Tossups:

1. Some men are born mediocre, some achieve mediocrity, and some men have mediocrity thrust upon them. He was all three. He was promoted by an I.B.M. machine with a sense of humor almost as keen as his father's. Other characters from the same work include Lieutenant Scheisskopf, Colonel Korn, and General Dreedle. FTP, name this commanding officer of Milo Minderbender and bombardier Captain John Yossarian in Joseph Heller's Catch 22.

Answer: MAJOR Major Major MAJOR

2. The name's the same. It was a Canaanite town that became the central sanctuary site of the Israelite confederacy during the period of the judges. The Tabernacle and the Ark of the Covenant were installed there until the Ark was captured by the Philistines. In more modern times, it was the site of a battle also known as Pittsburgh Landing, in which the Confederate Generals Johnston and Beauregard fought against Union troops under General Grant on April 6-7, 1862 in southwestern Tennessee in the second major engagement of the American Civil War. FTP, identify the common name.

ANSWER: SHILOH

3. Nicknamed the "Chicoutimi Cucumber" for his calm demeanor and Quebec birthplace, this goaltender for the Montreal Canadians won two Stanley Cups in fifteen outstanding seasons. His career came to a tragic halt in 1925 when he collapsed during a game because of tuberculosis. He never played again and died from the disease four months later. Name this legendary netminder for whom the NHL's annual outstanding goaltender award is named.

ANSWER: Georges VEZINA

4. This President received the nomination on the 49th ballot and was the first president to fail in his bid for a second nomination. He chose to affirm, rather than swear, his oath of office due to religious considerations, which did not gain him many friends. His endorsement of the Kansas-Nebraska Act and the political firestorm it created was the most influential of his actions during his own time, but perhaps his most lasting legacy lies in southern Arizona and New Mexico, which became part of the U.S. during his term through the Gadsden Purchase. FTP, name this president, the last Democratic president not to have a Republican opponent.

ANSWER: Franklin PIERCE

5. An episodic novel consisting of short stories, it tells the story of the McCaslin family, beginning with the family patriarch Lucius Quintus Carothers McCaslin, and his many descendants, both black and white. It is a noteworthy exploration of race, particularly as it is compounded with miscegenation, and is concerned also with the vanishing wilderness. FTP, name this 1942 work by William Faulkner.

ANSWER: _GO DOWN, MOSES_

6. The father was a leader of the Florentine Camerata, a group of musical and literary amateurs who attacked the theory and practice of vocal counterpoint as exemplified in the Italian madrigal and sought to revive the monodic singing style of ancient Greece. The more famous son did pioneering work on gravitation, first proposed that a pendulum could be applied to regulate clocks, and was an important astronomer. FTP, give the family name of Vincenzo and Galileo.

ANSWER: GALILEI

7. There are many national capital cities which lie directly across a river from another country; examples include Maseru, Lesotho and Asuncion, Paraguay. However, only one U.S. state capital lies directly across a river from another state. FTP, name this city on the Delaware river, the capital of New Jersey.

ANSWER: TRENTON

8. David Madson and Jeffrey Trail, in Minnesota. Lee Miglin, in Chicago. William Reese, in New Jersey. Two were shot, one was bludgeoned, and one was stabbed to death. The prime suspect in these murders had already achieved notoriety, having appeared on "America's Most Wanted" four times, but he became a household name upon the slaying of Gianni Versace. FTP, name the man suspected of committing five murders, who committed suicide last month.

ANSWER: Andrew CUNANAN

9. Though his Aunts think he's a monsyllabic fool, he actually has a wide vocabulary and a pretty good grasp of politics and society. However, this doesn't stop him from getting into all sorts of trouble with his friends Bingo, Honoria, and Madeline. FTP, name the banjo playing millionaire who employs Reginald Jeeves in P.G. Wodehouse's novels.

ANSWER: Bertram "Bertie" Wilberforce WOOSTER

10. First, produce a beam of heavy neutral atoms. Pass the beam through a mostly perpendicular, but slightly inhomogeneous magnetic field - the particles will deflect in proportion to their spin angular momentum. The quantization of the deflection of the particles is an important fundamental result of quantum mechanics. What is the name of the classic experiment just described, first performed in the early 1920s by two German physicists?

Answer: The STERN-GERLACH Experiment

11. Edouard Manet was awarded the French Legion of Honor shortly after this painting was exhibited at the Salon exhibition in Paris in 1882. The painting features a bartender facing the viewer with a mirror behind her reflecting the image of a crowd ready for entertainment. The mirror reflects objects in the foreground in a bizarre way, though - some objects are farther back than they should be, others (including the supposed image of the viewer of the painting) are off to the side. FTP, name the painting.

