Bonuses

1. Hip-hop is known for its infamous feuds, but other genres have had their beefs as well. Given clues about a pair of feuding artists or bands, name the artists or bands involved for 5 points each.

1. [5,5] When this much-loathed soprano saxophonist put out a record where he played over tapes of Louis Armstrong's *What A Wonderful World*, this jazz guitar master wrote an infamous screed to Jazz Guitar Online in 2000 urging a boycott.

ANSWER: Kenny G (or Kenny Gorelick) & Pat Metheny

2. [5,5] The singles *Country House* and *Roll With It* were released the same week in 1995, against a backdrop where the guitarist for one band said that he hoped that the singer of the other band would "die of AIDS." On the one hand, *Country House* beat *Roll With It* on the UK singles chart but (*What's The Story*) *Morning Glory* far outsold *The Great Escape*, especially Stateside.

ANSWER: Oasis and Blur

3. [5,5] This aging shockrocker wrote the song *Mutilation Is The Sincerest Form Of Flattery* for the album *Eat Me Drink Me* in which he implicitly claimed that this New Jersey outfit, fronted by Gerard Way, ripped him off.

ANSWER: Marilyn Manson and My Chemical Romance

2. He is a man with no name, although it has been promised that his name will be revealed in the series finale. For ten points each:

1. Name this character played by Neil Flynn on *Scrubs* who is known only by a descriptive name.

ANSWER: The Janitor

2. Janitor's father was played by this guest star who made his son do push-ups suspiciously like a Marine drill sergeant.

ANSWER: R(onald) Lee Erme

3. Although Janitor is not on the medical staff, he has helped out occasionally, such as in the fourth season episode "My Office", in which his expert advice was a great help in removing this object from a patient's rectal cavity.

ANSWER: lightbulb [Because he was the hospital's most knowledgeable person about lightbulbs.]

3. Anyone who thinks that the Wii is not a hardcore gaming system is sorely mistaken. Name these games on the system for ten points each.

1. There are six new boards and, as usual, a boatload of minigames in the eighth iteration of this

series that combines a board game and characters from the Mario universe.

ANSWER: Mario Party (accept Mario Party 8)

2. This game from EA combines both singing via a USB microphone and dancing with the Wii Remote, albeit not particularly well according to most reviewers.

ANSWER: Boogie

3. If all that singing and dancing is too exciting, then try this mini-game compilation that includes such classic favorites as skee-ball, the milk can toss, the shooting gallery, and the dunk tank.

ANSWER: Carnival Games

4. Answer the following about the film career of The Great Gonzo, for ten points each.

1. Besides operating and providing the voice of Gonzo, this puppeteer has also worked behind Dr. Bunsen Honeydew and Zoot.

ANSWER: Dave Goelz

2. Following their success narrating *The Muppet Christmas Carol*, Gonzo and Rizzo the Rat were written in as the best friends of Kevin Bishop's character in this 1996 film starring Tim Curry as a cook turned pirate.

ANSWER: Muppet Treasure Island

3. In this film, Gonzo is a journalist - but not a gonzo journalist - who, along with Kermit and Fozzie, travels to England to interview Lady Holiday, a rich victim of jewel thieves played by Diana Rigg.

ANSWER: *The* Great Muppet Caper

5. A September scandal involving a naked picture appearing on the Internet hasn't seemed to hurt this actress, who will return to play Gabriella Montez in *High School Musical 3*. For ten points each:

1. Name the teen actress depicted in this photo, believed to have been taken for her co-star and boyfriend Zac Efron.

ANSWER: Vanessa Hudgens

2. The scandal didn't prevent Hudgens from signing a million dollar deal to promote this shoe line, previously repped in ads by Ashlie Simpson and Carrie Underwood.

ANSWER: Sketchers

3. Hudgens also landed a deal that will feature her in the upcoming holiday and spring advertising for this designer, who said he was glad that no one had released pictures of him in "all his naked glory." He had enough exposure earlier in the year.

ANSWER: Mark Ecko

6. Identify the following so-called "countryopolitan" artists whose style took over Nashville in the late '70s and early '80s for 10 points each.

