Bonuses

1. For ten points each, name the TV shows with these recurring journalistic characters:

1. News is broadcast by the alien Morbo, who has no respect for the species of his human female co-host Linda.

ANSWER: Futurama

2. As his name might suggest, DNN news anchor Howard Handupme was a puppet.

ANSWER: Dinosaurs

3. Teresa Parente seemed to report often on a certain family in her recurring role as Miranda Veracruz de la Jolla Cardinal.

ANSWER: Married... with Children

2. For ten points each, answer these questions on cloaking devices.

1. In the *Star Trek* universe, this race was the first to have demonstrated cloaking technology, as seen in the Original Series episode "Balance of Terror."

ANSWER: Romulans

2. Also known as Project Rainbow, this rumored World War II test, a favored topic of conspiracy theorists, was supposed to provide cloaking for the *USS Eldridge*.

ANSWER: Philadelphia Experiment

3. An invisibility cloak originating with Ignotus Peverell worked its way down to this descendant who later discovers its power alongside the Elder Wand and Resurrection Stone.

ANSWER: Harry Potter

3. Answer the following questions relating to the best-selling live album in British history, U2's *Under A Blood Red Sky*, for ten points each.

1. *Under A Blood Red Sky* is taken from a lyric in this U2 song, inspired by the Solidarity movement in Poland.

ANSWER: New Year's Day

2. *Under A Blood Red Sky* was taken from various 1983 concerts on the tour to support this landmark album, which featured *New Year's Day* as well as *Sunday Bloody Sunday* and *Two Hearts Beat As One*.

ANSWER: War

3. In the United States, U2 released a live version of this song from *Under A Blood Red Sky* as a

single. The original studio version was U2's first showing on the U.S. Hot 100, and the band has played it live more often than any other song.

ANSWER: I Will Follow

4. Name these early '90s movies based on video games from a plotline and actors for ten points each.

1. Bob Hoskins and John Leguizamo are the title characters in this 1993 feature, in which they save Samantha Mathis from the evil reptilian boss Dennis Hopper.

ANSWER: Super Mario Brothers

2. Ming-Na, Kylie Minogue, Roshan Seth, and Wes Studi played some familiar characters in this 1994 flick about a dictator holding Allied Nation relief workers for ransom in Shadaloo. It was the last film of Raul Julia and a star vehicle for Jean-Claude Van Damme.

ANSWER: Street Fighter

3. Talisa Soto, Bridgette Wilson, and Cary-Hiroyuki Tagawa co-star in this 1995 film in which the fate of Earth hinges on a martial arts tournament held on a mysterious island. Christopher Lambert stars as Lord Rayden.

ANSWER: Mortal Kombat

5. Identify the following movies from Alfred Hitchcock's oeuvre, for ten points each.

1. In this film Brandon Shaw and Philip Morgan plan a perfect murder based on the lectures on the art of murder by Rupert Cadell. It was also Hitchcock's first color film.

ANSWER: Rope

2. Adapted from a Leon Uris book, this film is a spy thriller set during the Cold War in New York, Paris and Cuba. Its name is taken from the name of the Soviet spy ring in it.

ANSWER: Topaz

3. It starts with Melanie Daniels looking for a mynah and trying to trick Mitch Brenner, and ends with Lydia, Mitch, Melanie and Cathy driving away in an Aston Martin DB2. In between, there is a birthday party, a bunch of people are attacked, and a gas station blows up.

ANSWER: The Birds

6. Are you a font of information, or do you have a lot of information about fonts? For ten points each we'll find out how well you know your p's and q's.

1. The Museum of Modern Art in New York will conclude a year-long display in March 2008 celebrating this sans-serif typeface created by Max Miedinger. It's the typeface used by Microsoft for their company logo brand.

ANSWER: Helvetica

2. At the end of *Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows*, a page describing the art direction is noted, listing the 12 point size of this typeface being used for the text created by Robert Slimbach while working for a San Jose company

ANSWER: Adobe Garamond

3. This typeface ties together book jackets for *Side Effects* and *Without Feathers*, and title cards for Woody Allen's movies.

ANSWER: Windsor

7. Identify these films featuring the late Bruno Kirby for ten points each.

1. Kirby played a talkative, Sinatra-loving limousine driver in this 1984 mockumentary.

ANSWER: *This is Spinal Tap* (prompt on "Spinal Tap")

2. Kirby played the humor-impaired Lt. Steve Hauk, who was a foil for manic disc jockey Adrian Cronauer, in this 1987 film.

