NOTE TO MODERATOR: Toss-Up questions and Bonus rounds are paired. If a Toss-Up goes dead, the linked Bonus round should be skipped as well.

NOTE TO MODERATOR (2): Before beginning play, confirm that each team has sufficient paper and pencil in preparation for the math question included in this packet

TU 1. In 2016, Netflix accidentally listed this character’s movie as “LGBT Representation,” leading the Tumblr community to launch headcannons that this character is a gay icon. One piece of supporting evidence, provided by Tumblr user NecroMantics, was that “he created a pop-up book of himself for the drama of it all.” Other users pointed out that “haunting a small white family in an (*) Australian suburb is a radical act,” to which other users responded “why can’t you just be normal?” To celebrate Pride month in 2019, ICF Midnight announced via Twitter the release of a limited-edition rainbow BluRay of this character’s movie, captioning the Tweet “So yeah, we’re the screaming kid right now.” For ten points, name this fierce Australian monster with a killer fashion sense who likes to disrupt traditional family structures.

ANS: Mister Babadook [also **accept “the Babadook”**] <EMC - VG & IC>

BONUS 1. I read it on FaceBook, so it must be true! For ten points each, answer these questions about conspiracy theories.

A. The Netflix documentary *Behind the Curve* focuses on this conspiracy theory, following loudspoken advocates of this theory such as Mark Sargent and the creators of the GlobeBusters YouTube channel.

ANS(A): Modern Flat Earth theory

B. This conspiracy theory promotes the idea that the white streak of condensation seen behind airplanes is actually a deliberate, nefarious release of poison upon an unsuspecting public, possibly for the purposes of mind control.

ANS(B): Chemtrails

C. The very true events of MKUltra inspired this conspiracy theory in which Cathy O’Brien claims to have been a victim of a government mind control program controlled by Satanists. She also claims to have met President George H.W. Bush while in this program, who appeared to her through a lizard hologram.

ANS(C): Project Monarch <EMC - other>

TU 2. The creator of this film stopped watching *Rick & Morty*, as he was concerned that the show’s second season was too similar to the plotline of this film. The 1969 children’s book *Slyvester and the Magic Pebble* was the inspiration for a unique “rock scene” in this film. The work of Wong Kar-Wai [pron] was the inspiration for the ambiance of one of the (*) universes of this film, in which the protagonist is a movie star. The Schwarzschild Radius and the idea that anything can become a black hole at a certain density inspired this movie’s iconic “everything bagel.” For ten points, name this genre-mashup A24 [“Ayh twenty-four”] film in which Waymond teaches Evelyn how to verse-jump in an attempt to save the multiverse from Jobu Tupaki [Joe-BOO Too-PAHK-ee].

ANS: Everything Everywhere All at Once <EMC - Film & TV>

BONUS 2. In the last packet, we had a bonus about unexpectedly deep quotes from unlikely sources. Well, we're doing that again, but with video games this time. For ten points each, identify the unlikely sources of these deep quotes.

A. "You have died of dysentery"

ANS(A): The Oregon Trail video game End Screen

B. "War is when the young and stupid are tricked by the old and bitter into killing each other."

ANS(B): Niko from Grand Theft Auto IV [**accept** either underlined portion]

C. "Sometimes, time stands still, and all you can do is watch."

ANS(C): Omega Squad Teemo from League of Legends [**accept** either underlined portion, if the team does not get this correct– tell them specifically that is is "Omega Squadron" Teemo, though "Omega Squadron" does not have to be given by the player for this to be correct] <EMC - VG & IC>

TU 3. The second act of this musical includes a quartet number featuring a rose vendor, a milkmaid, a strawberry seller, and a knife grinder. That number, "Who Will Buy," is a direct contrast to an Act 1 number, "Consider Yourself," in which the (*) Artful Dodger introduces the titular character to London life. This musical is sometimes criticized for being antisemitic due to the traditionally Jewish melody given to the songs sung by the villain character of Fagin [FAY-ghin], despite the fact that composer Lionel Bart was, himself, Jewish. Please sir, for ten points, name this 1960 classic musical based on a Dickens novel.

