- 3. A parody of this song, in which the performer claims "I'm like 8 foot 4, blond hair to the floor" was made with T-Pain for the 2009 CMT Music Awards. A 2020 re-recorded version of this song, which was made to circumvent the original's masters being sold by Big Machine Records, debuted in 2020 in a commercial for the dating app Match. Both Martin Johnson and Joe Jonas are rumored to be the addressee of this song, whose protagonist (*) "snuck out to the garden to see you" and notes "we were both young when I first saw you." In *The Man with the Golden Arm*, Frank Sinatra plays an ex-addict who aspires to this profession. In a 2020 film, a man with this profession named Ruben Stone deals with losing his (*) hearing and is played by Riz Ahmed. A student of this profession is asked by an abusive instructor if he is "rushing or dragging" in an intense scene from a Damien Chazelle film that earned an Oscar for actor J. K. Simmons. 5. After being invited by Margaret Neil, the protagonist of this series is appalled by the vapidness of a party thrown by the Apple Pi club. A model in this series named Cleo describes herself as vacant while conversing at the home of Benny Watts. As a child, this show's protagonist steals (*) magazines from a corner store, bonds with William Shaibel, a custodian, and develops an addiction to green tranquilizer pills, which enhance her ability to visualize a competitive activity. Beth Harmon is played by Anya Taylor-Joy in, for 10 points, what Netflix series about a young chess prodigy? ANSWER: *The Queen's Gambit* <Nelson>

6. The text "if she does not want to dance with you, respect it" appears at the end of a music video by this artist in which he performed in drag; that music video is for his song whose title means "I Dance Alone." This man released three albums in 2020, including a compilation album that included "En Casita" and the studio album YHLQMDLG, which features the song (*) "Vete." The album Oasis was a collaboration between J. Balvin and this artist, who both also appeared on Cardi B's "I Like it." Drake was featured on "Mia," a song by, for 10 points, what Puerto Rican rapper with an animal-themed stage name?

ANSWER: **Bad Bunny** [accept Benito Antonio **Martínez** Ocasio] < Andert>

- 7. A member of this group is replaced by an impostornamed Ricardo Jones in the storyline "This Man ... This Monster." Jack Kirby effectively ripped off his own series *Challengers of the Unknown* when co-creating this group. This group's base of operations, whose location on 42nd Street is unusually known to the public, is known as the (*) Baxter Building. A mishap during an experimental space flight gave superpowers to this group, which includes a man who activates his powers by shouting "Flame on!" Realmuto in 2018 and Sandy Alcantara the following year. 2020 marked the first time this team *lost* a (*) playoff series, as their prior two playoff berthsended in World Series wins, most recently in 2003. Giancarlo Stanton began his career with this team, whose star pitching prospect José Fernández died in a 2016 boat crash. A ballpark whose backstop contains fish tanks is appropriately the home of, for 10 points, what team based in south Florida? ANSWER: Miami Marlins [accept either; accept Florida Marlins] <Nelson>
- 9. After being drugged by Dr. Krieger, Cheryl hallucinates that this scenario is occurring in a third season episode of *Archer*. This scenario is central to the game "True American," which is played by characters on *New Girl*. Rutledge Wood hosted a 2020 Netflix (*) game show centered around this scenario, whose winners received a lamp for traversing areas named "Bedroom" and "Kitchen" that are made unusually perilous. The *Community* episode "Geothermal Escapism" depicts a large-scale application of, for 10 points, what activity whose participants must avoid the ground?

