2. As Detective Keith Frazier, Washington is able to keep a hostage situation from becoming deadly opposite Clive Owen's canny burglar in this 2006 Spike Lee Joint.

**Answer:** Inside Man

3. As if to prove he has more sex appeal in his little finger that most of us have in our whole bodies, Denzel played quadriplegic Detective Lincoln Rhyme opposite Angelina Jolie in this 1999 thriller.

**Answer:** The Bone Collector

- 6. Answer the following questions about a recently reconstituted 1990s rock band for ten points each.
- 1. This Arizona-based act scored a big hit in 1993 with the album *New Miserable Experience*, with the singles *Hey Jealousy* and *Allison Road*.

on the soundtrack to this movie about a record store, widely derided as a major studio's attempt to shamelessly rip off *Clerks*.

  - 1. This iconic NBC television figure hosted five Academy Awards in the late 1970s and early 1980s as well as four Primetime Emmy Awards in the early 1970s.

2. He hosted the Grammys in 2001 and 2002 which likely prepared him for hosting the Academy Awards in 2006 and for his scheduled return in 2008.

**ANSWER:** Jon Stewart

3. This comedian, then coming off a stint on SNL, hosted the first MTV Movie Awards in 1992 and the 1991 and 1992 Primetime Emmys and won three Emmys for writing in a variety or music program from 1994 to 1996.

**Answer:** Dennis Miller

Answer: That Championship Season

3. Miller and his wife Linda, the daughter of Jackie Gleason, were the parents of this *Speed 2:* Cruise Control and In the Valley of Elah star.

**Answer:** Jason <u>Patric</u>

- 10. For ten points each, name the TV series that ended in 2007 thusly:
- 1. Most of the main characters found themselves in a plane crash on a mountain before being rescued. The title character played by Jill Hennessy finally admitted her feelings for Woody.

**Answer:** Crossing Jordan

2. The last episode showed the characters six years after an earthquake rocked Newport.

3. The title character takes up his pre-legal profession in order to stop an old villain. After saving the day, the hero is killed by a bus.

Answer: Harvey Birdman, Attorney at Law

- 1. This quarterback, the starter of the home opener against Georgia Tech, was benched by halftime and a student at Northern Illinois before October. ND wouldn't release him from his scholarship to play there, so he's since set sights on the University of Cincinnati.

2. Notre Dame was the last team in all of divison I to score an offensive touchdown, doing so in their fourth game, against this Big 10 school.

ANSWER: Michigan State Unviersity

3. A triple overtime 46-44 loss ended a 43 game winning streak against this school, and marked ND's first home losing streak of five games.

Answer: Navy or US Naval Academy

3. The first show in September 2007 was peppered with tracks from this artist's recently released album, *Forever Cool*, which pairs this grave-bound crooner and actor born in Steubenville, Ohio with above-ground artists like Big Bad Voodoo Daddy, Dave Koz, Martina McBride, and Kevin Spacey.

- 1. With a slogan of "Where getting ready is half the fun!" this retail chain store sells mainly accessories, including perfume lines from Britney Spears, Hillary Duff and Hello Kitty.

2. When Claire's Stores, Inc. bought the chain Afterthoughts in 1999, they converted it into this chain that aims for an older crowd.

**ANSWER:** Icing by Claire's

3. Another popular mall chain that aims at teens is Piercing Pagoda, which is owned by this corporation whose flagship brand's slogan is "The Diamond Store."

3. Although its best years were played when it was based out of Giants Stadium, Yankee Stadium was the home for two seasons of this North American Soccer League team whose players included Pele.

**ANSWER:** New York Cosmos

- 16. Identify these films starring O.J. Simpson from clues for ten points each.
- 1. Simpson co-starred as Harry Jernigan in this 1974 disaster flick about a skyscraper which catches fire the night of its dedication, trapping dignitaries inside.

