The General Strike of 1926 broke out during his second term as Prime Minister. Originally forced out because his counter-measures proved to be unpopular, he again came to power in 1935 and helped rearm Britain quietly in the face of German aggression. After inducing Edward VIII to resign in the face of the



Simpson affair, he resigned in favor of Neville Chamberlain and retired from politics. For ten points, name this Conservative Prime Minister.

### TOSSUP #6

One might think that Romanticism has gone too far when someone writes a poem entitled "To a Young Ass." However, this intellectual poet thought it good enough to be be put into print. For ten points, name this opium addict who was a co-author of \_Lyrical Ballads\_.

### TOSSUP #7 -

This famous 17th century English work was a call for freedom of the press during a very tumultuous era in English history. The title is derived from the name of a high court maintained in Ancient Athens. For ten points, name this prose work written by John Milton

### TOSSUP #8

As the story goes, he praised his king very highly. So highly, in fact, that the king threw a banquet in his honor. "Maple Leaf Rag" and "Acts of Light" were among the last works she set to music. Her earlier, far more famous works, include "El Penitente" and "Clytemnestra." Name this female choreographer, For ten points, who died in 1992 at the age of 96.

## TOSSUP #11

Although Jean-Jacques Roussau, is better known for his Social Contract, he also wrote a very influential work which ignited the romantic



movement. In this posthumously published work he reflects upon many of the events of his life, including his love for Mme.de Warens, whom he calls "mamma." For ten points, name this work, which also shares its title with a much earlier work written by St. Augustine.

## TOSSUP #12

Inscribed on his grave stone are the following words: "But had the fortune in his age/To live a fool and die a sage." This is fitting, considering the dramatic realizations that this character has near the end of the novel named after him. For ten points, name this proponent of the chivalric ideal, most famous for losing a battle to windmills.

# TOSSUP #15

The average human body contains approximately 1 g of this molecule, a grand total of 15 millionths of a mole. It has a molecular weight of about 65 000. Of the 600 amino acids in this polypeptide, over half are known to mutate, with well over 100 of these mutations having physiological effect. For ten points, name this protein with an iron-containing prosthetic group that is res ponsible for binding to the oxygen in blood.

Kit Carson served as his guide in several expeditions to the West. During the Mexican War, he was court-martialed for insubordination, and resigned even though the verdict was overturned by President Polk. For ten points, name this leader of the Bear Flag revolt in California.