ANSWER: *Good Morning, Vietnam*

3. Kirby's first major role was as a young Peter Clemenza, the man who introduced Vito Corleone to a life of crime in this 1974 movie.

ANSWER: *The Godfather, Part II*

8. For ten points each, answer these questions about Augusta National Golf Course.

1. Among the features named for this member and former US President are one of ten cabins on the course grounds, a pond created from a dam he suggested, and a loblolly pine tree on the 17th hole that he hit so many times when playing he suggested it be cut down.

ANSWER: Dwight D. Eisenhower

2. You can reach the cupola on Augusta's clubhouse through this room, which is offered as accommodations for any amateurs playing in the Masters, who have to be careful not to take a left at the bottom of the stairs, as that's the entrance to the Champions Locker Room.

ANSWER: Crow's Nest

3. This water feature flows at the back of the green on the 11th hole, in front of the green on the 12th, and in front of the tee on the 13th. It is named for a local resident whose house served as the farthest fortress up the Savannah River from Fort Augusta.

ANSWER: Rae's Creek

9. For ten points each, answer these questions about renowned sleazebag Rick Salomon.

2. Created from the Key sought by Glory, she was introduced in the fifth season of *Buffy the Vampire Slayer* and played by Michelle Trachtenberg.

ANSWER: Dawn Summers

3. Amy Yasbeck joined the cast of *Wings* in its last few seasons as this sister of Helen.

ANSWER: Casey Chappel

11. Songs that try to get your attention, for ten points each

1. Andre "Ice Cold" 3000 and his band of video doppelgangers took this Outkast song to the top of the charts in late 2003

ANSWER: Hey Ya!

2. No Doubt collaborated with Bounty Killer on this west-coast version of techno-dancehall, the first single from *Rock Steady*, that allows Gwen Stefani to expound on her bandmates' sexual exploits and rhyme "chamomile" with "sex appeal."

ANSWER: Hey Baby

3. This track by Kanye West found on *Late Registration*, in which Kanye promises to buy a special woman a Jaguar S-Type, sampled Donal Leace's *Today Won't Come Again*. It features John Legend on background vocals.

ANSWER: Hey Mama

12. Angry Young Man over 50 and the 40-ish laid-back woman who loves him, for ten points each

1. He opened for Bob Dylan on eleven dates in an early Fall 2007 tour of the South and New England. Extra exposure came weekly in the Summer as one of his songs from 1977's *My Aim is*

True was used as the theme to the PBS show *History Detectives*.

ANSWER: Elvis Costello or Declan Patrick MacManus

2. She gave birth to Dexter and Frank, Costello's two youngest children last December. She returned to touring in Summer 2007 to support her new release, *From This Moment On*

ANSWER: Diana Krall

3. Krall and Costello defended their ads for this automaker by stating that they were able to select music by their idols to display on the luxury sound system of the car they were shilling in separate ads.

ANSWER: Lexus

1. For ten points each, name either the first three Magic expansions to be released, or the latest three Magic expansions to be released. Pick one or the other.

14. Answer the following about the Summers bloodline, for ten points each.

1. Along with his brother Havoc, this X-Man is perhaps one of the most recognizable members of the Summers bloodline, what with the ruby-colored concussive blasts he shoots from his eyes.

ANSWER: Cyclops or Scott

2. It turns out that all that hype about a third Summers brother was true when Vulcan (Gabriel Summers) turned up as another son of Christopher Summers, their father, who is better known by this name he uses whilst leading the Starjammers.

ANSWER: Corsair

3. Encouraged to work by En Sabah Nur in England in the late 1800s, immortal master geneticist Nathaniel Essex, better known by this moniker, was instrumental in shaping the Summers bloodline.

ANSWER: Mr. Sinister

15. Name these food dishes with something in common, for ten points each.

1. This very light and fluffy, buttery, layer cake requires egg whites to be whipped until they are stiff and may have gotten its name as a contrast to a richer, heavier, and darker cake.

ANSWER: angel food cake

2. The basis for this appetizer could date back to early Rome, and involves combining egg yolks with mayonnaise, mustard, and any of several other spices before replacing them in the hard-boiled egg whites.

