

- 1) **In Sonic Adventure 2, you could take your Chao to a stand-in for this place after developing a Dark Chao. In Super Paper Mario, Bonechill's Prison is the equivalent to this place, a worse place than the Underwhere.** In *Guitar Hero 3*, you're forced to play in this location, in the last concert, after you try to get out of your contract with a certain figure. In *Minecraft*, "Nether" was named for this place in development. For 10 points, name this place that is central to the 2010 EA game *Dante's Inferno*.  
ANSWER: **Hell** [accept **Tartarus**, especially around the Paper Mario clue]
- 2) **When asked, a referee said David Sills "intimidated the crowd" after being one of the first people penalized for taking this action, that Will Grier was later flagged for in the same game.** In Baseball, Tristan Stivors took this action after poaching the #1 team in the country. The Big 12 executive pushing this this said "I know people want us to be definitive on that, but it's like any touchdown celebration, Is it directed at an opponent or just celebration with your teammates?" For 10 points, name this "inflammatory" action geared at Texas fans for years.  
ANSWER: **Horns Down**
- 3) **A senile woman asks "is this the airport?" in this movie, when confused, and recites the Declaration of Independence when asked to say grace.** One character in this movie is described as a "cheap, lying, no-good, rotten, four-flushing, low-life, snake-licking, dirt-eating, inbred, overstuffed, ignorant, blood-sucking, dog-kissing, brainless, dickless, hopeless, heartless, fat-ass, bug-eyed, stiff-legged, spotty-lipped, worm-headed sack of monkey shit." Cousin Eddie arrives in his RV in this movie, and asks "save the neck for me, will you, Clark?" For 10 points, name this National Lampoon film in which Clark W. Griswold, played by Chevy Chase, tries and fails to create a loving holiday with his family.  
ANSWER: **Christmas Vacation**
- 4) **In the episode "All the President's Heads," it appears that a descendent of this president, with a gigantic unibrow, someday becomes president, in the future.** This is the only U.S. President who attended Fry's funeral in the Futurama episode "The Sting." In the episode "The Day the Earth Stood Stupid," this president laments "\*his name\* fall down" after Fry uses this president's head to put out a fire. For 10 points, name this president whose signing of the Pendleton Act somehow never came up on the show *Futurama*.  
ANSWER: Chester A. **Arthur**
- 5) **This actor allegedly never watched his film Loving You after his mother, who was an extra in it, died, and he purportedly started taking diet pills while working on**

**Clambake.** This actor's character said "on you, wet is my favorite color" and claims that "love songs are the same in any language" in *Blue Hawaii*. For 10 points, identify this star of *Love Me Tender* and *Jailhouse Rock*, who was in turn portrayed by Austin Butler in a 2022 biopic.

ANSWER: **Elvis Presley** [accept either] <Cody Johanesen Tossup>

- 6) **Anthony Johnson was sentenced to the most community service of anyone involved in this event, after striking Charlie Haddad in the back of the head.** Mike Breen and Bill Walton disagreed about the ejection of one player in this event, because of the concern of having Stephen Jackson walk in front of an opposing team's bench. Five players were charged with assault after this event that saw Ron Artest suspended for the rest of the year after he grabbed the wrong spectator, who he'd thought threw Diet Coke at him. For 10 points, name this Pacers-Pistons brawl that's been called the worst in NBA history.

ANSWER: The **Malice at the Palace**

- 7) **A mewithoutYou song called "Watermelon Ascot" claims that this individual cut glass, and Edison Manufacturing Company made a short film alleging to demonstrate why this person's spouse wanted a divorce.** In *Beyond the Valley of the Dolls*, the band The Kelly Affair renamed themselves for this person, and M.C. Breed namedrops this person after claiming to have enough crew members. Vanessa Bayer portrayed this woman in an episode of *Drunk History* titled "Bar Fights." For 10 points, name this central figure of the 1901 short film, *Kansas Saloon Smashers*.

