

- 1) **On Dora the Explorer, after punitive actions from this character, Swiper stops responding to “Swiper, no swiping” and steals no matter what, while living in a castle and littering, causing Dora to have to travel through time.** In a 1986 Fruity Pebbles ad, Barney Rubble tries to steal the cereal by dressing up as this character, who is already in the Flintstones home, and reminds Fred that it’s the season of sharing. This character had Fred Flintstone replace him twice, once after getting the flu and once after turning his ankle, in two different Flintstones Christmas specials. For 10 points, name this ubiquitous red-clad gift-giver from lots of nearly every Christmas special.
ANSWER: **Santa** Claus

- 2) **In Jojo Rabbit, Jojo is chasing one of these things when he finds his mother in the town square, and Jojo is told that love feels like these things in your stomach.** In the 1930 film *All Quiet on the Western Front*, Paul is killed while reaching for one of these things. In *Alice in Wonderland*, a hookah smoking creature turns into one of these animals and these animals symbolize rebirth to Ron in *Dallas Buyers Club*, in a scene where dozens of these animals land on him. For ten points, name these animals caught by Steve McQueen in *Papillon*-- flying colorful insects.
ANSWER: **Butterfly**

- 3) **This game recommends you get to level 3 before fighting the Garden Knight, who can be frozen with the Magic Dagger.** Some items that the player can pick up in this game are pages of the game’s manual. Andrew Shouldice, the sole developer of this game, said it was inspired by a “certain Triangle-seeking game,” implying its heavy reliance on *Zelda*, and the majority of the dialogue in this game is delivered in a gibberish language. For 10 points, name this 2022 Finji game for Windows and Xbox, that follows a sword-wielding Fox.
ANSWER: **TUNIC**

- 4) **This country has won the most Eurovision Song Contests with seven titles, two of which were won by the only performer to win twice, Johnny Logan.** Siblings Andrea, Sharon, Caroline, and Jim comprise a band from this country known as The Corrs who had a hit with the song “Breathless.” This country is the home of singer-songwriters Damien Rice and Hozier, as well as that of the new age singer behind the songs “May It Be” and “Only Time.” Enya was born in, ftp, what country where The Joshua Tree was recorded by native sons U2?
ANSWER: Republic of **Ireland** <Mickey Sizemore Tossup>

- 5) **This ship was secretly constructed on Damogran and was described as looking like a running shoe on its first voyage.** This ship was the first to have entirely GPP utilizing technology and it was attacked on its first voyage at Magrathea. This spaceship came

with a device that was called a paranoid android, lending its name to a Radiohead album, and it operates using an Infinite Improbability Drive, that created, among other things, a mob of monkeys that made the works of Shakespeare, after it rescued Arthur Dent. For ten points, name this spaceship stolen by Zaphod Beeblebrox in *Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy*, which isn't located inside a hooker.

ANSWER: The **Heart of Gold**

- 6) ***It's not Thomas Brown but this athlete's 8 touchdowns led the SEC for freshmen in 2004, though he only got 357 yards.*** This athlete wrested a starting job away from **Jerome Harrison** in a campaign after he, and two draft picks, were traded for **Brady Quinn**. This athlete shared a college backfield with Felix Jones and Darren McFadden but may be best remembered for winning the janky 2012 Madden Cover tournament. For 10 points, name this Browns running back who recorded half of his career touchdowns in 2010.

ANSWER: Peyton **Hillis**

- 7) ***"Hella Bacon" is a company near this city, that allows you to fire a machine gun out of a helicopter window in order to "control the swine population."*** The **George H.W. Bush Presidential Library** is found in this city that is home to iconic things like the **Northgate Music Festival** and a **Holiday Inn**. For 90 years, a school in this city had an annual bonfire tradition until a 1999 disaster, and that school in this city has produced athletes like Alex Caruso, DeAndre Jordan, and Ryan Tannehill. For 10 points, name this city that's home to Texas A&M.

