4. IN THE 1884 PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION, THEY DESERTED THE REPUBLICAN CANDIDATE, JAMES G. BLAINE, AND SUPPORTED THE DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATE GROVER CLEVELAND. FOR 10 POINTS—NAME THIS 1880S U.S. POLITICAL FACTION COMPOSED OF INDEPENDENT REPUBLICANS.

FOR 10 POINTS—NAME THIS FOLK SINGER WHO SPENT MUCH OF THE LATE 1980S AS A BORN-AGAIN CHRISTIAN.

6. GEORGE WILLIG, A TOY DESIGNER, WAS FINED ONE CENT FOR EACH STORY OF THIS BUILDING IN 1977. THAT'S THE PENALTY HE RECEIVED WHEN HE CLIMBED—FOR 10 POINTS—THE MINORU YAMASAKI-DESIGNED SOUTH TOWER OF WHAT 110 STORY BUILDING IN NEW YORK CITY?