ANSWER: The _Bar at the Folies-Bergere_ (or French equivalent, _Le Bar aux Folies-Bergere_)

12. Until recently, her Broadway appearances were limited to dancing in Bob Fosse productions. Her film career was brief, consisting of roles in "Annie", "Micki & Maude", and another Fosse production, "All that Jazz" She entered the spotlight again last year when she revived the Kander & Ebb show "Chicago", taking the lead role of Roxie Hart, and choreographing it in the style of Fosse. FTP, name the 1997 Tony winner for best choreography.

ANSWER: Ann _REINKING_

13. He served as Minister of Culture in his country for 11 years before being ousted for being too permissive. Now, however, he holds the second highest office, having defeated conservative Parliament Speaker Ali Akbar Nateq-Nouri by an overwhelming majority in his country's May election. FTP, name this 54-year-old Shiite clergyman who was sworn in this week, succeeding Akhbar Hashemi Rafsanjani as President of Iran.

Answer: Mohammed KHATAMI

14. Below it, atoms of ferromagnetic materials such as iron spontaneously align themselves in the same direction. This arrangement of atoms is disrupted above a certain critical temperature, leaving only a weaker paramagnetism in effect. FTP, give the name applied to this threshold temperature, named after the 19th century French scientist who investigated the effect of temperature on magnetic materials, and who is perhaps better known as the man who married Maria Sklowdowska.

15. Born in Cape Girardeau, Missouri in 1951, thich construction large came from an influential family: his grandfather served as U.S. Ambassador to India, and his uncle Stephen is a federal judge who has a son on the Missouri Supreme Court. Despite this lineage, he dropped out of college and held such jobs as a disc jockey in Pittsburgh and Director of Sales for the Kansas City Royals baseball team. He then decided to try talk radio, and established himself as a talk show host in Sacramento before going national in 1988. Identify this much-admired and much-reviled inventor of the term "feminazi".

ANSWER: Rush Limbaugh

16. Born in Vlissingen in 1607 and employed at sea at the age of 9, he received his first naval command during the first Anglo-Dutch war. During the Second Anglo-Dutch war he destroyed much of the English fleet in the Four Days Battle and in the raid on Medway. Yet his greatest achievements came in the third Anglo-Dutch War when he defeated superior Anglo-French forces, preventing an invasion by sea. FTP, name this brilliant Dutch seaman.

ANSWER: Michiel Adriaanszoon DE RUYTER

17. The Umatilla Indians, leading a coalition of five tribes of the Columbia River basin, have filed a lawsuit seeking to reclaim him under the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act. Physical anthropologists are seeking to continue to study him, arguing that he is not an ancestor of the Indians and hence does not belong to them under the law. FTP, give the name applied to this controversial 9000 year old skeleton with Caucasoid features, named for the Washington locale where it was discovered.

ANSWER: KENNEWICK Man

18. Though this Republican was first elected governor in 1990 and was reelected in 1994 with 71% of the vote, Senate Foreign Relations Committee Chairman Jesse Helms considers him unqualified to be ambassador to Mexico because of his moderate stance on issues such as the medical use of marijuana. FTP, name this former governor of Massachusetts whose nomination is being blocked by Helms, who refuses to schedule hearings on the matter.

ANSWER: William WELD

19. "A disorder in which strongly-felt ethical and altruistic impulses are perpetually warring with extreme sexual longings, often of a perverse nature. Spielvogel says: 'Acts of exhibitionism, voyeurism, fetishism, auto-eroticism and oral coitus are plentiful; as a consequence of the

patient's "morality," however, neither fantasy nor act issues in genuine sexual gratification, but rather in overriding feelings of shame and the dread of retribution...'" FTP, identify this condition, also the title of a 1969 novel by Philip Roth.

ANSWER: PORTNOY'S COMPLAINT

20. A native of Semyonovo, Russia, this composer emigrated to the U.S. shortly after the October revolution of 1917. Although he composed in the 19th century's Romantic style, his most successful works were written in the early twentieth century. Despite the abysmal failure of his First Symphony in the minds of contemporary critics, he later established himself as a world-class composer with such works as the tone poem Isle of the Dead. Identify this composer who died in Beverly Hills in 1943, a few weeks after becoming a U.S. citizen.

ANSWER: Sergei RACHMANINOFF

21. He served as private secretary from 1861-1865 and was an editorial writer for the New York Tribune, but he first became nationally prominent when he served as ambassador to Great Britain and became Secretary of State under President McKinley. In 1901 he negotiated a treaty with Great Britain giving the U.S. exclusive rights to build a canal across the ishtmus of Panama. FTP, name this statesman, probably best known for his opposition to spheres of influence and his promotion of the Open Door policy in China.

