1. **A sketch featuring this man titled "Blake Like Me" depicts him in "disguise" as Blake Griffin and playing horrifically bad basketball. Laurie Metcalf played a former social worker and best friend in a sitcom starring and named for this man centered on a disgraced former NHL player. Lieutenant Lt. Yaphit (VOFF-it), a small green blob in the first two seasons of *The Orville*, was voiced by this actor, who also voiced an utterly depraved (*) pigeon on Adult Swim's *Mike Tyson Mysteries*. 2. **The studio behind this game series was initially formed to make the action game *The Mark of Kri*. Certain editions of a 2022 game in this series featured cover artwork by *Afro Samurai* creator Takashi Okazaki. Video segments starring Bob Kendrick punctuate this series' "Storylines" mode that was introduced in a 2023 release. Advertisements for this series were the first to feature the character Kevin (*) Butler, who often told another figure "well done." A "Captain Edition" was released for the most recent game in this series, which has featured the only games by the "San Diego Studio" to be released on Xbox. "Stubs" are the in-game currency of a card-collecting mode in this series partially named "Dynasty." A create-a-player mode is titled for the "Road to" the title location of, for 10 points, what pro baseball franchise by Sony?**

3. *Description acceptable.* **In a film, a committee responds to this work by discussing how its protagonist once appeared in a Ricky Martin music video. Kim Kardashian recreated this work as part of a Halloween costume in 2019. This work includes a *Days of Our Lives* recap and a vote on switching toilet paper from Charmin to generic brand. Members of the (*) Delta Nu sorority and the dog Bruiser appear in this video, which begins with the protagonist introducing herself in a hot tub wearing a sequined pink bikini. During this work, a protagonist smiles after responding "I object" to a catcall to demonstrate her use of relevant jargon. For 10 points, name this video prepared by a Reese Witherspoon-played character in hopes of attending a prestigious law school.**

4. **The Beighton Cup is a prestigious annual club tournament held for this sport, which was dominated for decades by Leslie Claudius. In the mid-19th century, some clubs for this sport made use of a black cube, preferring it to its more common equivalent. To reduce dangerous play, this sport established an "undercutting" foul that can be called when a central object leaves the playing surface. Alexander Hendrickx is a star with the Belgian national team of this sport, who won gold at the Tokyo Olympics. This sport has earned (*) India a plurality of its Olympic medals. Players in this sport may be awarded a "penalty corner" for infractions within a 23-meter semicircle. Implements used in this sport are nearly identical to those used in the ice sport bandy. For 10 points, name this sport in which players use a curved stick to hit a ball around a pitch.**

5. **Radiohead and this group collaborated on choreographer Merce Cunningham's piece *Split Sides*, which this band released as an EP titled *Ba Ba Ti Ki Di Do*. Several works by this group feature its singer's former life partner, Alex Somers, who also collaborated with this group's singer on the album *Riceboy Sleeps*. A 2005 single by this group is titled for a compound word meaning "hopping into puddles," (*) "Hoppípolla"; that song appears on an album titled for a word meaning "thanks." A song that is officially untitled but is typically known as "Vaka" is one of many songs by this group sung in Vonlenska, a gibberish language this group devised. An acclaimed album whose title is a pair of parentheses was released by, for 10 points, what post-rock band from Iceland?**

ANSWER: **Sigur Rós** <Nelson>

6. **A series of informal 'awards' named for people with this characteristic was awarded annually by blogger Michael Harriot. A person with this characteristic is described as out "of breath and coughing" in a song critical of them by Was (Not Was). People with this trait are referenced in the title of a TV series directed by Justin Simien, which was itself based on a film starring Tessa Thompson. Food associated with people with this trait is central to the (*) "Lunch of Suffering," a recent social media trend in China. Coffee, awareness, and assists are among the things described in a late 2000s blog about the things that people with this characteristic "like." A song about these people from Bo Burnham's *Make Happy* claims they "invented everything but peanut butter." The last category in every episode of *SNL*'s "Black Jeopardy" is, for 10 points, what majority people of the US?**

ANSWER: **white** people [or whites; accept wypipo or "White People Can't Dance" or Stuff White People Like] <Nelson>