1. This youngest sister of Loretta Lynn was one of the major country crossover successes of the late '70s, particularly with her 1978 hit *Don't It Make My Brown Eyes Blue*.

ANSWER: Crystal Gayle

2. Gayle had a hit duet *You And I*, in 1982 with this singer, better known for 1981's *I Love A Rainy Night*.

ANSWER: Eddie Rabbitt

3. In turn, this singer had a hit duet in 1986 with Rabbitt entitled *Both To Each Other (Friends & Lovers)* She's better known for the 1980 crossover hit *Queen of Hearts*.

ANSWER: Juice Newton

7. For ten points each, answer these questions about recent big hits.

1. This 14 time NHRA funny car champ had his car split in two during a race in September, with the front half crossing lanes to hit another car. Thankfully, he was in the back half of the car, and suffered only minor injuries.

ANSWER: John Force

2. At this year's X Games, this Big Air participant suffered a 40 foot fall that knocked both of his shoes off and left him motionless for five minutes. He only suffered a lung contusion and fractured wrist.

ANSWER: Jake Brown

3. This reserve tight end for the Buffalo Bills dropped his head while making a hit in the team's season opener against Denver, suffering a spinal injury that was first called "catastrophic," but from which he has been able to regain significant movement in his arms and legs.

2. The villain in *Zyzzx Road* is played by this man, ubiquitous in war movies - most famously *Black Hawk Down* and *Saving Private Ryan* - and on rap sheets.

ANSWER: Tom Sizemore

3. The *femme fatale* in *Zyzzx Road*, this *Grey's Anatomy* cast member had much more success on the big screen in *Knocked Up*.

2. This Chick tract alleges that role-playing games are fronts for actual covens that teach real black magic spells.

ANSWER: Dark Dungeons

3. The Chick parody *Who Will Be Eaten First*, uses Chick's prose and drawing style to argue that people should worship this fictional alien deity in order to be eaten last when he awakens from the sunken city of R'lyeh.

For 5 points each name the New York Yankee All-Star on base and the movie tough guy, best known for roles in Tarantino films, giving him the advice.

2. This Detroit Tigers star base-stealer of the 1970s was depicted in a biopic called *One in a Million* by Levar Burton, including his incarceration for armed robbery

ANSWER: Ron LeFlore

3. Although later becoming a famous preacher in the early 1900's, this man wasn't against stealing 84 bases in the 1890 campaign for Pittsburgh and Philadelphia

ANSWER: Billy Sunday

12. They've won two Juno Awards, one for a 2006 eponymous album, the other for the album *You Forgot It in People*. For ten points each:

1. Name this Toronto-based indie supergroup.

ANSWER: Broken Social Scene

2. One of the contributors to Broken Social Scene is this singer-songwriter going by only her surname who has a 2007 hit with *1,2,3,4* from her album *The Reminder*.

ANSWER: (Leslie) Feist

3. This band's singer Torquil Campbell and guitarist Amy Milian are also members of the Broken Social Scene collective.

ANSWER: Stars

13. What does Nabisco do when it runs out of new cookie ideas? Modify old ones! Given a list of Nabisco cookie variants, name the one that has NOT been marketed yet, for ten points each.

1. Chips Ahoy!: Butterscotch Chip, Chunky White Fudge, or Candy Blasts.

ANSWER: Butterscotch Chip

2. Oreo: White Fudge Covered, Peanut Butter Creme, or Strawberry Filled.

ANSWER: Strawberry Filled

3. Newtons: Chocolate, Cherries 'n' Cheesecake, or Caramel Apple.

1. One of James' projects was this girl group headed by James' backup singer Joanne McDuffie. They had a R&B hit with *All Night Long* and a Top 10 smash with *In My House*.

ANSWER: Mary Jane Girls

2. James is also responsible for this song, which legend has it was written after someone bet him he couldn't write a hit song in 10 minutes. Thankfully it was the only hit in the short pop music career of comedian Eddie Murphy.

