1. She toured Europe in 1955 with the cast of Porgy and Bess, then wrote such Off-Broadway productions as Cabaret For Freedom. She worked in Ghana as editor of the African Review but is better known for her autobiographical stories and poetry. For 10 points, what author of I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings read her poem, On the Pulse of Morning, at Bill Clinton's 1993 inauguration?

Answer: Maya ANGELOU

2 "Till this moment, I never knew myself," this character says when she realizes that her high opinion of Mr. Wickham has been based only on his "voice and manner." She reads the truth about Wickham in a letter from her future husband that she initially regards with "a strong prejudice against every thing he might say." For 10 points, name this lover of Fitzwilliam Darcy and heroine of Jane Austen's Pride and Prejudice.

Answer: ELIZABETH Bennett (prompt on "Bennett"; prompt on early "Pride and Prejudice" or "Austen")

3 "Many years later, as he faced the firing squad, Colonel Aureliano Buendia was to remember that distant afternoon when his father took him to discover ice." So begins a 1967 book about the village of Macondo, and the people who live there over the course of a century. For 10 points, name this novel by Gabriel Garcia Marquez.

Answer: ONE HUNDRED YEARS OF SOLITUDE or CIEN ANOS DE SOLEDAD

4 Based on a novel by Pierce Egan, this play distinguishes city life from country life in such settings as Fleet Street and the 'Chaffing Crib' in Corinthian House. Bob Logic, a "professor of the flash," teaches the younger title character how to behave in London. For 10 points, name this W.T. Moncrieff play that should not be confused with a Hanna-Barbera cartoon about a cat and mouse.

Answer: TOM AND JERRY HISTORY

5 Born to an upper-class Kentucky family, she was living with her sister in Springfield when she met her husband. Of her four children, only Robert lived to adulthood. The death of Willie in 1862 caused her great sorrow and the 1871 death of Tad may have driven insane. You'd go crazy too if you had to witness your husband's assassination. For 10 points, name this woman who served as First Lady from 1861 to 1865.

Answer: Mary TODD Lincoln or MARY LINCOLN (prompt on Lincoln or "Mrs. Lincoln")

6 Julien Fedon's 1795 slave revolt on this island was just one of many uprisings that eventually led to the 1951 election of Eric Gairy and his "Mongoose Gang." Gairy was toppled in 1979 by the New Jewel Movement, led by Maurice Bishop, but the U.S. sent in troops in 1983. For 10 points, name the Caribbean nation whose invasion caused the Soviets to boycott the 1984 Olympics.

Answer: GRENADA

7 During his reign, Britain was restored to the empire, the Persians were conquered, and the Roman senate became a municipal council. To repel the Germans, he appointed three caesars to rule with him. The army made him emperor upon the death of Numerian but he abdicated to his castle in Salona in 305. For 10 points, name this Roman emperor best known for his persecution of the Christians.

Answer: Caius Aurelius Valerius DIOCLETIAN us

8 Promulgated by King Henry IV, it guaranteed the freedom of private worship, called for state subsidy for religious schools, and left control of over 200 cities, including La Rochelle, in the hands of the Protestants. That provision was incompatible with the policies of Louis XIV, who issued a series of edicts weakening it. For 10 points, name this 1598 edict defining the rights of Huguenots.

Answer: Edict of NANTES

9 In wave motion, it is the fraction of a wave cycle completed by a time variable, where one complete cycle amounts to 2 pi radians. In chemistry, this five-letter word refers to one of four different types of matter, including plasma. For 10 points, what word can also refer to a stage in a project or a brief period of eccentric behavior?

Answer: PHASE

10 He showed that the final fate of a star depends on its mass, because stars larger than about 1.4 solar masses will be unable to evolve into white dwarves. For 10 points, name this Nobel Laureate, a physicist from Lahore, Pakistan.  
Answer: Subrahmanyam \_CHANDRASEKHAR\_

11 He studied pernicious anemia and researched the adrenal glands. Weakness, apathy, low blood pressure, and high pigment are all symptoms of a disease named after him, which results from the destruction of the adrenal cortex. For 10 points, name this 19th century physician.  
Answer: Thomas \_ADDISON\_

12 Metabolic processes through which organisms derive energy. The uptake of oxygen and release of carbon dioxide. Pumping water through gills or air in and out of lungs. For 10 points, what 11-letter word describes all of these acts and is synonymous with breathing?  
Answer: \_RESPIRATION\_

