

Purdue Campus Packet

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TOSSUPS:

1. Description acceptable: **It isn't engineering-related, but this region contains a "mall" that covers two blocks. Lynn Hall and Lyles-Porter Hall are located in this region. Harrison Street cuts through this region, and (*) State Street divides this region from the rest of campus.** For 10 points, name this region of Purdue's campus that is dedicated to a college containing majors such as Forestry and Plant Science.

ANSWER: **Agricultural** Campus [accept **Ag** Campus]

2. **One room in this complex is supposedly home to Purdue Pete. Scholarship athletes used to dine at this complex's former All-American Dining Room. This complex was named after a (*) student who died of appendicitis shortly before he was set to attend Purdue. This complex contains The Burrow and a Night Spot.** For 10 points each, name this collection of men's dormitories located on Stadium Avenue.

ANSWER: **Cary** Quadrangle

3. **It isn't Ross-Ade or Mackey, but a Purdue Team Store is located in this building. Purdue's For Me Tours typically begin at this building. This building houses the offices of Admissions, the Bursar, and the Registrar. A library commonly known as (*) HSSE is located in this building. Spaces within this building include Fowler Hall and Loeb Playhouse.** For 10 points, name this large building located next to the Purdue Memorial Union.

ANSWER: **Stewart** Center

4. **This place is located next to a road called Oval Drive. This place contains a stretch of sidewalk with a plaque instructing you to say hello to everyone you pass. A statue and a fountain mark where (*) John Purdue is buried underneath this place. Stanley Coulter Hall and University Hall overlook this place.** For 10 points, name this large green space located on State Street that hosts a farmers market in the fall.

ANSWER: **Memorial Mall**

5. **A recently-proposed residence hall project will be located at the corner of this street and McCormick Road. The only fire station on Purdue's campus can be found on this street. This street is a part of one of the busiest intersections on campus where it crosses (*) University Street.** For 10 points, name this numerically-numbered street that becomes pedestrian-only through residential campus.

ANSWER: **Third** Street

6. A building dedicated to this field is named after the president and CEO of Tricor International. Another building dedicated to this discipline features three allegorical statues by Jon Magnus Jonson carved into its exterior. That building of this type features a large, (*) rounded brick exterior, while another was completed in 2022 and is named for Marc and Sharon Hagle. For 10 points, name this artistic discipline that provides part of the name for Elliott Hall.

ANSWER: **music**

BONUSES:

1. The namesake of this building graduated in 1938 with a degree in Mechanical Engineering.

For 10 points each:

[10h] Name this “Center For Entrepreneurship” that is named after the founder of an adhesive company.

ANSWER: Burton D. **Morgan** Center For Entrepreneurship

[10m] The Burton D. Morgan Center is part of this district, which is a collection of research-focused buildings.

ANSWER: **Discovery Park**

[10e] The VOSS Model, which can be found in Discovery Park, is a scale model of this astronomical system and depicts the orbits of the planets.

ANSWER: the **solar system**

2. For 10 points each, answer the following about fast food locations near Purdue’s campus:

[10e] Those with late-night cravings for McNuggets and Big Macs often visit this establishment, located at the corner of Stadium Avenue and Northwestern Avenue.

ANSWER: **McDonald’s**

[10h] This sandwich shop can be found in the Purdue West strip mall across from McCutcheon Drive Parking Garage.

ANSWER: **Subway**

[10m] A franchise of this burger chain is located in Chauncey Hill mall.

ANSWER: **Five Guys**

3. This building can be found between Class of 1950 and the Psychological Sciences Building.

For 10 points each:

[10h] Name this small, orange brick building that I could not find any information about.

ANSWER: **Peirce** Hall

[10e] Peirce Hall was originally constructed as an addition to this building. The modern building with this name is located next to Armstrong Hall and is abbreviated “PHYS.”

ANSWER: **Physics** Building

[10m] In 1941, Peirce Hall was renamed to describe its new role as space for this discipline. This discipline is now centered in Lilly Hall.

ANSWER: **Biology**

4. This building was originally known as Graduate House. For 10 points each:

[10h] Name this building on South Grant Street that has a distinctive blue exterior.

ANSWER: **Young** Hall

[10e] Young Hall is located next to this twelve-story residence hall, which was originally called Graduate House II. It is the only residence hall located near the southeast corner of campus.

ANSWER: George **Hawkins** Hall

[10m] Hawkins overlooks this building, which houses many performing arts spaces.

ANSWER: Yue-Kong **Pao** Hall of Visual and Performing Arts

5. For 10 points each, answer the following about the grossest buildings I could think of.

[10e] This notoriously-bad residence hall is home to Pete's Za and is known for having particularly wild residents and disgusting bathrooms.

ANSWER: Newton Booth **Tarkington** Residence Hall

[10h] This largely irrelevant building was originally known as the Home Economics building. It can be found at the corner of University and State Streets.

ANSWER: **Matthews** Hall

[10m] Before the construction of Chaney-Hale Hall of Science, this building served as the facility for chemistry labs. It is attached to Wetherill Hall by a second-story bridge.

ANSWER: Herbert C. **Brown** Laboratory of Chemistry

6. For 10 points each, now answer some questions about the least gross buildings I could find.

[10h] This building contains Boiler Bistro and is the home of the Hospitality and Tourism Management program.

ANSWER: **Marriott** Hall

[10e] This newest building on campus was completed in 2023 and contains expansive space for both the College of Engineering and the Polytechnic Institute.

ANSWER: **Lambertus** and **Dudley** Halls [accept **Gateway** Complex]

[10m] Located on Northwestern Avenue, this building contains space for graduate studies in the School of Electrical and Computer Engineering.

ANSWER: Seng-Liang **Wang** Hall
