NOTE TO MODERATOR: Toss-Up questions and Bonus rounds are paired. If a Toss-Up goes dead, the linked Bonus round should be skipped as well.

TU 1. According to “Xanathar’s Guide to Everything,” Rangers of the Gloomstalker conclave gain a bonus to this stat equal to their wisdom modifier. In the Player’s Handbook, characters that take the “Alert” feat permanently gain +5 to this stat, and “are always on the lookout for (*) danger.” For most players, this stat is calculated by the roll of a d20 plus their dex modifier, often as a result of a dramatic phrase uttered by the DM. For 10 points, “You hear the door lock behind you, and see blood-red eyes glaring from the darkness of the room. Roll...” this temporary stat, used to determine order in combat in Dungeons and Dragons.

ANS: Initiative <JHH - Other>

BONUS 1. For ten points each, answer these questions about real weddings televised on live TV.

A. On December 17th, 1969, Miss Vickie’s wedding to this “Tiptoe Through the Tulips” one-hit wonder was televised live on *The Tonight Show with Johnny Carson*, and was watched by over 21 million households.

ANS(A): Tiny Tim

B. In 2003, Trista Rehn and Ryan Sutter were married on a three-part ABC special after they got engaged on this program.

ANS(B): The Bachelorette [prompt on “The Bachelor”]

C. This couple’s 1981 wedding drew more than 750 million viewers. During the ceremony, the bride scrambled the sequence of the groom’s many names, calling him “Philip Charles Arthur George” instead of his actual legal name.

ANS(C): Diana and Charles [prompt on “Royal Wedding,” prompt on “Diana,” “Princess Diana,” etc, and inform the team that you need the **couple**] <EMC - Film & TV>

TU 2. A 2010 concept album preceding this stage musical features the voices of Justin Vernon and the Haden triplets, as well as the composer herself. This musical has two distinct styles of music for the different worlds the protagonists travel through— a jazzy, New-Orleans-inspired sound is heard “Up Top,” while the (*) Underworld is characterized by call-and-response songs reminiscent of African American slave songs. The first act of this musical closes with the song “Why We Built the Wall,” providing a political commentary on immigration. “Wait For Me” is, for ten points, the showstopper number from which 2019 folk punk Broadway musical written and composed by Anaïs Mitchell?

ANS: Hadestown <EMC - Music>

BONUS 2. For ten points each, answer these questions about these “secret” phrases internet users employ to identify each other IRL.

A. The correct response to this Tumblr-user-identifying phrase is “Thanks, I stole them from the President.”

ANS(A): I like your shoelaces

B. This predecessor to “I like your shoelaces” was used to identify Tumblr users on other websites, such as 4chan and Omegle, and played a significant part in the 2010 Operation Overlord. This phrase was a way of saying you were laughing so hard you couldn’t breathe.

ANS(C): What is air?

C. [MODERATOR: Indicate to the team before reading that both the “call” and “response” must be given.] For some reason, Reddit users decided to use this absurd question-and-answer to distinguish each other, though I imagine any one of them would rather die than ever say it aloud.

ANS(C): When does the narwhal bacon? At midnight! <EMC - VG & IC >

TU 3. This man studied insurance in college, and intended to only golf at the amateur level until turning professional in order to support his family. As a result, he finished a few hours short of graduating from Ohio State, which granted him an honorary degree in 1972. This man gained fame for defeating Arnold Palmer in the 1962 U.S Open (*). He, Palmer, and Gary Player were known as “The Big Three” of golf in the 1960’s. For 10 points, name this man, who has won a record 18 major tournaments.

ANS: Jack Nicklaus <EGM-Sports>

BONUS 3. For ten points each, answer these questions about controversies surrounding recently deceased (thank God) science fiction author Harlan Ellison.

A. Ellison wrote the episode *The City on the Edge of Forever* for this show. Despite it being widely considered one of the greatest episodes of this show, Ellison hated it because of some changes creator Gene Roddenberry made to the script.

ANS(A): Star Trek

B. After accusing the head of production at Warner Brothers of “having the intellectual and cranial capacity of an artichoke,” Ellison was removed from a project to adapt this Isaac Asimov anthology.

