Toss-ups

3. This accomplished scholar was characterized by piety and kindness. She brought Mary and Elizabeth back to the court and treated them like princesses. She also tried to lessen the religious persecutions during her time. She married Thomas Seymour, the brother of Jane Seymour. Like, her sister-in-law, she died shortly after giving birth to her first child. FTP, name this sixth wife of Henry VIII.

Catherine \_Parr\_

4. Born Tamara Fytch, this woman was a pre-med student before she found her calling in life. She appeared on the show, Singled Out and ended up with a dud for a date. She now manages Tom Pritchard and Chris Candido. FTP, name this manager of this tag team duo from the WWF who are better known as Skip and Zip, the Body Donnas.

\_Sunny\_

5. This American woman left on March 18th to fly solo around the world. She started on this date so that she could complete the exact course of Amelia Earharts mission. FTP, name this aviator who shares her name with a type of bird studied by Darwin.

\_Finch\_

6. William James first used this technique in his Principles of Psychology. Les Lauriers Sont Coupes, Pilgrimage, Mrs. Dalloway, The Waves, Ulysses, Occurrence at Outcreek Bridge, and Finnegans Wake all used this narrative technique. This technique represents the characters thoughts and feelings in an approximated level without comment by the author. FTP, name this technique used in The Sound and the Fury.

\_Stream of Consciousness\_

7. This Roman emperor was the first emperor since Augustus to expand the Roman empire significantly. The wealth from Dacia's gold mines allowed him to construct a new forum, a new library, and a new aqueduct. FTP, name this good emperor who ruled between 98 and 117 and who was succeeded by Hadrian.

\_Trajan\_

8. These animals are part of the order Pholidota. They live in tropical and subtropical parts of the Southern half of Africa and in much of Southeast Asia. They look like reptiles because of their body full of scales, but in reality they are mammals since they have mammary glands. They usually eat termites, but they will eat ants or any other insect that is readily available. FTP, name this strange animal whose closest relative is the Armadillo.

\_Pangolin\_

9. This opera was based on the play "La Dame aux Camélias" by Alexandre Dumas. It tells the story of the courtesan Violetta Valéry who sacrifices her love for Alfredo Germont to preserve his family's honor. FTP, name this opera by Verdi.

\_La Traviata\_

10. This Italian painter accomplished frescoes in two chapels in San Giovanni Evangelista, showing his admiration for Corregio who had worked there previously. He painted Cupid Carving His Bow, The Vision of St. Jerome, and Self-Portrait in a Convex Mirror. FTP, name the other name of Girolamo Francesco Mazzola who painted Madonna of the Long Neck.

\_Parmigianino\_

11. This battle was the setting of a Michael Drayton ballad and of Shakespeare's Henry V. In this battle, an English army defeated the more numerous better armed French in Northern France. FTP, name this 1415 battle.

\_Agincourt\_

12. This economist was known for his trenchant criticism of 19th century capitalism. Born in Wisconsin, he studied at Carleton College, Johns Hopkins University, and Yale University, and taught at several U.S. universities. His works include The Theory of Business Enterprise and The Instinct of the Workmanship. FTP, name this American economist who wrote Theory of the Leisure Class

Thorstein \_Veblen\_

13. This effect occurs when electrons eject from the surface of a metal when it is irradiated with electromagnetic radiation. Its equation states that energy equals Planck's constant times the frequency. FTP, name this effect proposed by Albert Einstein.

\_Photoelectric Effect\_

14. This playwright's plays, *Giftas I* and *Giftas II* led him to stand trial for alleged blasphemy. His Chamber Plays were written for the Intimate Theatre which he founded in 1907. He is, however, better known for *The Red Room*, *Married*, and *Lucky Pers Travels*. FTP, name this Swedish author of *Miss Julie*.

\_Strindberg\_

15. One of the first five players inducted to the Baseball Hall of Fame, this player led the league in steals on six occasions with a total of 720 steals. He broke into the majors by batting .344 and batted 17 consecutive seasons with a .300 average. He won the NL batting title for eight of these seventeen seasons with a lifetime batting average of .329. FTP, name this Pittsburgh Pirates shortstop who started playing baseball in 1897.

Honus \_Wagner\_

16. This king of Phoenicia and Telephassa was married to Harmonia and was the father of Ino and Actaeon. Since his sister Europa was carried off by Zeus, he set forth to find her. Along the way, he had to slay a dragon from whose teeth sprang an army of warriors that killed each other. The survivors helped this king find a new city. FTP, name this founder of Thebes.

\_Cadmus\_

17. Pencil and Paper ready: Two heterozygous people for a particular trait have four children. FTP, what is the probability that all four children be homozygous recessive for that trait.

\_The Hind and The Panther\_

19. This Japanese general, statesman, and prime minister, was born in Tokyo. He attended military college, became military attaché in Germany, and served in Manchuria as Chief-of-Staff. In World War II, he was Minister of War and Premier. FTP, name this prime minister of Japan between 1941 and 1944 who was hanged as a war criminal in 1945.

Hideki \_Tojo\_

20. This prophet's book was written during the reign of King Josiah before the Babylonian Captivity. The book contains an Apocalyptic vision and warns of the great day of the Lord when all men and nations shall be called to judgement. After an

exhortation to repent, this prophet prophesies the restoration of Israel and calls on the Israelites to rejoice in their salvation. FTP, name this prophet from the Old Testament whose book is after Habakkuk.

\_Zephaniah\_

21.This physicist was born in Albany, New York. He discovered electrical induction independently of Faraday. He constructed the first electromagnetic motor and demonstrated the oscillatory nature of electric charges. He also introduced a system of weather forecasting. FTP, name the first secretary of the Smithsonian Institution with a unit of inductance named after him.

Joseph \_Henry\_

22.This near Eastern fertility god is known as the shepherd god Dumuzi to the Sumerians and Adonis to the Greeks. With his father Ningishzida, he became a gatekeeper of the Palace of Anu. Ea helps rescue him from the underworld so that he could be reunited with his love. FTP, name this lover of Ishtar.

\_Tammuz\_

23.This economist was educated at Oxford. With the publication of Theory of Moral Sentiments, he expressed his ethical views. His name was popularly associated with his belief that self-interest would operate to bring about the healthiest economic conditions for all citizens, hence a Laissez-faire economy. His other work, Essays on Philosophic Subjects was published posthumously. FTP, name this author of The Wealth of Nations.