ANSWER: Carrie A. **Nation**

- 8) **According to the movie Rubber, this is the purpose why "this guy has to hide and live like a bum when he plays the piano so well."** In the Broadway adaptation of *Beetlejuice*, a song titled for this purpose claims that "Science makes no sense/who needs evidence?/Go with your feels." In the episode "Naturama," *Futurama* claims that life exists for this purpose. For 10 points, give this nihilistic set of reasoning why nonsense happens, a two-word negating phrase.

ANSWER: **No Reason**

- 9) **One hit by this band asserts "You gotta whistle Gotta rumble Gotta scream Gotta stomp" before instructing the listener to do the title phrase.** Wendy Nespah played keyboard for this band whose other members included Monroe Yoder and Clyde Lipman. This band's best known hit included the line "I always thought I was such a nerd/I refused to touch that strange bean curd/I wouldn't eat it (WOO!)/BUT IT ATE YOU!" For 10 points, name this Bluffington-based band responsible for hits like "I Need Mo' Allowance" and "Killer Tofu" on the TV show *Doug*.

ANSWER: The Beets

- 10) One ruler of this polity, who presided over its "Golden Age," received a marriage proposal from Rabash of Calormene and was nicknamed "the Gentle." Digory Kirke was the first European to visit this polity and came with Queen Jadis. One ruler of this polity was titled "Duke of Lantern Waste" and lived at Cair Paravel while another ruler, King Miraz, attempted to kill his nephew, who was assisted to safety by an astronomer. This polity included such landmarks as the Lone Islands and the Stone Table and the citizens of this place often warred with the Telmarines, as seen in the book *The Silver Chair*. For ten points, name this polity written about extensively in a certain "Chronicles" by C.S. Lewis.

Answer: Narnia

- 11) The first iteration of this game, in 1939, took place at Wrigley Field, in Los Angeles, and involved players from the Hollywood Bears. Deep middle safeties have to line up between the hash marks and defenses are required to line up in a 4-3 in this game. Jason Witten broke the MVP trophy for this game that bans blitzing and has automatic fair catch rules. Despite being voted to this game 15 times, Tom Brady only played this game twice. For 10 points, name this game that used to be played in Hawaii, which theoretically celebrates the best NFL players from the past year.

ANSWER: The Pro Bowl

- 12) In *The Stanley Parable*, your character will get taken to the "Serious Room" and be lectured by the narrator if you try to use these things. If you use three of the "illegal" ones of these things in *Banjo-Kazooie*, Bottles will cause the game to erase all your data and delete your save file. *Gradius III* exploded your ship when you used the most famous ones of these things that gave 30 lives in the game *Contra*. For 10 points, name these things most famously exemplified by the Konami Code.

ANSWER: Cheat Codes - Games

- 13) Tiffany Maxwell storms out of the Llanerch Diner in a film set in this city where Kate Holbrook lives in *Baby Mama*. Howard Hughes gifted the film rights to a play partially named for this city to its star, Katharine Hepburn. For 10 points, Tom Hanks starred as an AIDS patient in a film titled for what hometown of Rocky Balboa?

ANSWER: Philadelphia (accept "Upper Darby" before "Holbrook") <Cody Tossup>

- 14) This Pacific-Ocean based people group were heavily featured in an 11-minute feature written by Sherm Cohen in 1999, where they were demeaningly referred to by the slur "Jethro." This people group ate coral in starving conditions, though some sources say it was mud, and could locate nearby civilizations based on the growth of moss on

**rock.** This people group would breakdance to signify they would like to hitchhike, and when they found rocks, not boulders, they would ride them for miles at a time. For 10 points, name these people idolized by SpongeBob in the episode “Pizza Delivery,” who share their name with some rugged American explorers.

