4. This military leader led a successful coup in 1973 against the first constitutionally elected Marxist government of his country, ending 45 years of democratic government. FTP name this dictator who overthrew the Allende government in Chile.

A: Augusto PINOCHET Ugarte

5. This historian and philosopher was headed for the priesthood, but became a socialist after graduating from St. Peters College in New Jersey. He married Ida Kauffman, one of his students at an anarchist school, who later changed her name to Ariel. FTP name this author of "Story of Philosophy" and the eleven-volume "The Story of Civilization", the last five of which were co-authored by Ariel.

A: Will DURANT

6. Shaped like a square with a triangle on top, it is called the Herdsman. Its brightest star is Arcturus. FTP name this northern hemisphere constellation in the spelling of whose name appears a dieresis.

A: BOOTES (Bo U tees)

7. In 1990, it elected Gro Harlem Brundland as Prime Minister. 95% of its citizens are Evangelical Lutherans; a religion whose tenets do not forbid whaling. FTP name this Scandinavian country, the home of Grieg and Ibsen.

A: NORWAY

8. Meteorologically it is a low pressure area, but in economics it is a situation where demand is slack. In psychology, it is a state of a lack of motivation. Recently, the manic variety has been renamed "bipolar disorder." FTP give the term meeting the above definitions.

A: DEPRESSION

9. This British actor co-directed "Pygmalion" in 1938 and was thought to be shot down in a special mission from Lisbon to London during WW II. FTP name this actor who played the role of the plantation owner coveted by Scarlet O'Hara.

A: Leslie HOWARD

10. This conifer genus includes species with common names "white", "red", "black", Englemann and Norway. FTP give the common name of this turpentine producing forestry tree of the genus Picea.

A: SPRUCE (Accept Picea on an interrupt)

11. It includes mutualism, commensualism, and parasitism. The classic bio class example is the lichen, which consists of an alga and a fungus living together for mutual benefit. FTP give this scientific term which comes from the Greek for "living together."

A: SYMBIOSIS

12. This charismatic chief organized a formidable Native American military alliance. He roused nearly all the tribes east of the Mississippi to expunge all signs of white civilization. FTP name this Shawnee who was defeated by William Henry Harrison at Tippecanoe.

A: TECUMSEH

13. This thoroughbred stakes race is not as famous as the Kentucky Derby, and has a smaller purse than the Breeders Cup Classic, but is the oldest in the U.S. FTP name this August race held at "the graveyard of champions".

A: TRAVERS Stakes

14. Mesoamerica's first metropolis, it rivaled Rome in size during the middle of the first millennium C.E. FTP name this city which, centuries after its fall, the Aztecs called "the place of the Gods.

A: TEOTIHUACAN (Tio-tee-wa-can)

15. Although his swing was pretty this author of "Confessions of a Hooker" never shot his age. FTP who is this golfer better known for his travels with Bing and Dorothy and for entertaining the troops in the field?

A: Bob HOPE

16. This 134-acre site in the Catocin Mountain Park was built in 1934 and was originally known as the Shangri-La retreat, but the name was changed when President Eisenhower named it after a grandson who shared his name with the President's middle name. FTP name this hideaway just outside Thurmont, MD.

A: CAMP DAVID

17. The December 1995 elections in this country saw a change in power as the Welfare party, headed by the Muslim Necmettin Erbakan, took a majority of seats. FTP, name this NATO member whose animosity with Greece dates back to the abduction of Helen.

A: TURKEY

18. The first one, developed in 1940 at RCA labs in New Jersey, was ten feet high, weighed 700 lbs., and was capable of magnifying up to one hundred thousand diameters. FTP, name this device developed by Russian-American Vladimir Zworkin, whose varieties include the Scanning Tunneling.

A: ELECTRON MICROSCOPE

19. He could be called the James Bond of the 19th century, because, like Bond he was cool and inventive under stress and had a weakness for beautiful women.

FTP, who is this literary hero of the high seas created by Cecil Forrester, whose first name is the middle name of Hubert Humphrey.

A: Horatio HORNBLLOWER

20. On May 10, 1775 was the first Colonial victory in the War of Independence, at this fort across Lake Champlain from Vermont. Ethan Allen led his Green Mountain boys across Lake Champlain and captured FTP what fort.

A: TICONDEROGA

21. They have 50 teeth, more than any other North American mammal. There are no monotremes native to North America, and all the other mammals are placentals except this only North American marsupial. FTP name this mammal, which you might have played if you didn't want to get out of bed this morning.

A: OPOSSUM

22. In the mid 80's, he broke his hand punching a recording studio wall. His recording career began in 1973 with the Gainesville, Florida band Mudcrutch, but it wasn't until he moved to LA and began recording songs like "Listen to her Heart", "American Girl," and "Refugee" that he hit the charts. FTP, name this musician and front man for the Heartbreakers.

A: Tom PETTY

23. He contracted gastroenteritis after eating too many iced cherries at the cornerstone ceremony for the Washington monument and died 5 days later, ending his 16 month tenure as president. FTP, name this U. S. president who was succeeded by his VP, Millard Fillmore.

A: Zachary TAYLOR

24. Initially, it was developed to intensify the action of standard sedatives, but in 1954, two Montreal physicians reported success in treating psychotic patients with it. FTP, what is this brand name drug whose chemical name is Chlorpromazine.

A: THORAZINE (Accept Chlorpromazine on early buzz)

25. When he was only 24, he became professor of classics at Switzerland's University of Basel and later became close friends with Richard Wagner. FTP, name this German philosopher and poet to whom the title of the director of this tournament alludes, and whose works include "Beyond Good and Evil" and "The Anti-Christ."

A: Friedrich NIETZSCHE

26. Although Joseph Henry actually discovered electromagnetic induction, he never published his work and so credit for it went to this man, the son of a blacksmith. FTP name this chemist who developed processes to liquify gasses and who invented the dynamo.

A: Michael FARADAY

27. Until Woodstock 2, this was the largest rock festival in the U. S. with 600,000 fans there to see the Grateful Dead, the Allman Bros. and The Band perform in 1973, at FTP, what western NY town better known for auto racing.

A: WATKINS GLEN

28. It literally means "for this;" more roughly it means "for the particular end or purpose at hand." FTP what is this Latin phrase used to describe

quickly-formed committees in business or government, or hastily-organized tournaments at Maryland?

A: AD HOC

29. This colloquial term is not called "pork barrelling", but is the practice in which one member of Congress helps another to pass laws of local or personal interest in exchange for the same favor. FTP name this term which is also used in the trade of lumberjacks.

A: LOG-ROLLING

30. These personal bodyguards of the sovereign of England, also called beefeaters, were established in 1485 by Henry VII. FTP name these stalwarts who were later immortalized in the name of a Gilbert and Sullivan operetta.