ANSWER: Party All The Time

3. One of the few white women to be consistently successful on the R&B charts in the 1980s, she is best known for her duet with James on *Fire and Desire* and her own 1984 hit song *Lovergirl*.

ANSWER: Teena Marie

16. The question writer spent time in Cornwall this summer, and now you get to suffer, I mean get points, for it. For ten points each:

1. The signature food of Cornwall is this turnover-style pie of meat and veggies that was originally made for tin miners so they didn't have to surface to have a hearty lunch.

ANSWER: pasty

2. As a tourist the Cornish would have referred to me as an "emmet," a word that came to Cornish through an Old English word for this insect, which tourists are said to resemble.

ANSWER: ant

3. I was too late to play this traditional Cornish sport, where two teams try to get a silver and applewood ball over a goal set at a town or parish boundary. It should not be confused with the Gaelic sport of the same name that uses sticks.

18. Answer these related questions about a toy for ten points each.

1. This Hasbro toy is basically a bunch of little colored plastic pegs that you push into a black board, then illuminate from the rear to create a colored pattern.

ANSWER: Lite-Brite

2. Devices similar to a Lite-Brite used to promote this television show caused a bomb scare in Boston when brought to the attention of culturally blind policemen.

ANSWER: Aqua Teen Hunger Force

3. This Japanese equivalent to the Lite-Brite, manufactured by Tomytec, lets users recreate classic video game characters one pixel at a time with colored pegs.

ANSWER: Dot-S

19. Answer these questions about the fictional works of L. Ron Hubbard.

1. This document purporting to be "The New Science of Mental Health" contains information on Engrams and auditing and lays the groundwork for Scientology.

ANSWER: Dianetics

2. Hubbard's most well-known science fictional work is this 1980 work about the Psychlo invasion, made into a 2000 travesty of a film by John Travolta.

ANSWER: Battlefield Earth

3. This ten-part series about the Voltar Confederacy's invasion of earth made the NY Times bestseller list numerous times due to an organized Scientologist campaign, resulting in changes in the NY Times' algorithm.

ANSWER: Mission: Earth

20. Related TV names, for five points each:

1. These two brothers have given PBS four of their most-watched documentary series, with *The Civil War*, *Baseball*, *New York*, and *Jazz*.

ANSWER: Ken Burns and Ric Burns

2. Harry Shearer voices this Captain of Industry in Springfield, as well his assistant, Waylon Smithers.

ANSWER: Montgomery Burns

3. This Ashton Kutcher character helped make "Burn!" into a catchphrase for the early 21st century.

ANSWER: Michael Kelso (accept either)

4. The MASH character Frank Burns was played by these two actors, in the 1970 film and on the TV show from 1972 to 1977.

ANSWER: Robert Duvall and Larry Linville

21. Before OJ Simpson went Hollywood, he was known as a pretty good running back, for ten points each:

1. Simpson was the first running back to top this single season yardage plateau in 1973 for the Buffalo Bills, and the only one to do it in the 14-game-season era.

ANSWER: 2000 yards rushing

2. The success of the Bills running attack in the mid-70's was helped by this powerfully named offensive line including All-Pros Joe DeLamielleure and Reggie McKenzie

ANSWER: The Electric Company

3. Not until this coach's second stint in Buffalo did Simpson get to carry the ball more than 200 times a season, averaging over 21 carries per game from 1972-1975 for this older cousin of the Crimson Tide's current football coach.

ANSWER: Lou Saban

22. In 1999, *You're a Good Man Charlie Brown* was revived on Broadway and featured some now familiar cast members. For ten points each:

1. Sally Brown was the Tony-award winning breakthrough role for this actress who later starred

as Glinda in Wicked.

ANSWER: Kristin Chenoweth

2. This Chinese-American, Law & Order: SVU actor, who won a Best Featured Actor Tony in 1988 for M. Butterfly, played Linus Van Pelt.

ANSWER: B.D. Wong or Bradley Darryl Wong

3. Charlie Brown was played by Anthony Rapp who had previously originated Mark Cohen in this musical, a role he reprised in the 2005 film.

ANSWER: Rent