ANS(B): I, Robot

C. After being presented with one of these literary awards for science fiction and fantasy authors in 2006, Ellison was asked if he was going to “be good” before being handed the microphone to give his acceptance speech. He was not, in fact, good.

ANS(C): Hugo Award <EMC - other>

TU 4. Initially, this game did not include any characters from its original parent company. In the opening movie for this game, the characters appear as toys before coming to life thanks to the (*) “Master Hand,” who appears as the game’s boss in the mode “1 Player Game.” This game essentially created the platform fighter sub-genre. For 10 points, name this 1999 fighting game that was released on the Nintendo 64 and includes characters such as Mario, Donkey Kong, and Link.

ANS: Super Smash Bros. [prompt on “Smash” alone, do **NOT** accept any other Smash Bros. title (Melee, Brawl, Ultimate)] <LN - VG & IC>

BONUS 4. For ten points each, answer these questions about former game show hosts.

A. The trivia community mourned the loss of this *Jeopardy!* host to pancreatic cancer in 2020. He hosted the show for 37 consecutive seasons, starting with the show’s first revived season in 1984.

ANS(A): Alex Trebek [accept either underlined portion]

B. Spay and neuter your pets! This man hosted *The Price is Right* from its very first episode in 1972 until he retired in 2002 and was replaced by Drew Carrey.

ANS(B): Bob Barker [prompt on “Bob”]

C. Richard Dawson, who hosted this game show from 1976 to 1985, greeted every woman who appeared on the show with a big ole smack on the lips.

ANS(C): Family Feud <EMC - Film & TV >

TU 5. This fictional publication’s moniker is intentionally ironic, as a word in its name means “showing great attention to detail and accuracy.” This newspaper is a source of misinformation in the universe in which it appears, filled with sensationalist headlines, untrue information, and typos. First appearing in (*) *The Vile Village*, this newspaper ran a story claiming that Veronica, Klyde, and Susie murdered Count Omar, and continues to refer to those characters by those incorrect names for the next six books as this publication wrongly accuses them of a variety of crimes, such as arson. For ten points, identify this propagandist newspaper from Lemony Snicket’s *Series of Unfortunate Events*.

ANS: The Daily Punctilio <EMC - other>

BONUS 5. For 10 points each, name these protest songs of the 21st century.

A. This 2018 Childish Gambino song, best known for its music video, was made to draw attention to issues such as gun violence and racism in America.

ANS(A): This is America

B. This 2020 Demi Lovato song, addressed to then-president Donald Trump, was made in order to raise voter turnout in the 2020 presidential election.

ANS(B): Commander in Chief

C. This 2002 George Michael song was made in order to protest the American president George W. Bush, British prime minister Tony Blair, their close relationship, and the War on Terror.

ANS(C): Shoot the Dog <EGM - Music>

TU 6. This character believes that he was less-loved than his older brother due to his poor kickball skills. As a teenager, this character was tricked into immigrating to America by his parents, who led him to believe he was going to the *schtor* [store] while it was really just a painting hiding the entrance to an American-bound ship. This character was raised by ocelots, as neither of his parents were (*) present for his birth, though he appears to have been eventually returned to his human family. While being forced to act as his family's lawn gnome, this character's only company was his neighbor, Kenny, and a beloved balloon. For ten points, name this man, originally from Drusselstein, who now makes weekly, failed attempts to take over the Tri-State Area.

ANS: Dr. Heinz Doofenschmirtz [**prompt** on "Doof"] <EMC - Film & TV>

BONUS 6. For ten points each, answer these questions about World of Warcraft players celebrated by the community for their unconventional approach to the game.

A. One World of Warcraft player named DoubleAgent reached max level in many versions of the game simply by performing this peaceful task on the Wandering Isle.

ANS(A): picking flowers [**description acceptable**]

B. Gutrot the Naked Troll Warrior was a World of Warcraft user in 2006 who scaled all the way up to level 70 by performing only these types of attacks.

ANS(B): melee attacks

C. World of Warcraft player DesMephisto is a speed-leveling master who has forty-nine max level warriors in-game. He streams through Twitch and raises awareness for this disorder, which he was diagnosed with at age 29.