7. Jody Trautwein, who specializes in this service, is complimented for the plumpness of his lips in the film *Bruno*. Marshall and Nancy seek out this service in a 2018 film after they get an unprompted phone call from a character played by Joe Alwyn. A hippie girl named Jane Fonda and her friend Adam Red Eagle receive this service in another 2018 film that stars (*) Chloë Grace Moretz. A business that once sold this service is the subject of the 2011 film *This Is What Love in Action Looks Like*. A memoir by Garrard Conley inspired a film about this practice starring Nicole Kidman as a fundamentalist mother. The dramas *The Miseducation of Cameron Post* and *Boy Erased* center on, for 10 points, what religiously-motivated practice central to the documentary *Pray Away?*

ANSWER: gay **conversion therapy** [accept answers indicating a purported service for turning **gay** people **straight**, such as **ex-gay** ministry or a **pray-the-gay-away** camp] <Vopava>

8. A character on this show compliments a stoner on her shooting ability by nicknaming her Jane Wayne, but is then told that her father--who taught her to shoot--shot himself. The real-life daughter of this show's star has a cameo as a barista who tries to serve her father's character coffee in a paper cup. This show's main character seems to befriend an aging white horse named Pilot, who he encounters on a ranch that employs the Max Casella-played Armand. On this show, a dispute with the Black Macadam (*) biker gang over selling nitrous oxide at a festival is investigated by ATF agent Stacy Beale. Martin Starr plays a weed dispensary owner named Bodhi on this show who is brought under the protection of an Invernizzi family member nicknamed General. For 10 points, name this 2023 show in which a mobster played by Sylvester Stallone sets up a racket in Oklahoma.

9. At the recording session for this song, engineer Don Casale told its performers to practice the song while he tested levels, but instead left the room and let its band perform it in one take. For the soundtrack to the 1987 film *Less than Zero*, Slayer recorded a faster, more intense cover of this song. A 1968 album whose A-side opens with "Most Anything You Want" features (*) only this song, the album's title track, on its B-side. At the start of this song, which also features an iconic Ron Bushy drum solo, vocalist Doug Ingle pleads to the listener "won't you come with me, and take my hand" after declaring "Don't you know that I'll always be true?" 10. After beating Western Michigan in a bowl game in this city, Brian Kelly became the only coach to beat the same school with two different teams in the same season. This city has hosted over 40 instances of the Vanier Cup, which began in this city's Varsity Stadium. In 2011, South Florida won the last iteration of a bowl game based in this city which featured schools from the MAC and Big East. "Pinball" Clemons spent a decade playing for a team in this city and now serves as its general manager. Doubts over an NFL team's ability to secure a (*) new stadium led to five regular season games being played in this city in an arrangement that was approved by Ralph Wilson. This phrase is referenced by a response given by Claire Quilty in a 1962 adaptation of *Lolita*. Many instances of this phrase were recorded using the crowd at a Notre Dame football game. In an uncredited role, a man played by Carleton Young delivers a (*) proclamation that precedes this phrase. A group of crucified men shouting a parody of this phrase causes mass confusion at the end of *Monty Python's Life of Brian*. The blacklisting of writer Dalton Trumbo inspired the scene featuring this phrase, whose many speakers are offered leniency if they give up their leader to General Crassus. For 10 points, name this phrase with which Roman slaves all proclaim to be Kirk Douglas's character in a 1960 Stanley Kubrick film.

12. According to personal manager Gary Moore, a central figure of this event likened it to "providing" the "Kryptonite." Involvement in this event was cited by one of its central figures as the reason he signed a lucrative contract with the Washington Wizards. This event helped seal the first loss one of its teams had experienced in over two months, and capped off a (*) 48-point performance by its instigator. While discussing his role in this event, a Hall of Famer claimed "I don't like it because I love him" in reference to the mockery this event caused for a man who is now the coach of the L.A. Clippers. A stepback jumper in front of the Lakers' bench immediately preceded, for 10 points, what notorious action in Game 1 of the 2001 NBA Finals taken by a 76ers point guard known as The Answer?

