

- 1) **This artist sampled “Bring on the Night” by The Police for a song that includes the line “my madness is the only love I let myself embrace.” This artist released the song “Adaptation” off their debut album, Kiss Land, and this artist first worked with Lana Del Rey on the song “Prisoner.” This artist appears wearing a red jacket with blood running from their nose and mouth on the cover of their 2020 album, which Universal Studios used as inspiration for an attraction at Halloween Horror Nights. FTP, identify this Canadian artist who recorded the albums Beauty Behind the Madness and After Hours.**

ANSWER: The **Weeknd** (or Abel **Tesfaye**) <Mickey Sizemore Tossup>

- 2) **In 1972, researchers at Stanford made likely the first ever online purchase, buying this product, from other researchers from MIT on ARPANET. Samuel R. Caldwell spent four years doing hard labor at Leavenworth for dodging the taxes on selling this product in 1937. Bob Marley was buried with his guitar, a Bible, and this product whose synthetic “Nabilone” version is used to treat fibromyalgia. A popular, but false, urban legend claims that all the clocks in Pulp Fiction are set to the same time, as an homage to this product that’s celebrated on at 4:20. For ten points, name this leafy-green drug that’s often smoked in bongos by hippies.**

ANSWER: **Weed**

- 3) **This actor’s first of his two Oscars came for playing Batiatus in Spartacus and he played Hercule Poirot six times, including in Mia Farrow’s Death on the Nile. Indira Gandhi was on her way to interview with this actor when she was assassinated by her bodyguards. This British actor was the president of the World Federalist Movement for the last 13 years of his life, and after Danny Kaye, was the second ever UNICEF Goodwill Ambassador, which he considered to overshadow his acting for his last 36 years. For 10 points, name this ubiquitous British actor and talk-show staple from the 1940s until 2004.**

ANSWER: Peter **Ustinov**

- 4) **In the episode “Spongebob You’re Fired,” Spongebob attempts to make a homemade version of this product and both Patrick and his second head loved it. In the episode “Whatever Happened to Spongebob?,” Spongebob leaves a year’s supply of this product before running away. In “Have you seen this Snail,” Gary runs away after Spongebob neglects to refill this product. For 10 points, name this substance that fills the food bowl of Gary the Snail**

ANSWER: **Snail Food**

- 5) **Greg Biekert ended this play believing he had possession of the ball, during a game called Snow Bowl 2. One coach was blamed by the team owner for not protesting the**

outcome of this play loudly enough, and that coach claims that that conflict led to his eventual trade. A hit by Charles Woodson caused the primary action in this play, which was blown dead as referee Walt Coleman thought the quarterback's hand was moving forward. For 10 points, name this legendary play, named for a controversial rule, when Tom Brady supposedly didn't fumble in the playoffs against the Raiders, on the way to his first Super Bowl.

ANSWER: The "**Tuck Rule**" play

- 6) **In Wisconsin, for some reason, brandy is used instead of the most significant ingredient in this cocktail that was first named in the Chicago Tribune in 1880. Glasses named for this drink are also called "lowball glasses" or a "rocks glass."** An orange twist or a maraschino cherry are the most common garnishes for this Don Draper-loved drink. For 10 points, name this "Classic-sounding" drink made with whisky, bitters, sugar, and ice.

ANSWER: **Old Fashioned**

- 7) **Tim Derk created the first of these objects while working as the mascot for the San Antonio Spurs. The Bucks recently developed one of these things that launch 2 rounds per second and the Philly Phanatic injured a fan with a modified one of these things.** Maude Flanders was killed by one of these objects on *The Simpsons* and I once boxed TJ out to get an object from one of these items as a basketball game. For 10 points, name these "spud guns" that launch wearable items to fans at sports games.

ANSWER: **T-Shirt cannons**

- 8) **The actor who took on the role of this character said he took it because it was so far away from his last role, because it "doesn't get further away from a musical theater, flamboyant writer."** This character investigates the 1984 murder of Brenda Wright Lafferty and her 15-month-old daughter Erica. For 10 points, name this Mormon character, played by Anrew Garfield, who investigates a murder committed by Mormon extremists in *Under the Banner of Heaven*.

ANSWER: **Jeb Pyre** [accept either]

- 9) **This movie was Richard Dreyfuss's second movie, and he plays an uncredited boarder who says "Shall I get the cops- I'll get the cops."** The leading actor of this movie was set to star in *The Producers*, but backed out to appear in this movie, prompting Mel Brooks to call him and ask "How do you like fucking my wife?" One character in this movie is told that the secret to the future is "plastics" and Simon and Garfunkle wrote "Mrs. Robinson" for this movie. For 10 points, name this 1967 Mike Nichols and Dustin Hoffman movie about a recent university attendee who dates a mother and a daughter.

