Toss-Ups

1. Born in 1904, this U.S. policy advisor began his career as a language officer in 1929 in Berlin. He later went on to serve as ambassador to the Soviet Union and Yugoslavia. However, for ten points name this man who is probably best known for his "Mr.X" article in which he originally outlined the Cold War Policy of Containment.

George Kennan

2. This road was abandoned after the building of the National Road, but it gained new life when it became part of U.S. Route 25 in 1926. FTP, name this principal route of westward U.S. migration that was blazed by Daniel Boone in 1775 and ran from Virginia to the Ohio River.

Wilderness Road

3. This British general was 60 years old when he led an expeditionary force whose goal was to take Fort Duquesne from the French during the French and Indian War. The expedition, however, ended in disaster when the general and his men were ambushed and many of the men bolted. FTP, name this general who lost his life in the attack.

Edward Braddock

4. The Battle of Dettingen occurred during the War of the Austrian Succession. It is not an especially noteworthy battle, but it is remembered as the last occasion on which a British sovereign commanded an army in the field. FTP, name that sovereign who was present at this 1743 battle.

George II

5. 5. b Symbolizing the sign of the times the marriage of 45 years is planning to be cut short, when Tess gave her husband the divorce papers on February 7, 1994. She claimed he spent too much time at work fighting criminals such as Mumbles and other. FTP name this cartoon character who "lives" in 100 newspapers nationwide.

6. One of the most popular novels in America around the turn of the century, it spawned "Bellamy clubs" to discuss its vies. FTP, name this classic American utopian novel.

Looking Backward by Edward Bellamy

7. Born in Canada in 1908, this economist in his 1958 book <u>The Affluent Society</u> argues that an obsession with growth leads to waste: the productions of goods and services that are not really needed and called for government intervention to control it. FTP, name this economist.

John Kenneth Galbraith

8. This philosophy originated in Russia in the mid 1800's. It began as a rejection of authority and influenced the revolutionary movement. In Western Europe, it came to mean a disbelief in objective values and truths.

NIHILISM

9. She was among the first member of the Student Non-violence Coordinating Committee. She authored the book, <u>The Measure of Our Success</u> as a means of advocating increased parental involvement in child development. However, she is best known for her role as the head and founder of the Children's Defense Fund. FTP, name her.