It is implied that this character is not seen while atop a large tree playing an acorn flute by Tatsuo. This character is able to fly by using a magical (*) top. Seeds wrapped in a bamboo leaf are given by this character in exchange for replacing a leaf on his head with an umbrella. In a film named for him, this character helps Satsuki to find Mei by summoning a Catbus. The mascot of Studio Ghibli is, for 10 points, what character referred to in a film as "My Neighbor"? ANSWER: <u>Totoro</u> [accept: *My Neighbor <u>Totoro</u>*] <Weiner>

- 11. An RPG series starring this character inspired a spin-off starring the character Tron Bonne. A truly terrible box art featuring this character was emulated in a 2008 game that was the ninth game of the original series named for him. This character was illustrated by Keiji Inafune, whose game *Mighty* (*) *No. 9* was largely based on him. Later games starring this character feature the dog Rush, who can act as a springboard. - 13. An extended solo on this instrument occurs about halfway through "Long Train Runnin" by the Doobie Brothers. The lyric "The road is long / With many a winding turn" follows this instrument's wistful melody that typically begins "He Ain't Heavy, He's My Brother." The long-used closing theme to Sesame Street featured (*) Toots Thielemans' playing of this instrument. "Karma Chameleon" opens with a wild solo on this instrument, which appears prominently in Neil Young's "Heart of Gold." - 14. This actress served as the narrator for the 2020 Apple TV+ short film, Here We Are: Notes for Living on Planet Earth. In a 2020 film, this actress played Alice Hughes, who travels to Britain to receive a literary prize aboard a cruise ship. This star of (*) Let Them All Talk played the narcissistic Broadway star Dee Dee Allen who travels with the James Corden-played Barry Glickman to Edgewater, Indiana in The Prom. This woman earned a third acting Oscar for performance as Margaret Thatcher. The Iron Lady starred, for 10 points, what actress who has been nominated for an Oscar a record 21 times? ANSWER: Meryl Streep [or Mary Louise Streep] <Weiner>
- 15. This college's most recent football championship was largely sealed on a long touchdown pass from Tee Martin to Peerless Price. This team plays a rival to its south in a game named for when it is held, the "Third Saturday in October." In 1988, head coach Johnny Majors invented this team's namesake "Walk" where players walk through fans into Neyland Stadium while their band plays (*) "Rocky Top". Before settling on Ole Miss, Leigh Anne Tuohy (TOO-ee) encourages Michael Oher ("oar") to attend this school in *The Blind Side* before clarifying "I will not wear that gaudy orange." Peyton Manning attended, for 10 points, what SEC school that plays home games in Knoxville?

ANSWER: University of **Tennessee Volunteers** [accept either; accept **Vols**; prompt on "UT"] <Andert>

- 16. In 2019, a makeup kit named for this figure was found to contain asbestos, leading it to be recalled from Claire's. An uplifting song by this person describes life as "sweet, sweeter than you think." This figure co-starred with Jace Norman in *Blurt!*, a TV movie made as part of her deal with (*) Nickelodeon. This person, who came out to the LGBT community in 2021, sang "won't let the haters get their way" in the anti-bulying song "Boomerang." Enormous hair bows are typically worn by, for 10 points, YouTube star who appeared with her mother Jessalyn on *Dance Moms?* ANSWER: JoJo <u>Siwa</u> (SEE-wah) [or Joelle Joanie <u>Siwa</u>] <Nelson>
- 17. While on a road trip to receive laser eye surgery, two members of this group bond over doing K-pop dances. At the last moment, the head of this organization smartly swaps out a shoddy new formula supplied by the Elizabeth Holmes-inspired Edison Jaymes. At a hearing, this organization is questioned for its decision to spend \$30,000 to (*) transport an orange. Mark Naird leads this organization, which is the subject of a show that re-united *The Office* writer Greg Daniels with one of that show's stars. A general played by Steve Carell is the head of, for 10 points, what fictional organization based on a real military branch created in 2019?

- 18. In the 2015 playoffs, this NBA player committed a record 13 turnovers in a game. An assistant coach claimed that this player turned his team's culture into "an organized AAU team" shortly after he delayed his arrival to 2020 training camp to go to (*) Lil Baby's birthday party. In 2012, the pick that became Steven Adams was one of several assets traded for this player. In 2021, Jarrett Allen and Caris LeVert were dealt in a trade centered on this man, which united him with Kyrie Irving and Kevin Durant. "If the devil is six, then God is seven" is repeated in a verse of a Pixies song partially titled for one of these animals. A Foo Fighters song with this animal in the title begins by asking (*) "What have we done with innocence?" A band named for these animals claimed "I thought love was only true in fairy tales" in a song that later exclaimed "and then I saw her face." 20. This actor played the seedy filmmaker McCarthy in *The Brave*, a controversial Johnny Depp film that was never released in America. Madam Tussauds's official waxwork of this actor stands next to a Triumph motorcycle, evoking his iconic role in *The Wild One*. Sacheen (sah-sheen) Littlefeather was booed when she announced this actor's (*) refusal of his Best Actor Oscar in 1973. One character played by this actor takes a series of requests on the day of his daughter Connie's wedding. The line "I coulda been a contender!" was uttered in the film *On the Waterfront* by, for 10 points, what actor who played Don Corleone in *The Godfather*?

