1. Used in Mayfair's Empire Builder games to create rail lines, they also serve to make bids in Cipher.

Answer: Crayons

2. Khet, or Deflexion, uses these along with a pharaoh, obelisks, and pyramids with mirrors.

Answer: Lasers

3. The Game of Life: Twists and Turns edition, as well as the new version of Monopoly, both get rid of many of their traditional components in favor of an electronic system using these.

ANSWER: Credit Cards or debit cards

3. This star of the French horror film *High Tension* played Phileas Fogg's love interest in the Jackie Chan vehicle *Around the World in 80 Days*.

ANSWER: Cécile de France

3. Whoopi Goldberg, Speed skater Johann Olav Koss, Ricky Martin, and Jackie Chan all serve as

goodwill ambassadors for this UN agency known for their "trick or treat" program.

ANSWER: UNICEF or United Nations Children's Fund

3. Cut from later versions of the opening is Bart stealing a sign for this, which results in five people having to give chase.

Answer: <u>Classic Concentration</u> and <u>To Tell the Truth</u>

3. Also the nickname of Michael Shackleford, this short-lived game show hosted by Trebek replaced *Sale of the Century* but couldn't compete in its time slot with *Gambit* or *Now You See It*.

Answer: The Wizard of Odds

- 1. Taking a look at the "modern day warrior" via a 19th-century literary character, this song was a collaboration between Pye Dubois and Neil Peart and featured a riff that was used to test synthesizers.

2. *Tom Sawyer* is considered one of the most representative works of this Canadian group by Geddy Lee, its lead singer.

Answer: Rush

3. "Tom Sawyer" originally appeared as the first track on this 1981 album. Other tracks include

"Limelight" and "YYZ". The triple entendre consists of a film being made about people crying over art that is being relocated.

Answer: Moving Pictures

- 1. This host of *This Week in Tech* previously hosted *Call for Help* and *The Screen Savers* on TechTV.

Answer: Leo LaPorte

2. This man behind *Daily Source Code* is considered one of the pioneers of podcasting. His previous claim to fame was serving as an MTV VJ from 1987 to 1994.

ANSWER: Adam Curry

3. This band used to offer fans a Dial-a-Song service over the phone. Now, John Linnell and John Flansburgh offer a podcast every month or so.

Answer: They Might Be Giants

- 1. After winning a Razzie as Worst New Star for *Bolero* and *Conan the Destroyer*, this British actress redeemed herself as Karen on *The Wonder Years* and Nicole Wallace on *Law and Order: Criminal Intent*.

2. Olivia's cousin Maryam d'Abo is best known as Bond girl Kara Milovy from this 1987 Ian Fleming adaptation starring Timothy Dalton.

Answer: The Living Daylights

3. Olivia's father Mike d'Abo sang lead vocals on the hit version of "The Mighty Quinn" by this British group named for its keyboardist. That keyboardist went on to form an "Earth Band" in the 1970s.

Answer: Manfred Mann (Do not accept "Manfred Mann's Earth Band")

4. Mike d'Abo's songwriting credits include "Build Me Up Buttercup" by the Foundations and "Handbags and Gladrags" by Rod Stewart. The latter song was the theme for what 21st-century cult classic British TV series?

Answer: The Office

- 15. Identify these films which may or may not be related for ten points each.
- 1. In this film, Michael Biehn and Matt Craven portray two climbers who manage to talk their way onto an ill-fated team attempting to scale one of the world's tallest mountains.

Answer: K2

2. In this 2001 film, Kevin Spacey portrays Prot (moderators note: rhymes with 'goat') a New York mental patient who may or may not be from another world.

ANSWER: K-Pax

3. Harrison Ford plays Alexi Vostrikov, the captain of a Cold War-era Soviet nuclear submarine with a reactor leak, in this 2002 offering.

Answer: *K-19*: The Widowmaker

- 16. Name these early titles for the original PlayStation for ten points each.
- 1. This port of a Namco arcade racing game was one of the system's launch titles. Simplistic by today's standards, it can still make Sony executive Kaz Hirai excited when emulated on the PSP.

Answer: Ridge Racer

2. This early 3D fighting game featured characters like Eiji Shinjo and Kayin Amoh, but it was most notable for the ability to take advantage of the 3D space by allowing players to sidestep into or toward the screen.

ANSWER: Battle Arena Toshinden

3. Possibly the best game of all-time to feature a protagonist that is a mechanical rabbit, players of this game collected jet pods by making use of the hero's ability to triple jump.

Answer: Jumping Flash!

Answer: Norway

3. New Chelsea manager Avram Grant was originally brought on to help coax more out of this Ukranian player, whose header allowed the Blues to salvage a tie with Rosenborg.

Answer: Andriy Shevchenko

- 1. This one-time journalist for the *Baltimore Sun* wrote the book that inspired the TV series *Homicide: Life on the Street* and created and executive produces HBO's *The Wire*.

ANSWER: David Simon

2. Simon won two Emmys for this 2000 HBO miniseries, based on his non-fiction book about drug addicts in Baltimore.

Answer: The Corner

3. This comedian first played Detective John Munch, a character inspired by Simon's book, on *Homicide*, and has gone on to play him in six other television series.

Answer: Richard Belzer

- 19. Waffles, chocolate, and, in the early 1990s at least, electronic dance music. Given clues, identify the following Belgian techno acts for 10 points each.
- 1. This techno group's 1991 debut *Lust*, remains infamous for sexually explicit and humorous lyrics on tracks like *Rough Sex* and *I Must Increase My Bust*.

ANSWER: Lords of Acid

2. This collaboration between producer Jo Bogaert and Afro-Belgian rapper Ya Kid K gave the world the 1990 hits *Pump Up The Jam* and *Move This*, which was later used in Revlon commercials.

ANSWER: Technotronic

3. Created by Belgian producers but fronted by Dutch duo Ray Slijngard and Anita Doth, this group scored a hit in Europe with *No Limit* but their biggest smash stateside is *ESPN Jock Jams* staple *Get Ready For This*.

Answer: 2 Unlimited
