

1. The 119th Psalm, or the Psalm of 22, can be divided into 22 stanzas of 8 verses. In the original Hebrew, each verse of the first stanza starts with aleph, the next stanza with beth, then gimel, and so on. For 10 points, what sort of verse form does this represent, a form where the first letter in each line or stanza spells out the alphabet, a word, or phrase?

A: ACROSTIC

2. The hexagonal form of this compound is, like graphite, an excellent lubricant. The cubic form is only second to diamond in hardness. For 10 points name this binary compound, with a molecular weight of 24.82, whose elements are both adjacent to carbon on the periodic table.

A: BORAZON or BORON NITRIDE

3. This art form was favored by surrealists such as Jean Arp and Max Ernst, and Matisse's *Papiers Decoupees* were an adaptation of this technique. For 10 points identify this art form, whose name is from the French for "pasting," and consists of building images from paper, fabric, and other found materials.

A: COLLAGE

4. "From these garish lights, I now vanish forever more, with a heartfelt, respectful, affectionate farewell." Spoken in his last London appearance, they were also on his funeral card. For 10 points name this author who died in 1870 of a stroke, leaving his last work unfinished.

A: Charles DICKENS

5. Upon discovering that she had had many affairs before their marriage, he urged the Parliament to pass a law making it illegal for an unchaste woman to marry the king. The law passed on February 11, 1542, and she was beheaded two days later. For 10 points name this woman, the fifth wife of King Henry VIII.

A: Catherine HOWARD

6. "It is impossible to live pleasurably without living wisely, well, and justly, and impossible to live wisely, well, and justly without living pleasurably." For 10 points, this quote represents what philosophy, named for the man who penned this line?

A: EPICURIANISM

7. CEO Andy Grove recently announced this company's move into 2 areas: multimedia technology and chess. The company will produce a product which allows PC users to see each other and share information. It will also sponsor the Professional Chess Association for the next 2 years. For 10 points name this company, the leading U.S. producer of computer microchips.

A: INTEL

8. Originally staffed by Christians from the Balkans converted to Islam, they were active until 1826, when they mutinied and were massacred by order of Sultan Mahmud II in the Auspicious Incident. For 10 points name this elite unit of the Ottoman Empire's army, whose power and prestige peaked in the 15th and 16th centuries.

A: JANISSARIES

9. Michael played Vila on the BBC production *Blake's 7*. Paul is the prime minister of Australia. Charles, former chairman of the Lincoln Savings and Loan Association, got 5 Senators in trouble for swapping campaign funds for favors. For 10 points, what is the shared name?

A: KEATING

10. She led the nation in both batting average (.510) and earned run average (0.25), the first to ever do so. She also threw 6 no hitters. For 10 points, name this woman, a UCLA softball player, who is the most recent winner of the Honda-Broderick Cup.

A: Lisa FERNANDEZ

11. Sounds the same: the complete name of the woman who designed the wall that makes up the bulk of the Vietnam War Memorial, and the substance which, when lost, results in multiple sclerosis. For 10 points, give either one of these homophonic 3 syllable names.

A: MAYA LIN or MYELIN

12. Born in 1896, he apprenticed as a locksmith. Captured by the Russians in World War I, he became a communist and lived in Moscow from 1929 to 1944, when he returned to his native land. He eventually became premier in 1953, but was ousted in 1955 for being too independent. He soon became the leader of the revolutionary government. For 10 points name this man, executed by the Soviets in 1958.

A: Imre NAGY

13. The main points of this 1892 document included an income tax, an 8 hour workday, and the creation of "postal savings banks" to protect farmers from the failure of small-town banks. For 10 points name this document, the platform of the Populist Party, named for the city in which it was drafted.

A: The OMAHA PLATFORM (prompt for more if as "populist party platform")

14. It was introduced by Bertrand Russell at a rally in Aldermaston, England, in 1958. Its shape is derived from the semaphore letters 'n' and 'd', representing nuclear disarmament. For 10 points name this symbol which would get much use in the following decade.

A: the PEACE symbol

15. Al Gore is only the second vice-president from Tennessee, the first being Andrew Johnson. This state, though, can count 11 vice-presidents, almost a quarter of them all. For 10 points, name this mother of VPs, including Daniel Tompkins, William Wheeler, and future Presidents Van Buren, Arthur, and Teddy Roosevelt.