ANSWER: **Pioneers**

15) **This singer has “glitter in her tear lines” and will “be your brand new disaster” according to her album Lady Wood, on which she explains that “We don’t put a label on it/so we can run”. This singer wonders if a lover will care “If I’m way too lazy/for the Mom-Olympic team”, and discusses her struggles with bulimia in “Grapefruit”. For 10 points, what “Saddest girl in Sweden” does the title action “to keep you off my mind” in “Habits (Stay High)”?**

ANSWER: **Tove Lo** <Tossup by Cody Johansen>

16) **Bodegas Torres owns the trademark usually associated with this drink in Spain, so it’s marketed under a different name there. This drink is the best selling product of Constellation Brands and every December runs an “O Tannenpalm” advertisement on TV. This brand of beer is the top-selling imported beer into America, and is traditionally served with a lime wedge in the neck of the bottle. For 10 points, name this Mexican beer brand that would fit in with our loose theming tonight, that tells you to “find your beach” that once employed Tony Romo on the Gruden Hotline.**

ANSWER: **Corona**

17) **In 1964, this athlete accidentally shot himself in the stomach, but went on to play in that weeks’ game, and in 1971, after crashing a snowmobile, survived a blizzard by burning his money for heat. This athlete, second to Rod Woodson in career fumble recoveries for defensive players, spent a single year with the Browns before being traded to his best known team. This player has the record for defensive players for most consecutive starts and the fewest rushing yards for a defensive player. For 10 points, name this legendary Vikings defensive end who’s sadly best remembered for rushing 66 yards the wrong way and chucking the ball out of bounds, resulting in a safety.**

ANSWER: Jim **Marshall**

18) **This organ is discovered in the opening scene of Blue Velvet, and Tony Montana says he’s got octopus coming out of this organ. Westley tells Humperdinck that he’ll be allowed to keep this body part in their duel “to the pain”. For 10 points, identify these body parts that are used as wings by Dumbo.**

ANSWER: **Ears** <Cody Tossup>

19) **In “Jaws Wired Shut,” a preview of a movie is shown where these monsters play soccer. In *The Simpsons: Tapped Out*, one of these monsters was released in 2018 in conjunction with Treehouse 29, who can summon a sandstorm every 4 hours— Womenhet, and in Treehouse 4, Wiggum orders a wing of the Springfield museum destroyed to stop these things.** The three bullies suggested that Milhouse was one of these monsters, ready for a mystical journey, after completely wrapping Milhouse in Quimby bumper stickers. For 10 points, name these monsters with surprisingly little Simpsons airtime, since the show doesn’t take place in Ancient Egypt.

ANSWER: **Mummies**

20) **This is the only ride that can be found at all 6 Disneylands worldwide, and this was the only ride that Harry Truman refused to ride.** Timothy Q Mouse sits on the central hub of this ride and holds a magic feather. This ride’s iteration at Disney World is the only one that spins clockwise, and passengers can use a hydraulic ram to determine how high or low they want their car to be. For 10 points, name this elephant-themed ride based on a 1941 film.

ANSWER: **Dumbo** the Flying Elephant

21) **It’s not Samurai but the Nikkatsu film studio made many movies in the 1950s and 60s in a genre named for this group of people.** A SEGA video game franchise named for this group of people released a 2020 game subtitled “Like a Dragon.” This group of people were accused of owning the Tampa Bay Lightning during the 1990s and this organization works like the mafia in San Francisco in the *Man in the High Castle*. For 10 points, name this crime syndicate that requires cutting off a finger, with a popular mystique in Japan.

ANSWER: **Yakuza**

22) **In 8 Bit Theater, Fighter laments what tangled webs we weave when we play this game.** In an episode of *The Twilight Zone*, Colonel Taylor has to admit that he’s bankrupt when he loses a wager that Tennyson couldn’t win this game in a glass room over a year. In the film *Zombieland*, Wichita suggests that this game is likely being played in Columbus, Ohio after the character Columbus loses at this game. Russell claims that his mother loves this game after Carl suggests it in the movie *Up*. For ten points, name this game you’re losing by answering.

Answer: The **Quiet Game** [or “not talking” or “being quiet,” or anything equivalent—mostly and especially around the *Twilight Zone* episode clue]