ANS: Oliver! [**prompt** on "Oliver Twist"] <EMC - Music>

BONUS 3. For 10 points each, name these TV characters with legendary names. In each case, both the first and last name is required.

A. This businessman is known for his thick Texas drawl, his large white hat, and his periodic interactions, many of which are antagonistic, with Timmy Turner.

ANS(A): Douglas "Doug" Dimmadome, owner of the Dimmsdale Dimmadome

B. This attorney hired to replace Barry Zuckerhorn as the Bluth family's attorney on *Arrested Development* claims that he "no habla español," and operates a self-titled law blog.

ANS(B): Bob Loblaw

C. This leader of a self-titled pirate crew is the primary antagonist of *One Piece's* Dressrosa Arc, and is an underworld broker by the codename "Joker" and by the nickname "Heavenly Yaksha".

ANS(C): Donquixote Doflamingo <EGM - Film & TV>

TU 4. In the third novel in the franchise in which this character appears, while possessed by an “Eidolon” [“eye-doh-lawn”] this character fires upon a city his group was trying to make peace with, forcing them to flee East. This character was the second of his group to crash land on Ogygia (Oh-Jih-Jee-uh), but the only person in history to find his way back, rescuing the maiden (*) Calypso. This character befriends and repairs the mechanical dragon “Festus,” and upon the dragon’s destruction, used his head as a figurehead for the Argos 2. For 10 points name this member of the prophecy of seven from Rick Riordan’s *Heroes of Olympus*, the first son of Hephestus in centuries with the power of fire.

ANS: Leo Valdez [**accept** either underlined portion] <JHH - Other>

BONUS 4. The internet is a wild place. For 10 points each, name these cursed videos.

A. The script for this video was originally posted on 4chan, and tells the story of a little boy praying to the titular ogre before having an intense interaction with him.

ANS(A): Shrek is Love, Shrek is Life [**prompt** on “Shrek” alone]

B. This video originally got in trouble for showing too much of Princess Peach’s skin in the thumbnail, so creator Flashgitz rectified the problem by creating a new thumbnail with her in a hijab.

ANS(B): Racist Mario

C. This video was taken down due to a copyright claim by Warner Bros., leading creator Meatcanyon to point out that this means that it is canon that Bugs Bunny is a struggling rapist.

ANS(C): Wabbit Season <EGM- VG & IC>

TU 5. This movie featured some of the lyrics from Eminem’s “Lose Yourself” in the trailer. This movie’s eponymous characters have become known as Comcast’s corporate icons since its 2013 acquisition of (*) Illumination. A two-year delay in releasing this film launched a viral trend where boys older than the target audience arrived to watch this film dressed in full-formal blazers– causing 34% of this movie’s opening weekend audience to be between 13 and 17 years old, an absurdly high percentage for an animated film. For 10 points, name this 2022 film, the fifth installment in the *Despicable Me* franchise.

ANS: Minions: The Rise of Gru [**prompt** on “Minions,” “Minions 2,” or “Rise of Gru”] <EGM - Film & TV>

BONUS 5. For 10 points each, answer these questions about songs that use non-instrumental sound effects.

A. This song by English heavy metal band Judas Priest utilizes the sound of breaking glass and a police siren, likely to reference the title action.

ANS(A): Breaking the Law

B. This 1966 song by The Beatles, sometimes considered to be a children’s song, utilizes the sound of rushing water and foghorns to reference the location that ‘we all live in.’

ANS(B): Yellow Submarine

C. This band is no stranger to using sound effects in many of its songs, most notably with the ringing and chiming of clocks in their song “Time” and the sound of a cash register in their song “Money.”

ANS(C): Pink Floyd <JMS - Music>

TU 6. On July 6 2022, Twitter user @SergeYager posted a photo of an elaborate hotel shower faucet that he described using this term. KnowYourMeme later reblogged that tweet, titling the entry “Be Not Unmoisturized.” Although not its first internet appearance by well over a decade, this term was widely popularized in July 2020 when Redditor CSGoose posted a Swoll Doge edit contrasting how certain (*) religious beings are portrayed in art and popular imagination versus how they are actually described in their canonical text. For ten points, give this descriptive term meaning that something conforms to the literal, canonical Christian text, most commonly used to describe angels.