ANSWER: deviled eggs

3. This candy, fudge or ice cream is usually made with chocolate chips, walnuts or pecans, and miniature marshmallows.

ANSWER: heavenly hash

16. For ten points each, name these members of the seemingly neo-Raider Cincinnati Bengals:

1. The poster boy for the Bengals character woes is this wide receiver with at least five different arrests whose legal problems got him an eight-game suspension for 2007.

ANSWER: Chris Henry

2. This Florida State linebacker, who had been arrested on sexual assault and burglary charges while in colleges, was arrested for burglary and grand theft in June 2006, shortly after the Bengals chose him in the 5th round of the NFL Draft.

ANSWER: A.J. Nicholson

3. A 2006 boating while intoxicated charge mars the record of this offensive lineman, whose seven-year, \$49.5 million dollar free agent signing with the Browns made him the highest paid guard in NFL history.

ANSWER: Eric Steinbach

17. Answer these questions about one of the worst movies of 2006, for ten points each.

1. In this disastrous remake of a 1970s British cult classic, Nicholas Cage plays a cop brought to a remote island inhabited by a bizarre matriarchal pagan cult to search for a missing girl. Unintentional hilarity ensues.

ANSWER: *The Wicker Man*

2. The *Wicker Man* remake actually has two Oscar winners in its cast, Cage and this five-time nominee, who is such an awards magnet that she was once Emmy-nominated for a role in which she only had 14 seconds of screen time.

ANSWER: Ellen Burstyn

3. For 5 points each, Burstyn and Cage respectively occupy roles originally played by these two men - one among the most prolific villains of horror and fantasy films, the other best known to Americans as the star of the TV series *The Equalizer*.

ANSWER: Christopher Lee and Edward Woodward

18. They recently made a return to consoles with the release of a PS3 game subtitled *Future: Tools of Destruction*. Non-gamers may be familiar with the zany commercials for their games which include real-life demonstrations of bizarre weapons. For ten points each:

1. Name this destructive duo made up of a cat-like Lombax and a robot buddy.

ANSWER: Ratchet and Clank

2. The third game in the *Ratchet & Clank* series, this PS2 follow-up to *Going Commando* was the first in the series to feature online play as well as a naughty pun in the subtitle.

ANSWER: *Ratchet & Clank: Up Your Arsenal*

3. The main releases in the series each feature a new iteration of this powerful weapon with a clever acronym for a name that launches multiple homing rockets.

ANSWER: RYNO or Rip You a New One

19. It includes three members each from the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Conference, the MAC, and the Big Ten. For ten points each:

1. Name this mostly midwestern hockey-only conference.

ANSWER: Central Collegiate Hockey Association or CCHA

2. This is the only conference member to have never won a CCHA regular season or tournament title.

ANSWER: University of Alaska Fairbanks Nanooks

3. With 11 titles, this reigning NCAA champion has won the CCHA tournament the most times.

ANSWER: Michigan State University Spartans

20. For ten points each, name these breeds of cat.

1. This breed developed through years of harsh New England winters. Its large size - an average of 13 to 20 pounds - is not due to breeding with the animal that makes up part of its name.

ANSWER: Maine coon cat

2. This cat hails from the plateau region of its namesake country, though crossbreeding of Angoras and British longhairs has confused their origin. They are known for their dense coat, flat faces, and green to blue-green eye color.

ANSWER: Persian

3. This Asian breed has dark points on its ears, paws, snout, and tail and almond-shaped eyes. Its extroverted temperament is at odds with the best known pop culture example of them, the troublesome duo that live with Aunt Sara in *The Lady and the Tramp*.

ANSWER: Siamese

2. Also the "Snack Fairy" in Nabisco ads, this comedian is the host of Global's "Are You Smarter Than a Canadian 5th Grader?"

ANSWER: Colin Mochrie

3. Wayne Brady has to sing along with amateur karaoke buffs on this Fox game show that challenges contestants to remember the words to classic pop songs.

ANSWER: Don't Forget The Lyrics!

4. *Whose Line* regular Greg Proops hosted this Comedy Central quiz show that pitted two groups of unlike people against each other.

ANSWER: Vs.

22. For five points each, name the two teams involved in the following one game playoffs in Major League Baseball.

1. 2007, for the National League wild card spot.

ANSWER: San Diego Padres, Colorado Rockies

2. 1995, for the American League West title.

ANSWER: Seattle Mariners, California Angels

3. 1948, the first-ever one game playoff for the AL pennant.

ANSWER: Cleveland Indians, Boston Red Sox (prompt on Boston)
