1. The uncle led an abortive 1838 raid on Windsor, Canada. The nephew served in the Union Army during the Civil War and later was a newspaperman and writer, authoring "An Occurrence at Owl Creek Bridge" and "Chickamauga." FTP, give the common last name.

2. A former Royal Navy lieutenant and a member of Parliament, this man organized and was the head of a movement to repeal the Catholic Relief Act of 1778. He then led the mob that engaged in the week-long anti-Catholic riots in London in June 1780. FTP, name this British lord.

3. He had a wife "three times his size. She sued [him] for divorce, Now he's livin' with his horse." FTP, who was this comic strip character with the "Goo-goo-googly eyes?"

4. He was to sailors what Pecos Bill was to cowboys and Paul Bunyan was to lumbermen. 19th century Ameriddcan sailors said the term "AB," for able-bodied seamen, came from his first and middle initials. FTP, name this American folk hero.