ANSWER: John HAY

22. Try as he might, Alexis St. Martin could not get away from this man. An accidental shotgun blast had torn a hole in St. Martin's stomach, and this man, his doctor, tracked him down in remote areas of Lower Canada in order to conduct his experiments, which involved lowering meat on a string into the hole then withdrawing them to observe the extent of digestion. FTP, Whose 1833 work "Experiments and Observations on the Gastric Juice and the Physiology of Digestion" created a sensation in the medical world?

A: William BEAUMONT

23. Born to a barren woman, he was given into the service of the high priest Eli as an infant. As a boy, he was called by the Lord and became one of Israel's greatest judges, and its last. FTP, name this son of Hannah who anointed the first two kings of Israel.

ANSWER: SAMUEL

24. Discovered by Jean Nicolet in 1634, its location made it a prime trading post and an important military outpost in the French and Indian War and in the War of 1812. Nowadays known for its Grand Hotel and its fudge, name this island between Michigan's two peninsulas located next to a suspension bridge of the same name.

ANSWER: MACKINAC Island

25. As she passed a group of admiring teenage boys on her way to her hotel, she drew numerous cheers and whistles. Her response? "You boys couldn't afford me." Name this 16 year old tennis starlet, linked with Red Wing center Sergei Fedorov, who lost to Martina Hingis in the 1997 Wimbledon semifinals.

ANSWER: Anna KOURNIKOVA

26. Invented by Cayley in the later 1800s, they don't form a group since they not only aren't commutative, they're not even *associative*. However, they do form a normed division algebra. Name this algebra generated by seven square roots of -1 in much the same way that quaternions are generated by 3 square roots of -1.

ANSWER: OCTONIONS

27. The name's the same: the evil brother of Dido who secretly killed her husband, Sychaeus, causing Dido to flee Tyre for Carthage; a sculptor who fell in love with his ivory statue of a beautiful woman; and a play featuring Henry Higgins and Eliza Doolittle, written by George Bernard Shaw. FTP, name the Italian Humanist who in 1440 pointed out a number of anachronisms and other irregularities in the text of the Donation of Constantine, thus proving it to be a forgery.

ANSWER: Lorenzo VALLA

- 3. Last month [July 1997], a member of the lowest caste in Indian society was elected to the highest office in the nation. Answer these questions about this event FTPE.
- a. First, name the man sworn in as president on July 25, who had served

the previous five years as vice president.

ANS: K. R. NARAYANAN [na-RYE-nun]

b. Name the former president of India, whose five year term ended last month. ans: congress

ANS: Shankar Daryal SHARMA

c. Narayanan belongs to the lowest Hindu caste, formerly called the "untouchables", which makes up 25% of India's population. FTP, give the Hindi word meaning "oppressed people" which is now applied to this caste.

ANS: DALIT

- 4. From the following descriptions, identify the type of laser or laser component:
- a. For five points: Lasers of this broad category are often employed in communications systems and optical media devices, and their small size makes them popular in laser pointers.

c. You probably know that Jack Nicholson won Best Actor for his role in One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest. For 5 points each, name the Best Actress and Best Director Oscar winners from that film.

ANSWER: Louise FLETCHER and Milos FORMAN

- 11. Identify the following U.S. territories which are not part of any state for five points each, plus a bonus five points for getting all correct:
- a. While part of the geographic Hawaiian Archipelago stretching from the Kure Atoll to the island of Hawaii, this island group is actually administered by the U.S. Navy and is the home to a military airstrip that saw heavy use in World War II.

ANSWER: Midway Islands

b. This island west of Haiti is claimed by Haiti and Cuba as well as the U.S. and is home to a U.S. Coast Guard lighthouse.

ANSWER: Navassa Island

c. This area surrounding a sheltered natural harbor is actually leased land occupied by the U.S. Navy since the 1902 Platt Amendment. The boundary around this area is heavily fortified and remains one of the last frontiers of the Cold War.

ANSWER: GUANTANAMO Bay Naval Base, Cuba

NOTE: indulgently accept "Guantanamo", which is a town in Cuba north of the base.

d. This island group in the Western Pacific is home to Saipan, a popular destination for Japanese tourists.

ANSWER: NORTHERN MARIANA Islands (prompt on Mariana)

- 12. Answer these questions about Virgil's Aeneid for the stated number of points.
- a. (5) The daughter of King Latinus, she is the destined wife of Aeneas. Though central to the story, she has few lines, if any, in the epic. ANS: LAVINIA
- b. (5) This king of the Rutulians leads the Italian forces in battle against Aeneas' Trojans, angered because it had been promised that he would marry Lavinia and succeed King Latinus.

ANS: TURNUS

c. (10) This King of Pallanteum in Arcadia agrees to an alliance with Aeneas against the Latins.