ANS(C): Autism Spectrum Disorder <EMC - VG & IC>

TU 7. In one movie, a high school band plays this song before being interrupted by that movie's protagonist, who proclaims that he is now that school's mascot. In another movie scene featuring this song, the protagonist smiles in a mirror after brushing his teeth, and the mirror promptly (*) shatters. In that same montage, an angry mob collects pitchforks, lights torches, and marches towards the protagonist's home while this song plays, and the protagonist enjoys a quiet meal of eyeballs. The protagonist paints and posts a "Beware of Ogre" sign during this song's montage. John Lithgow, Cameron Diaz, Eddie Murphy, and Mike Myers' names appear on screen while, for ten points, what alt-rock song by Smash Mouth plays during the opening credits to 2001's *Shrek*?

ANS: All Star by Smash Mouth <EMC - Music>

BONUS 7. Float like a butterfly, sting like a bee, and for 10 points each, answer these questions about boxing.

A. The primary right handed stance, the Orthodox, is contrasted with this stance that favors left-handed boxers and often leaves the user more vulnerable to blows to the liver.

ANS(A): Southpaw

B. Of the original eight weight classes in modern boxing, this is the lightest weight class and was established in 1909. The weight in this class ranges from 108 to 112 lbs.

ANS(B): Flyweight

C. A 1997 fight between these two professional boxers at the MGM Grand Garden arena in Las Vegas resulted in one of these boxers getting disqualified for biting the other boxer's ear off. Name both.

ANS(C): Mike Tyson AND Evander Holyfield [**both** names required] <JMS - Sports.>

TU 8. When characters in this movie experience an electric shock, it is notably their nervous system that is illuminated, not their skeleton. The protagonist's thoughts in this film, including "My pants shrank!" and "why is the voice in my head so LOUD?" are displayed in text bubbles on-screen. Because every animator working on this film wanted to draw (*) Stan Lee, he appears in every subway train in this movie. While most of this movie runs at the standard 24 frames-per-second, the protagonist is animated at only 12 fps, to highlight his inexperience as Spider-Man. For ten points, name this comic-book-style movie by Sony Pictures Animation in which Miles Morales meets different "Spider-People" from across different realities.

ANS: Spider-Man: Into the Spideverse [**prompt** on just "Spideverse;" **prompt** on "Spider-Man" **before** it appears in the question; do **not** accept or prompt on "**Across** the Spideverse"] <EMC - Film & TV>

BONUS 8. For 10 points each, given one of the two rappers involved in each feud, name the other.

A. In 2018, when a fan asked Hopsin whether he or this man would win in a rap battle, he responded "That's a dumb question that I'm sure you already know the answer to." This led to a short-lived feud.

ANS(A): Joyner Lucas

B. This man holds an ongoing feud with Eminem that began in 2012 when he made sexually charged comments about Eminem's daughter Hailie when she was just 16.

ANS(B): Machine Gun Kelly

C. Throughout 2018, this man was involved in a feud with Chief Keef due to him and Chief Keef's cousin Tadoe both being involved with fellow rapper Cuban Doll.

ANS(C): 6ix9ine [**pronounced** "six nine," do **not** accept or prompt on Tekashi69] <EGM -Music>

TU 9. In this video game, if the player releases a dog stuck in a bear trap at the start of the game, it would flee and later return to help the player in a boss fight. In response to multiple enemies fleeing combat due to the ringing of a church bell, the main character in this video game asks 'Where's everyone going, Bingo?' The main enemies the player encounters in this game are called (*) 'Ganados,' a Spanish word for livestock. In areas near blue flames in this game, the player can encounter the trenchcoat and hood wearing merchant, who can buy from and sell to the player, and upgrade any weapons the player has. For 10 points, name this 2005 video game in which Leon S. Kennedy is tasked with rescuing the US President's daughter from a parasite-worshiping cult known as Los Illuminados.

ANS: Resident Evil 4 [**prompt** on "Resident Evil" do **NOT** accept any other Resident Evil title] <JMS - VG & IC>

BONUS 9. Your momma isn't gonna like this bonus about animals. For 10 points each, identify these animals by their genitals.

A. This mammal is a monotreme, known to lay eggs instead. Their penis is also known to have 4 heads. If this description didn't do the trick, this animal is also good friends with Sonic.

ANS(A): Echidna [Do **not** accept Knuckles]

B. Large in size and not very docile, this next animal is a very large reptile. Its lower member isn't hard to inspect, because this large lizard is always erect.

