

1. His name has been given to an annual contest for bad writing. FTP, name the Victorian novelist who began his novel Paul Clifford with the words, "It was a dark and stormy night."

Edward George BULWER-LYTTON

2. His first major work was The Division of Labor in Society. For ten points, name this French social theorist who formulated an important method of sociology and also wrote Suicide.

Emile DURKHEIM

3. This man's "demon" was featured in Thomas Pynchon's The Crying of Lot 49. FTP, name this 19th century physicist best known for his equations dealing with electricity and magnetism.

James Clark MAXWELL

4. This man overthrew then-President Gamsakhurdia in January 1992, but now is in danger of being ousted himself. FTP, name this leader of Georgia who was once Soviet foreign minister under Gorbachev.

Eduard SHEVARDNADZE

5. In the Inferno, Dante depicts this man in hell as being crucified on the ground so hypocrites can walk over him. He was high priest of the Pharisees under Pontius Pilate, who counseled that Jesus should be punished to appease the Romans. FTP, name him.

CAIAPHAS

6. Charter of National Bank expires; War Hawks succeed in controlling Congress; William Henry Harrison is victorious in the Battle of Tippecanoe; the strongest earthquake ever to strike North America hits Missouri. FTP, what year is it?

7. He was crowned king of his country in 1941. In 1955 he abdicated the throne but retained political control. In 1971 he was ousted from power. Now he is king again, but political control is mainly in the hands of his son, the elected head of the government. FTP, name this past and present Cambodian leader.

Norodom SIHANOUK

8. It is created by epimerization of glucose at the fourth carbon and can be isolated in two enantiomeric forms, one from milk and one from mucilage. FTP, name this hexose sugar.

GALACTOSE

9. Its life span was only about 6 years. It is an art form described as anarchic, nihilistic, disruptive, and useless. Some of its premier artists were Picabia, Ernst, and Duchamp. FTP, name this art form whose name itself is nonsensical.

DADAISM

10. His works include symphonies and the Lemminkainen Legends, but his most famous work is a nationalistic symphonic poem that would later become his country's national anthem. FTP, who composed Finlandia?

Jean SIBELIUS

He gave a series of three lectures at Berkeley in 1967 called "Language and Mind." Many of his early political essays are collected in "American Power and the New Mandarins" and "Towards a New Cold War." FTP, who is this left-wing political activist, outspoken critic of American society, philosopher, and famous linguist?

Noam CHOMSKY

12. Playwright Israel Horovitz is probably not the most famous member of his family. His son's name is Adam. FTP, of what well-known rap group is son Adam a member?

The BEASTIE BOYS

13. It has a population of around 750,000, has an area about the size of Massachusetts, and English is its official language. It is an island in the Pacific Ocean, in proximity to Western Samoa, Tonga, New Caledonia, and Vanuatu. Its capital is Suva. FTP, name this country, often confused with a Japanese electronics corporation.

14. He was a hunchback and barely five feet tall. This Augustan Age writer was well-known for his rhyming couplets. FTP, name this author of The Rape of the Lock.

Alexander POPE

15. The stethoscope was invented in the early 19th century by a French physician. FTP, name him.

Rene Theophile Hyacinthe LAENNEC

16. After spending the first years of his life grazing with wild animals, he was civilized by a temple prostitute and eventually played a part in killing the Bull of Heaven. FTP, name this brother of Gilgamesh.

ENKIDU

17. He first rose to international fame with an opera called "The Lady Macbeth of the Mtsensk District." But after he was criticized by Stalin his career at home was threatened. In response he wrote his best known work, his Fifth Symphony, subtitled "A Soviet Artist's Reply to Just Criticism." FTP, name this Russian composer.

Dmitri SHOSTAKOVICH

18. Liechtenstein, located between Switzerland and Austria, is one of the world's smallest nations. FTP, name its capital.

VADUZ

19. He was a frail, sickly boy raised in a household of pious women. He later became a classics scholar. He was first an admirer, then a bitter enemy of Richard Wagner. His sister distorted some of his writings, making him sound more racist than he actually was. FTP, name this philosopher whose works include *Twilight of the Idols*, *The Will to Power*, *Ecce Homo*, and *Also Sprach Zarathustra*?

Friedrich NIETZSCHE

20. John Dewey publishes "*Democracy and Education*", Jeanette Rankin is elected as the first U.S. congresswoman, General John Pershing enters Mexico to pursue Pancho Villa, and the battle of Verdun is fought. FTP, give the year.