13. **This rapper appeared to mock the death of a former rival in his early single "Dis Ain't What U Want." Before his death, King Von was part of this artist's collective and record label, Only the Family. In a guest appearance, this rapper called out 6ix9ine ("six nine") for snitching with the lyric "We do not listen to rats." Morgan Wallen described a woman he met "down at Aldean's" in an unexpected collaboration with this rapper titled "Broadway Girls." This artist shouts "Pooh (*) Shiesty that's my dog, but Pooh, you know I'm really Shiesty" as the featured artist on the track "Back in Blood." Bloody bandages cover this rapper's face on the cover of his 2023 album *Almost Healed*. Drake's "Laugh Now Cry Later" features, for 10 points, what Chicago rapper behind the 2023 hit "All My Life"?**

14. **To host a house party with the band Anthrax, Bud Bundy sends his parents to one of these events on an episode of *Married with Children*. On *King of the Hill*, Cotton Hill uses a sudden inheritance to go to Mexico to attend one of these events, to Hank's dismay. A man played by Billy Crudup leads numerous examples of these events in the 2023 Apple TV series *Hello Tomorrow*. The fictional wife Wanda Jo hosts a parody of one of these events in a 2023 comedy news episode that proposes using an extremely inefficient (*) "exit company." In an episode of *South Park*, several parents are held at gunpoint after calling the police during an unbearably long one of these events in Aspen. In a 2023 *Last Week Tonight* episode, "lying" is described as a key element of, for 10 points, what highly aggressive attempts at selling temporally variable real estate?**

15. **This company owns the product lines Farex and Daddies, which are sold in Commonwealth countries. In a sight gag in *The Manchurian Candidate*, John Iselin ("EYES"-lin) uses a product by this company just before a jump-cut to Iselin making an announcement about Communists. McDonald's ended its relationship with this company in 2013 after this company hired former Burger King head Bernardo Hees as CEO. In her previous marriage, John (*) Kerry's wife Teresa was married to a scion of this company's namesake family, which merged with Kraft in 2015. Until they were made available at Walmart in 2011, customers frequently hoarded this company's Dip & Squeeze packets. A combination of two lucky numbers, and *not* any purported number of food "varieties," is the source of the slogan of, for 10 points, what ketchup company?**

16. **A character in this film reveals her childhood trauma through a rant that begins by discussing ice cream toppings. In another scene, that character from this film loses a fight to a rattlesnake and then subsequently makes out with the Chinese lesbian singer who saves her. This film's jazzy soundtrack featured the tracks "Coke Room" and "Voodoo Mama" and earned composer Justin (*) Hurwitz critical acclaim. Rodents are eaten alive at parties thrown by the mobster James McKay in this film who is played by Tobey Maguire. The ending of this film was widely criticized for showing the audience a montage of popular movies including *The Matrix* and *Avatar* while this film's protagonist cries watching *Singin' in the Rain*. In reference to his birth year, this player switched to the jersey number 84 upon joining his final MLB team. In 2015 this player earned Comeback Player of the Year honors after overcoming a neck injury; a year later, spinal disk herniations forced him into retirement while still under a massive contract with the (*) Rangers. This player was videotaped hitting batting practice home runs to the upper deck of Tiger Stadium as a 12-year-old. Upon securing a 50-home run season, this player claimed he wanted to reach 52 to "shut up" an estranged family member. In 2023 Variety reported on an upcoming film adaptation of a work by this author about a girl who has nightmares about rain after a bad breakup causes her to develop an eating disorder; that story is the first in this author's collection (*) *Smashed*. This author's cameo as the Engineer in the video game *Death Stranding* honors his aborted work with Hideo Kojima on *Silent Hills*. In a novel by this author, Kirie chops off her hair because it, like many things in town, begins mutating into an insidious spiral. 19. A 2021 song that repeatedly claims "Pretty girl, you're like" these objects was a hit for South Korean singer Kai. Roman Coppola directed the 1996 music video of a song named for these objects that ends with its performers being attacked by ninja. A Canadian singer named for these objects released the 2006 album *Impeach My Bush*, which included her hit "Boys Wanna Be Her." Jack (*) Black plays a piano while wearing a green suit and a red mullet wig in the humorous video for a song that shares its name with these objects that first appeared in a 2023 animated film. In a hit for the Presidents of the United States of America, these objects are said to "come from a can, they were put there by a man." Daniel Cesar and Giveon featured on a 2021 hit named after, for 10 points, what fruits that Justin Beiber has "out in Georgia"?