ANS(B): Alligator

C. While it seems like a hard time for the previous reptile, this next mammal's penis is prehensile. Yes, it moves, grabs, swivels, and sways; which makes its job much easier in the ocean where it stays.

ANS(C): Dolphin <MCB-Other>

TU 10. *Figuran D'an and the Modal Nodes* specialized in this genre of music. Not to be confused with Jatz, this style of music employs instruments such as the Kloo Horn, the Ploong Sounder, and a namesake box. The name of this genre was revealed in *Tales from (*) Mos Eisley*, though the term for a musician who plays this type of music was introduced much earlier, in the *Return of the Jedi* novelization. The *Max Rebo Band* plays, for ten points, what style of maybe-accidentally crudely-named music at Jabba's Palace in the *Star Wars* universe.

ANS: jizz [grudgingly **accept descriptive answers including the phrase "cantina music,"** but do inform them that it's canonically named jizz.] <EMC - Music>

BONUS 10. For ten points each, answer these questions about controversial TikTok trends.

A. Name this controversial trend that circulated in Fall 2021, involving users stealing items such as hand sanitizer dispensers, lab microscopes, and wall signs from their schools.

ANS(A): Devious Licks

B. The Devious Lick trend inspired this "reverse" trend, in which users return to the scene of their crime and return the item they stole.

ANS(B): Angelic Yields

C. Many critics compared the Devious Licks trend to another trend popularized in August 2021, where users walked up and down an unsteady staircase made of these objects— usually resulting in a fall, sometimes resulting in serious injury.

ANS(C): Milk Crate Challenge <EMC - VG & IC>

HALF-TIME: SCORE CHECK -----

TU 11. In a deleted scene, this man kills the two lookouts who sent the messenger hawk that his bird intercepted. Though he never has any lines of dialogue, he is voiced by Greg Baldwin, who also voiced another character from the same series following actor Mako Iwamatsu's untimely death. He first appears in an episode titled "The Headband," in which he is hired to (*) hunt down and kill the Avatar. He ultimately dies in his attack on the Western Air Temple after he is hit in his third eye by Sokka's boomerang. For 10 points, name this Fire Nation assassin who, due to his eponymous ability, is also known as "Sparky Sparky Boom Man."

ANS: Combustion Man [**accept** "Sparky Sparky Boom Man" **before** that name is read in the question] <EGM - Film & TV>

BONUS 11. Remember that toss-up about Anti-Barney humor, way back in Packet 1? Well, for ten points each, answer these other questions about similar schoolyard phenomena.

A. Much like the anti-Barney songs, this other schoolyard song has a variety of different versions, though the most common version includes a specific character laying an egg. In June of 2020, YouTuber Tom Scott made a video exploring the different versions of this song across geography and time.

ANS(A): Jingle Bells Batman Smells

B. This piece of graffiti we all had on our middle school notebooks starts off by drawing two rows of three parallel, vertical lines, and connecting them to look like a specific letter.

ANS(B): The Cool S [also **accept:** the Superman S]

C. Sorry in advance, but this next phenomenon has three rules: everybody in the world is playing, you lose the moment you think about it, and losses must be announced verbally.

ANS(C): The Game <EMC-other>

TU 12. Having played its first game in 1884, this club was elected to the Football League in 1894 and adopted its current name in 1919. Before its most famous achievement, this team had won the League Cup three times, in 1964, 1997, and 2000, and made the UEFA Conference League semi-finals in the (*) 2021-2022 season. After being relegated to the third tier following the 2007-2008 season, this team immediately returned to the Champions League the following year. After being promoted to the Premier League following the 2013-2014 season, this club won 7 of its final 9 games to avoid relegation. For 10 points, name this English football club that completed one of the greatest upsets in sports history by winning the 2015-2016 Premier League title.

ANS: Leicester City ["Lester"] <EGM - Sports>

BONUS 12. On the popular anime ranking website myanimelist.net, Fullmetal Alchemist Brotherhood has continued to dominate the number 1 spot for years. However, it has been dethroned on occasion. For 10 points each, answer these questions about anime that have once held the number 1 spot.

