1. Everyone knows that Roger Bannister was the first man to run a four minute mile. FAQTP, though, can you name the first man to triple jump over 60 feet? Hint: He shares his name with the author of Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God.

ANSWER: Jonathan _EDWARDS_

- 2. It is never found in pure form on earth, but is a common component of meteorites. This element is found in combination with, and grouped with, osmium and platinum. FTP, identify this rare metal, whose name, due to its colored salts, derives from the Greek for rainbow and whose atomic number is 77. A: IRIDIUM
- 3. He graduated from Yale at the age of 18, and taught school until the age of 21. Unfortunately, he was forced into early retirement for spying on the British Army. FTP, name this man who had only one life to give for his country.

ANSWER: Nathan HALE

- 4. This botanist discovered that genes are mobile within a plant cell's chromosomes, but she is best known for winning a Nobel Prize in 1983 for this work, especially with corn and maize. FTP, name this American woman. Ans: Barbara MC CLINTOCK
- 5. Ever the idealist, he resigned from the czar's guard at age 19 to pursue a "meaningful endeavor" music. His early works included "The Outcast" and "The Orphan Girl." He then turned to opera, starting but never finishing an adaptation of Gogol's "The Marriage." His best-known work was originally rejected for its radical breaks with operatic convention. FTP identify this composer of "Night On Bald Mountain," "Pictures at an Exhibition," and the classic "Boris Gudunov."

A: Modest MUSSORGSKY

6. He has become a legend after his suicide following an unsuccessful attempt to foment rebellion among the ranks of his country's Self Defense Force. His works are known for eroticism and conservative politics, but his obsession was with the proper way to die. Many of his charcters killed themselves as he did: by hara-kiri. Identify this 20-th Century Japanese author, writer of "Temple Of The Golden Pavillion."

A: Yukio MISHIMA

7. Originally its main rival was Denmark but the Netherlands and Great Britain were more responsible for its ultimate decline. At one time or another, some 200 cities belonged. Some of the important ones included Lubeck, Bremen, and Hamburg. FTP name this medieval union of cities, whose name derives from the German for "association" or "hansa."

A: HANSEATIC LEAGUE

8. Invented by John Bardeen, Walter H. Brattain, and William Shockley of AT&T Bell Laboratories in 1948, the n-p-n and p-n-p varieties are often dubbed BJTs, while the p-channel and n-channel varieties are either JFETs, MOSFETs, or IGFETs. FTP name this amplifying device of integrated circuits whose function is dependent upon the opposed motion of holes and electrons through a triplet of semiconductor layers.

- 9. Boy meets girl. Girl nearly gets boy in trouble twice. Boy breaks into the military's computer system with the password Joshua, gets arrested for espionage, and, thanks to a game of tic-tac-toe, narrowly saves the world from "Global Thermonuclear War." This is essentially the plot of, FTP, what 1984 film starring Matthew Broderick?

- 10. The inspiration of Brahms's melancholy 5th Piano Quartet, this novella garnered its young author an international reputation with its 1774 publication. Its protagonist's clothing even became the fashion at European courts while a rash of romanticized suicides was recorded among German youths. FTP name this Gothe novel, the first of the epistolary genre, of a romantic young man with a passion for Homer who, in despair of an inaccessible love, ends his life with the use of a friends pistol.

- 11. In 1940, Ramon Mercador del Rio carved himself a niche in history, when he killed a man with a mountain climber's axe. FTP, name this man, symbolized by Snowball in Orwell's _Animal Farm_, who was exiled from Russia shortly after the overthrow of Czar Nicholas II.

 ANSWER: Leon _TROTSKY_
- 12. In 1889 he won the last title bout fought with bare knuckles, defeating Jake Kilrain; however, when gloves were added, he lost to "Gentleman Jim" Corbett in 1892. FTP, name this American boxer, known as the "Boston Strong Boy".

A: John Lawrence SULLIVAN.

13. The Supreme Court Case "Roth v. United States" in 1959 says that the Postmaster General cannot judge the obscenity of material in the US Mail. FTP, this decision dealt with the printing and distribution of what rather racy 1929 D.H. Lawrence novel?

A: "LADY CHATTERLEY'S LOVER"

14. The basis for a 1965 hit by the Byrds, this Haftarah book's authorship was ascribed to Solomon. FTP, name this book, which was the inspiration for "Turn, Turn, Turn."

15. It has been languishing under an embargo for over a year and a half. But that changed in October when this country signed an agreement to remove the Star of Vergina from its flag and make no territorial claims beyond its existing borders. FTP, name this former Yugoslav republic which borders Greece.

- 16. This architect's most celebrated work is the facade of the Expiatory Church of the Holy Family. His work developed a startling new style that combined art nouveau with random bits of color and material, which manifested itself in another of his works, the Casa Mila in Barcelona. FTP, name this architect, whose last name gave rise to an adjective that matches his style. A: Antonio GAUDI.

- 18. Married to a local girl, this 19th century American author is buried in Elmira, NY, and had one of the first telephones in the United States. FTP, name this man, sometimes given credit for inventing the modern novel, author of such works as _Letters to the Earth_, "The Fabulous Jumping Frog of Calaveras County," and _The Adventures of Tom Sawyer_. ANSWER: Mark _TWAIN_
- 19. A Baron of Tilton, he represented the British Treasury at the end of World War I but resigned his position in protest of the economic provisions of the Versailles treaty. FTP name this author of _The General Theory of Employment, Interest, and Money_, whose economic theories supported the legislation of the New Deal. ANSWER: John Maynard _KEYNES_
- 20. A big uproar arose a few years ago when various religious reformers denounced records that contained hidden "satanic" messages when played backward. While not quite demonic, one recently released song does contain hidden messages--two of them--when played backward. FTP, name this new Beatles release first heard on the _Beatles Anthology._ ANSWER: _FREE AS A BIRD_

- 21. He was present at the Versailles conference during World War I, worked as a cook in Manhattan, and was jailed for subversion in Hong Kong. He has fought the Chinese Nationalists and the Japanese, but you probably know him best for his stuggles against the armies of France and the United States. FTP name this man, after whom the former Saigon is named.

 A: Ho Chi Minh
- 22. Careful! There are two answers for this poetic question: "Half a league, half a league, half a league onward,/ Into the Valley of Death rode the Six Hundred."
 FTP, name both the author of these lines and the war in which the described battle took place.

ANSWER: Alfred Lord _TENNYSON_ and _THE CRIMEAN WAR_.