A: NEW YORK

16. This dimensionless quantity is a representation of the ratio between fluid's inertia and viscosity. For pipe flow, the critical value separating laminar flow and turbulent flow is approximately 2000. For 10 points identify this quantity, always important in fluid dynamics.

A: REYNOLDS NUMBER

17. He appeared in dozens of motion pictures, including *The Greatest Story Ever Told*, *The Bridge on the River Kwai*, and *Beau Geste*. His most memorable role was the one for which he won an Emmy for the 1973-74 season. For 10 points, "who loves ya, baby?"

A: Telly SAVALAS

18. A. D. Hope and James McAuley are 2 of Australia's best known poets, and both hail from the same Australian state, a state to which Sydney used to send its worst prisoners. Hmm. For 10 points, name this state formerly called Van Diemen's Land.

A: TASMANIA

19. Founded in 1890, it provided the base for FDR's labor support. In 1942, under the leadership of John L. Lewis, it left the CIO. For 10 points name this labor union whose current president is Richard Trumka.

A: UNITED MINE WORKERS of America or UMW

20. *Ben-Hur*, better known as a movie, started out as a book, not surprisingly. For 10 points, name the man who wrote this work which became the movie to win the most Oscars ever.

A: Lew WALLACE

21. Paul Newman, Sidney Poitier, Stevie Wonder, and the Beatles were all added. I guess this makes up for prior addition of the various Gabor sisters. For 10 points, name this Hollywood landmark which added the aforementioned greats (and 27 others) in a February 1st ceremony.

A: WALK OF FAME

22. Havoc, Angel, Jubilee, Gambit, Rouge, Cyclop, and Wolverine. All of these are past or present members of, for 10 points, what team of superheroes led by a telepathic professor?

A: THE X-MEN

23. As an adjective for 'round,' it refers to an archery event of 144 arrows shot from "the prince's lengths." As an adjective for 'plays,' it refers to a cycle of 48 plays performed in the Middle Ages that covered the fall and redemption of man. And when put in front of "town," it's the place where Cornwallis surrendered. For 10 points, what is this four letter word?

A: YORK

24. Comprised of 15 consonant and 4 long and short vowels, the classical form of this language can still be found in literature written by its main speakers. Three dialects of this language are still spoken by natives in Mexico. For 10 points name this language, spoken by the Aztecs.

A: NAHUATL

25. As personal representative of the UN Secretary General, he accompanied UN mediator Count Folke Bernadotte to the Middle East. When Bernadotte was assassinated, he became acting mediator, and worked to the Arab-Israeli armistice agreements of 1949. For 10 points name this academic and civil rights activist, the 1950 winner of the Nobel Prize.

A: Ralph BUNCHE

26. In his non-fiction work *Danse Macabre*, he expresses two views of the world: the Apollonian, which stresses the rational and moral, and the Dionysian, which is more immoral and romantic. He then placed most of his work in that second world view. For 10 points name this author who describes his work as "the literary equivalent of a Big Mac and french fries."

A: Stephen KING

27. This 7 letter word can refer to a piece of unglazed earthenware or porcelain after firing, a pale-brown color, a small piece of wood used to join boards in furniture, a cookie, or a type of risen bread made in small, soft cakes. For 10 points, what's the common word?

A: BISCUIT

28. He provided the voice for both the Pope and the Devil on *Ren and Stimpy*. He also worked as a special correspondent in Eastern Europe for the Financial News Network. That job was fitting, given that he's Vaclav Havel's favorite musician. For 10 points, name this man who died last year from prostate cancer.

A: Frank ZAPPA

29. It wasn't the big one, nor was it a Los Angeles earthquake per se. A suburb of Los Angeles was the actual epicenter of the earthquake. For 10 points name it, a 'burb which boasts a school in the California state system with the nickname of the Matadors.

A: NORTHRIDGE

30. And, finally, for a quick 10 points, name the thing tank formed by former Presidential candidate Paul Tsongas and former Senator Warren Rudman which puts primary focus on ways to reduce the federal budget deficit.

A: the CONCORD COMMISSION

3. 25 POINT BONUS. You're probably sick of hearing about the Winter Olympics, so just sit back and watch this bonus on them. For 5 points each, given a logo from a Winter Olympics, tell me where the Games occurred.