A. This 2013 anime was adapted from the manga series of the same name written by Hajime Isayama. The anime is known for its shocking gore, gritty environment, and its themes of war, xenophobia, and power. It follows three childhood friends as they fight against large, violent creatures.

ANS(A): Attack On Titan

B. This 2011 anime was animated by White Fox and was adapted from a visual novel game by the same name. This anime follows a mad scientist and his friends as they create technology that allows them to travel to the past, leading to many terrible consequences and unexpected enemies.

ANS(B): Steins;Gate

C. This 2009 anime series follows Koyomi Araragi after he survives a vampire attack and gets involved with helping girls with a variety of similar supernatural phenomena. The anime is more notoriously known for its unorthodox film direction, surreal style, its out-of-nowhere humor, and some really weird scenes that shouldn't be sexual but somehow are. Also there's a character in the show named Meme, that's really funny to me.

ANS(C): Monogatari [the series has other names but they all include "monogatari" so just accept it if Monogatari is mentioned], <MCB - Film & TV>

TU 13. In 2010, this band debuted with the song "Full Moon (Death Classic)", followed the next year by their self-titled EP and the mixtape *Exmilitary*, which featured unique songs such as "Guillotine", "Blood Creepin", and "Takyon". In 2012, this band gained controversy due to the album cover for *No Love Deep Web* consisting of a picture of band member Zach Hill's (*) erect penis with the album's name written across it. For 10 points, name this experimental hip hop band, consisting of Hill, MC Ride, and Andy Morin, known for their aggressive style and heavy punk influence.

ANS: Death Grips <EGM - Music>

BONUS 13. I scream, you scream, we all scream for ice cream! For ten points each, identify these celebrities by their signature Ben & Jerry's collaboration flavor.

A. One of Ben & Jerry's most popular flavors is a cherry ice cream with cherry bites and fudge flakes, named after this Grateful Dead front man.

ANS(A): Jerry Garcia [the flavor is "Cherry Garcia"]

B. This celebrity noted that he wasn't afraid to say that "dessert has a well-known liberal agenda" in his announcement that he was launching his "AmeriCone Dream" flavor with Ben & Jerry's.

ANS(B): Stephen Colbert

C. This comic's *30 Rock* character gives her name to one citrus-flavored Greek Frozen Yogurt by Ben & Jerry's.

ANS(C): Tina Fey [prompt on "Liz Lemon." Tina Fey played Liz Lemon on *30 Rock*.]
<EMC - other>

TU 14. Tim Roth portrays a character named after this color in one early Quentin Tarantino film. When anime characters are “coded” this color, they are typically an “energetic wild card,” such as Ed from *Cowboy Bebop*. A 1971 (*) Stanley Kubrick film with this color in its title was banned in several countries for its inspiration of “copycat” acts of violence in the UK. For ten points, name this color seen on screen in characters such as Thomas O’Malley, BB-8, Velma Dinkley, and Tigger.

ANS: Orange <EMC - Film & TV>

BONUS 14. For 10 points each, answer these questions about musically upbeat songs that have a darker meaning.

A. This debut single by Foster the People discusses the homicidal thoughts of a boy named Robert, who, throughout the song, warns all of the other kids who wear this titular object to outrun his gun.

ANS(A): Pumped up Kicks

B. This anti-war German language song was inspired by the title objects being released at a Rolling Stones concert in 1982. It tells the story of those objects being mistaken for UFO’s, and as a result, the world is driven to a war of global destruction.

ANS(B): 99 Luftballons [accept German, prompt on “99 Red Balloons”]

C. Although this song, whose title is shared with a lake located in Texas, has many interpretations of its meaning, such as being about a serial killer murdering victims at the title location, Toadies lead singer Vaden Todd Lewis states that this song is about a man attempting to lure a woman into joining a cult at the titular lake.

ANS(C): Possum Kingdom <JMS - Music>

TU 15. In 1998, astronaut John Glenn took some of these animals to Outer Space, aboard the Space Shuttle Discovery, to study the effect of space travel on eggs. A 1992 TV show starring Howie Mandel centering around this species of animal was one of the most expensive children’s TV programs to ever air. One officially-licensed video game developed by *Creature Labs* based on this type of (*) aquatic life received poor reviews due to being “exactly as exciting as actually owning” these pets. Harold von Braunhut began marketing these animals as pets after deciding there needed to be an aquatic version of the ant farm. For ten points, give this popular name for *Artemia* brine shrimp.

