Ans.: James RENWICK

5. By now, everyone knows the infamous tale of John Wayne and Lorena Bobbitt. But FTP, can you name the town in which both trials took place, which shares its name with the Southern name for the site of two Civil War Battles?

Ans.: MANASSAS, Virginia

6. Treplev is a young writer who is frustrated with his search for new literary forms. Nina is a young girl who dreams of being an actress. Trigorin is another writer who successfully seduces Nina. FTP, all of these characters appear in what play by Anton Chekhov?

Ans.: THE SEA GULL

7. This advocate coined the term "birth control" and founded the magazine "Woman Rebel" to advance her views. FTP, name this founder of the Planned Parenthood Federation.

Ans.: Margaret SANGER

8. Two answers required. The paymaster and guard of the Slater and Morrill Shoe Factory were shot dead and robbed of \$15,776 in Braintree, Massachusetts. FTP, name the two immigrant anarchists were convicted and executed for the crime despite their protestations of innocence.

Ans.: Nicola SACCO and Bartolomeo VANZETTI

9. This bone disease usually found in children is caused by a deficiency in Vitamin D during the period of bone growth. If not treated with large amounts of Vitamin D and sunlight, it can cause permanent skeletal deformation. FTP, name it.

Ans.: RICKETS