ANS: EVANDER

d. (10) This son of Evander is killed by Turnus and is finally avenged by Aeneas.

ANS: PALLAS

- 13. Identify the U.S. states with the following flags, for five points each:
- a. This state has the only non-rectangular flag: a "double pennant".

 ANSWER: OHIO

- b. This state sports the slogan The Sunshine State on its flag. ANSWER: South Dakota (NOT Florida)
- c. This is the only state with the British Union Jack incorporated in its flag design.

ANSWER: HAWAII

d. Finally, for five points each, name the two states with the Confederate battle flag incorporated in their flag designs.

ANSWER: GEORGIA and MISSISSIPPI

- 14. Identify the following concerning international land disputes, for ten points each:
- a. This nation was granted the Aozou Strip by the International Court of Justice in 1994, but Libya still maintains military forces there.
 ANSWER: Chad
- b. China has an ongoing border dispute with this former Soviet republic on its western frontier.

ANSWER: Tajikistan

c. These two nations fought over the Cordillera del Condor for several years, but established a peace after renewed fighting in 1995 and pressure from other Latin American countries.

Answer: Peru and Ecuador (must give both for credit)

- 15. Identify the year, on a 30, 20, 10 basis:
- 30 point clue: Erik Karlfeldt of Sweden wins the Nobel Prize for Literature; King Anfonso of Spain is deposed.
- 20 point clue: The Empire State Building opens in New York; Wolfgang Pauli discovers the neutrino.
- 10 point clue: Japan sets up the puppet state of Manchukuo in northeast China; the "Star-Spangled Banner" becomes the official U.S. national anthem.

ANSWER: 1931

- 16. Name the World Chess Champion FTPE:
- Q: This Russian held the world crown from 1927-1935 and then from 1938 until his death in 1946, the only person to die as champion.
- A: Alexander _Alekhine_ (ahl-YEHK-een)
- Q: This Soviet won the 1948 tournament to fill the vacated position and was able to twice regain the title after losing to Vasily Smyslov in 1957 and Mikhail Tal in 1960.

A: Mikhail _Botvinnik_

Q: This Soviet held the title between the reigns of Botvinnik and Spassky. He was known for distracting his opponents by nervously tapping the table, then turning off his hearing aid to make himself immune to retaliation.

A: Tigram (the Tiger) _Petrosian_

- 17. Identify the author from the following works, 30-20-10.
- 30 point clue: Time Must Have a Stop, Chrome Yellow 20 point clue: Antic Hay, The Doors of Perception 10 point clue: Eyeless in Gaza, Point Counter Point

ANSWER: ALDOUS HUXLEY (prompt on "Huxley"; do not accept Thomas Huxley)

- 18. Ah, today's action army—Be all that you can be. Answer these questions about the latest military sex scandals for 5 points each, with a bonus 5 for all correct.
- a. (5) Name the Army Staff Sgt. sentenced to 25 years in prison for raping women under his command at the Aberdeen Proving Ground.

 ANSWER: Delmar SIMPSON
- b. (5) As Sergeant Major of the Army, he is the highest ranking enlisted man in the military. He faces a court martial on various charges of sexual misconduct.

ANSWER: Gene MCKINNEY

c. (5) Name the Air Force pilot who was given a general discharge, thus avoiding a court martial on charges of adultery, lying, and disobeying orders.

ANSWER: Lt. Kelly FLINN

d. (5) After the attention given to the Flinn case, his nomination to succeed Gen. John Shalikashvili as Chairman of the Joint Chiefs was scuttled when it was revealed that he had had an affair while separated from his wife in the 1980s.

ANSWER: Gen. Joseph RALSTON

- e. (5) Name the squeaky-clean head of the Pentagon's Special Operations Command who was nominated to be Chairman of the Joint Chiefs after Ralston withdrew from consideration. Reportedly still happily married to his high school sweetheart, he should easily receive confirmation.

 ANSWER: Lt. Gen. Henry (Hugh) SHELTON
- 19. Many of the most critically acclaimed films made in China in the past decade, including Red Sorghum, Ju Dou, Raise the Red Lantern, The Story of Qiu Ju, and To Live, were the result of a collaboration between China's

Gong Li has appeared in two movies by another director, producing the Academy Award-nominated film Farewell My Concubine as well as the 1996 film Temptress Moon, which was recently released in the US and was widely panned. FTP, name the director of these two films.

ANSWER: CHEN Kaige

- 20. Although Richard Hernstein and Charles Murray's book "The Bell Curve" came out several years ago, let's see how you measure up. Provide these terms related to intelligence classification, used technically in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, but now discredited.
- a. This term was coined to describe a person with a mental age between 8 and 12, who was capable of performing routine work under supervision.
 ANSWER: MORON