ANS: Sea Monkeys [also accept “Artemia” or “brine shrimp” before *Artemia* is named in the question] <EMC - other>

BONUS 15. For 10 points each, identify these naughty professional athletes.

A. This Las Vegas Raiders wide receiver’s career came to an abrupt end on November 2nd, 2021 when he killed a woman and her dog in a drunk driving incident.

ANS(A): Henry Ruggs

B. This Charlotte Hornets small forward was arrested on June 29th, 2022 for felony domestic violence.

ANS(B): Miles Bridges

C. This catcher, formerly for the Toronto Blue Jays, got into a bit of a “pickle” in February 2020 for public masturbation.

ANS(C): Reese McGuire <EGM- Sports>

TU 16. A character in this video game series got a job at a power plant by saying he has a theoretical degree in physics. In the first game of this series, when trying to blackmail Iguana Bob Frazier, the player can reference the film *Soylent Green* by stating that "Prime Choice Select is made of people!!!! It's made of people!!!" A DLC expansion for a game in this series places the player character in a simulation of the battle of (*) Anchorage, Alaska, which took place between the years 2066 to 2077 and was fought between the US and the People's Republic of China for the last remaining oil reserves on Earth. The first online multiplayer title in this series was advertised to have 'sixteen times the detail' of its predecessor. For 10 points, name this video game series that takes place in a post-apocalyptic America, originally owned by Interplay Productions and later purchased by Bethesda Softworks.

ANS: Fallout <JMS - VG & IC>

BONUS 16. We all know about the recent *Sonic the Hedgehog* movies, but he has a history in TV as well. For 10 points each, answer these questions about the Sonic the Hedgehog TV shows.

A. This 1999 TV show stars Sonic along with his two siblings Manic and Sonia as they form a band and search for their lost mother.

ANS(A): Sonic Underground

B. This anime's story revolves around Sonic and friends finding themselves transported to Earth and features adaptations of Sonic Adventure, Sonic Adventure 2, and Sonic Battle.

ANS(B): Sonic X

C. This TV show was initially criticized for the redesigns of the characters, especially Knuckles, and the terrible video game tie-ins, but its high quality quickly turned that criticism around.

ANS(C): Sonic Boom <MBR- Film & TV>

TU 17. This program underwent some controversy in June 2022, when it included *Big Wig*, a children's picture book about a drag performer, on their recommended reading list. *Campaign for a Commercial-Free Childhood* criticizes this program as "one of corporate America's most insidious school-based brand promotions," and argues that this program "promotes (*) junk food to a captive audience." The idea for this program was born in 1984, when the then-president of the fast food chain that hosts this program wanted to motivate his son to read more. For ten points, name this program in which students in sixth grade and under are rewarded for reaching their monthly reading goal with a certificate for a free single-topping pan pizza from Pizza Hut.

ANS: Pizza Hut's Book It! Reading Challenge <EMC - other>

BONUS 17. For 10 points each, answer these questions about artists that appeared on *MTV Unplugged*.

A. This alternative rock band from San Diego debuted their song *Big Empty* on *Unplugged* prior to the release of the song on their album *Purple*. They also performed other signature songs such as *Creep*, *Plush*, and *Wicked Garden*.

ANS(A): Stone Temple Pilots

B. Nirvana's appearance on *Unplugged* in 1993 consisted of them performing many covers of songs, such as *The Man Who Sold the World* by David Bowie. They also covered three songs by fellow grunge band the Meat Puppets. Name any of the three.

ANS(B): Lake of Fire, OR Plateau, OR Oh Me [**accept** any underlined portion]

C. Alice in Chains' *Unplugged* session in 1996 was their last concert as a group for nine years. Despite his physically weak appearance on stage due to his ongoing struggles with drug addiction, this lead singer of Alice in Chains was nevertheless able to deliver a strong performance, especially during songs such as *Angry Chair*, *Would?*, and *Rooster*.