ANSWER: **The Graduate**

- 10) *Jerry Tarkanian developed the “Amoeba Defense” in this sport and Ryan McCarthy developed a variant that could be run through the entire game.* “The 4-1 Chameleon Defense” is a similar “junk defense” in this sport that saw Lason Perkins develop the “Horn Offense.” “Reaching in” and “Over the back” calls are often made in this sport, though neither term appears in its rulebook, and pick-and-rolls often comprise much of an offense. For 10 points, name this sport that has charging fouls, full court presses, and slam dunks.
ANSWER: Basketball
- 11) *“Club Cool” is a gift shop that operates in this park that is home to a miniature replica of the Hampton Court Palace.* This park has an iconic glass pyramid with jumping fountains in front of it, near the Kabuki Cafe. This 305 acre park has been called a “permanent World’s Fair” and its most iconic point is a geodesic sphere with 11,324 tiles, across this park from the World Showcase. For 10 points, name this Disney property that stands for the Experimental Prototype Community Of Tomorrow.
ANSWER: Epcot
- 12) *Specific answer required. A cloak named for one of these beings appears in the lyrics of the Rolling Stones song “Midnight Rambler,” and another one of these beings sleep on a “stained bed” in the Black Sabbath song “Evil Woman.”* The title character is described as a “tall walking” one of these beings in a song by *The Hollies* about a “Long Cool Woman.” In John Mellencamp’s “Pink Houses,” one of these beings is paired with a “Black man” and a “Black neighborhood.” FTP, identify these superstitious beings, one of which has “nine lives” and titles a song by Janet Jackson.
ANSWER: Black Cat <Mickey Sizemore Tossup>
- 13) *In the Lucky Charms ad, these items are the fifth marshmallow given in the sing-songy list.* Johnny Odom, who won three straight World Series as a pitcher, was nicknamed for these items and an ice cream flavor of this name has been described as “Smurf-like” and supposedly comes from Milwaukee. Miller-Coors markets a wheat beer named for these items, and this witbier first marketed in 1995 has the Pale Moon and Golden Moon variants. For 10 points, name these infrequent objects, the colorfully-named extra full-moon in a year with 13 full moons.
ANSWER: Blue Moons
- 14) *This AI program held the Activation Index at Installation 04 and is currently up to Instillation 09.* This AI program was initially created for Operation RED FLAG and the creator of this third-generation volitional A.I. used the same technology as the flash clones from the Spartan II program. This AI program, which struggled with

“rampancy,” originally partnered with United Nations military forces, began service in 2549, and worked with John-117. For 10 points, name this AI program from the Halo series.

ANSWER: Cortana

- 15) **This country’s “Treaty of Treason” was written after its “Fire Rebellion” and its National Anthem claims “We shall never falter/One Horn of Plenty for us all.” This country names itself for part of a Latin quotation and after a rebellion in this country, it was claimed that two rebels died for every citizen who was killed.** This country consists of a capital district and 13 outlying districts that included the militaristic District 13 that occupies most of Ohio and Pennsylvania. For 10 points, name this country led by presidents like Coriolanus Snow, in *The Hunger Games*.

ANSWER: Panem

- 16) **This team and Houston had their conferences switched in the 2015 season to accommodate for expansion teams, and in 2017 this team won the Lamar Hunt cup for the third time in six years.** This team has played its home games in Children’s Mercy Park since its 2011 opening, and it formerly played at Legends Field. Alan Pulido currently leads this team in goals and Peter Vermes has been the head coach of this team since 2009. For 10 points, name this Major League Soccer team that had the best record in the West in 2020, from their home in Kansas.

ANSWER: Sporting Kansas City

- 17) **This happened in the season one finale of “Are You Afraid of the Dark,” and Ross stays furious that this is still happening to him even after he won.** In the second episode of *Fairly OddParents*, this happened to Timmy, Chester, and AJ, and Vicky’s attempt to use as many appliances as possible risked a power surge to trap them in forever. This happened to the characters in *Scooby Doo*, who needed to find 10 boxes of Scooby Snacks to escape and delete the virus chasing them. For 10 points, name this action when a video game comes to life in a real way that you can’t escape.

ANSWER: Getting Trapped Inside the Game [or equivalents]

- 18) **According to one myth, these things were created by their possessor’s father after a night of drinking, when his consort brandished a knife.** In another telling, these things were created by a man to cheer up a woman who lost a series of wagers. Another tale of the creation of these things was cut short when Bruce Wayne said “no, but I know how you got these.” For 10 points, name these disfiguring parts of Heath Ledger’s character in *The Dark Knight*.

ANSWER: The Joker’s Scars [or equivalents]

19) After Todd Fedoruk was knocked unconscious in 2007, senior vice-president Colin Campbell suggested banning this action. Most players will grab another person's shirt to maintain balance while taking this action and Rob Ray formerly would take his jersey off during these events to prevent opponents from doing that. "Enforcers" and "goons" are players who have less skill but might be able to bring about these events and do well when they happen. For 10 points, name these events that, with a goal and an assist, make up the Gordie Howe hat trick.

ANSWER: **Fighting**

20) One character in this game, Sam, has a striking resemblance to Bernie Sanders, and always wears black-rimmed glasses. All characters in this game wear black turtlenecks and there are only 5 women in the original version of this game. Georgia, Maria, Eric, and Clair, all characters in this game, each wear hats. Characters like Peter and Anita can be eliminated in this game by asking if your character has gray hair. For 10 points, name this popular children's game in which you try to deduce who an opponent's character is by asking eliminating questions.

ANSWER: **Guess Who?**

21) This city was originally laid out into 25 equally-sized square districts and it originally could only be reached by train. This city has an annual "pi day" festival where the winner gets a pi shaped pie and its current City Hall, constructed in 2005, is on the south side of a set of sheer cliffs dividing this city into north and south. This city will have a "bug-off" on the Third Saturday in January if it's in the Southern hemisphere, and in the northern hemisphere, this city celebrates cherry blossoms in early April. For 10 points, name this city that's home to Tortimer and Tom Nook.

ANSWER: The **Village** from *Animal Crossing* [accept **Town** but not Deserted "Island"]

22) In one episode, this secret agent is sent home until he can get a weight issue under control, and in another this secret agent witnessed Jimmy Carter's final demise after failing to switch a bottle of peanut butter. This secret agent is beaten up by Stelio Kontos before agreeing that another character can pay to have oranges moved, and this agent stole mind-altering goo to get out of family vacations. This CIA agent missed the rapture while having sex with his wife Francine in a church and has provided a hiding place for the alien Roger. For 10 points, name this buffoonish CIA agent, the Dad in *American Dad*.

ANSWER: **Stan Smith** [accept either]