ANSWER: Marlon **Brando** (Jr.) < Vopava>

1. In lieu of enjoying the spoils of their robber baron forebears, the Vanderbilt family has decided to corner pop culture instead. For 10 points each:

[10] This white-haired, openly gay journalist is the son of Gloria Vanderbilt. His Facebook Watch program *Full Circle* has a title that alludes to his CNN show *360*.

ANSWER: Anderson (Hays) Cooper

[10] In 2020 Vanderbilt descendant Timothy Olyphant debuted the role of this dashing lawman on *The Mandalorian* who hopes to hunt down the krayt ("crate") dragon.

ANSWER: Cobb Vanth [accept either underlined portion; accept The Marshal]

[10] James Vanderbilt wrote the screenplay for this 2007 true-crime thriller starring Jake Gyllenhaal as Robert Graysmith that critics have unanimously praised in recent years.

ANSWER: **Zodiac** < Vopava>

2. In this film's climax, countless scenarios like "U.S.S.R. First Strike" and "Far East Strategy" flash across screens, each giving the same result: "Winner: none." For 10 points each:

[10] Name this 1983 thriller about a teenage hacker who accidentally and unwittingly accesses WOPR ("Whopper"), NORAD's new nuclear defense supercomputer.

ANSWER: WarGames

[10] David, the protagonist of WarGames, was the breakout role for this actor, who went on to star in Ladyhawke and Ferris Bueller's Day Off.

ANSWER: Matthew **Broderick**

[10] David is able to teach the WOPR computer the futility of nuclear war by making it play this simple game, which almost always ends in a tie if each side knows basic strategy.

ANSWER: <u>tic-tac-toe</u> <Vopava>

- 3. The fact that players can not take this action in *The Division II* inspired a Twitter account that has gained nearly half a million followers since 2019. For 10 points each:
- [10] Name this wholesome video game action, which fortunately can be done in Far Cry: New Dawn and Red Dead Redemption II.

ANSWER: petting a dog [accept Can You Pet The Dog]

[10] Among the most notable games in which you can pet a dog is this 2000 PC hit, in which player characters are marked with a green gem over their heads.

ANSWER: The **Sims**

[10] In September 2020, a compilation of games in which you can pet the dog was released by this altruistic website, in which similar packages are sold to raise money for charity.

ANSWER: Humble Bundle < Nelson>

4. Jimmy Needles and Gene Smith coached the United States' team to a gold medal in basketball in the first year in which it was an Olympic sport. For 10 points each:

[10] Those Olympics were held in this year. The games of this year were filmed by Leni Riefenstahl (LEN-ee REEF-en-stahl).

ANSWER: 1936

[10] The United States team were awarded their gold medals by this Canadian-born inventor of basketball.

ANSWER: James Naismith

[10] The captain of the US team, Joe Fortenberry, is credited with being the first person to take this action in a basketball game. Lisa Leslie was the first woman to do this in the WNBA.

ANSWER: slam <u>dunk</u> <Maharjan>

5. After being inexplicably criticized for doing this on live television, a noted performer tweeted "can't believe I am the first woman ever." For 10 points each:

[10] Name this destructive but very cool action that a musician may take at the end of a raucous concert. In part because he used cheap instruments, Nirvana's Kurt Cobain did this very frequently.

