Louis XVI

- T6. For a quick 10 points, who became the first leader of the German Democratic Republic when he took power in 1949?

Walter Ulbricht

- T7. Many people gained fame under stage names or nicknames. For example, Margarita Cansino was better known as Rita Hayworth. FTP, what famous person was born Cornelius McGillicuddy?

Connie Mack

- T8. They led the Greek forces to victory over the Carthaginians at the battle of Himera in 480 B.C. For 10 points, name these two Sicilian tyrants.

Gelon and Theron

- T9. In Spain, agricultural expansion in the 17th and 18th centuries was severely hampered by the dominance of a class of nobility which relied primarily on sheep herding for income. They controlled much of the land, preventing its use in farming. FTP, name this Spanish nobility class.

Mesta

- T10. Formed in the early 70's, this band was hailed as the greatest musical force ever to emerge from New Zealand. Their first album, Mental Notes, came out in 1975 and was produced by Phil Manzanera of Roxy Music. Their first chart-topping singles in Australia were "I See Red" and "I Got You." FTP, name the group that broke up in 1983 and eventually gave birth to Crowded House.

- T14. Whig-Tory politics were thrown into disarray when a plot was uncovered to kill Charles II and place his Catholic brother James on the throne. Despite its dubious authenticity, the popish plot created a frenzy of hysteria for two years. FTP, identify the man who announced this plot.

- T15. Born in 1917, she had the distinction of being the first Black to win the Pulitzer prize for fiction when in 1950 she won for her book Annie Allen. FTP, name this author.
