TOSSUP 1

TOSSUP 2

Since 1966 he has recorded over 50 albums, one of which became the score for his film, 200 motels. His first album, "Freak Out," inspired the Beatles' "Sergeant Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band." In 1986 he won a Grammy for "Jazz From Hell." For ten points, name this founder of The Mothers of Invention.

TOSSUP 3

Before the advent of Morse code, ships in visual contact could communicate by this method. For a quick 10 points, what name is given to the code of signaling with two flags, one held in each hand.

TOSSUP 4

The initial symptoms are extreme headache, rising fever, stiff neck, drowsiness and irritability. Bacteria or viruses gain access to the cerebrospinal fluid and follow the space around vessels. FTP name this potentially fatal inflammation.

Answer: _MENENGITIS_

TOSSUP 5

For a quick ten points, what British author is best known for his plays "The Silver Box" and "Joy" and the nine novels and four short stories chronicling the fortunes of the Forsyte family?

TOSSUP 6

It was the name of a Beatles song, and today is the name for a cult T.V. series on the United Paramount Network. For 10 points, on what show is Thomas Veil fighting against the conspiracy to reclaim his life?

TOSSUP 7

In physics, this is the integral of force with respect to time, and denotes a change in momentum. Psychologists use the word to describe sudden urges. For 10 points, give this word, which names a Calvin Klein fragrance.

TOSSUP 8

Among its sites are the house where Karl Marx was born, and many Roman ruins, including the Porta Nigra. Founded by Augustus in 15 BC as Augusta Treverorum, it served as an imperial capital and residence from about 295 AD. For ten points, name this German city on the Moselle River.

TOSSUP 9

He played Ross Perot to help Clinton practice for the 1992 debates. His lawsuit derailed the enforcement provisions of Gramm-Rudman. Best known for opposing tobacco and guns, he lost a 1994 primary election to 71-year-old Virgil Cooper. For ten points, what Oklahoma Democrat recently died of brain cancer?

TOSSUP 10

Although his name means painter in German, this Austrian was actually a composer who conducted the Hamburg and Vienna operas as well as the New York Metropolitan. For ten points, name this late Romantic composer of nine symphonies including Resurrection Symphony in 1894 and Symphony of a Thousand in 1907.

Answer: Gustav _MAHLER_

TOSSUP 11

There are 112 of them, mostly set down in about 900 BCE. In one, the young boy Nachiketa engages in a philosophical dialogue with Yama, the god of death. FTP name these texts of Hinduism; the final portion of the Veda.

Answer: _UPANISHADS_

TOSSUP 12

His theory didn't get much attention until in 1802 his friend John Playfair published a condensed version of his 1795 work. Even with his obfuscatory writing style, this Scotsman's theory on the steady formation of geologic forms over millions of years won enough support to begin the displacement of Biblically inspired theories.