20. A group of contestants from this show competed in a special episode of *The Weakest Link* that resulted in the lowest amount of winnings in the show's history. A "Beat the Beast" segment was featured in MTV's short-lived 2017 reboot of this series. Winners of this series are addressed with a catchphrase beginning with the word "evidently." The Dutch series *Now or Neverland* was adapted into this show, which prompted a lawsuit by Austin Aitken who claimed that watching this show made him so (*) ill that he ran into a door. In the mid-2000s, Universal Studios was home to an attraction based on this series that included an "Eel Tank Relay." An episode of this series was rejected by NBC due to its use of donkey semen. 1. Since 2020, the annual "Science of Scare" project has determined the scariest movies of all time by measuring their viewers' average heart rates. For 10 points each:

[10] For each of the last two years, the scariest movie according to the study has been *Host*, a 56-minute horror film whose action occurs in this app, which was used due to the film's creation during COVID lockdowns.

ANSWER: **Zoom**

[10] *Host* dethroned this 2012 Scott Derrickson film, in which murders committed by children are immortalized as film reels, as the study's "scariest movie."

ANSWER: **Sinister**

[10] The study also measured spikes in heart rate to determine the scariest jump scares, a list that gave high marks to the notorious hospital scene from this 1990 sequel.

ANSWER: *The **Exorcist III*** <Nelson>

2. A fictitious business founded by someone with this surname released a jingle that asks "suppose you're going nut-gathering" and describes its products as "positively, very, very necessary." For 10 points each:

[10] Identify this surname shared by three generations of men that operate a business that sells "every adverb in the book."

ANSWER: **Lolly** [accept "**Lolly, Lolly, Lolly**, Get Your Adverbs Here" or **Lolly**, Inc.]

[10] "Lolly, Lolly, Lolly, Get Your Adverbs Here" appeared with songs like "Conjunction Junction" appeared on this 1970s and 80s animated children's educational TV show.

ANSWER: **Schoolhouse Rock!**

[10] In a song that teaches children about pronouns, this character finds a kangaroo that followed him home. In that song, this character's sister finds an aardvark and the singer finds a rhinoceros.

ANSWER: **Rufus** Xavier **Sarsaparilla** [accept either underlined portion] <Andert>

3. In a verse from his hit "The Box," Roddy Ricch claimed to put "a hundred bands" on this man, meaning an offer of \$100,000 to kill him. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this awful person, who cited "stand your ground" laws following his killing of Trayvon Martin.

ANSWER: George (Michael) **Zimmerman**

[10] In a verse on Drake's "Talk Up," Jay-Z lamented that the "streets is done" because Zimmerman was alive but this rapper of "Jocelyn Flores" and "Moonlight" was dead.

ANSWER: **XXXTentacion** (X-X-X ten-tah-see-OHN) [or Jahseh Dwayne Ricardo **Onfroy**]

[10] In his song "Devil's Work," this rapper lamented "Zimmerman walk free, we don't like that." This rapper depicted a conservative white guy's dialogue to a Black man in the viral hit "I'm Not Racist."

ANSWER: Joyner **Lucas** [or Gary Maurice **Lucas** Jr.] <Nelson>

4. A list of upcoming actions in this essay includes a dramatic re-creation of the *Diff'rent Strokes* episode in which Gary Coleman's character nearly gets molested. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this vaguely holiday-themed 2009 essay by Colin Nissan, which is typically republished to viral success every September.

ANSWER: "**It's Decorative Gourd Season, Motherfuckers**"

[10] In the article, Nissan appropriately claims he will use a decorative gourd to make a perfect replica of this English transport vessel, from which he will do "lines of blow" "with a hooker."

ANSWER: **Mayflower**

[10] "It's Decorative Gourd Season, Motherfuckers" is only the second-most read article in the history of McSweeney's, behind a fictional, new age-y one of these texts ostensibly written by "Jamie and Jeff." Its "Philosophy" section notes " We are opposed to torture/gluten."

ANSWER: **birth plan** [accept any answer describing an **agenda** or **plan for giving birth**; accept "**Jamie and Jeff's Birth Plan**"] <Nelson>

5. Initial seasons of this series depicted five patients each, with each patient appearing on a different day of the week. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this acclaimed HBO series. Its first three seasons starred Gabriel Byrne as a therapist, as well as Dianne Wiest as *his* therapist.