2. The Juice played astronaut John Walker in this 1978 thriller about a Mars landing hoax and the attempted cover-up.

Answer: Capricorn One

3. O.J. played bumbling Detective Nordberg in this series of cop spoof films starring Leslie Nielsen.

**Answer:** the *Naked Gun* series (prompt on "Police Squad")

- 17. Games that made use of this include the fantasy game *Loom*, the Stephen Spielberg co-written *The Dig* and the biker adventure *Full Throttle*. For ten points each:
  - 1. Name this scripting language used by numerous Lucasarts computer adventure games that takes two letters in its acronym from the first game that used it, *Maniac Mansion*.

Answer: <u>SCUMM</u> (accept <u>Script Creation Utility for Maniac Mansion</u>)

2. The last game to use the SCUMM engine was a sequel about the curse of this title location. The previous two games in this series also used SCUMM and focused on the exploits of wannabe pirate Guybrush Threepwood.

**Answer:** Monkey Island

3. The second game to utilize the SCUMM engine was this graphical adventure that sees the title character thwart the Caponians from making everyone on Earth dumb with annoying ring tones by assembling a device with parts located on Earth and Mars.

Answer: Zak McKracken and the Alien Mindbenders

**Answer:** Morgana Le Faye (grudgingly accept Morgan Le Faye)

3. *King Arthur and the Knights of Justice* originally aired in the Amazing Adventures programming block, which included, among various other shows, this one based off a video game starring the twin martial artists Billy and Jimmy Lee.

Answer: Double Dragon

- 19. 2006-2007 Cleveland Cavaliers not named LeBron, for ten points each.
- 1. This power forward out of Kansas led the team with 8.5 rebounds per game.

2. The oldest player on the team, this guard has played for the Nets, Celtics, Hornets, and Rockets since going undrafted out of Baylor.

**Answer:** David Wesley

3. Drafted in the second round out of Texas, this rookie spent most of the year as a reserve, but scored 21 points in series-tying Game 4 and 31 in the clincher Game 6 to help defeat the Pistons in the Eastern Conference Finals.

ANSWER: Daniel "Boobie" Gibson

- 20. Changes in the writing staffs at Sports Illustrated and ESPN: The Magazine for ten points each.
  - 1. This long-time SI writer, known primarily for his columns on the magazine's last page, will join the staff of ESPN's magazine in 2008. He will also contribute pieces to SportsCenter and work live events.

**ANSWER:** Rick Reilly

2. For its part, SI will gain this long-time SportsCenter anchor, who will pen a column in the magazine, have his radio show simulcasted on SI's website, and host SI-related TV programming,

**Answer:** Dan Patrick

3. Patrick's column will appear in the front of SI, an area most recently occupied by this writer's Air and Space column.

**ANSWER:** Steve Rushin

- 21. Given an alcoholic drink, identify the non-alcoholic juice or juices you need to make it, for 10 points each.
  - 1. A Harvey Wallbanger requires vodka, Galliano, and this juice.

ANSWER: orange juice

2. All or nothing, these two juices combine with vodka and triple sec to make a cosmopolitan.

ANSWER: cranberry juice and lime juice

3. While not a juice, this fruit's puree is used in a Bellini.

- 22. Answer the following about the Polaris Music Prize, for ten points each.
  - 1. First awarded in 2006, the Polaris Music Prize is awarded annually to the best full-length album Canadian album regardless of genre, sales, or label. It is Canada's answer to this similar award for the United Kingdom and Ireland, most recently awarded to the Klaxons in 2007.

**ANSWER: Mercury Music Prize** 

2. The winner of the inaugural Polaris Music Prize was this band, a creation of violinist Owen Pallett, for the 2006 release *He Poos Clouds*. The band name should be familiar to TRASH players as the name of a popular video game series, of which Pallett is a fan.

**ANSWER:** Final Fantasy

3. Pallett frequently works with this Montreal-based indie band, led by Win Butler, who made the short list for the Polaris in 2007 with their most recent release, *Neon Bible*.

**ANSWER:** Arcade Fire