ANS: Biblically Accurate Angels [also **accept** “Be Not Afraid”] <EMC - VG & IC>

BONUS 6. We don’t talk about season two... For ten points each, name these primary antagonists from “The Legend of Korra”

A. This masked figure served as the primary villain in season 1. He led the Equalist movement, and was the only person besides Avatar Aang with the power to take away bending.

ANS(A): Amon [also **accept** Noatak]

B. Have you heard of the guru Laghima? This man was imprisoned by the white lotus at the start of season 3, but escapes using airbending he gains following Harmonic Convergence. He leads the Red Lotus and aims to end the Avatar Cycle.

ANS(B): Zaheer

C. Following the death of the Earth Queen, this “Great Uniter” stabilized the Earth Kingdom. However, she then dissolved it and created the Earth Empire, before setting her eyes on Republic City.

ANS(C): Kuvira <JHH - Film & TV>

TU 7. This man was drafted by the Kansas City Royals in the 1979 mock draft, but decided to play college football instead. During his successful time with Pitt, he was aided by an impressive offensive line that featured future NFL guard Mark May and tackle Jimbo Covert. A weaker senior season led to his draft stock plummeting and him only being selected 27th overall by the (*) Miami Dolphins. During his time with the Dolphins, he led his team to the playoffs 10 times and appeared in Super Bowl XIX [19], losing to the Joe Montana-led 49ers. For 10 points, name this former quarterback, widely considered the best to never win a Super Bowl.

ANS: Dan Marino <EGM-Sports>

BONUS 7. For 10 points each, name these female country music stars.

A. This woman got her start finishing third in the sixteenth season of the *American Idol*, and first achieved mainstream success with her single “I Hope.”

ANS: Gabby Barrett

B. This woman’s first single, “My Church,” led to her career taking off, though she has also made ventures into pop through songs such as “The Middle” and “The Bones.”

ANS: Maren Morris

C. The success of this woman’s first album through songs such as “Heads Carolina, Tails California” was followed by three number one singles from her second album *I’m Alright*.

ANS: Jo Dee Messina <EGM - Music>

TU 8. In June 2020, one tabloid named after this thing published a front-page article titled “I Slapped JK Rowling and I’m Not Sorry!” In *Super Mario Brothers 3*, this thing swoops down in a U-shaped arch to attack Mario in World 2 of (*) Desert Land. A song about this thing is featured in the movies *I Am Sam*, *The Parent Trap*, and *The Bee Movie*. In *Spider-Man 2*, while holding a nuclear reactor core, Doc Ock says he has the power of this thing in the palm of his hand. For ten points, name this thing that, according to Bill Wurtz’s “history of the entire world, i guess,” is a deadly lazer.

ANS: the Sun <EMC - other>

BONUS 8. For 10 points each, name these players for the NFL’s big brother, the newly reformed USFL.

A. This Birmingham Stallions running back played at the University of Alabama in college, and fans often play off his name saying that he “knows”.

ANS(A): Bo Scarborough

B. This Michigan Panthers quarterback was drafted first overall in the 2022 USFL quarterback draft following successful collegiate careers with Ole Miss and Michigan.

ANS(B): Shea [“Shay”] Patterson

C. This New Orleans Breakers defensive end was the first of his position selected in the draft following a collegiate career with Georgia.

ANS(C): Davin Bellamy <EGM Sports>

TU 9. In one mission in this game, this player can unknowingly enter a duel with Lord Shaw by delivering a sealed letter provided to the player by another character. In another mission, the player must dispose of that same character’s brothers at “The (*) Golden Cat” brothel, either by making an agreement with Slackjaw or assassinating them directly. The final mission of this game has two versions that differ depending on how the player’s actions have affected the city up to that point, known as High Chaos and Low Chaos. For 10 points, name this game set in the city of Dunwall, in which Corvo Attano [“Ah-Tawn-oh”] attempts to clear his name by avenging the death of Empress Jessamine Kaldwin.