ANSWER: **College Station**

- 8) ***This person was playing for the Portland Pilots, feet away from Hank Gathers, when Gathers died on the court of a heart condition, some time before this person coached Basketball Bundesliga's second division as a player-coach.*** This coach lost then 2020 finals despite an outsized performance by Jimmy Butler and won a pair of finals with Chris Bosh and Dwayne Wade. For 10 points, name this Miami Heat coach who had much success with LeBron James.

ANSWER: Erik **Spoelstra**

- 9) ***This figure was originally called the "Lone Jogger" and his gibberish language could be translated by Captain Crook.*** In 2002, this figure appeared with **Venus and Serena Williams** to pitch certain \$1 items and he had a weird live-action iteration in 2015. In the 1980s, this figure's unintelligible language got changed to the simpler "robble robble" and he got a makeover to being a red-headed kid with a mask and a black-and-white striped shirt. For 10 points, name this thief who kept trying and failing to steal all the hamburgers in McDonaldland and got foiled by Ronald McDonald.

ANSWER: The Hamburgler

- 10) **It's not Oscar Wilde. Despite being banned by the local church, a tradition is to leave lipstick-kiss-marks on this tomb that, according to one tradition, will one-day regenerate its holder.** This tomb contains the inscription “omnia ab uno,” and at only nine feet high, this pyramid is shockingly small compared to a counterpart at Giza. This tomb, allegedly built because of the proximity to Marie Laveau’s grave, was built in a neo-Egyptian style by an actor who’s appeared in a few Egyptian-themed movies. For 10 points, name this giant pyramid in St. Louis I in New Orleans, Louisiana, to house the remains of the beloved star of Face/Off.

ANSWER: Nicholas Cage’s Tomb

- 11) **In the movie Just Wright, Queen Latifah assists a man who got hurt in this activity, which nearly cost him his job.** Daniel Stern and Dan Aykroyd kidnap a man from Utah in a Judd Apatow movie about this game. Steve James followed recruit Arthur Agee and Williams Gates in a documentary about this sport in Chicago high schools. In Coach Carter, Coach Carter coaches this sport that is central to Uncle Drew. Dennis Hopper’s only Oscar nomination for acting came for playing Shooter in a movie about this sport, that starred Gene Hackman as Coach Norman Dale. For ten points, name this game whose “March Madness” is detailed in Glory Road.

ANSWER: Basketball

- 12) **Sebastien Gabriel designed this game in 2014. Briefly in September 2018, grabbing a birthday cake in this game caused the central figure to don a birthday hat.** This game, which is opened with “control+shift+I,” pivots to nighttime at the 700 point mark, when this game plays, a link underneath it offers to highlight “Running Connectivity Diagnostics” in blue. The central reptile in this game can duck down or jump over most of the birds in this game, but must jump over the cactuses in the way. For ten points, name this game that loads when a certain Alphabet-owned browser can’t connect to the Wifi.

ANSWER: The Dinosaur Game That Plays When Google Chrome Doesn’t have Internet [that’s not the title, so accept anything equivalent]

- 13) **This company became commercially viable after a late-late night commercial featuring Old Man Winter.** This company suffered commercially after its best known rival recorded an advertisement with Linda Ronstadt. The owner of this company pranked a rival by convincing them to drive to the top of Widow’s Peak and got the titular object repossessed by the bank for not making payments when all the snow melted. For 10 points, name *this snowplow company*, that’s my name, that name again is *this snowplow company*, from *The Simpsons*.

ANSWER: Mr. Plow

- 14) *This character gives out different rewards for making bean coffees in Mario & Luigi: Superstar Saga. This character created the time machine for Mario and Luigi in Mario & Luigi: Partners in Time, and after Skolar, this character engineered the top-rated Super Duel equipment in Mario Party 5 for the GameCube. This character invented F.L.U.D.D. in Super Mario Sunshine and in his best known appearance created the Game Boy Horror and Poltergust 3000. For 10 points, name this eccentric Boo-hunting professor from Luigi's Mansion.*

ANSWER: Professor E. Gadd

- 15) *A Christmas 2004 matchup between these two players was the first time they ever played, in a game where the taller scored 24 points before fouling out in 28 minutes, and these two players have appeared in 8 Christmas games together. One of these two players claimed the other showed up to camp "fat and out of shape" and shouldn't have asked for a bigger contract when "we have two future hall of famers basically playing for free" before arranging the other's trade to Miami. One of these two players is the all-time Christmas scoring leader and the other lost all three Christmas matches against the other. For 10 points, name these feuding teammates from the 2000s Lakers who won three titles together.*

