Jack Black has a cameo in this film as a motorcyclist who kicks a (\*) dog named Baxter off a bridge; Baxter returns to save his owner from being mauled by a bear. Brian Fantana demos a cologne that smells like gasoline in this film, whose protagonist is fired after the words on a teleprompter are changed by Veronica Corningstone. For 10 points, name this 2004 film starring Will Ferrell as the news reporter Ron Burgundy. ANSWER: Anchorman: The Legend of Ron Burgundy <Golden>

- 8. This man raps "I'll do the time, but her love is timeless" in a song whose chorus claims "We can hear the angels calling us." In another song, he describes a girl who "had a lot of crooks trying to steal your heart." In 2016, this rapper of "Mrs. Officer" and (\*) "How to Love" announced his retirement after Cash Money Records delayed the release of the fifth album to be titled for his last name. The third of those albums featured "A Milli" and a #1 hit named for a candy. Dwayne Carter is better known as, for 10 points, what rapper of "Lollipop"? ANSWER: Lil Wayne [or Weezy; accept Dwayne Michael Carter, Jr.] < Golden>
- 9. The shape of this object was changed after its first appearance due to complaints from MLJ Magazines. The Serpent snapped this object in half in the 2011 Fear Itself storyline. In another story, Nebula reconstructs this object after it is shattered by Thanos. Franklin (\*) Roosevelt may have given this object to its user, who can ensure it will return to him after throwing it due to intelligence granted by a super serum. Wakandan vibranium was used to make, for 10 points, what round object wielded by Steve Rogers, a patriotic superhero? ANSWER: Captain America's shield [accept similar answers like Cap's shield or other forms; prompt on just "shield"] <Nelson>
- 10. A TV series about this character depicts her interactions with the attractive church guitarist Owen Trent. One work by this character shouts out, among others, German DJ Flula Borg and Our Second Life's Ricky Dillon. A "magic trick" performed during this (\*) woman's live performances involves performing while being stabbed in the neck. The David Cross-played (\*) Tobias Funke on Arrested Development attempts to join this troupe, which performs at New York's Astor Place Theatre and uses plastic tubes as instruments. For 10 points, name this "group" that performs in black outfits and colorful body paint. ANSWER: Blue Man Group [accept just Blue Man after "group"] <Nelson>

1. The TV sitcom *Two Guys and a Girl* starred a number of people who went on to greater success. For 10 points each:

[10] One of the title "Guys" was played by this man, who has since played superheroes in the maligned *Green Lantern* film and the not-at-all maligned 2016 hit *Deadpool*.

ANSWER: Ryan [Rodney] Reynolds

[10] This actor, who has had starring roles on *Castle* and *Firefly*, was a member of the show's cast beginning in the second season.

ANSWER: Nathan Fillion

[10] The "Girl" in the show was played by Traylor Howard, who is best known as Natalie Teeger, an assistant to the title detective on this former USA series.

ANSWER: Monk < Nelson>

- 2. Due to their father's relentless originality, this novel's Curtis brothers are given the first names Ponyboy and Sodapop. For 10 points each:
- [10] Name this young-adult novel by S.E. Hinton about a group of kids who, according to its title, just don't fit in.

ANSWER: The **Outsiders**

[10] This 9-person mask-wearing metal band, who moved to the mansion to record *Vol. 3: The Subliminal Verses*, is one of several groups who later claimed the mansion was haunted.

[10] The Mansion is owned by this prolific and legendary producer, known for co-founding Def Jam Records, as well as for his long hair and beard.

4. For 10 points each, answer the following about the Disney Renaissance, which began in 1989: [10] It featured three films that all set box-office records for animated films, including this 1992 movie set in Agrabah and based on one of the *Arabian Nights* stories.

ANSWER: Aladdin

[10] 1999, the last year of the Renaissance, saw the release of *Fantasia 2000* and this film, for which Phil Collins won an Oscar for the song "You'll Be in My Heart."

ANSWER: Candace [Nicole] Parker < Golden>

- 6. For 10 points each, answer the following about albums that hipster music outlet Pitchfork Media named among 2016's best:
- [10] This band fronted by Thom Yorke released *A Moon Shaped Pool* in 2016, which Pitchfork ranked as the year's 10th best. Their other albums include *OK Computer*.

ANSWER: Radiohead

[10] Its number one album was *A Seat at the Table*, released by this R&B singer whose older sister is a major superstar. Songs on the album include "Cranes in the Sky."

ANSWER: **Diners, Drive-Ins, and Dives** [prompt on "triple d"]<Vopava>

12. In the early 1990s, id ["idd"] Software released multiple first-person shooters that brought the genre to the mainstream. For 10 points each:

[10] The first such game was this one, whose final boss was a mechanical Adolf Hitler. It has seen sporadic sequels since, including 2014's *The New Order*.

ANSWER: Wolfenstein 3D

[10] Following the success of *Wolfenstein 3D*, id released this far more violent follow-up, which centered on an unnamed marine. A reboot of this game with the same name was released in 2016.

ANSWER: **Doom** 

[10] The first portions of both *Wolfenstein 3D* and *Doom* were released as free demos via gaming magazines, a practice common at the time. The tactic was known by this rhyming portmanteau.

[10] Redmayne stars as Hufflepuff alumnus Newt Scamander [skuh-MAN-der] in this 2016 film.

ANSWER: Fantastic Beasts and Where to Find Them [prompt on partial answers]

[10] At the start of *Fantastic Beasts*, Newt's case of magical creatures is misplaced following an incident involving one of these cute, treasure-loving creatures.

ANSWER: <u>niffler</u>s <Vopava>

14. For 10 points each, answer the following about odd celebrations players made during the 2016 NFL season:

[10] This third-year wide receiver for the New York Giants hugged the kicking net after scoring his first touchdown of the season; a week later he proposed to it.

ANSWER: Odell [Cornelious] **Beckham** Jr. [prompt on "OBJ"]

[10] Josh Norman, a cornerback for this team, was fined \$10,000 for shooting an imaginary bow-and-arrow after an interception. This team's other players include Ryan Kerrigan and Matt Jones.

ANSWER: Washington Redskins [accept either]

[10] In the first week of the season, Steelers wide receiver Antonio Brown was fined over \$12,000 for performing this specific action, which probably hit peak popularity in 2013.

ANSWER: twerking [accept word forms] <Golden>

15. For 10 points each, give these films that rank in the Top 10 of the American Bar Association's list of the greatest courtroom films of all time:

18. Among baseball's best and weirdest traditions is the act of making mascots race each other between innings. For 10 points each:

[10] This NL Central team has a "Sausage Race" at each of its home games, which are played at Miller Park. In 2003, an opposing player hit one of the sausages with a bat.

ANSWER: Milwaukee Brewers [accept either]

[10] Inspired by Milwaukee's Sausage Races, the Pittsburgh Pirates created a race that pits these Eastern European dumplings against each other. Its contestants include Potato Pete and Sauerkraut Saul.

[10] For a brief time, the Giants raced oversized versions of these souvenirs; the Giants were the first team to give these things way in 1999 when they produced one depicting Willie Mays.

19. Several 2016 video games were set in reasonably faithful re-creations of real U.S. cities. For 10 points each:

[10] The second release in this open-world series features a re-creation of San Francisco, while its first release did the same for Chicago. Both games heavily feature hacking.

#### ANSWER: Watch Dogs [accept Watch Dogs 2]
