Man," as well as a song with the lyrics "The buildings they shake but my heart it beats still, oh mother of Jesus, I feel pretty ill." They recorded their most recent album in Detroit, which is the subject of the track "The Power's Out." This band behind Speed of Darkness is more famous for an album whose title track features the lyrics "Ah but don't, don't sink the boat," and another album that includes the ballad "If I Ever Leave This World Alive." Besides Float, this band's most famous song contains the lyrics "Cause we find ourselves in the same old mess, singing," the title entities. For 10 points, name this Celtic punk band behind "Drunken Lullabies."

ANSWER: Flogging Molly

24. This character grew up in a compound known as "The Farm" and ran away at the age of 16 to work at a New York City bar called Bad Weather. This character is a distant cousin to another character whose real name is Clay Kaczmarek, and this character's genes contain high concentrations of First Civilization DNA. Voiced by Nolan North, some of this character's ancestors include Connor Kenway, the son of a Mohawk Indian, as well as one man who killed Al Mualim. After being captured by Abstergo, this character was aided by Subject 16 in an effort to escape from the Animus. For 10 points, name this descendant of Ezio Auditore da Firenze and Altaïr Ibn-La'Ahad, the protagonist of the *Assassin's Creed* series. ANSWER: **Desmond Miles** [accept either]

25. After being asked what this character did with Sati, he mockingly replies, "Cookies need love like everything does." He is described as "The result of the equation trying to balance itself," and in one form, this character is responsible for triggering an EMP too early. While not in the form of Bane, this character classifies the human species as a virus and also kills the Keymaker. After an interrogation, this character asks the question, "What good is a phone call if you are unable to speak?" and he later sends an envelope to his enemy who he calls "Mr. Anderson," containing the earpiece he wore when he was an agent of the system. For 10 points, name this Hugo Weaving-portrayed antagonist of the *Matrix* films.

ANSWER: Agent Smith
