TOSSUP 1

TOSSUP 9

Atlantic Records must regret not releasing this artist's third self-titled solo album in 1980. He then signed to the Geffen label, and within six years was an international superstar, thanks in part to his creative videos and pioneering use of world rhythms. FTP name this performer, whose third album ended up selling, thanks to the new wave hit "Games Without Frontiers." A: Peter _GABRIEL_

TOSSUP 10

When he was a young prince, a revolt known as the Fronde was attempted. The Fronde failed, but the young king remembered how in danger he felt during that uprising. So, as King of France, he moved his court out of Paris after he became his own chief minister in 1661. FTP name this famous King of France, who once declared "L'etat c'est moi" (Lay-Ta-Say-Mwa) or "I am the state." A: _LOUIS XIV_ (prompt if "Louis" is given)

TOSSUP 11

He played for the New York Yankees in 1928, and the St. Louis Cardinals from 1933-37. He's more famous as a manager, winning pennants with the Brooklyn Dodgers in 1941 and the New York Giants in 1951 before his Giants won the World Series in 1954. FTP, name this legendary "lip" known for his maxim "Nice guys finish last."