ANSWER: Shaquille O'Neal and Kobe Bryant [or "O'Neal and Bryant." Accept either order]

- 16) *In an episode of Father Ted, this song is played so that Frank Kelly would stand up, freeing another priest he was sitting on; and in La Vie en Rose, Edith Piaf is told to "do something" so she starts singing this song. This song is Glass Joe's entry music in Punch-Out!! and in The Grand Illusion, this song is paired with Die Wacht am Rhein after it's found out that the camp will be liberated. In a famous movie scene with this song, expatriates in Morocco drown out a group of Nazi soldiers by singing this song. For 10 points, name this song memorably performed in Casablanca, the French national anthem.*

ANSWER: La Marseillaise

- 17) *This restaurant chain advertised a certain product as a "dangerously cheesy re-imagination," that being the limited time "Mac and Cheetos." This franchise's only franchise under a different name is Australia's Hungry Jack's because of a trademark dispute. In 2022, this chain found that only 15% of its patrons could name*

more than one menu item, rendering moot its slogan of “Have it your way.” For 10 points, name this home of the Whopper that’s the primary rival of McDonalds.

ANSWER: **Burger King**

- 18) **This winner of the 2020 Kwalick-Clark award prompted his backup Zach Gentry to do more in the 2022 season.** This athlete was asked if the spark from a certain rookie quarterback would continue a second week and said “I hope so” before being sent a hospital-ball that led to him getting decked by Quinen Williams. In his rookie year, 2021, this tight end sustained two of his three career concussions, after being selected in the second round out of Penn State, and was PFF’s highest graded blocking TE as a rookie. For 10 points, name this third-year tight end for the Pittsburgh Steelers.

ANSWER: Pat **Freiermuth**

- 19) **Smile masks are often traditionally worn during this holiday, and some of the most popular masks have black crosses across the forehead.** This holiday was first celebrated on Staten Island, was organized by the “New Founding Fathers,” and opposed by politician Charlie Roan. This March 21st holiday was established nationally by the 28th amendment, first took place in 2014, and it prohibits bothering class 10 politicians or using weapons above grade 4. For 10 points, name this holiday invented for a series of horror movies, in which most crime is legal.

ANSWER: The **Purge**

- 20) **In the Croatian dub, this monster is called "Jack Konobarosjek," because of its similar sound to their name for "Jack the Ripper."** Signs that this monster will come include flickering lights and the appearance of the ghostly bus that killed him. This monster replaced his hand with a rusty spatula, he was fired at his own funeral, and walls oozing green slime is *not* a sign that he’ll come. For 10 points, name this hunchbacked monster from the Spongebob episode “Graveyard Shift.”

ANSWER: The **Hash-Slinging Slasher**

- 21) **Genesee Street in this city is home to a historic courthouse and a popular nearby bar, Martini's.** This city was home to a ghosthouse, owned by the Granville family, that supposedly, if you could break a window with a rock, a dream would come true. This city was home to the notable slum “Potter’s Field” and the oldest tree in this city was damaged by the drunk driving owner of a certain Building and Loan. For 10 points, name this city that was renamed to “Potterville” in an alternate reality, a city lived in by Uncle Billy and Zuzu Bailey in *It’s a Wonderful Life*.

ANSWER: **Bedford Falls**

22) Michael Martin Murphy asks “What’s [this word] for?” in a song that mentions “the glory of living” and includes the line “doesn’t anybody ever stay together anymore?” A Papa Roach song titled for this word describes a “paper man cut into shreds” and asks for “one last kiss before I go,” and this word is the last word in the title of a Queen song written for the film Highlander. Neil Diamond sang a song titled for this word “in Blue Jeans” and Kenny Chesney pondered commitment in a song asking how this word “Feels.” FTP, identify this word that describes the amount of time Bob Dylan wishes you would stay “Young.”

ANSWER: Forever <Mickey Sizemore Tossup>