ANS: Dishonored <JHH - VG & IC>

BONUS 9. For ten points each, answer these questions about the M&M’s advertisement characters.

A. After Mars re-designed the M&M’s characters in early 2022 to “expand the range of personalities represented,” *Fox News* anchor Tucker Carlson was especially upset about the desexualization of this color M&M, who traded out her classic Go-Go boots for some plain white tennis shoes.

ANS(A): green

B. It wasn’t just the green M&M that had Tucker Carlson upset. In that same broadcast– titled “miserable, non-binary candy is all we deserve”-- Carlson suggested that the reason this color of M&M may be so anxious is because “maybe he’s a secret sexist, himself.”

ANS(B): orange

C. In an advertisement created for *Super Bowl LII* [52], this color M&M found a lucky penny, wished to be a human, and turned into Danny Devito.

ANS(C): red <EMC - other>

TU 10. In the 2022 song “Numb Little Bug,” American singer-songwriter Em Beihold writes about her struggle with this concept, for which she was on (*) antidepressants. In 2020, rapper Juice Wrld’s [“Juice World”] first posthumous single “Righteous” was released detailing his struggle with his inner demons, first and foremost of which was this concept. In 2018, Canadian singer Shawn Mendes released the song “In My Blood,” which was about his struggles with this concept. For 10 points, name this mental health condition, characterized by a sense of dread over the future.

ANS: Anxiety [**accept** other synonymous words such as “nervousness”] <EGM - Music>

BONUS 10. *Jeopardy!* defines a Super Champ as “a player who wins ten or more games.” For ten points each, identify these recent *Jeopardy!* Super Champs who have appeared on the show since longtime host Alex Trebek’s passing.

A. This Yale PhD student was the first Super Champ following Trebek’s passing, and played during the period in which *Jeopardy!* was being hosted by a carousel of guest hosts. This Super Champ became the third *Jeopardy!* millionaire during his 38-day streak, which fans nicknamed his “rodeo.”

ANS(A): Matt Amodio [**accept** either underlined portion]

B. This woman’s 40-game winning streak made her the most successful woman to have appeared on the show, as well as *Jeopardy!*’s first female millionaire. She is also the first transgender contestant to have qualified for the *Jeopardy!* Tournament of Champions.

ANS(B): Amy Schneider [**accept** either underlined portion]

C. This 23-year-old Canadian was the first Gen Z contestant to have achieved the rank of *Jeopardy!* Super Champ. Her 23-game streak won her over \$560-thousand, a total that ranked her in 5th of all time on *Jeopardy!*’s Highest Winnings “Leaderboard of Legends.”

ANS(C): Mattea Roach [**accept** either underlined portion] <EMC - Film & TV>

HALF-TIME: SCORE CHECK

TU 11. In an alternate version of the music video for this song, three men beat up the singer of this song as he is walking down a busy street, after which, the singer gets up and continues walking as if nothing occurred. This song is based on a sample of the Andrew Loog Oldham orchestral cover of The Rolling Stones song ‘The Last Time,’ which led to Mick Jagger and Keith Richards being added to the songwriting credits of this song. The lyrics ‘I’m a million different (*) people from one day to the next’ are recited in this song, indicating the singer’s inability to act as his true self. This song utilizes a violin loop almost entirely throughout its near six minute length. For 10 points, name this 1997 Britpop song by The Verve, from the album *Urban Hymns*.

ANS: Bitter Sweet Symphony <JMS - Music>

BONUS 11. More fun, less grind. For ten points each, answer these questions about Fortnite dances. Physical demonstrations of the dances are acceptable in lieu of verbally naming the dance.

A. This most iconic Fortnite dance was popularized after the Backpack Kid performed it on Saturday Night Live while musical guest Katy Perry sang her song “Swish Swish.”

ANS(A): the Floss

B. Actor Alphonso Ribiero tried and failed to sue Epic Games over this dance, as this dance was a near-perfect copy of a dance he created and popularized on the 90’s sitcom *The Fresh Prince of Bel-Air*.