ANSWER: **In Treatment**

[10] A brief 2021 revival of *In Treatment* starred this actress, who is best known for playing the volatile Suzanne Warren on a long-running Netflix series.

ANSWER: Uzo **Aduba** (OO-zoh uh-DOO-buh) [or Uzoamaka Nwanneka **Aduba**]

[10] Among the Emmy winners from *In Treatment* was Glynn Turman, who previously played the Baltimore mayor Clarence Royce on this other HBO series.

ANSWER: *The **Wire*** <Nelson>

6. In 1929, Ernie Nevers scored all 40 points for this team against the Chicago Bears. For 10 points each:

[10] In addition to kicking four extra points, Nevers rushed for six touchdowns while playing for this franchise. Its current starting running back is James Conner.

ANSWER: **Arizona Cardinals** [accept **Chicago Cardinals**, prompt on **Chicago**]

[10] The only other player to rush for six touchdowns in a game is this New Orleans Saints running back, who did it against the Vikings on Christmas Day in 2020.

ANSWER: Alvin (Mentian) **Kamara** (kuh-MAR-uh)

[10] Before Kamara, the most recent player to rush for at least *five* touchdowns in a game was this running back in a 2003 game against the Chiefs. Less than a year later, this running back was part of a blockbuster swap for Champ Bailey.

ANSWER: Clinton (Earl) **Portis** <Andert>

[10] Name this 2010 music project. The song "Indestructible" was the lead single from the final portion of this album, which also included the hit "Dancing on My Own."

ANSWER: **Body Talk**

[10] *Body Talk* was a 2010 project by this musician, who completed the rare transformation from teen pop star to full-blown indie icon.

ANSWER: **Robyn** [or Robin Miriam **Carlsson**]

[10] *Body Talk* also featured this absolutely bop in which Robyn tells the listener "you just met somebody new" after requesting he take the title action.

ANSWER: "**Call Your Girlfriend**" <Weiner>

8. For 10 points each, answer the following about the very varied career of now-grown child actor Dylan Minnette:

[10] Minnette is most recognizable as Clay, a classmate who is notably *not* to blame for his friend Hannah Baker's death, in this Netflix teen drama.

ANSWER: **13 Reasons Why**

[10] Minnette's successful forays into horror movies include this 2016 film in which Minnette is one of three young burglars aiming to steal \$300,000 from a disabled Gulf War vet.

ANSWER: **Don't Breathe**

[10] Minnette was 14 when he and several friends formed this bedroom pop band behind the 2019 indie single "Are You Bored Yet?"

ANSWER: **Wallows** <Vopava>

9. Masao and Terue, two characters in this film, share a sweet moment during a song whose lyrics appear on screen like a karaoke performance. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this extremely weird 2001 musical horror film, which was loosely based on the Korean film *The Quiet Family*. Its title family lives in a literal garbage dump that they wish to turn into a bed and breakfast.

ANSWER: *The **Happiness of the Katakuris***

[10] This filmmaker, who is better known for ultraviolet films like *Ichi the Killer* and *Audition*, directed *The Happiness of the Katakuris*.

ANSWER: Takashi **Miike**

[10] An American character in *The Happiness of the Katakuris* claims to be the nephew of this woman, who was played in Oscar-winning fashion by Helen Mirren in a 2006 drama.

ANSWER: Queen **Elizabeth II** [prompt on **Elizabeth**] <Nelson>

10. While a student at NYU, singer-songwriter Maggie Rogers transcribed many of the hundreds of interviews compiled in this book. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this 2017 book by Lizzy Goodman that chronicles New York City's rock music boom in the early 2000s. It was adapted into a documentary in 2022.

ANSWER: **Meet Me in the Bathroom**

[10] The title of *Meet Me in the Bathroom* is taken from a song from *Room on Fire*, the sophomore album by this New York band behind "Last Nite" and "Reptilia."

ANSWER: The **Strokes**

[10] The book also prominently features this group behind the concert film *Shut Up and Play The Hits*; that film's directors also helmed the *Meet Me in the Bathroom* documentary series.

