Mustapha Kemal is elected president of Turkey, and 120,000 die in an earthquake in Tokyo and Yokohama. Millikan wins the Nobel Physics Prize for his work on the elementary electric charge, and Yeats takes the Nobel for Literature. President Harding dies, and the Beer Hall Putsch falls through. FTP, these events took place in what year?

This author, born in Providence in 1890, lent new meaning to the term "American Gothic". Most of his stories are set in New England and feature protagonists who encounter cosmic horrors only to discover the insignificance of humankind in the grand scheme. FTP name this creator of Cthulu and author of "The Shadow Out of Time," and "The Thing on the Doorstep."

A: H.P. LOVECRAFT

He recently broke with the EU Commission, saying that the target startup date of 1999 for the European Monetary Union was too early, and that the strategy of enlarging to include Eastern European countries should be scrapped. FTP name this EU Commissioner for Transport, and former British MP once plagiarised by Joseph Biden.

5)
Like the 1954 Indians, this year's Cleveland team looked like a juggernaut heading into the postseason. The '95 Tribe was of course beaten in the World Series by the Atlanta Braves, but FTP who forced the Indians to settle for second best in 1954?

A: NEW YORK GIANTS

Fog is a natural occurrence of it, although we often think of this word as referring to environmentally unfriendly things. But particles of liquid or

solid suspended in a gas don't necessarily threaten the ozone layer, unless they contain chlorofluorocarbons. FTP, name this term which evokes images of whipped cream and hairspray.

On the morning of August 24, 1572, the killing began, of over 3000 in Paris alone. FTP, give the name of this event which is not named after the canonized son of Montgomery Burns's most famous employee.

A: ST. BARTHOLOMEW'S DAY MASSACRE or MASSACRE OF ST. BARTHOLOMEW'S DAY

Critics such as Johnson and Dryden originally applied this adjective pejoratively. Objects of their wrath included Henry Vaughn, Richard Crashaw, and George Herbert. FTP name this school of thought in poetry which is named for the branch of philosophy which deals with ultimate questions.

Born in 1886 in Poland to a Zionist father, he emigrated to Palestine in 1906. Elected Chairman of the Zionist executive, when Britain later turned against his aims, he called upon Palestinian Jews to fight for independence. FTP name this man who, when that aim was achieved in 1948, and after Albert Einstein turned down the post, became Israel's first Prime Minister.

Thomas was a Scottish chemist, Otto was a pro football player and coach, George was a builder of astronomical instruments, Katherine owns the Washington Post, Martha was a dancer and choreographer, and Billy is an evangelist. FTP what's the name shared by these people and a famous cracker?

Its name is a Sioux word meaning "people of the South Wind," but its population density is less than half the national average. It is the 15th largest state by area, and was for a time, often prefixed with "Bleeding." FTP name this state which borders Colorado, Oklahoma, Nebraska, and Missouri.

To obtain this element from ore deposits, stibnite is roasted in open air to produce senarmontite, whose oxygen is then removed by reduction with carbon. Present in tartar emetic, it is used in grids for lead storage batteries. Its name sounds like Kant's term for a certain type of paradox. FTP name this element whose symbol is derived from the Latin word "stibium."

He took out newspaper ads two weekends ago, insisting he could prove the lawful origin of his wealth. He did this in response to being charged with forgery and illicit enrichment, in addition to the murder charges which have kept him in jail since February. He had ten days to produce this proof, under Mexican law. FTP name this brother of an ex-president of Mexico.

In 1910, he won a trophy for making the first flight in Australia. He was probably born in Hungary in 1874, but claimed to be from Wisconsin. He took his stage name from a 19th Century French conjuror, and upon his death in 1926, his wife attempted to communicate with his spirit. FTP name this magician born Ehrich Weiss.

A: Harry HOUDINI (Accept Ehrich WEISS on early buzz)

When asked about his expensive tastes, he said "I may be President of the United States, but my private life is nobody's damned business." His wife died in 1880, so a sister served as first lady. Once working in Roscoe Conkling's political organization, he spent his 3 1/2 year presidency keeping Conkling at arm's length. FTP name this Vermonter and 21st president.

A: Chester Alan ARTHUR

20)

Richard is a playwright and founder of the Ontological-Hysteric Theater, and won recognition for his 1976 staging of "The Threepenny Opera." George won a Gold Medal in the 1968 Olympics for heavyweight boxing, and has five sons named "George." FTP give the common surname.

A: FOREMAN

21)

>From 1901 to 1906, she worked in Pittsburgh and Allegheny high schools, and was managing editor for McClure's magazine soon after. Her work "One of Ours" won the 1923 Pulitzer for fiction. FTP name this novelist and pioneer chronicler of the American West.

A: Willa CATHER

22)

COBOL is a high-level computer language that is the standard for all business data processing. FTP, what four words are abbreviated "COBOL?"