ANS(C): Layne Staley (lane-stay-lee) <JMS - Music>

TU 18. On June 1st, 2022, Twitter user @HoberTweets responded to a Chick-fil-A tweet with an uncaptioned version of this meme, saying "This little fella will have a great time at your restaurant," referencing the Chick-fil-A (*) gay marriage controversy, though the Chick-fil-A Twitter account responded in such a way that indicated they were unaware of this meme or its connotations. For ten points, name this meme featuring a white dachshund named Whitney Chewston standing by a glass of red wine.

ANS: homophobic dog [also **accept** "the dog that is not too fond of gay people"] <EMG - VG & IC>

BONUS 18. Sometimes unexpectedly deep quotes come from the most unlikely sources. For ten points each, identify the unlikely sources of these deep quotes.

A. "Do you think God lives in Heaven because he, too, lives in fear of what he's created?"

ANS(A): Dr. Romero (or Steve Buscemi) in Spy Kids 2 [**accept** either underlined portion; **prompt** on "Spy Kids," lacking the **2**; **prompt** on "Buscemi"/ "Steve Buscemi"]

B. "Sometimes we have to go deep inside ourselves to solve our problems."

ANS(B): Patrick Star from SpongeBob SquarePants [**prompt** on "SpongeBob" or "SpongeBob SquarePants" alone (without a mention of **Patrick**), clarifying that we do need the specific character from this quote because SpongeBob is the name of both the show and a character within the show]

C. "The world holds many mysteries, but what seems strange to one may be commonplace to another."

ANS(C): Ferb from Phineas & Ferb <EMC - Film & TV>

TU 19. This rapper achieved his greatest fame with songs such as “Suge,” “Bop,” and “Rockstar.” This man has collaborated on various songs with other artists, including with Post Malone on “Enemies” and Dua Lipa on (*) “Levitating.” This man has been involved in legal troubles for shooting a man in North Carolina in 2018, for robbing an associate in Texas in 2020, and for slapping a female fan the same year at a concert. However, his most serious offense was controversial remarks he made regarding the LGBTQ+ community in a July 2021 concert, after which many venues and businesses canceled their collaborations with him. For 10 points, “let’s gooooo” and name this rapper, known for memes in which he turns into a car.

ANS: DaBaby <EGM - Music>

BONUS 19. We all miss *Vine*, but the iconic memes born there will live in our hearts forever. For this bonus, you will be given the beginning of a classic Vine, and (for ten points each) you must complete the phrase.

A. “Road work ahead?”

ANS(A): I sure hope it does! [prompt on “I hope it does,” lacking the “**sure**”]

B. “Hurricane Katrina?”

ANS(B): More like Hurricane Tortilla! [note that “tortilla” should here be pronounced like the whitest way possible (tore-till-ah, like with the L’s), but I guess pronouncing “tortilla” in the actual correct way shouldn’t be penalized.]

C. “Two bros, chilling in a hot tub”

ANS(C): Five feet apart, ‘cuz they’re not gay [don’t penalize saying “**because**” instead of “**cuz**,” it’s effectively the same thing] <EMC - VG & IC >

TU 20. Due to a character in this show’s untimely death in the first season, many fans responded with websites, forums, and hashtags demanding justice for her. The show’s creators have recently announced the launching of a production company named after one of its central locations. This show’s popularity has led to increased popularity for products used in the series such as Jiff peanut butter, New Coke, and (*) Eggo’s. For 10 points, name this Netflix horror drama show by the Duffer Brothers, recently renewed for a fifth and final season, that is centered around the residents of Hawkins, Indiana and their interactions with the Upside Down.

ANS: Stranger Things <EGM Film & TV>

BONUS 20. They left us too soon. For 10 points each, answer these questions about members of the 27 Club.

A. This guitarist and singer was part of a namesake band that produced songs such as *Foxy Lady*, *Purple Haze*, and a cover of *All Along the Watchtower*. This man famously set his guitar on fire while performing at the 1967 Monterey Pop Festival.

ANS(A): Jimi Hendrix

B. This woman was lead singer of the psychedelic rock band Big Brother and the Holding Company before leaving to become a solo artist. She performed at the Woodstock Music and Art Fair before dying of a heroin overdose in 1970.

ANS(B): Janis Joplin

C. This man, the founder and original leader of the Rolling Stones, drowned in a swimming pool after drinking an excessive amount of alcohol. The cause of death stated in his coroner's report is 'death by misadventure.'

ANS(C): Brian Jones <JMS - Music>