ANSWER: **LCD Soundsystem** <Nelson>

11. In an act of astounding hypocrisy, this character eats much of his date Sarah's chocolate torte while Sarah steps away to take a phone call. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this TV character who, per a mantra he later shouts at Sarah, "doesn't share food."

ANSWER: **Joey Tribbiani** [or **Joseph** Francis Tribbiani Jr.; accept any underlined portion]

[10] The claim "Joey doesn't share food" is made by this *Friends* actor, who later played an over-the-top version of himself on the sitcom *Episodes*.

ANSWER: Matt **LeBlanc** [or Matthew Steven **LeBlanc**]

ANSWER: Anna (Kay) **Faris** <Nelson>

12. Noted pop singer Jewel has several relatives who are also sort of famous. For 10 points each:

[10] Jewel's dad, Atz Kilcher, is a co-star of this Discovery Channel show, which is subtitled "The Last Frontier" and is named for their family's home state.

ANSWER: **Alaska: The Last Frontier**

[10] Q'orianka Kilcher, one of Jewel's cousins, played this historical figure in Terrence Malick's romantic drama *The New World*.

ANSWER: **Pocahontas** [accept **Amonute** or **Matoaka**]

[10] Jewel was once married to Ty Murray, who is considered one of the greatest athletes in the history of this sport. Its other all-time greats include Tuff Hedeman and J. B. Mauney.

ANSWER: **rodeo** [or **bull-riding** or similar; prompt on **PBR**] <Nelson>

13. Baron Davis, who directed a documentary about this league, first played in it when he was 13. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this California pro-am basketball league, which was originally named for the middle school where its games were held. To aid its local community, this league notably ran games during the Rodney King riots.

ANSWER: **Drew** League

[10] This LA native and Drew League regular first played in the league when he was 14. This player spent his first nine NBA seasons with the Raptors before being part of a Kawhi Leonard trade.

ANSWER: DeMar (Darnell) **DeRozan** (deh-ROH-zin)

[10] During the 2011 NBA lockout, this 20-year Lakers veteran hit a game-winning jumper in an iconic performance at the Drew League.

ANSWER: **Kobe** (Bean) **Bryant** [accept either underlined portion] <Nelson>

14. A performer known by this moniker takes the novice construction worker Adam under his wing and assigns him the nickname "the Kid." For 10 points each:

[10] Give this stage name that Michael Lane uses while performing at Xquisite as an exotic dancer in a 2012 film.

ANSWER: **Magic Mike** [prompt on partial answers]

[10] Magic Mike's boss at Xquisite is an ex-stripper played by Matthew McConaughey who goes by this name. Coincidentally, this is also the first word in a film starring McConaughey as Ron Woodruff.

ANSWER: **Dallas** [accept **Dallas Buyers Club**]

[10] Mike's most in-demand castmate at Xquisite is this dancer played by Joe Manganiello (MANG-guh-NEL-oh), whose signature act is performed in silhouette behind a screen. He boasts a very lewd stage name.

ANSWER: Big Dick **Richie** [prompt on **Big Dick**] <Vopava>

15. A 1983 law passed by the Arkansas State Senate required that all artists that employ this tactic explicitly label their records accordingly. For 10 points each:

[10] Name or describe this tactic that Judas Priest admitted to using in their song "Love Bites" from *Defenders of the Faith* as part of a 1985 trial.

ANSWER: **backmasking** [or recording **audio backwards**; accept recording **hidden lyrics backwards**; prompt on recording **hidden lyrics** or equivalents if they don't specifically mention that the hidden lyrics are "backwards"]

[10] In response to being listed by name in the 1983 Arkansas law, this band released the concept album *Kilroy Was Here*, whose song "Mr. Roboto" imagined a world where rock was outlawed.

ANSWER: **Styx**

[10] This band responded to backmasking accusations by releasing the 1983 album *Secret Messages*, which is chock full of backmasked content. This group's other 80's output includes the theme to the film *Xanadu*, which also featured Olivia Newton-John.

ANSWER: **Electric Light Orchestra** [or **ELO**] <Weiner>

16. This player was named the Man of the Match at the 2022 EFL Cup Final, a match that was ultimately decided by eleven rounds of penalty kicks. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this soccer player of Surinamese descent. Considered one of the best defenders on the planet, this man began his Premier League career in Southampton before being moved in a record transfer for a defenseman.

