16. ALFRED SYSTEMATIZED THE SCIENCE OF BIOGEOGRAPHY, LEW WAS A TERRITORIAL GOVERNOR AND NOVELIST, AND GEORGE WAS SHOT AND PARALYZED WHILE CAMPAIGNING FOR THE 1972 DEMOCRATIC PRESIDENTIAL NOMINATION. FOR 10 POINTS, STATE THEIR COMMON LAST NAME.

17. THE CANONICAL TEXT WAS ESTABLISHED IN 652 AD UNDER THE CALIPH UTHMAN. THE REVELATIONS ARE DIVIDED INTO 114 *SURAS* OR CHAPTERS, AND CONSTITUTE THE WORLD'S MOST INFLUENTIAL BOOK AFTER THE BIBLE. FOR 10 POINTS, NAME IT.

18. IN PSYCHOANALYSIS, EROS IS A TERM USED TO DENOTE THE POSITIVE LIFE-FORCE THAT UNDERLIES THE SEXUAL INSTINCT, AND THAT OPPOSES THE DEATH INSTINCT, WHICH ACCOUNTS FOR DESTRUCTIVE IMPULSES IN THE INDIVIDUAL. FOR 10 POINTS, STATE THE PROPER TERM FOR THE LATTER.

20. CONSIDERED A "THROWAWAY" CANDIDATE BY OTHER DEMOCRATS IN PENNSYLVANIA, HE NEVERTHELESS CAPITALIZED ON THE POLITICS OF RESENTMENT BY DEPICTING OPPONENT RICHARD THORNBURGH AS AN OUT-OF-TOUCH RICH REPUBLICAN. FOR 10 POINTS, NAME THIS RECENTLY-ELECTED US SENATOR.

21. CHARACTERIZED BY A NUCLEUS OF CLOSELY-PACKED STARS LYING IN THE DIRECTION OF SAGITTARIUS, IT IS SEEN EDGEWISE AS A BROAD BAND OF LIGHT ARCHING ACROSS THE NIGHT SKY, AND PASSING THROUGH THE CONSTELLATIONS AQUILA, CYGNUS, AURIGA, ORION, AND CRUX. FOR 10 POINTS, NAME THIS GALAXY.