ANSWER: **smashing** a **guitar** [accept reasonable equivalents of this; prompt on less specific answers like destroying an instrument]

[10] This singer, whose 2020 album *Punisher* brought her universal acclaim, smashed a guitar after performing "I Know the End" on *SNL* in January 2021, sparking a sexist backlash.

ANSWER: Phoebe (Lucille) **Bridgers**

[10] Observers of the backlash rightly noted that the same criticism would be ridiculous if applied to this male guitarist, who formed a namesake band with David Lee Roth. He died of a stroke in October 2020.

ANSWER: Eddie <u>Van Halen</u> [or Edward Lodewijk <u>Van Halen</u>] < Vopava>

6. The documentary *Long Shot* shows how the LAPD framed Juan Catalan for murder until his lawyer spotted him in footage shot for this TV series, thus proving his alibi. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this comedy series that initially ran from 2000 to 2011 on HBO. Its protagonist is a fictionalized version of the creator of *Seinfeld*.

ANSWER: Curb Your Enthusiasm

[10] This creator and star of *Curb Your Enthusiasm* appears in *Long Shot* and remarks that he tells the Juan Catalan story at a party every year or so.

ANSWER: Larry **David** [or Lawrence Gene **David**]

[10] The footage in question was shot at an L.A. Dodgers game for an episode named for this specific type of location, which Larry uses to get to the game by hiring a sex worker.

ANSWER: <u>car pool</u> lane [accept close equivalents, such as <u>HOV</u> lane or <u>High Occupancy Vehicle</u> lane; prompt on "freeway" or "highway" or "interstate"]

7. "Filmmaker" Paul W. S. Anderson is widely known for his garbage video game adaptations starring his wife Milla Jovovich and very little else. For 10 points each:

[10] The best known of Anderson's bad video game movies is his series based on this popular Capcom horror franchise. The films' subtitles include "Extinction" and "Afterlife."

ANSWER: Resident Evil

[10] The most recent of Anderson's game adaptations is this 2020 kaiju film in which a group of soldiers is pulled into the "New World" inhabited by large, deadly creatures.

ANSWER: Monster Hunter

[10] Although not based on a video game, Anderson's 2004 film about one of these creatures fighting the Predator was also horrendous. In their first appearance, one of these characters is killed by Ellen Ripley.

ANSWER: aliens [or Xenomorph XX121 or Internecivus raptus] < Weiner>

8. Two quick exhales are followed by five hip pops at the end of this dance. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this dance invented by young choreographer Jalaiah Harmon. It is performed to the song "Lottery" by K-Camp, whose lyrics repeat this dance's name.

ANSWER: Renegade

[10] Renegade is one of the many dances that became famous thanks to this video-sharing social network. A ban of this app in the U.S. was considered in late 2020 due to national security concerns.

ANSWER: TikTok

[10] Even though Harmon created it, much of the credit for the Renegade was often wrongly credited to this other influencer, who performed it in early 2020. She is by far the most followed person on TikTok with over 100 million followers.

ANSWER: Charli **D'Amelio** < Andert>

9. For 10 points each, answer the following about the soundtrack to *Bee Movie*:

[10] A cover of "Here Comes the Sun" by this singer of "Every Day Is a Winding Road" and "Soak Up the Sun" plays in the background of Barry's first expedition with the pollen jocks.

ANSWER: Sheryl (Suzanne) Crow

[10] The first song to be played in the *Bee Movie* is this traditional song composed by Edward Elgar, which is played for Barry B. Benson and the rest of the graduating class of 9:15.

ANSWER: "Pomp and Circumstance"

[10] The song "Sugar Sugar", which was performed by this fictitious band, plays in the background of a montage in which Barry B. Benson and Vanessa have a picnic and fly together. Kevin Keller plays bass for this band in an episode of *Riverdale*.

ANSWER: The **Archies** < Andert>

10. Cordarrelle (kor-"DARE"-ull) Patterson recorded the longest play in NFL history while playing this position. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this position also played by Josh Cribbs and Leon Washington. Unlike a similar position, people in this role typically do not call for a "fair catch."