ANS: the Fresh [**prompt** on “Carlton Dance”]

C. This dance appeared after a fan-favorite submission did not win the BoogieDown Dance Contest. That submission featured a kid in an orange shirt doing this dance.

ANS: the Orange Justice <EMC - VG & IC>

TU 12. This comic book character made his very first appearance in 1941 as a part of the *More Fun Comics* anthology. Over the past 81 years, this character’s comic book appearance has remained relatively the same, with white skin, blonde hair, and blue eyes, though this physical appearance has not been carried over into the more recent movie adaptations. This superhero has an upcoming sequel movie that has come under fire due to star actor (*) Amber Heard’s recent court case. For 10 points, name this DC superhero, most recently played by Jason Momoa, who has the power to swim real good, kind of control sea creatures, and uses a trident to control water and the weather.

ANS: Aquaman <MCB- Other>

BONUS 12. For 10 points each, name these songs that feature very high numerical measurements.

A. This 1988 song by Scottish rock duo “The Proclaimers” saw the narrator say that he would walk two sets of this title distance to be with his lover.

ANS: I’m Gonna Be (500 Miles) [**Prompt** on any portion of the answerline]

B. This 2011 song by Christina Perri was originally made for the soundtrack of *The Twilight Saga: Breaking Dawn - Part 1*, and describes the narrator promising to love her lover for the title length of time.

ANS: A Thousand Years

C. This 2016 song by Lady Gaga was about the men in her life giving her the title measurement to leave them, when all she wanted was one to stay.

ANS: Million Reasons <EGM - Music>

TU 13. This show is heavily influenced by H.P Lovecraft’s philosophy of cosmicism, with one of the two title characters saying “nobody exists on purpose, nobody belongs anywhere, everybody's gonna die. Come watch TV.” The seventh episode of this show’s fourth season drew some controversy for a scene in which the two title characters resist the urge to reenact the September (*) 11th terrorist attacks. One of this show’s most famous episodes features one of the title characters turning themselves into a pickle to avoid a family counseling session, one of the funniest things I’ve ever seen. For 10 points, name this animated adult sitcom, which you have to have a very high IQ to understand.

ANS: Rick and Morty <EGM - Film & TV>

BONUS 13. These bonus questions may be a little scary, but for 10 points each, answer these questions about niche phobias.

A. People who have trypophobia are typically afraid of these kinds of things. Examples of what could be scary include, but are not limited to: Sponges, enlarged pores, the Surinam toad, and honeycomb.

ANS(A): [DESCRIPTION ACCEPTABLE] clusters of holes, things with holes in them

B. Anatidaephobia was the source of a meme popularized by the Urban Dictionary. It entails the fear of no matter where you are or what you are doing; somewhere and somehow one of these things is watching you.

ANS(B): A duck

C. Looking up images of this phobia is actually quite interesting if you do not suffer from it. This phobia describes the fear of animatronics and other man-made objects being fully or partially submerged in water.

ANS(C): Submechanophobia <MCB - Other>

TU 14. In one game manual, this character is described as being “a romanticist, a feminist, and a self-professed gentleman.” This character’s original name came from the Czech word for servant, though his more commonly used name reflects his physique, which was designed around the idea that a (*) round character would be easier for children to draw. That rotund stature as well as his pronounced mustache leads many people to compare this character’s appearance to former US President Theodore Roosevelt. For ten points, name this antienvironmentalist villain portrayed by Jim Carrey in the *Sonic the Hedgehog* movies.

ANS: Doctor Ivo Robotnik OR Dr. Eggman <WGC - VG & IC>

BONUS 14. He’s white and nerdy. For ten points each, answer these questions about Weird Al Yankovich.

A. Weird Al is known for his polka parodies in which he plays this instrument.

ANS(A): Accordion

B. In light of the HBO documentary *Leaving Neverland*, Weird Al no longer performs two of his most famous parodies at his live shows. Name either one.

ANS(B): Eat and Eat It [which were parodies of Michael Jackson’s “Bad” and “Beat It,” respectively]

C. In his album *Running With Scissors*, Weird Al recapped the plot of this 1999 movie to the tune of Don McLean’s “American Pie.”

