Alice in Wonderland inspired his "Don't Come Around Here No More." We can only suspect the source of his dancing with the dead body of Kim Basinger for "Mary Jane's Last Dance." FTP, name this prolific frontman for the Heartbreakers.

Due to it, there are few paved roads in the Yukon. Laying Asphalt on top of this land would cause it to absorb heat, which would cause it to melt into runny black mud. FTP, name this phenomenon where land stays below freezing all year long.

Originally known as the Society of the Friends of the Constitution, their meetings were held in a former Dominican convent. By 1791, moderate members moved to the Feuillants. By 1793, 5000 of these clubs could be found in France. FTP, name this radical group of the French Revolution generally associated with Robespierre.

Born on Cyprus, he believed that there were only two types of people, ones who were good in every way, and those who were totally without virtue. He also believed that the human soul was really only reason, and that fear, ambition, and the like were to be eliminated. FTP, name this founder of Stoicism.

A: ZENO

15

Their names are Neal, Mike, Rik, and Vyvyan ["Vivian"]. They all are students at Scumbag University, but never attend class. In one episode they played the British University Challenge, and almost won, had Rik not answered the question "Who's been messing with my packet?" correctly. FTP, name this British comedy series of the early eighties, previously seen on MTV and PBS, but now on Comedy Central.

One of the most used to end a piece is the V-I ("five, one"), which works from a chord built on a fifth to a chord built on the key note. 17

Originally designed by Anthemius of Tralles and Isidore of Miletus, minarets were added in 1453. A miracle of architecture when built, its central dome collapsed in 563, demanding serious repairs. FTP, name this major lanmark of Byzantium, constructed under Justinian I from 532 to 537 AD.

A: HAGIA SOPHIA

18

In this state, observances include Covered Bridge Week, Lithuanian Independence Day, and Rachel Carson Day. It's highest point is Mount Davis, a rather unimpressive peak in the Appalachian chain. Some other major attractions include the Frick Art Museum, the Rodin Museum, and Dutch Wonderland. FTP, identify this state, where you are currently sitting.

A: PENNSYLVANIA

19

Because these events are beyond human control, people ordinarily are not held accountable for losses due to them. Common types in law include flooding, earthquakes, and falling trees. FTP, give the three word legal term, which is often found in insurance policies.

The first pair in this series were named for what they looked like, Gumdrop and Spider. They were followed by Odyssey and Aquarius, America and Challenger, Casper and Orion, Charlie Brown and Snoopy, and the most famous Columbia and Eagle. FTP, these were the names for the Command and Lunar modules of what US Space