ANSWER: kick returner [prompt on return specialist, do not accept or prompt on "punt returner"]

[10] Patterson's record-setting 109-yard kick return was achieved as a member of this team. The previous year, Adrian Peterson rushed for over 2,000 yards while playing for this team.

ANSWER: Minnesota Vikings

[10] Although he only returned one kick for a touchdown against the Vikings, this former Bears return specialist scored 10 of his 37 total touchdowns against them. He also returned the opening kick of Super Bowl XLI (41) for a touchdown.

ANSWER: Devin Hester [or Devin Devorris Hester Sr.] < Andert>

11. After playing Hannah Baker on 13 Reasons Why, Katherine Langford has appeared in several critically acclaimed films. For 10 points each:

[10] Langford's first film appearance was in this 2018 dramedy starring Nick Robinson as the title closeted teenager who emails an anonymous gay classmate. A similarly titled spinoff named for Victor premiered on Hulu in 2020.

ANSWER: <u>Love, Simon</u> [do not accept or prompt on "Love, Victor"]

[10] Langford made her most recent cinematic appearance as Mara Carlyle in this 2020 black comedy in which students at a high school suddenly start exploding.

ANSWER: Spontaneous

[10] Langford's best-known cinematic role is likely as Meg, a member of the Thrombey family in this 2019 Rian Johnson whodunit comedy starring Daniel Craig and Ana de Armas.

ANSWER: *Knives Out* < Weiner>

12. In *The Kid Who Ran for President*, 12-year-old Judson Moon runs on a platform of bringing world peace, rescuing the environment, and taking this specific action. For 10 points each:

[10] Describe this action, which precedes professional baseball games. George W. Bush famously performed this action in Yankee Stadium before Game 3 of the 2001 World Series.

ANSWER: throwing the first pitch at a baseball game [accept equivalents like ceremonial first pitch]

[10] The Kid Who Ran for President is written by this author, who also wrote The Homework Machine, Getting Air, and The Million Dollar Shot.

ANSWER: Dan Gutman

[10] The rivalry between A.J. and Andrea Young is the focus of this other Dan Gutman series. It is set at Ella Mentry School, and it includes the stories "Miss Daisy is Crazy!" and "Mr. Klutz is Nuts!"

ANSWER: *My Weird School* < Andert>

13. In 1987, this player and his brother Bill became the first baseball-playing siblings to be managed by their father. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this shortstop, who played an incredible 2,632 consecutive games between 1981 and 1998.

ANSWER: Cal Ripken Jr. [or Calvin Edwin Ripken Jr.]

[10] Ripken spent his entire career with this team, whose Camden Yards is built over the former yard of the B&O Railroad.

ANSWER: **Baltimore Orioles** [accept either]

[10] During his streak, Ripken set the record for home runs by a shortstop, passing this long-time NL star who popularized the saying "It's a beautiful day for a ballgame. Let's play two!" His nicknames included "Mr. Sunshine."

ANSWER: Ernie **Banks** [or Ernest **Banks**] <Nelson>

14. 70 percent of respondents to this service's Oscars and Super Bowl ads said they thought it was a food-delivery service. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this short-lived mobile streaming service, whose content was notably delivered via episodes under 10 minutes in length.

ANSWER: Quibi [prompt on Quick Bites]

[10] One of Quibi's gimmicks was that its content was viewable in *both* of these two standard viewing modes on mobile devices.

ANSWER: **portrait** and **landscape** [accept answers in either order]

[10] Quibi was co-founded by former Ebay CEO Meg Whitman and this man who led Disney through its "Renaissance." He is also the "K" in the company name DreamWorks SKG.

ANSWER: Jeffrey Katzenberg < Maharjan >

15. This rapper claimed his ideas were "nightmares to white parents" in a song featuring a guitar solo by Joe Perry. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this rapper who sampled Aerosmith's "Dream On" in his song "Sing For The Moment." His other hits include "Lose Yourself."

ANSWER: Eminem [accept Marshall Bruce Mathers III]

[10] This rap group and Aerosmith try to outplay each other in the music video to their version of Aerosmith's song "Walk This Way".