ANS(C): Star Wars Episode I: The Phantom Menace [**accept** either underlined section; **prompt** on “The Saga Begins,” which is the name of the song, not the movie on which it is based. I guess also **prompt** on “Star Wars.”] <EMC - Music>

TU 15. Until being passed up by *Sing* in 2016, this film held the record for highest-grossing film of all time to never reach number one at the box office during its release, though this film still holds that record when adjusted for inflation. Later, the cast sued one of the film's producers for their share of the profits, except for lead actress (*) Nia Vardalos, who had a separate deal due to having starred in and written the play it was based on. This film helped popularize the Bundt cake due to a scene in which one of the two leads' parents bring it to a party with the other's family. For 10 points, name this 2002 film, which is the highest grossing romantic comedy in history.

ANS: My Big Fat Greek Wedding <EGM - Film & TV>

BONUS 15. We can still find great wisdom in Scripture. For 10 points each, identify each book of the Bible by the given subject addressed in it.

A. In the fifth chapter of this book, Jesus says that if "thy right hand offend thee, cut it off, and cast it from thee," which is sometimes interpreted as a prohibition against masturbation.

ANS(A): The Gospel of Matthew

B. In the seventh chapter of this book, the author writes to his lover "how beautiful are thy feet with shoes," meaning that foot fetishes are, fortunately, Biblically ordained.

ANS(B): Song of Solomon

C. In the twenty-third chapter of this book, God prescribes a method for the Israelites to deal with wet dreams, commanding them to leave the camp for one day. Notably, it is not a sin.

ANS(C): Deuteronomy <EGM- Other>

TU 16. This English musician's happy, carefree personality has been contrasted with his dark, punk-inspired music. A good example of this is his 2022 single "The (*) Funeral," which describes the narrator watching as nobody attends the title event. That song was part of his eponymous third album, which was released on September 2, 2022. In another one of his songs, he describes and advocates for rebellious actions such as having sex with his best friend because "parents aren't always right." For 10 points each, name this artist, whose songs often contain themes of sexual liberation, and who dated musician Halsey for several months in 2019.

ANS: Yungblud <EGM - Music>

BONUS 16. For 10 points each, identify these epic screen villains of the 21st century. [**note to moderator: if the question is missed, provide the piece of media the character is from**]

A. This hitman who was hired to retrieve the \$2 million of cartel money stolen by Llewelyn Moss was ranked by a group of psychologists as *Most Realistic Depiction of a Psychopath* in the *Journal of Forensic Scientists*.

ANS: Anton Chigurh from *No Country for Old Men* [**accept** either underlined portion]

B. This brilliant, sadistic, yet charming SS officer, known as "The Jew Hunter" in France, made a deal with the Allies to allow the assassination of the Nazi Party inner circle in exchange for amnesty for his war crimes.

ANS: Hans Landa from *Inglorious Basterds* [**accept** either underlined portion]

C. This yuppie investment banker sometimes matter-of-factly confesses to his crimes, telling one of his friends "I like to dissect girls, did you know that I'm utterly insane" to see if they are listening. They never are.

ANS: Patrick Bateman from *American Psycho* [**accept** either underlined portion] <EGM - Film & TV>

TU 17. Guillermo del Toro was removed from a project to produce a dark film based off this place, after the sponsoring studio decided his vision was too scary for family audiences and didn't reflect the company image. That film based on this place, now with a new director and script and starring Rosario Dawson and Danny Devito, is now projected to be released in March 2023. A Muppets special set at this place dropped on Disney+ during the 2021 Halloween season. A 2003 film starring (*) Eddie Murphy set at and titled after this place garnered poor reviews, with one *Rotten Tomatoes* review reading "neither scary nor funny, (the movie) is as lifeless as its ghosts." Different versions of this place can be found in Tokyo, California, and Orlando, while similar places with different names can be found in Paris and Hong Kong. For ten points, name this ghoulish attraction found in New Orleans Square at Disneyland or in Liberty Square at Walt Disney World.