13 God is the true one but there are 10 historical ones. Since the end of the line in 1708, the community itself has been one. This four-letter word refers to the sacred scripture \_Adi Granth\_ as well as to a man called Nanak. For 10 points, what term for the inner voice of God is taken from the Sikh religion?  
Answer: \_GURU\_

14 The German philosopher Ludwig Fichte used this three-letter word to replace the concept of a "thing-in-itself" with the act of primitive consciousness. It became less primitive when used by Sigmund Freud to describe a middle ground between one's basest urges and highest intellect. For 10 points, what word also describes a sense of self-importance?  
Answer: \_EGO\_

15 First translated by Charlotte Guest, it includes, among others, the tales of Branwen, Olwen, Peredur, and Taliesin [tally-ESS-en]. For 10 points, name this collection of 12 medieval stories from Welsh myth.  
Answer: The \_MABINOGI\_ on FINE ARTS

16 This style was revived in the late 17th and early 18th centuries, and used for parliament buildings in London and Ottawa. Featuring pointed arches, rib vaults, flying buttresses, lofty interiors and huge window areas, it flourished from the 12th to 15th centuries. For 10 points, name this successor to the Romanesque style of architecture.  
Answer: \_GOTHIC\_

17 This type of work takes its name from the "prayer halls" in which the earliest ones were performed. Composers who used this form include Elgar, Mendelssohn, and Haydn, who wrote \_The Creation\_. For 10 points, name this form of music originated by Handel, of which one example is the \_Messiah\_.  
Answer: \_ORATORIO\_

18 Jewish groups took out a full-page ad in the October 6 \_New York Times\_, demanding that this company compensate those who were forced to work for its German subsidiary during World War II. The Nazis left the subsidiary intact, possibly because the founder of this company gave large birthday gifts to Adolph Hitler and wrote anti-Semitic tracts. For 10 points, name this Dearborn, Michigan, auto maker.  
Answer: \_FORD\_ Motor Company [The subsidiary is Ford Werke AG]

19 The Supreme Court ruled in October 1999 that this man made himself a public figure by taking part in several July 1996 interviews. The ruling hindered his libel suit against the \_Atlanta Journal-Constitution\_, which reported on July 30 that he had become a suspect in the Olympic Park bombing. For 10 points, name this security guard.  
Answer: Richard \_JEWELL\_

20 Queen Latifah makes a cameo on this singer's latest album, \_Deconstruction\_. A rap about black coffee and Todd Rundgren opens her 1997 debut, \_Blurring the Edges\_, which is better known for a song that rips off the binary structure of Alanis Morissette's "Ironie" under a more attention-grabbing name. For 10 points, name the alternative star whose biggest hit to date is "Bitch."  
Answer: Meredith \_BROOKS\_

12 Pencil and paper ready. You will have \_10\_ seconds per part. Suppose that two equally matched teams play a best-of-seven series. In every game, each team is equally likely to win. That is, there is a probability of  $1/2$  that a particular team will win a particular game. Now, in simplest terms:

1. For 5 points, what is the probability that the series will be a four-game sweep?

Answer:  $1/8$  (one eighth) [Assume w/o loss of generality that Team A beats Team B in Game 1. Then the probability that Team A wins the next three is  $(1/2)*(1/2)*(1/2)$ .]

2. For 15 points, given that the series is not a four-game sweep, what is the probability that it will last exactly five games?

Answer:  $2/7$  [Of the 16 possible outcomes from the first four games, 14 do not involve a sweep. Of those 14, six leave the series tied, 2-2, leaving no chance for the series to end in five games. In eight scenarios of 14, some team has a 3-1 lead. That team has a  $1/2$  probability of winning the fifth game.]

3. For 10 points, given that the series reaches Game 6, what is the probability that it will reach Game 7?

Answer:  $1/2$  [If there is a Game 6 then somebody leads the series, 3-2. That team has a  $1/2$  chance of winning.]

13 Name these Greek philosophers or mythological beings, for 15 points each:

1. He lived from 490 BC to 421 BC and taught his followers that "man is the measure of all things."

Answer: \_PROTAGORAS\_

2. A shape-changing sea god associated with seals, he would answer any question, but only after you wrestled with him.