ANSWER: Virgil **van Dijk**

[10] Since joining them in 2018, Virgil van Dijk has led a resurgence of this northern English club, including a Premier League championship in 2020. They are often known as the "Reds."

ANSWER: **Liverpool** FC

[10] Van Dijk was one of three Liverpool stars to finish in the top five of the 2019 Ballon d'Or voting, alongside Sadio Mané and this legendary forward from Egypt.

ANSWER: Mohamed **Salah** [or Mo **Salah**; accept Mohamed **Salah** Hamed Mahrous Ghaly] <Nelson>

17. The speedrunner Pannenkoek built up speed for twelve real-life hours in this game for a trick in which he collected the "Watch for Rolling Rocks" star with half a button press. For 10 points each:

[10] Name this platformer whose blindfolded speedrunners use normalized strategies to enter levels by jumping into paintings in Peach's Castle.

ANSWER: *Super* **Mario 64**

[10] Many *Super Mario 64* speedrun categories use this glitch to build speed on a stairway and enter the final Bowser fight early. This trick, often known as "BLJ," is possible due to an error in how the game reads movement on different surfaces.

ANSWER: **backwards long jump**

[10] Until a consistent trick was found, many *Mario 64* speedrun attempts ended upon missing a frame-perfect cannon glitch in a "Fortress" named for these rectangular beings. They should not be confused with a similar enemy in early Mario platformers.

ANSWER: **whomp** [accept **Whomp**'s Fortress; do not accept or prompt on "thwomp"] <Evans>

18. One of the very rare male luminaries to appear in this segment is Little Richard, as played by Kennedy Davenport in season seven. For 10 points each:

[10] Queens showcase their celebrity impersonations on what *RuPaul's Drag Race* challenge formatted like a 1970s panel game show?

ANSWER: **Snatch Game**

[10] Often cited as Snatch Game's greatest performance is this queen's turn as the eccentric Little Edie from the documentary *Grey Gardens*. This queen went on to win season five, and later won season seven of *Drag Race All Stars*.

ANSWER: **Jinkx Monsoon** [accept either underlined portion]

[10] In another unexpected choice, BenDeLaCreme (**BEN de luh KREM**) won season six's *Snatch Game* as this eminent British dame, who at the time played the Dowager Countess on *Downton Abbey*.

ANSWER: (Dame) Maggie **Smith** [or Margaret Natalie **Smith**] <Vopava>

19. In *Who Framed Roger Rabbit*, Eddie Valiant sees this character waiting tables at the Ink and Paint Club, where she remarks "I've still got it!" For 10 points each:

[10] Name this squeaky-voiced 1930s cartoon flapper noted for her very round head and her very short dresses.

ANSWER: **Betty Boop** [accept either underlined portion]

[10] In this 1932 cartoon, Betty Boop encounters spooky figures led by a walrus whose uncanny dance moves were traced from footage of Cab Calloway. Calloway himself performs this cartoon's title song, which has a memorable "hitey-hitey-ho" call-and-response.

ANSWER: **Minnie the Moocher**

[10] Betty Boop was a flagship character of this early animation studio. The art direction in the video game *Cuphead* deliberately mimics this studio's style.

ANSWER: **Fleischer** Studios [accept Max **Fleischer**; prompt on **Famous Studios**] <Vopava>

20. The dimensions of the Texas Rangers' Globe Life Park were all precisely made to honor various people and moments in baseball history. For 10 points each:

[10] Most of the measurements reference Rangers-related things, though the distance from home plate to the backstop was made to be this number of feet. This number is worn by every MLB player every April 15.

ANSWER: **42**

[10] The park's left field line is 329 feet long, in honor of the number 29 worn by this legendary hitter and third baseman, who had a notable and hilarious aversion to having his head touched.

ANSWER: Adrián **Beltré** (**BEL**-tray) [or Adrián **Beltré** Pérez]

[10] The deepest part of the park, at 410 feet from home plate, was set to honor this infielder, the Rangers' all-time leader in hits.

ANSWER: Michael (Brian) **Young** <Nelson>
