2. He has been acknowledged as having been a child prodigy on the piano, having performed with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra at age 11. He would eventually join Miles Davis and eventually go on to a succesful solo jazz career. FTP, name this leader of the fusion jazz movement whose works include Watermelon Man and Rockit.

A: HERBIE HANCOCK

3. Because of his marital problems, Burt Reynolds was replaced as pitchman for Florida's orange industry by this portly author of the bestselling book "See, I Told You So." For 10 points, name this portly radio and television personality who claims to have talent on loan from God.

A: RUSH LIMBAUGH

4. If you happen to travel to the cventrasl mountain range of this island, you might run into some "Maroons", descendants of slaves who escaped and hid in the woods of the central mountain. You might also see the coffee plantation that make this island a leading coffee producer. FTP, name this Carribean country, home to the Blue Mountains.

A: JAMAICA

5. The creation of this institution marked a departure in the history of religion. The absence of a visible symbol of the deity to lend sacredness to an especial place, along with the absence of a ritual sacrifice or priveleged clergy to intercede, permitted anyone, anywhere to commune with God for the first time in history. He worked at the Salk Institute of Biological Studies before becoming the director of MIT's Institute for Biomedical Research, but his greatest claim to fame was sharing the 1975 Nobel Prize for medicine with Renato Dulbecco and Howard Temin for the discovery of reverse transcriptase. For 10 points, name this American biochemist, who became president of Rockefeller University in 1990.

A: DAVID BALTIMORE

11. After the fall of Communists in Hungary, he exhumed his body and reburied him as a hero of the people. FTP, name the reformist prime minister who was involved in the 1956 revolt against the Rakosi (RAH-kosh-ee) regime.

A: IMRE NAGY (NAHDJ)

12. His recent appearances at college campuses have resulted in an uproar, causing both the Senate and the Congressional Black Caucus to repudiate the Nation of Islam. Leaders across the political spectrum from Bob Dole to Jesse Jackson have attacked him. FTP, name this leader of the Fruits of Islam and the second-in-command to Louis Farrakhan.

A: KHALID ABDUL MUHAMMED

13. During her first administration from 1960-65, her country suffered from inflation and rising unemployment. During her second term, the country became a "socialist democracy" until she was voted out in 1977, after which it adopted a presidential form of government. FTP, name this woman who was the first women prime minister in Sri Lanka and the world.

A: MRS. SIRIMAVO BANDARONAIKE

14. Many people thought her poems were too exclusively Jewish. This might explain her fall into literary oblivion. That is until the 60's brought her back into vogue. FTP, name this female author, who definitely was not too Jewish to write The New Colossus.

A: EMMA LAZARUS

15. If a procedure is according to this 18th century Englishman, you can bet it conforms to the rules. For 10 points, name the man who literally wrote the book on and standardized many board and card game rules.

19. This city was founded in 1608 as the seat of the Imperial Mogul Viceroys of Bengal. It is home to the Lal Bagh Fort, the Katra of Burma and Chota, as well as over 1,000 mosques. FTP, name this city which since 1971 has been the capital of Bangladesh.

A: DHAKA

20. In Buddhism, it is possible for anyone to reach perfection and become a "buddha." However, certain people qualified to enter nirvana, prefer to remain outside of it in order to work for the salvation of all beings. FTP, give the term used for the "buddhas-to-be"

A: BODHISATVAS

21. This term was first used by Charles Sumner to describe the routine habits, customs, or patterns of social intercourse shared by members of a social group. These habits can eventually become mores if they are consciously agreed to as necessary for proper society. FTP, name this term, which along with mores, can sometimes be considered an obstacle to social progress.

22. During the 1993 parliamentary elections in Canada, Kim Campbell's ruling Progressive-Conservative party polled numbers so low that they that it's no longer considered a political party. FTP, how many seats did the Progressive-Conservative win in that election.

25. Emiliano Zapata, Mexican rebel and folk hero from the early 1900 revolution, created a program of agrarian reform, which called for the division of large haciendas and land provisions for orphans and women. FTP, name this plan, Zapata's 1911 brainchild.

A: THE PLAN OF AYALA

26. This element is the last member of the Actinide Series in Group IIIb of the periodic table and was first synthesized in 1961 at the Radiation Laboratory in Berkeley. For 10 points, name this element, whose atomic number is 103 and was named after the inventor of the cyclotron.

27. During the mid 14th century, a dispute erupted between King Philip of France and the papacy in Rome, resulting in no less than 3 popes in 1378. This era of papal confusion, FTP, is known in history books as what?