ANSWER: Run-DMC

[10] The lyric "I kept the right ones out, and let the wrong ones in" from the Aerosmith song "Amazing" was sampled in this rapper's song "Dreams." This rapper featured on Justin Bieber's song "As Long As You Love Me."

ANSWER: Big Sean [accept Sean Michael-Leonard Anderson] < Maharjan>

16. At these Olympic Games, speed skater Eric Heiden became the only winter athlete to win five gold medals in one year. For 10 points each:

ANSWER: 1980 Winter Olympics [prompt on partial answers or on Lake Placid]

[10] The U.S. did not win the gold medal by defeating the Soviet Union; instead, they had to beat this country two days after the Miracle on Ice. Tuuka Rask (TOO-kuh rask) and Teemu Selänne (TEE-moo seh-LAH-nee) are from this country.

ANSWER: Finland

[10] This captain of the U.S. men's hockey team scored the game-winning goal in the "Miracle on Ice" game. He sold much of his memorabilia from the game, including the jersey he wore, at a 2013 auction.

ANSWER: Mike **Eruzione** [er-oo-zee-OH-nee] <Andert>

17. For 10 points each, answer the following about people surnamed McElroy (MACK-il-roy) whose first names are *not* Clint, Travis, Justin, or Griffin:

[10] This McIlroy, who spells his surname with an *i*, is a highly successful PGA champion and hails from Northern Ireland.

ANSWER: Rory McIlroy

[10] Jerome McElroy is the real name of this character on *South Park* who was humiliatingly killed off after his voice actor, Isaac Hayes, objected to the show's criticisms of Scientology.

ANSWER: Chef

[10] The cruel bully Rex McElroy is killed by a mob in a small Missouri town in this 2019 Sundance true crime series, which is titled for the townsfolks' unbelievable collective alibi.

ANSWER: **No One Saw a Thing** < Vopava>

18. The performer of this song proudly exclaims "No I'm no-one's wife, but oh I love my life" before repeating the song's title. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this song that Catherine Zeta-Jones performs at the start of a 2003 film. Its title is sometimes used as slang for "and other, similar things."

ANSWER: "All That Jazz"

[10] "All That Jazz" is the opening number of this musical about the fame-hungry murderer Roxie Hart, who does crimes in the title city.

ANSWER: *Chicago*

[10] A film titled *All That Jazz* was directed by this famed choreographer and dancer, who choreographed *Chicago*'s original Broadway production. His relationship with Gwen Verdon was the subject of a 2019 TV series

ANSWER: Bob <u>Fosse</u> (FOSS-ee) [or Robert Louis <u>Fosse</u>] <Vopava>

19. For 10 points each, answer the following about the acting career of Taraji P. Henson:

[10] In her most prominent role, Henson played Katherine Johnson in this 2016 movie about the unsung work of female Black mathematicians at NASA.

ANSWER: Hidden Figures

[10] In the TV show *Empire*, Henson's character manages the career of Jamal, a gay hip-hop artist played by Jussie Smollet. This character is the wife of hip-hop mogul Lucious Lyon.

ANSWER: **Cookie** Lyon [or **Loretha** Lyon; prompt on Lyon]

[10] Henson plays Detective Carter on this CBS sci-fi crime drama in which Harold Finch and John Reese attempt to use "The Machine" to prevent criminal acts before they occur.

ANSWER: **Person of Interest**<Andert>

20. The two music videos for this song are designated as the "high budget" and "low budget" versions, though they both have about the same production quality. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this song by Blackbear that says to "Turn it up and throw a tantrum" and claims "I hate your friends and they hate me too." It is unrelated to a Megan Thee Stallion song with a similar name.

ANSWER: "Hot Girl Bummer"

[10] "Hot Girl Bummer" became Blackbear's highest charting single, beating out a song with this name. A song from the *Sound of Music* with this name is used to teach the solfege scale.

ANSWER: "**Do Re Mi**"

[10] Blackbear is also part of the group Mansionz, where he performs alongside this singer of "Cooler than Me."

ANSWER: Mike **Posner** [Michael Robert Henrion **Posner**] < Maharjan>