ANS: the Haunted Mansion [prompt on "Haunted Manor," "Phantom Manor," "Mystic Manor," or "Haunted House"] <EMC - Other>

BONUS 17. For ten points each, identify these songs that saw a resurgence in popularity after being featured in Netflix shows.

A. After being featured in *Stranger Things Volume 4*, this 1985 Kate Bush single saw a 16,000% streaming increase that led it to become the most-streamed song on Spotify in June 2022.

ANS(A): Running Up That Hill

B. The 1987 Tiffany cover of this 1967 Ritchie Cordell song saw a streaming increase in 2019 after the cast of *The Umbrella Academy* danced to it in the show's debut episode.

ANS(B): I Think We're Alone Now

C. This song trended on TikTok after being featured in a scene of Netflix's *Heartstopper* in which Nick Nelson realizes he is bisexual.

ANS(C): Why am I Like This <EMC - music>

TU 18. A clip of this character's voice actor Bill Fagerbakke in the 2009 film *Jennifer's Body*, in which he threatened to castrate his son's killer, went viral due to Fagerbakke's widespread association with this character. In the episode "Chocolate With (*) Nuts", this character followed his friend's advice to "flatter the customer" by greeting him with a passionate "I love you." A. This man who gained international fame for winning the Tour de France seven times in a row was later stripped of all his victories due to the revelation that he had led a sophisticated doping ring.

ANS(A): Lance Armstrong

B. This quarterback received a year-long suspension while playing in college for Florida in 2015 for testing positive for Ligandrol, an over-the-counter drug he was unaware was banned.

ANS(B): Will Grier

C. This man, who won the single season MLB home run record in 2001, was indicted in 2007 on charges of perjury and obstruction of justice during a federal investigation into a steroid manufacturer.

ANS: screamo [also **accept** “skramz” **before** it is named; **prompt** on “emo” **before** “Midwest Emo”] <WGC - Music>

BONUS 19. Prove you’re not a fugly slut and for ten points each, get your pencils and paper ready to solve these math problems seen in the movie *Mean Girls*. You will have fifteen seconds after the end of the question is read to report your answer.

A. For this most famous problem in the film, which scored North Shore High the title of Illinois Mathlete State Champions: Evaluate the limit as x approaches zero of the natural log of one minus x all minus sine x all over one minus cosine squared x .

ANS(A): The limit does not exist

B. This first problem seen at the mathletes championship is as follows: Twice the larger of two numbers is three more than five times the smaller, and the sum of four times the larger and three times the smaller is 71. What are the numbers?

ANS(B): five and fourteen

C. North Shore’s rivals, Marymount, buzz correctly on this problem, which actually has two correct answers. Give either answer– the one given in the movie or the other correct answer, either is equally acceptable. “Find an odd three-digit number whose digits all add up to twelve. The digits are all different, and the difference between the first two digits equals the distance between the next two digits.”

TU 20. In 2020, this man led the world in income from endorsements with \$100 million. This man first made a name for himself at the 1998 Wimbledon by winning both the boys' singles final over Irakli Labadze, and the doubles while teamed up with Oliver Rochus. This man is known for his versatility, being one of the few players to be highly successful on clay, grass, and hard court. In 2018, this man became the (*) oldest ATP in the world, at age 36. In his famous rivalry with Rafael Nadal, this man trails Nadal 16-24. For 10 points, name this Swiss Tennis player, who has won the second most ATP singles in history, after Jimmy Connors.

BONUS 20. For ten points each, answer these questions about islands in video games.

A. This dolphin-shaped island serves as a vacation hotspot for the subjects of the Mushroom Kingdom in *Super Mario Sunshine*.

ANS(A): Isle Delfino

B. Swordplay, bicycling, and bowling are only some of the many activities enjoyed by the residents of this island seen in the *Wii Sports* series.

ANS(B): Wuhu Island [woohoo]

C. In *Elder Scrolls*, the Dadrac Prince of Madness, Sheogorath, reigns over this island divided into Mania and Dementia.

ANS(C): the Shivering Isles <WGC - VG & IC>