A: CALGARY, ALBERTVILLE, LILLEHAMMER, ST. MORITZ, GRENOBLE

4. 25 POINT BONUS. We've fired 2 warning shots, but the Led Zeppelin questions keep coming. So, we're moving Richard's Christian music questions up in the pack. For 5 points each, I'll name a song from a Christian artist, you tell me which one.
 - *The Live Adventure* A: STEVEN CURTIS CHAPMAN or S.C. CHAPMAN
 - *Le Voyage* A: Sandi PATTI
 - *Songs From the Loft* A: Amy GRANT
 - *The Standard* A: CARMAN
 - *Stories* A: Randy STONEHILL

5. 25 POINT BONUS. A descendant of the sun goddess Amaterasu through her celestial grandson Ninigi, he married a descendent of the storm god Susanowo. In 607 BC, he led an expedition across Japan, ending in Yamato, where he established his center of state. So goes the legend of, for 25 points, what legendary first emperor of Japan, from whom all emperors are supposedly descended from?

A: JIMMU Tenno or KAMU-YAMATO-IHOUE-BIRO

6. 30-20-10 BONUS. Name the actor.

30: He played The Trickster on the short-lived CBS series *The Flash*.

20: Currently, he supplies the voice for the Joker on *Batman: The Animated Series*

10: Originally the oldest son on *Eight is Enough*, he's best known for playing the son of his own archenemy, and interstellar menace cloaked in black.

A: Mark HAMILL

7. 25 POINT BONUS. Time to reverse the trend of musicians going unplugged, here's a TV family we're plugging in. It's time for Electric Bradys! 10 points for each part, and a 5 point bonus for both.
 - As Greg is trying to fix the family car, he accidentally places his hands on the terminals of the car's 12-volt battery. Placing an ohmmeter across him, we find that Greg is effectively a 2 milliohm resistor. How many amps are running through Greg?

A: 6000 amps
 - Interestingly, all 6 kids are effectively identical resistors. If all 6 join hands and form a chain between the terminals, then how much amperage passes thru each Brady?

A: 1000 amps

8. 30 POINT BONUS. One of the favorite rules of Cornell College Bowl is that what comes around goes around. After having to suffer through an ABA bonus at this tournament last year, we hereby answer with a question on the World Hockey Association. Given the location, name the WHA team, 10 points each.

- Houston A: AEROS

9. 20 POINT BONUS. Land Rover, last of the great British auto makers, is going foreign. British Aerospace sold its 80 percent share in Rover Cars to another European car maker. For 10 points, name that company, which now looks to double its US sales.

A: BMW

For another 10 points, name the other auto maker that owns the other 20 percent of Rover stock. A: HONDA

10. 25 POINT BONUS. College Bowlers have this inordinate need to order things, and this question is no exception. Given the 20th century artworks, order them from oldest to newest for 5 points each, and a 5 point bonus for all 4. The works are Guernica, The Kiss, Number One, and The Persistence of Memory.

- For 10 points, If you watched *Your Number's Up* when you had the time, you saw this host known for wisdom in rhyme. A: Nipsey RUSSELL
- For 15 points, name the man who actually was the first African-American game show host, the host of *Musical Chairs*, a CBS offering in 1975. A: Adam WADE

12. 20 POINT BONUS. The separation of Yugoslavia has led to more national capitals for College Bowlers to memorize. So, for each former Yugo republic I name, you give the new national capital, 5 points each.

14. 20 POINT BONUS. Trouble is brewing in Bill Gates' compu-kingdom. Version 6 of MS-DOS includes a compression program so similar to a competitor's that the whole thing may wind up in court. For 10 points, name the compression program packaged with MS-DOS version 6. A: DOUBLESPACE

For another 10 points, name either the competitor or their supposedly copied product. A: STAC or STACKER

15. 20 POINT BONUS. In the book of the Bible bearing his name, Daniel interpreted the Aramaic words "Mene, Mene, Tekel, Upharsin." that appeared on the wall at Belshazzar's feast as meaning that Belshazzar's kingdom was about to end. For 20 points (5 points per word), what does this prophecy mean?

16. 25-10 BONUS. Name the attorney.
