This pioneer of X-ray crystallography discovered that DNA had a constant diameter and that it was comprised of two or three threads. Although this British scientist, who was the first to identify the three-dimensional structure of coal, never identified the exact structure of DNA, many believe that Watson and Crick would have never discovered the double helix without her work. FTP, name this woman who did not win a Nobel prize because the award is not given posthumously.

A: Rosalind FRANKLIN

He revolutionized warfare in his land by having his men use the short, stout assegai (ASS uh GEE) instead of the more traditional throwing spear. Footwear was forbidden; and to toughen his soldiers' feet he made them dance on thorns; those who didn't dance vigorously enough were clubbed to death. He slaughtered captured enemy warriors and is estimated to have killed more than one million men during the turbulent wars of the 1820s that are named after his tribe. FTP, name this African empire builder. A: SHAKA Zulu

Film Flam: essay on Hollywood; Moving On; Some Can Whistle; Cadillac Jack; Buffalo Girls; Texasville; The Evening Star; and Lonesome Dove. FAQTP, name the American author who wrote all of these works.

A: Larry MCMURTRY

After his death his right hand was kept as a relic, and today it can be seen in the Eastern European cathedral bearing his name. He became leader of the house of Arpad in 997, and in the year 1000

he was crowned as the king of a unified country. During his 38-year reign as king he oversaw territorial expansion which went as far as the Mediterranean, but he is probably best remebered for converting the Magyars (maw-dyawrs), for which he was canonized in 1083. FTP, name this Hungarian king.

A: STEPHEN or ISTVAN ("easht-vahn") the FIRST (prompt for number)

In the first half of the 19th Century, pig iron created in blast furnaces contained impurities that had to be removed to produce steel. In the 1850s, this device, which forced a blast of hot air through the molten pig iron, was invented. The blast of air caused oxygen to combine with the the impurities, allowing them to be burned out of the iron. FTP, name this type of converter.

A: BESSEMER Converter

He was appointed court composer to Emporer Joseph II of Austria in 1774 and is known for being the teacher of Beethoven, Shubert, and Liszt. He composed more than 40 operas, including Tarare, with the libretto written by Beaumarchais. Though he dominated the Viennese and Parisian opera at one time, he is most known for a myth that has little historical evidence. This fabled incident has been the subject of an opera by Rimsky-Korsakov, a play by Peter Schaffer, and a 1984 movie. FTP, name this classical composer, rumored ot have murdered Mozart.

A: Antonio SALIERI

In Africa, they are heavily discriminated against. Not so long ago, they were often killed at birth. They are taunted by children and drunks as "peeled potatoes," "monkeys" and "ghosts." Making matters worse, the recessive gene that causes their disorder also causes nystagmus-- i.e. "dancing eyeballs"-- as well as myopia that, even with thick glasses, can only be corrected to about 20-200. FTP, name these people that lack the gene that controls the coding of melanin.

In one of his stories, Mathilda Loisel borrows an expensive item from her friend to wear to a lavish ball. When she returns, it is gone. Too proud to admit the mistake, she and her husband spend their entire inheritance to buy a new one. Financially ruined, they work for ten years to pay off the debt. Poor and worn down, Mathilda sees her friend one day and tells her the whole sad story only to find out that the original necklace had only been costume jewelry. FTP, this French author of "The Necklace."

A: Guy de MAUPASSANT

This condition was first described by Kahlbaum in 1874, and is seen particularly in manic depression and schizophrenia. There may be repetitive movements, the repetition of sounds the patient has heard and automatic obedience. FTP, what is this condition most noted for its patients being in a stupor?

A: CATATONIA or CATATONIC STATE

He engineered a stunning addition to his people's domains during the 1270s A.D when he vanquished the most populous region in the world, Sung South China. However, his later expeditions against Java and Japan were costly fiascos. He is

presently renowned for his peaceful civilian achievements, as he restored central and local government institutions and agencies familiar to the Chinese and reinstated Confucian

rituals and ceremonies at court. FTP name this Mongol emperor.

A: KUBLAI Khan

Everyone knows that America's biggest city used to be called New Amsterdam, but in this nation one of the biggest cities is still called New Amsterdam. However, it is no metropolis, as the entire country has only 700 thousand people. Most of the country is covered by dense tropical rainforests, and 90% of the population lives within 40 miles of the Caribbean coast in the north. FTP, name this country which has been controlled by Holland and England, which has had border disputes with Venezuela and Surinam, and which has its capital at Georgetown.

At 17 he was a world champion, though he saw no time in World Cup games. At 18 he led the Dutch First Division in scoring. At 19 he was transferred to Barcelona in the Spanish League, where he was named World Player of the Year. FTP, identify this one-named Brizilian soccer phenom.

This family produced three notable painters, a father and two sons, sometimes referred to as "Hell" and "Velvet." Of the three, the father is probably the most famous, renowned for his 16th-century landscapes and peasant scenes, the best collection of which is in Vienna's Kunstmuseum. Specific works of his include "The Seven Deadly Sins," "Wooded Village," "Belgian Wagon," and "The Tower of Babel." FTP, give the shared last name of Flemish artists Pieter, Pieter, and Jan. A: BRUEGEL

"I had nothing to do with shooting your father," he told the son of the man he shot. "I believe you, and my family believes you," the son reportedly replied, but this man is still in jail in Nashville, Tennessee. In this device light is reflected off the main mirror to a secondary mirror, which then reflects the light back through a hole in the main mirror. FAQTP name this type of reflecting telescope.

She was born in 1873 in Virginia but later moved to Nebraska, where the new landscape greatly influenced her writing. In 1923 she won the Pulitzer prize for "One of Ours." FTP, name this author of "A Lost Lady" and "O Pioneers." A: Willa CATHER

Perhaps no other war saw as much advance and retreat by both sides, as a percentage of the land area of the two countries involved. The capital city of one of the countries was liberated four times in less than a year. The rapid shifts in momentum could be attributed to separate interventions by major world powers. One side was pushed back as far north as the Chosin reservoir after advancing as far south as the Pusan perimeter. FTP, name this war, whose final armistice line, agreed to 43 years ago on July 27, intersects the 38th parallel. A: KOREAN WAR
